PUBLIC SCHOOL CRICKET IN 1899.

It is a pleasant task to be able to begin one's article with an expression of sincere thanks to the many kind friends who have helped one with information, the absence of which could have rendered this paper impossible, for personal observation of the thirty and more Public Schools whose names appear, is of course impossible, and would often be misleading, as many a crack bat, bowler, or fieldsman fails to do himself justice in any given match. I must also thank the school secretaries and captains for the promptitude with which my circular was, as a general rule, answered. To only one school had I to write a third application, to only five a second; only one Captain filled up his paper in pencil, while score-books seem to have been so readily accessible that my homily in last year's *WISDEN* must have been read, marked, learned and inwardly digested. However, whatever the cause of this promptitude, to one and all—"Thanks!"

The weather plays so large a part in cricket, that a word on the subject is not out of place, especially as 1899 will probably be quoted in the future as an exceptional year for batsmen, and someone will say "*fin de siècle*"; but we must not forget, in dealing with school cricket, that the red-hot month was August, when county and international cricket was in full swing, but the schools were making holiday; in truth this reflection was forced upon me by my surprise at finding how good were many of the bowlers' analyses; then I discovered batting averages of a highly creditable size, and could only reconcile the apparent contradiction by recalling the fact that there was much broken weather in the course of the school season, and that averages and analyses, based as they are on a comparatively small number of matches, are not only misleading, but were, in 1899 largely dependent on the vagaries of the "cloud-compelling Zeus."

I adopted a form of classification last year, which seemed to have a certain amount of convenience and appropriateness, and as no better scheme presents itself twelve months later, it may again be utilised, so that the elevens of Eton, Harrow and Winchester, who play no Schools except each other, may be taken first. Though Eton only beat Winchester by one wicket, and only drew with Harrow, they were perhaps the best side of the three, though the Wykehamists ran them very close for second place; indeed the latter may think I am hard on them, as they lost by a strangely narrow majority, thanks mainly to the bowling of Bernard who, with a wind to help him, developed a remarkable "swerve in the air," which is now the fashionable

cult. It may also be recorded that whereas the Winchester batsmen got 337 runs from the Eton bowlers, the Eton men faced 206 overs before they got 307, the Winchester wicket-keeper being generous in his allowance of byes; but byes must not always be debited to wicket-keepers, for what beats the bat is equally likely to beat the gloves. As things stand, one is not justified in going behind the figures, especially when it is remembered that the bowler's business is not merely to beat the bat, but also to hit the wicket; if he misses them both, then he and the wicket-keeper must share some of the responsibility. The Eton side was a little above the average and a good all-round eleven, with sound, rather than brilliant batsmen; Grenfell had a fine average of over 40, while Gilliatt, Longman and Wormald were practically level, Gilliatt being the most ready to adapt himself to a change of conditions. In Martin and Bernard the Etonians were lucky to have two capital bowlers, bowlers of real promise; Bernard won the Winchester match, and Martin had an average of about 11 runs for every wicket he took (14 in all) in the two school matches. Add to these facts excellent fielding and a capital wicket-keeper in Findlay, who is practically first-rate, and the Eton men may be congratulated on their side and their success, though in the second innings at Lord's some very feeble fielding on the part of Harrow added largely to their score; still that is part of the game; the critic has to consider the balance of sides, as sides, and not merely to collate a series of individuals. The Harrow batting averages are remarkably high, a clear proof of an improvement in their somewhat difficult ground, and the bowling, headed of course by Dowson, works out very well, but the fielding and catching were conspicuously and strikingly poor. "A good team spoiled by bad fielding" was the verdict of a good critic, and I quite concur. It's no good having a Dowson if the fieldsman drop catches, for not only is a batsman allowed a second innings, but the bowler's heart is broken when he cannot trust his field, and has to bowl merely to bowl men out. Dowson struck me as being rather too clever; his variations were admirable but too frequent, and kept the batsmen too much on the *qui vive*; a sense of security is often fatal to the striker, but when the sound of the bugle is momentarily possible, we either don't sleep at all, or don't sleep our soundest. Black struck me as being quite a promising bowler, as far as style went, but he did not train on; Wyld was useful, and Wilson, one of the variety type, may turn out valuable. As Wyld and Dowson headed the batting averages, and with good figures, it will be seen that they were invaluable to Harrow. Winchester had a useful side, with a plentiful supply of bowling, Bruce, Joy and Hunter the best. Hunter got four wickets in four balls against the M.C.C. but Bruce is the most likely man with the ball, as Darling is with the bat. A bad starter, Darling is a fine forward player when

he is set, and may well look forward to a blue, being also an excellent captain. The general batting was also of a useful type, and as every man scored over 30 in some match, the Wykehamists wanted some beating, especially as they had hitters as well as plodders, but they stumbled over the same stone as Harrow, viz : catching. "No side would have got over 170 against us, if we had held all the *reasonable* catches." There's the keynote! Ensure the catching of "reasonable" catches, all of them, and the wickets needn't be widened or the laws altered. Unluckily you can't ensure this, for we are all human, some of us more so. No less than six of the Winchester are off to Oxford, but Harrow and Eton contribute five in all to Cambridge. An instance of the futility of figures has just been sent me—a batsman with an average of over 30; he had ten innings and was seven times "not out" for a total of 102; hence his paper average was 34; I wonder if he was ever expected to get 34 when he went in! The order of the first block must be Eton first, then Winchester and then Harrow; fielding decided the day.

The second group is a large one and the fact that *inter*-matches are few does not help one in the way of classification, but at the head of the group I put Uppingham and Marlborough. The latter school beat both Rugby and Clifton handsomely, but this gives no further clue unfortunately to their strength in relation to other schools. Uppingham, moreover, only actually beat the weak Repton side, but the draw with Malvern was in their favour to some extent, and the draw with Haileybury must have resulted in a win. Now Haileybury beat Cheltenham and also Wellington, who in their turn beat Charterhouse, *ergo*, as far as single matches go, Uppingham were better than all these four, and either they or Marlborough would probably have made any of the first group "sit up." However I am not proposing to draw a comparison as I never saw Uppingham perform, but their figures are good, the three first batsmen having averages of 46, 37 and 36, while their bowlers open with 40 for 13·52 and 37 for 17·56. G. H. S. Fowke heads the batting averages, and is the second-best bowler, besides which he has played occasionally, though not very successfully, for Leicestershire, and is described as "good enough for any team." The side was big, and rich in fast bowlers, but the bowling lacked variety, though in Willey it had a passable lob-bowler, while the wicket-keeping was quite respectable. It is curious to read from one source that Uppingham was a quick-scoring side, from another that "the pace of the Malvern scoring contrasted favourably with that of their rivals." I must put Marlborough on the whole, behind Uppingham, as it was essential a one-man side. Spooner, as he afterwards showed in county cricket, was a really first-class batsman; if he came off, Marlborough was a big side; if he failed, it was a little one. But he seldom failed, and his aggregate of 926

runs must be a record for School Cricket, though his average of 71 has been surpassed. The long and the short of it is that Marlborough, with Spooner was a strong side, as he was always likely to make 100, and to get a few wickets with his curly slows. If he failed, which he seldom did, the side was a weak one. Hence I am justified, remembering the chances of cricket, in giving the sounder team, Uppingham, the higher place. How either would have feared against Eton is a matter of pure conjecture. Rugby was, I understand, greatly disappointed at the result of the game with Marlborough, the sole school-match which the Rugbeians play. As Spooner made some 260 runs in the match, he fairly won it for his side, but he was badly missed at least once, and—well any cricketer can finish the sentence. Rugby was indeed a failure in its solitary public appearance; the side had a good reputation, and there were many quite good batsmen in it, but they found Lord's too much for them, though they had no really formidable bowling to meet. Grylls may be heard of again as a bowler, though he is quite erratic at present, and the general fielding was fairly up to the mark. In the absence of Spooner they were certainly a match for Marlborough but then Spooner was not absent, in fact he was "all there," and the Rugby catchers were not. Malvern were as usual a tough lot to tackle, but figures must not be trusted as to their batting, as the small boundaries help runs and reduce the chances of getting out. They had two undoubtedly fine batsmen in Evans (nephew of the famous Oxford bowler) and White; the former is likely to train on as a bowler as well, but Canny, slow left hand, came out with the best analysis, and a creditable one at that, for the Malvern ground at its best is not a paradise for slows. Repton was easily defeated, and the draw with Uppingham was not largely in favour of the Rutlanders. Malvern, like Uppingham, met a series of "hot" sides with fair success, and the fact that they gave their school rivals so good a match stamps the side as being nearly, if not quite the equal of Rugby and Marlborough. When, oh! when, shall we have School League matches?

As Haileybury evaded the grasp of Uppingham, though morally beaten, and defeated both Wellington and Cheltenham, that school takes a high place in the list, especially as Wellington "outed" Charterhouse. A. H. Spooner (brother of the Marlburian) was quite a failure with the bat, though he kept wicket well and captained the side excellently. He will probably rise phoenix-fashion from the ashes in 1900. The undoubted strength of the side lay in the batting, Bignell and E. C. Smith being not only steady but successful, while Hodges put in some good work; all the batting indeed was good and anyone might have made, and occasionally did make a good score, but there was the usual lack of bowling, though of the four or five moderate trundlers one or other

generally came off. Wellington put an undoubtedly dangerous side into the field, the first three batsmen having, in the aggregate, an average of 50 each. Elliott, a fine, hard, strong-wristed player was an indubitably fine bat, though somewhat lacking in discretion. Goldie, who retrograded in 1898, found his form again in 1899, as is proved by his performance against the Free Foresters, when he scored 140 not out, in less than two hours, against such bowlers as Bosanquet, Hollins and E. C. Lee, all of Oxford University; he also made in the holidays a double century in a single day, a feat which only Ranjitsinhji has hitherto rivalled. Moderate bowling, however, discounted the value of the batting, which collapsed partially in the Haileybury match before some lobs which are described as very moderate, but the absence of Elliott in the Haileybury match may help to account for the bad totals of the Wellingtonians. Henderson, the wicket-keeper, played in his "freshman's year." Is this a record? or did Dowson do the same for Harrow? In any case, he is described not only as promising but as "never missing anything on the leg side." Lockett was perhaps the soundest bat of the side and the hardest wicket to get, so that Cambridge may find a place for him some day. The Cheltenham boys were seldom seen at their best owing to the ravages of illness, which made it impossible for them to meet their old rivals, Marlborough and Clifton, who, to square matters, met each other for the first time, Marlborough coming out top. The Cheltonians had, strange to say, a side that was stronger in bowling than in batting, though, again strange to say, it was the bowling that failed against Haileybury, yet Winterbotham, quite a youngster, had but few off-days, his slow left-hand bowling being not only fairly steady, but occasionally brilliant, while Salter, fast medium, was a very useful foil to him; but the eleven, decimated by occasional absences, could hardly expect to have a great season, and the collapse against Haileybury quite knocked it out of court. White was the pick of the batsmen, with a strong defence but tame forward strokes. Murray at the wickets was safe, plucky and quick. The Clifton boys beat Tonbridge by eight wickets, but lost to Marlborough by some 70 or 80 runs; this however gives no line as to their merits as compared with other schools, as Tonbridge met only one other school, the weak Dulwich side. The Clifton batting was characterised by vigour rather than science, I am told, though Keigwin promises well, and P. G. Robinson is a free, up-standing bat who may turn out very well, and the same applies to the captain, Crawley-Boevey, who has gone to Cambridge. Remembering the excellence of the Clifton ground one is not surprised to find the bowling averages rather weak, indeed Jamieson alone did much; he bowls fast-medium of a good class, and there was also a lob bowler in the team of the name of Grace, a relation I presume of the great man.

Good wicket-keeping and only moderate fielding could not compensate for weak bowling, and so "moderate" must be the verdict as to the side. Westminster had a rarely exciting game with Charterhouse, or rather with time, for though 128 runs are a handsome majority, four spare minutes make a tight fit. The rare event of "out for obstructing field" occurred in this match, an excited batsman apparently losing his head for a moment, but the obstruction is described as "flagrant;" the offender, Plaskett, however practically won the match by his fine bowling. The Westminster boys had no less than three bats with averages of over 40, viz.—Young, Harris and Willett, but there was some good stuff on the rest of the side; my kind critic says: "Runs come easily here (i.e. in Vincent Square), but we should have made a good score against any school, though a strong side would have made a lot of runs against us." That sums up the case of most schools. Young goes to Cambridge, but is more likely to get a "blue" for football than cricket, as his style errs on the side of being too defensive. Willett, "a young giant," may get hold of a "blue" at Oxford in due course, while Harris is described as "rarely promising;" his average is the more remarkable because he was a new choice. Bompas, next year's captain, was an excellent bat and wicket-keeper. The defeat of Charterhouse by Westminster is somewhat discounted by the weakness of the Godalming boys, who lost six matches out of fourteen and never won one. The reasons, as given are ample, "bad luck, weak bowling and execrable fielding, the number of easy catches dropped being phenomenal!" This is not good news, and I hope that a rumour which has reached my ears is not true, viz.:—that the school as a body cares nothing about cricket, but is wholly devoted to football; after all there is room for the two games. Wellington utterly outplayed the Carthusians, scoring 356 for four wickets, all of which fell to Eddis, who heads both lists of averages, though he did not bowl very much. He was a good bat in 1898, improved in 1899, and should be first-class in 1900 unless the cares of captaincy tell on him. Tompson was a successful scorer, but played with "the crookedest bat you ever saw"; he also had an unhappy knack of losing the toss twice in every three efforts. Repton does not come out of the ordeal very honourably, as her representatives were beaten in an innings by both Malvern and Uppingham, both tough customers this year, especially Uppingham. The Reptonians lacked experience and were a young lot, so that there are hopes for the future, (especially as a new and good ground has been acquired), with extra assistance in coaching. Gould was a useful bat, especially in the school matches, while Franklin got plenty of folk out on doubtful wickets. I congratulate Tonbridge on having met Clifton, and am in hopes that some words of mine in WISDEN'S contributed to the arrangement of the match. Clifton won quite easily, as

the Tonbridge eleven was not up to sample, the bowling being especially weak. F. V. Hutchings was a really good bat, and had an average of 63, Marriott, the captain, being next with 23, but the latter is the more stylish of the two; the younger Hutchings (H. L.) is full of runs and promise, and in Brown was "a really first-class stumper."

Summing up the results of the school matches in this group, I can go no further than to give an opinion which is worth, what it is worth,—little or nothing. Harrow and Eton seemed to me to be certainly better than either Rugby or Marlborough, though Spooner of Marlborough was the best boy bat I have seen for ages, though possibly he took too many risks. Winchester and Uppingham were practically as good as either Eton or Harrow, and Haileybury and Malvern as Rugby and Marlborough. Wellington, Cheltenham and Clifton probably came next, with Westminster, Charterhouse, Repton and Tonbridge in the rear, Westminster the best of the group. If this sub-division gives any dissatisfaction, the dissatisfied can make out an order for themselves, and I hope they'll like the job.

We now come to *Bedford Grammar School*, which must have had some useful batting, if figures are a test, for Brooks, Cantrell and Maclear all topped 35, Maclear and Hazell having good bowling figures; they morally beat Merchant Taylors', who did not lose a match, but were severely beaten by St. Paul's, also an undefeated side. Nor did *Bedford Modern School* have a great season, though the bowling was well ahead of the batting, only Davis having a decent record, but Read and especially Linnell did a lot of good work with the ball, and the latter may be heard of at Cambridge. *Bradfield* "had the best season we have had for several years," as, though the defeat of Radley was not very glorious, an even draw with Sherborne, exceptionally strong in 1899, was highly creditable. The school had three quite good bowlers, Ling's record being admirable, 47 wickets for 11·46, while Goldsmid had a batting average of over 40, with only one not-out to help him. *Brighton College* had a fairly good season, and quite a good bat in Umfreville, though his defence is said to be weak; still he puts the bat well against the ball. Maltby, however, was the man of the team, as he was really useful in all departments of the game, and may be worth a little attention at Cambridge. *Dulwich* had a weak side, and lost all its school matches—four. Tonbridge made hares of them, though in the matches with Bedford, Brighton and St. Paul's, the losers had not the best of luck, but the batting was clearly below the average, though the side claims to have had about four good all-round men. Nor is there much to be said about *Hurstpierpoint*, which won two out of five matches and lost three, against weak schools. The bowling of Halford and Fremantle, together with Shears' wicket-keeping, was the redeeming

point of the side. *Lancing*, however, had quite a good eleven, and consequently a successful season; they had at least four good bats and two good bowlers, Read and Gill being prominent both ways, and the fielding being excellent. Gill is available in 1900, and "deeds of derring do" are expected of him. *Merchant Taylors'* had a rare list of fixtures, meeting as many as nine schools, losing to none and defeating four, Eight fellows had a batting average of over 20, Tasker's being 35; his style was more efficient than ornamental. The bowling and fielding were quite up to sample, but the feature of the season was the 153 put up against Felsted for the last wicket by Barrett and White. *Radley* was not well represented, especially as Worsley, a really promising player, lost his form, and his luck, as usual, went with it. The bowling works out as being better than the batting, but this, I am assured, is not the case, though Worsley was pretty good. The fielding was but moderate and was often severely tested. *Rossall* had the sad experience of losing its captain by death in the middle of the season, and it is not surprising that the loss did not conduce to the success of the eleven; still it beat Loretto, quite a fair side, and morally defeated Shrewsbury, so that the sea-siders quite held their own under the circumstances, for their lost leader had a good average both with bat and ball. *Sherborne* "had an undefeated record, and the best eleven we have had for years, at least in the batting line," thus Stanger-Leathes averaged 41, Eglington 57, Wood 37 and Garnier 33. These are pretty formidable figures, and the two first-named are quite of the first-class, especially on Sherborne wickets; the bowling was very moderate, likewise the fielding, and probably this is the reason why the matches with Bradfield and St. Paul's were drawn. *Shrewsbury* "as in former years felt the want of a good fast bowler." The phrase is stereotyped, and till bowlers bowl *overs* when they practice, and not single balls at hap-hazard, the cry will still be the same. The batting was fair, Goldie being the best, but the team, as a team, was only mediocre, and the results unsatisfactory. *St. Paul's* had a good side and a good season, losing no school matches and defeating Dulwich and Bedford Grammar Schools, though the draw with Sherborne was really the best performance as Londoners had quite the upper hand. Beyts with an average of 50 was a really good bat, and Hunt, with half his average, was not to be despised.

So many names of individuals have been already mentioned that only a few remarks need be added about them. Spooner of Marlborough was probably the best, as he was the most successful batsman of the year, and proved that he really was good by his performances for Lancashire. Fowke of Uppingham was also exceedingly good, though his trial with Leicestershire was not a great success. Grenfell, Elliott and Wormald of Eton should

make their mark, as should Elliott and Goldie of Wellington, Dowson and Wyld of Harrow were also good, the former seeming to me to be highly promising. Hutchings of Tonbridge deserves a word, with Dillon (Rugby), Stanger-Leathes (Sherborne), Crawley-Boevey (Clifton), Evans and White (Malvern) and Darling (Winchester).

Dowson (Harrow) was probable the bowler of last year as of other years, while other good men were Martin and Bernard (Eton), Hunter (Winchester), Grylls (Rugby), Canny (Malvern), Von Ernsthausen and Fowke (Uppingham), Winterbotham (Cheltenham); many others from less known schools had fair averages, but I cannot help thinking that they met weaker batsmen and that figures are in this respect especially untrustworthy. In all 32 bowlers had averages of between 10 and 15 runs per wicket, and 28 of between 15 and 20, fifteen wickets to qualify.

Of the Scotch Schools Merchiston and Glenalmond came out at the top of the School Championship series, Blair Lodge being last; yet the Polmont boys are generally pretty good, but the order for once in a way seems to have been turned upside down. As usual the bowling averages are far better than those of the batsmen, the Scotch climate conduced to difficult wickets, I presume. I have unfortunately to go to press without any report from Glenalmond, so I pass on to Merchiston Castle which had a really fine bat in Duncan, who, however, is not a good starter; he also bowls well, and is a capital all-round cricketer. Brown was not much behind him as a batsman, and both of them got a century. When I add that the averages of the three first bowlers, taken together, give a result of 8·58 per wicket, it will be seen that the game thrives at Merchiston. Blair Lodge had a disappointing season, as the old hands did not train on, and the new hands did not do much; Thorburn, last year's bowler, seems to have retrograded; in fact only Cheadle has decent figures, and he also heads the batting averages with a not very formidable record. Fettes won one match and lost three, Blair Lodge being the victim. Campbell, who goes to Cambridge, was the best of the batsmen, while Schulze is top bowler. Edinburgh Academy won two matches and lost three, their captain, Hole, having done well with bat and ball, and heading both lists. The loss to Merchiston was a one-wicket loss. Loretto lost to Blair Lodge alone, but were not a very strong side. Wordsworth, who bowled well in 1898 was equally to the fore in 1899, taking 63 wickets at the rate of 7.5 apiece; as he was also the best batsman, and the captain, he will be missed in 1900, though he will be heard of at Oxford. I must apologise for the meagreness of these notes, but fall back on the adequate plea of meagre information.

Most of the following will be in residence at Oxford or Cambridge in 1900.

ETON v. HARROW.

*Played at Lord's, Friday and Saturday, July 14, 15.—*Limited, unfortunately, as before to two days, the Eton and Harrow match for the fifth time in six years ended in a draw. The ground was in perfect order for run-getting, and at no time did there seem any prospect of arriving at a definite result. Time was economised to the utmost extent, play, which began each day at eleven o'clock, being prolonged till seven o'clock on Friday, and a quarter past seven on Saturday, but all to no purpose. At the finish, Harrow wanted 123 runs to win with five wickets to go down, but the final score counted for nothing, Eton, in the hope of winning the game, having declared their second innings closed with only two men out for the splendid total of 264. Both teams are criticised in Mr. Ford's article on Public School cricket, but it may be said here that, to those who only saw them at Lord's, they seemed decidedly rich in capable batsmen, Dowson and Wyld for Harrow and Longman, Grenfell and Gilliat for Eton playing in a style that held out high promise for the future. Dowson was far and away the best all-round cricketer in the match, but it was as a batsman rather than as a bowler that he triumphed, his inability to get wickets in Eton's second innings being a little disquieting to those who had closely watched his career since he first appeared at Lord's. His innings of 87 not out was in every way admirable, the certainty with which he drove every over-pitched ball being quite as remarkable as his defence. Eton's supporters expected great things of Bernard, the left-handed slow bowler, who had made such an impression in the match against Winchester, but the ground was probably too fast for him, and though at times he sent down some good overs, he only took one wicket. The sensation of the match came when Eton, at ten minutes to one on Saturday, started their second innings. Longman and Grenfell went in, and Longman, when he had made only five, was missed at slip. For this blunder Harrow had to pay a tremendously high price, the two batsmen staying together for two hours and a quarter, and in that time scoring 167 runs. Longman was the first to leave, his innings of 81, apart from the chance, being superb. He played in most attractive style and scored all round the wicket. As most readers of *Wisden* will be aware, he is a son of Mr. G. H. Longman—so famous at Eton and Cambridge as a batsman in the first half of the '70's. Grenfell, who was out at 184, was not quite so good to look at, but played equally sound cricket. Curiously enough he made exactly the same score. Gilliat, who had perhaps shown the best form in Eton's first innings, was again seen to extreme advantage, he and Denison putting on 80 runs together in forty minutes before the innings was declared closed. It was stated that Gilliat, who played in a very free, commanding style, had been coached by Alec Hearne. When Harrow went in they wanted 256 runs, and with only two hours and a half left for cricket there was of course nothing to play for but a draw. It seemed certain that the game would be curtailed by half an hour and stumps drawn at seven o'clock, but just before that time Harrow's fourth and fifth wickets fell, and as there was a possibility of the last five wickets going down in half an hour, play was proceeded with, the arrangement being to go on till half past seven if necessary. Dowson and Kaye, however, soon placed Harrow out of all danger, and at a quarter past seven stumps were pulled up.

Seventy-four matches have been played, of which Eton have won twenty-eight, Harrow thirty, and sixteen have been drawn. This is the generally published record, but Harrow men object very strongly to the game in 1805 being treated as a regular contest between the two schools, contending that it is no more correct to count that than the fixture in 1857 for boys under twenty, which has been rejected. T. G. O. Cole's 142 in 1897 was the thirteenth three-figure innings in the matches between the schools and the highest but one in the whole series. The previous great scores were E. Bayley 152 in 1841; A. K. Watson 185 in 1885; A. W. Ridley 117 in 1871; C. P. Foley 114 in 1886; W. F. Forbes 113 in 1876; A. W. T. Daniel 112 not out in 1860; C. J. Ottaway 108 in 1867; E. Crawley 100 in 1885; R. B. Hoare 108 in 1888; J. H. Stogdon 124 in 1895; and H. C. Pilkington 101 and B. J. Bosanquet 120, both in 1896.

After the third batsman was dismissed at 242, there came something like a collapse and the innings closed for 309. The county after starting fairly well were dismissed during Tuesday afternoon for 204. The second innings of the home side in which Wynyard and Carpenter again distinguished themselves realised 338, and Worcestershire making only 111 of the 444 required, were beaten as stated. Wynyard played brilliant cricket in both innings, first scoring 89 in two hours and five minutes, and afterwards 81 in an hour and thirty-five minutes, and each time, curiously enough, hitting fifteen 4's. Carpenter, Storer, and Murdoch all did well. Trott made up for his comparative batting failure by taking eleven wickets for 103 runs.
