PUBLIC SCHOOL CRICKET IN 1911.

In looking through both the batting and bowling averages of the Public Schools for 1911, the extraordinary summer must immediately be taken into consideration in writing up the abilities of the boys. The season was made for run-getting, so bowlers had a hard time of it, and every boy—excuse the boy—who had a good, or even a fair bowling average, must, quite obviously, have been a good bowler. In summing up the abilities of bowlers and batsmen, however, a good deal that is not at first sight apparent must be considered. For instance, it is far more difficult to make runs at Harrow or Winchester, where there are, practically speaking, no boundaries, than at small, but perfect grounds such as Charterhouse and Malvern. The Public School grounds of to-day, speaking broadly, are as keenly looked after as the Oval was by Sam Apted. The difference between the grounds of to-day and the grounds of even fifteen years ago is prodigious, though even then, of course, there were some that were almost perfect.

The beautiful season and the resulting wickets proved one thing that the cricketers of, say twenty-five years ago, have been dinning into us for some years; the fact that back-play being looked upon as the be-all and end-all of cricket, is erroneous. With the lightning pace of the wickets, forward play was a *sine-qu-a-non*. Naturally one had to play forward, somehow: and that was how one saw them, lots of them, playing forward. Somehow, or anyhow, the head of the player would be thrown up, and quite out of a line with the ball; the left leg would not be nearly enough across, and the left elbow dropped: and the bat would follow the leg, the two making two distinct and different movements. The amount of wickets lost behind the wicket, and caught at point and cover by this hideous combination of mistakes—not to mention the ones that should have been lost, but for missed catches—was enormous.

Anyone who started well last year, had to make runs, if he was careful and was content to wait for his opportunities. Of course, a D. W. Carr might come down and pulverize a boy at school: he has done that for men who have played for England for years. That type of accident does not count. But the player who started badly

was in a bad case. It is so fatally easy to lose confidence if suddenly made to change your game. If out of luck, everything resembling a chance is always snapped up : decisions do not favour : and the first time runs look like coming, it is more than likely that an unlucky run out will break the batsman's heart.

W. G. Grace, though his back play was so wonderful, and, though he was, perhaps, the first perfect exponent of how to use his legs to guard his wicket, was a great believer in forward play. With his reach, which appeared even greater than it really was—for W.G. always played forward well within himself, and never lunged forward precipitously—he almost forced fast bowlers to bowl short of a length ; and, once short of a length, came the late cut from W.G. This year was the year of all years to use that almost forgotten stroke, the late cut. Cutting, now-a-days, is done by a wrist motion, the left wrist being well above the right. It was not that way that Dr. Grace disheartened, and even pulverised, such bowlers as Mold, to take one of the greatest—if questioned—bowlers of our time. W.G.'s right fist came up to the middle of his right collar-bone, his left wrist being down, with the face of the bat, the face be it marked, he patted that ball just where he wished it to go.

These remarks may seem quite irrelevant to a Public School article, but, in view of last season, I think that they are not. Had W. G. been at his best last season, with his strong push forward stroke, and his wonderful cutting—well described as the lost art—contemporaries of his are unanimous in stating that, on present day wickets, he would have averaged over a hundred for the season, barring, always, googlies. How he would have faced them we cannot tell.

The match between the M.C.C. and the Public Schools last year was not, unfortunately, a great test of the best Public School form. Some players, who undoubtedly should have played, were unable to do so. The M.C.C. had a strong batting side, but, on a grand Lord's wicket, their bowling was decidedly on the weak side. The features of the match, from the Public School point of view, were : first, the great partnership between M. Woosnam (Winchester) and R. A. Knight of St. John's. Woosnam made a perfect 144, and seemed at home at once, and Knight was left not out 120 at the close of the innings. Secondly, the bowling of A. I. Steel. In the first innings he had a long bowl and took three wickets for 86, out of a total of 414. This seems nothing at first sight, but on a perfect Lord's wicket, and against a good batting side, it is something, especially as he bowled over twenty-five overs. In the second innings he took four wickets—the only four that fell—for 42 runs,

bowling nineteen overs. This was a really fine performance, for he kept the runs down splendidly, even when the M.C.C. needed, at almost any cost, to make them quickly.

On the form of the season, there can be little doubt that *Eton* were quite the best side of the year. *Rugby* may dispute this : unfortunately, I was unable to see their match with *Marlborough*, a match won decisively and without the question of luck coming in either way. The performances, however, of *Eton*, on *Agar's Plough*, were quite exceptional. It is true that they lost to a strong M.C.C. team, but, when they met *Winchester* they were an unbeaten side ; and they scored, among other things, a truly great win over a very strong *Free Foresters* side. *Eton* declared with 322 for four wickets, and dismissed the *Free Foresters* for 77, a performance of which any Public School side that ever existed might well be very proud.

In spite of their undoubted superiority, however, *Eton* were extremely fortunate to beat *Winchester*. *Winchester* were not a sound side taken all through ; but, they had two of the players of the year, if not *the* two players of the year, in *Critchley-Salmonson* and *Woosnam*. *Salmonson* is as unpleasant a bowler for any public-school player to meet as I have seen for many years. He stands about six feet three inches in height, and has a very high, and, it should be mentioned, a very easy delivery. In pace he is something between *J. T. Hearne* at his best, and *Barnes* of *Staffordshire*. With the wind to help him, he makes the ball swerve anything from three to six inches from leg, and he swerves rather late. That is to say, the ball does come in a curve from his delivery, but turns off sharply some eight or ten feet from the batsman, just as he is shaping for a stroke. Unfortunately, he has come to rely too much on the swerve, and when he loses that he has little to fall back upon.

Winchester won the toss on *Agar's Plough*, and of course batted first. *M. Woosnam* was out rather unluckily, and they argue the point now and, probably, will for years. He stepped back to hook a ball from *Steel*, and, having cleared the fieldsmen, started for a run. As he did so, his foot slipped, and he broke the wicket. The point was (1) Did he break the wicket while making his stroke, or (2) Did he finish the stroke and then, when starting to make a run, slip, and so break the wicket ? In the first case he was, of course, out ; in the second, he was not. He was given out, and professed himself, afterwards, as perfectly satisfied. Some enthusiastic spectators were very upset by the decision ; but the majority of the more cool-headed agreed with the umpire's decision. The feature of *Winchester's* innings was *G. de L. Hough's* 90 not out. He was

rather a late-comer into the side, a good player with many possibilities, in time. He was not looked upon as the man likely to win the Eton and Winchester match: but he nearly did it. His on-side play is quite excellent, and they prophecy for him a real future.

Eton batted in most disappointing fashion, Salmonson worrying each and every one of them. In spite of useful twenties by Campbell and Boswell, they were all out for 100. Winchester, naturally, put them in again, and Eton lost Holland and Colman, two of their finest bats, for ten runs, and, but for bad light, might have been in an awful position. Rain fell heavily in the morning, and when the match was resumed the ground was wet, soft, and easy. It was soon impossible to swerve the ball, Salmonson's asset, and barring that, the Winchester bowling was fairly simple. Campbell scored a brilliant century, and Tufnell, always a player of infinite nerve—as he proved latter in the Eton and Harrow match—made 57. The wicket was not too easy when Winchester went in again, but that did not excuse their batting. Hone and Hough made 23 and 25 respectively: otherwise, no one got into double figures. Boswell took four wickets for four runs, a sufficiently remarkable average.

Woopnam, who plays forward in absolutely the right style, failed to come off in the match; he is, however, a fine player, and on hard wickets is bound to make lots of runs. Critchley-Salmonson has been rather disappointing as a bat, for he has a good eye, a tremendous reach, and good style. Several times he showed himself a really fine player, but too often he appeared to treat the bowling too lightly, and was out to feeble strokes. As a bowler he is the most dangerous of any Public School boys I saw last year. L. T. Morshead is young, but they think a lot of him at Winchester. Critchley-Salmonson is staying on this year and if he will devote himself seriously to the finer arts of bowling, and few since A. G. Steel can teach him better than E. R. Wilson, he should be at the finish of this year one of the ten best all-round Public School cricketers since F. S. Jackson. Among other old choices he will have Hough and Morshead, and as there are several young players of promise, Winchester ought to be a very strong side.

The Eton and Harrow match seemed an absolute foregone conclusion. If Eton were an undoubtedly good side, Harrow were, quite as undoubtedly, the opposite. The defeat of Harrow in 1910, when they apparently had the match safely won, was bad enough in itself. Unfortunately, instead of the Harrow boys being ex-

horted to emulate the example of Eton, the disgrace of their defeat was constantly dinned into their ears all through last year. Another fact that worried, was that T. L. G. Turnbull, owing to an old and quite un-understandable Harrow rule, was captain over the head of one who had got into the team weeks before him. There was not the making of a really good side in the school: add worry where encouragement was most needed, and it is not to be wondered at that Harrow were a despondent side when they went up to Lord's. Their one hope was to make something like a match of it, and, as it turned out, they did that and more.

Harrow batted first, but on a perfect wicket gave a feeble display, and were all out for 127. T. B. Wilson alone batted well, making 46 by rather slow, but really good cricket. Eton lost one wicket before lunch, but afterwards G. R. Colman and D. G. Wigan completely mastered the bowling, Colman playing especially fine cricket. Both made seventies, and later E. F. Campbell and A. I. Steel scored thirties, Steel's style being very free, and interesting to watch. Eton made 270, a smaller total than appeared probable at one time.

Harrow had an hour and a quarter to bat, and started badly. A fine stand by T. B. Wilson and H. G. Gregson, however, improved matters immensely, and at the close of play the pair were still together and 119 was totalled for two wickets. In the morning, matters went all wrong again for Harrow, Wilson being run out almost immediately, a decision which caused much discussion. Wickets fell fast, until J. H. Falcon and K. B. Morrison made another courageous stand. The Eton bowling fell off perceptibly at this point. The match had seemed so completely theirs that the unexpected stand may have upset them a trifle, and the heat was tremendous. Falcon made 46 and Morrison 42, so that the total at the finish was the respectable one of 254. Needing only 112 to win Eton went in to an apparently easy task. They started badly, however, H. G. Gregson bowling W. T. Holland for six and G. R. Colman for two. C. W. Tufnell gave a quite possible chance to second slip before he had scored, but the fieldsman made no attempt to touch the ball. Afterwards he hit well, if sometimes rather luckily, and he gave one chance of stumping. His 54, however, undoubtedly won the match, for L. A. de Jongh, whose flight was very puzzling—the only way to describe it is to say the ball seemed to wriggle in the air—was having all the other Eton batsmen in difficulties. Finally, Eton won by three wickets.

The most biased Harrovian would not attempt to deny that the best side won. Had Harrow had a little more luck, they might just

have won. Even if they had done so, it would not alter the fact that Eton were their superiors. Although they had so much the worst of the first day's play against Winchester, and had some uncomfortable moments at Lord's, Eton were undoubtedly the strongest eleven of the three. G. R. Colman was probably the best of a strong batting side. He has plenty of strokes all round the wicket, and makes up his mind very quickly, exactly what he ought to do to each ball sent down to him. E. F. Campbell is another fine player, and has another year at Eton. Campbell is, by the way, a very fine cover-point. W. T. Holland failed to show his form in either of the school matches, but is, I understand, a really good left-hand batsman. Wigan is a methodical player, with a strong defence, and one who, on good wickets at any rate, is sure to make plenty of runs. Tufnell is a stylish wicket-keeper and, though he let a lot of byes in the Harrow second innings, a good one. As a batsman he is brilliant rather than sound, but he possesses the grand asset, that of rising to an occasion; this he proved in the second innings of both the school matches. He is to be congratulated as captain of a really fine side, who had a splendid season. A. I. Steel was, perhaps, the star man of the side. Bowling on good wickets and against strong sides, he seldom failed to get wickets, and get them at a reasonable cost. A slow bowler, with a natural break from the off, he has also mastered the leg break, which he can command in length with great accuracy. He is not afraid of being hit, and is always trying something fresh. Sometimes one catches glimpses of the genius of his famous father, A. G. Steel, and the methods of C. M. Wells, to whose coaching Eton cricket owes so much, are noticeable. As a bat he is quick on his feet, and uses his wrists well: an awkward man to bowl to, one of those whose hitting is their defence. After the Winchester match, when he struck his form, Steel was about as good a bat as any on the side. K. Lister-Kaye, a medium left-hand bowler made the ball swing a lot in the air when the wind was at all favourable, and could bowl a very difficult yorker. G. R. Colman, W. G. K. Boswell, and K. Lister-Kaye have gone up to Oxford, and the Hon. G. J. A. Mulholland to Cambridge; C. W. Tufnell, A. I. Steel, W. T. Holland, and R. A. Pesse have gone either into business or to Sandhurst. D. G. Wigan, E. F. Campbell, and G. Freeman Thomas will be at Eton for 1912, as will G. L. Davies, who played against Winchester, but not against Harrow.

T. L. G. Turnbull had rather an in-and-out season. He is a left-handed bat, and can hit with tremendous power on both sides of the wicket. In figure he bears a marked resemblance to George Hirst. When set, he may knock any bowler off his length, but he is not too good a starter, and last year was not favoured by luck. T. B. Wilson is rather stiff in the shoulders, which cramps his game. His defence,

however, is excellent, his back-play being particularly sound. Being content to wait for loose balls, and being strong on the leg-side, he was easily the most consistent bat on the side, and made a lot of useful scores against good bowling. C. H. B. Blount, who will captain Harrow next year, is a pretty player, though he gets out most unexpectedly at times to very weak strokes. J. H. Falcon was the most consistent bowler on the side, and occasionally bowled the in-swerve really well. H. G. Gregson should be very useful next year. It was with regret that all Harrovians learned that George Baker, the best professional coach I ever saw, is to retire this year after twelve years' magnificent service to the school. His loss will mean a very great deal to Harrow cricket. T. L. G. Turnbull, T. B. Wilson, and J. H. Falcon have gone up to Cambridge.

Rugby had a fine season, winding up with the defeat of Marlborough at Lord's by 193 runs. In 1910 Marlborough were the more favoured eleven, but went to pieces in a most unaccountable manner, and were beaten by an innings, and last year Marlborough went up to Lord's with an unbeaten record, but again failed to do themselves justice. Rugby had had a good year but not such a good one as Marlborough. Winning the toss, Rugby started very badly, but after losing four wickets for 17, a fine stand by G. G. Jackson and J. T. Bretherton, both of whom made fifties, put them in a fair, if not a strong position, and with the help of a most useful 40 from N. W. Wadham, the total reached 226. T. E. M. Battersby bowled really well for Marlborough, taking five wickets for 54. The Marlborough batting was disappointing with the exception of B. H. G. Shaw, who hit tremendously hard and made a number of grand strokes in his 94, and R. B. Lagden who made 38. I. F. L. Elliot's bowling performance, fourteen overs, one maiden, forty-one runs, five wickets, speaks for itself. Rugby batted consistently in their second innings, though K. H. C. Woodroffe bothered them all. Set 293 to win, a big score, but by no means an impossible one for such a good batting side, Marlborough collapsed, and were all out for 99. I. F. L. Elliot, B. W. Fagan, and R. M. Aston, certainly bowled extremely well, but the only explanation of Marlborough's poor display is the old one that these things *will* happen in cricket. Every credit must be given to Rugby, and congratulation too, for, whatever the importance of other matches, the Lord's match, against Marlborough, is *the* match of the year for them. Against Clifton they were fortunate to gain a draw, time saving them. Had the match been played out they must, humanly speaking, have been beaten.

The batting of the eleven was eminently sound, nine men averaging over 20, and the other two both having double figures. Even in such a season as 1911, this is a fine record of consistency. J. L. Andrews

headed the list with 34 and a decimal. He is a good, forcing bat, with plenty of strokes, and, when set, a very dangerous player indeed. His one fault appears to be over-anxiety to score too quickly when he first goes in. J. T. Bretherton and G. G. Jackson played consistently through the season and there is cricket in both of them. I. F. L. Elliot made a painstaking and clever captain and, though handicapped by illness during part of the term, did well, both batting and bowling. A slow medium right hand bowler, he has a command over the ball, and bowls a splendid length, a thing, unhappily, very much ignored by the young amateur bowlers of the day. B. W. Fagan 'found' himself towards the end of the season and took eleven wickets for just over ten runs apiece. I. F. L. Elliot, R. M. Aston, and J. L. Andrews, however, were the staple bowlers of the side. Aston is fast: Andrews bowls leg-breaks, occasionally very well too.

E. A. Shaw, who was captain of *Marlborough*, had personally rather a poor year. He kept wicket well and is certainly a class wicket-keeper. He did not have much luck, which counts for far more than many people realize, in his batting, and as a batsman he was disappointing. Shaw is an extremely nice person, but he was, it seemed to me, a trifle stringent with his side, as captain. R. B. Lagden, the brother of R. O. Lagden of Oxford, who has won so many blues, was the best bat of the side. If he has one fault it is a slight air of carelessness when he first goes in. Though of medium height, and not, apparently, very strongly made, he hits the ball as few boys, or men, for that matter, can. He is very quick on his feet, has a wonderful eye, and perfect wrists. One stroke he has which is worthy of even K. S. Ranjitsinjhi, that beautiful off-drive played a little late, which goes through cover and extra-cover point like a flash, and will score four on any ground. His on-side play is also powerful, and owing to his quickness, and correct placing of his feet, his back play is excellent. He should be heard of at Cambridge this year. B. H. G. Shaw is another player of promise: possessing, as he does, a good knowledge of the game, confidence and the ability to rise to an occasion, he should do big things this year.

K. H. C. Woodroffe was one of the finest Public School bowlers of the year. He is really fast, and can make the ball turn from the off on nearly any wicket. His action is a high and easy one, and, being tall, he often makes the ball get up very quickly. Moreover, which is most important, missed catches do not appear to worry him unduly, and he keeps on trying all the time. Unfortunately he did not play in the M.C.C. v. Public Schools match.

I was not lucky enough to see *Charterhouse* last year, but from what several people who played against them say, and especially

from a most interesting letter from Mr. E. D. C. Lake, it is certain that they were a very fine side indeed. To quote "As a side, I think, they were stronger than any I have known in the last ten years, even if they had not got a Hooman, a Branston, or a Buchanan." Knowing the strength of *Charterhouse* of recent years, such a character is one to be really proud of. The side were always as likely as not to make 250 or 300 runs, though they broke down against a strong Free Forester team. In the first innings against Westminster, also, the side, with the exception of G. A. Wright who made a splendid 70 did not do themselves justice. They bowled Westminster out cheaply twice, however, and won very easily by eight wickets, C. G. B. Stevens and G. A. Wright putting on 104 for the first wicket. The match with Wellington was only for one day, but *Charterhouse*, in spite of losing the toss won very easily. By consistent batting, Wellington scored 241. To this *Charterhouse* replied with 286 for five, though missed catches helped them somewhat. J. S. J. Morrison, the captain, was the best bat on the side. Though rather given to crouching, he is a really good player, and scores at a great pace when once set. He averaged 52.53, his highest score being 173. Allowing for the excellence of the wickets—for which Mounsey deserves the highest praise—the performance was a fine one: for weak opposing teams are the exception, and strong ones the rule, at *Charterhouse*. Morrison has gone up to Cambridge, and will be welcome there. H. S. Sanderson is another good bat, and made a lot of runs, especially towards the end of the season; the same may be said of G. A. Wright. The School had two really good bowlers in K. King and L. Gjers. King is a fast medium bowler, with a good command over the ball: he also has gone up to Cambridge. L. Gjers had quite a remarkable season. He is a slow left-hander, who uses a lot of finger-spin: considering that the wickets never helped him one little bit, were as much against him as they could be, in fact, his average of forty wickets for 18.80 stamps him as a really dangerous bowler on anything like a bad wicket. C. E. S. Rucker is promising and, upon occasions, really fast. By the way, King did a thing which, if he had known it was going to happen when he was a little boy, would have made him, at a private school, insupportable for pride. He got W. G. Grace out for a nought!

Clifton had a useful side, a better one than their record: won two, lost three, and drawn four, would indicate. As mentioned above, *Clifton* had the best of their match against *Rugby*. The feature of the game was a grand innings of 157 not out by A. K. Hickman, which enabled *Clifton* to declare and leave *Rugby* 300 to get to win. They could only make a draw of it, in *Clifton's* favour. *Clifton* won the toss against *Malvern* and G. C. Southern made a hundred of the

best : F. E. Morgan scored 51, but the tail broke down and the side were out for 259. D. J. Knight, that fine player, and J. Cumming soon put Malvern in a safe position, Knight making 132 and Cumming 71, and the final total was 433. G. C. Southern, G. W. E. Whitehead, and F. E. Morgan all got runs, but the last batsmen failed again, and Malvern were left with only 100 to get to win. A greater opponent, however, Time, stepped in and Malvern were robbed of a certain victory.

Against Cheltenham, Clifton won the toss and were decisively beaten. Cheltenham scored 290 in their first innings and 224 for nine wickets in the second, and then declared. Clifton could only score 185 and 155, and it is hard to account for such small scores. C. Rissik made 70 and 53 and H. R. Hickman 37 and 30 : but why the rest failed so lamentably I cannot say.

F. E. Morgan was the most successful all-round man of the year, with a batting average of 39.6 and a bowling average of 17.8 for fourteen wickets. He stays on for 1912, when he will be, probably, captain, and with any luck should be one of the best all-round players that Clifton has produced for years. A. K. Hickman did some good things, notably, of course, the 157 not out referred to. G. W. E. Whitehead played steadily all through, and was always a bat to rely on. Most of the bowling was left in the hands of C. R. B. Murray and J. M. Wright, both of whom bowled consistently and sometimes effectively. Clifton will have five old choices left for 1912, but appear to be badly in want of bowlers.

Uppingham were a 'young' side, but they ought to have a good season this year, as they have seven old choices left, viz. : J. V. Wilshir, C. M. Morris, A. R. Trubshaw, R. A. T. Miller, R. W. Burns, A. B. Hale, T. G. Mayhew. Their match with Haileybury was an extraordinary one. Uppingham batted first, and R. C. Burn and H. B. Moore did very well, making 76 and 60 not out respectively. The rest of the batting, however, was weak, and they were dismissed for 186. Haileybury replied with 474 for nine wickets, and then declared. B. Pawle took 111 of these, playing grand free cricket. Later K. N. Mackenzie made 143 before running himself out. In the Uppingham second innings R. C. Burn was laid out by the first ball bowled him and after some delay was taken off the field. When the match was apparently won by Haileybury just on time, and the players were leaving the field, Burn came out again and just managed to play out time, though very shaky. It was a plucky effort, but it would hardly have been permissible, I think, in the sterner days of old. In the second school match, Uppingham were easily beaten in an innings by Repton. Repton won the toss, and R. P. Popham

(142) and E. C. Moses (85) put up a big stand for the second wicket. Against Repton's 370, Uppingham could only score 210 and 124. M. K. Young played a good innings of 81, but otherwise there was little in the batting. H. B. Moore had the excellent average of 41.50, but he was the only really reliable bat on the side. C. M. Morris bowled well at the beginning of the season, but fell off afterwards. The fielding was always keen and clean.

Of most of the other schools, I can only rely on the notes so kindly supplied : these, tempered by a few judicious criticisms from sound judges of the game, I give, often practically as written :

Haileybury had, on the whole, a very good season. It is true that they were lucky to make a draw with Wellington, but, barring a failure against a strong team of Butterflies, they did extremely well. A little too much work, however, had to be done by two men, H. G. Vincent and K. N. McKenzie. Vincent was virtually head of the averages, with 39.09, though R. H. Woollatt was actually first with 40 : but he only played six innings, three of them not out. McKenzie came next, averaging 35.50. McKenzie was easily head of the bowling averages, with Vincent second. In the batting line, McKenzie owed his average to his great innings, 143 against Uppingham. As a bowler, however, he was eminently sound. B. Pawle, who was captain, also got a hundred in the Uppingham match ; he started the season badly, but afterwards batted consistently enough. He took wickets also, though at rather expensive figures.

Wellington are handicapped by being, first and foremost, a school that trains principally for the army, and so lose the best of their players when they are quite young. Of course, there are exceptions, such as H. Brougham and G. J. V. Weigall—to couple May and December—among many others. The school had a moderate season, the batting being on the whole disappointing. In C. J. Coker—who has gone to Oxford—and R. C. Crofton, however, they had two really good bowlers. Wellington had one really good win—against Blundell's.

Repton produced another strong side : so strong a side, indeed, that it would have been most interesting to see them play Eton. They beat Uppingham in an innings, and gave Malvern, another strong side, a very good beating. E. C. Moses—who is captain this year—would give me no particulars about himself, for the very reason that he is captain this year. He had an average of 38.83, and was picked for the Public Schools against the M.C.C.—in itself the compliment of a year. After a brilliant start he fell off a little.

The Reptonian deplores his 'bad flourish.' But, Ranjitsinhji was accused of that, and both R. H. Spooner and K. L. Hutchings play in circles : to make a fourth at that table would be an honour to most people. R. F. Popham, a sound and painstaking bat had a good season, as did A. P. Rutherford, Repton's captain : he was, perhaps, the most trustworthy bat on the side. The chief factor of the side's success, however, was undoubtedly F. G. S. Calthorpe. He took fifty-seven wickets in the season—which is a big total for a Public School man—for 12.24 a-piece. E. C. Moses did good work also, and J. A. Higgs-Walker had a great match against Uppingham, but Calthorpe was the back-bone of the bowling. Repton should be a hot side again this year, as they have E. C. Moses, J. Howell, M. Howell, G. F. W. Palmer, and J. N. Richardson staying on.

Mr. J. F. Marsh, who will be well remembered as the man who holds the record score in the Inter-'Varsity Matches, tells on the whole, good things of *Rossall*. The batting, considering the good wickets, was a trifle disappointing. A. S. Edge, who averaged 54 in 1910, made a bad start to his season, but he is without question a good player. A careful bat, rather after the style of R. P. Keigwin, he only needs a little luck at the beginning of the season to give him confidence, and he is bound to make runs. He is at Jesus College, Cambridge. G. B. Davies is another good player, and R. R. H. P. Bolton, a useful one. It was the bowling, however, that enabled them to win their matches against Loretto and Shrewsbury : both matches were won easily. P. Ingleson, a slow left-hand bowler, who was not much helped by the wicket, took twenty-nine wickets for 11.6, a rare performance. A. S. Edge is a good-length bowler, who can do a little both ways : thirty-one wickets for 12.3 was his average. With his batting he should be a trial match, if not a 'Varsity player. G. B. Davies was perhaps the best bowler in the school. He captains the side this year and should really become quite first-class : especially as he is a splendid short slip. It is a pity that Rossall do not play more Inter-School matches. They are a little far north, of course, but such a fine school should find little difficulty in making fixtures.

Malvern, though a strong batting side, were let down on occasions by a lack of bowling. D. J. Knight was easily the best batsman on the side, and he scored 778 runs for 14 innings, which is exceptionally good going. His first innings was 211 against H. K. Foster's eleven, and he made a brilliant 139 against Clifton. His future is assured for, later in the season, he played for Surrey and showed first-class form. I understand he has another year at Malvern, and he should be THE Public School batsman of the year. I have not heard, however, which 'Varsity he is going to, if either. The

brunt of the bowling fell on J. H. Naumann, who has also got another year at school. A slow-medium left-hand bowler, he was naturally handicapped by the hard wickets, so that his fifty odd wickets, for under 20 runs apiece, speak well both for his length and his resource. F. C. G. Naumann, his elder brother, was captain of the side. He can make a new ball swing quite a lot from leg, if the wind helps him : but, like other captains before him, he seemed shy of putting himself on first, and probably bowled too little. The batting all through was dangerous.

Westminster were rather a disappointing side on the whole. The batting was never reliable against anything like really good bowling, though the school made 311 against the *Icognito* and 202 against the M.C.C. The bowling, on the other hand, was good, and F. R. C. Cobbold, R. R. Rawson, and F. C. Cozens all did good performances at times. There are, unfortunately, no notes to hand from Westminster.

Shrewsbury had an unfortunate season. Against Rossall, as mentioned above, their batting failed in the most unaccountable manner. As a bat, D. Boumphrey was the mainstay of the side, and he averaged at the end of the year, 51. He watches the ball well and besides possessing many good strokes, has the invaluable asset of patience. A. E. P. Grant bowled splendidly all through the year, as his analysis, 70 wickets for 15.44 apiece, proves. Both of these players will be at Shrewsbury in 1912, and there will be three other old choices left as well, A. N. Westlake, R. B. Stones, and R. T. Miller, so that they have the makings of a really good eleven. Shrewsbury were unlucky in that their match with Uppingham had to be abandoned owing to illness.

Tonbridge had quite a fair side and won both their school matches against Dulwich and Sherborne. They lost the toss against Dulwich, but dismissed them for a mere 138. C. A. S. Pattisson and D. L. S. Gaskell gave Tonbridge a fine start and the side eventually won by a big margin. Though they lost the toss again against Sherborne, they always had the best of their opponents and won by ten wickets. The feature of the match was a fine innings of 103 played by L. J. M. Peiris. He was, on the whole, the most polished bat on the side ; he has gone up to Cambridge. C. A. S. Pattisson batted consistently through the season and made a really good captain. H. H. Emerson, who is fast, was the back-bone of the bowling, though he is apt to get rather wild at times. With five old choices remaining, they should have a useful side this year.

Bedford Grammar School as usual had a big list, and, though they won three out of their four school matches, were rather disappointing in other matches. They beat St. Paul's handsomely

on the latter's ground by 68 runs, N. S. Maltby practically winning the match with a fine innings of 107 not out. Dulwich beat them by 54 runs, but, after a fine match, the school just beat Ley's School by two wickets. The credit of this win was due to J. R. Banks (70 not out) and R. C. Nailer (48). The pair put on exactly 100 for the eighth wicket, when the match looked as good as lost. Merchant Taylors, set 168 to win, collapsed before A. R. Porter and N. S. Maltby, and were dismissed for 75. N. S. Maltby was easily the best bat on the side, and came out with an average of 43.81.

St. Paul's won against Brighton College—who, though well coached, turned out a disappointing side: beat Dulwich; but lost to Bedford. They call for no special comment.

D. C. Isaac, of the *Merchant Taylors*, is a player to watch. He headed the school batting averages, though his average was only 22.7. As a bowler he came out very well in a hard season, taking 55 wickets for an average of 11.23. Neither of these performances is wonderful, but both are good.

The Scottish Schools Championship matches ended up in a draw between the Academy, Fettes, and Loretto. Cricket is slowly, though only slowly, gaining ground in Scotland. The fact that Kenneth McLeod has got a blue, and has even been considered as a Test Match player, has, no doubt, helped the game. We must think that A. P. Gordon Cumming, who made 103 against Edinburgh Academy, is a good player, for Scotch wickets are as difficult as the home temperament.

Finally, of R. Knight of St. John's School, Leatherhead. He was in the school eleven for five years, a record that has been equalled at other Public Schools, but not very often. He averaged 57.83 batting, and took sixty-nine wickets at an average of 12.03. In the M.C.C. and Public School match he made 120 not out, in quick time, as mentioned above. He is at Cambridge this year, and will be one of the many good Freshmen who will go very near a place in the 'Varsity side, though places will want a deal of getting this year. H. C. James, owing to two huge, and good, innings, beat him for top average, 62 being his mark. The two had to carry the side practically all through the season.

I take the opportunity of thanking most sincerely all those who have sent me notes and criticisms on the various Public School matches; and, especially Mr. A. Podmore, of the *Sportsman*, without whose criticisms and statistics these meagre notes could never have been written.

ETON v. HARROW.

Played at Lord's, Friday, Saturday, July 7, 8.—The Eton and Harrow match was a pleasant surprise. Not for several years had the game been regarded beforehand as so certain to prove one-sided. Eton, only beaten in one of their trial games, came up to Lord's with the reputation of being first-rate at every point, while even Harrow's keenest supporters stated frankly that for once, their school had a very weak team. No doubt there was a great difference between the two elevens, but in actual play the second half of the game falsified all prophecy, Harrow playing up with splendid resolution. Eton won in the end by three wickets, but they went through an amount of anxiety for which they were not in the least prepared. Probably they would have done better if they had not gone into the field so confident of victory. Up to a certain point on the first day, Eton had everything their own way. Batting first on a perfect wicket, Harrow could only make 127, their play, apart from Wilson's steadiness, being so poor as to suggest a single innings' defeat. Eton replied with a total of 270, and but for the bad luck of Wigan and Mulholland having their wickets thrown down would no doubt have made a much bigger score. Wigan played an admirable innings of 79, and Coleman and Campbell made their runs in fine style. Going in for the second time against a balance of 143, Harrow were regarded as a beaten side, but to everyone's surprise they scored a hundred runs in an hour, and when stumps were pulled up at seven o'clock their total stood at 119 for two wickets. Favoured with delightful weather the first day's play attracted more than 15,000 people.

Saturday's cricket was full of excitement. Wilson, who had played exceedingly well overnight, gave away his wicket by an error of judgment after getting two more runs, and despite excellent defence by Falcon, and some capital hitting by Morrison, Harrow's innings ended for 254. This left Eton only 112 to get to win, and on an unimpaired pitch the task seemed a very light one. Eton, however, made a shockingly bad start, losing Holland and Colman for nine runs, and only the coolness and sound judgment of Tufnell, their captain, enabled them to win the game. Harrow deserved all possible credit for making such a fight against opponents far stronger than themselves. A. I. Steel, who took eight wickets for Eton, was the best bowler in the two elevens, and De Jongh bowled uncommonly well for Harrow in the last innings. Eton had five old choices—Tufnell, Holland, Wigan, Steel, and Lister-Kaye, and Harrow three—Turnbull, the captain, Wilson, and Blount.

Eighty-six matches have been played, of which Eton have won thirty-three, Harrow thirty-five, and eighteen have been drawn. This is the generally published record, but Harrow men object very strongly to the game in 1805 being treated as a regular contest between the two schools, contending that it is no more correct to count that than the fixture in 1857, for boys under twenty, which has been rejected. The result of a match in 1800, won by Eton, has recently been discovered and some other matches are known to have been played but no records of them have yet been found.

RUGBY v. MARLBOROUGH.

Played at LORD'S, Wednesday, Thursday, August 2, 3.—Coming up to Lord's with an unbeaten record the Marlborough eleven greatly disappointed their friends and in the end were defeated by 193 runs. Twice during the opening stage Marlborough looked like securing an advantage—first when they had four of their opponents out for 17 runs, and later when they had themselves scored 170 with only three wickets down—but from the moment that B. H. Shaw left everything went against them, and Rugby were 84 runs ahead at the drawing of stumps with nine wickets in hand in their second innings. During the second day Rugby were always winning easily, Elliot and Fagan following up the bowling successes which the former with Aston had gained on the Wednesday. The outstanding feature of the match was the dazzling innings of B. H. Shaw, who, mainly by superb driving, scored 94 out of 166 in an hour and a half. E. A. Shaw, the Marlborough captain, created a record for the College, this being his fifth appearance in the eleven, and his third year as captain.
