

## PUBLIC SCHOOL CRICKET IN 1915.

A good deal of public school cricket was played in 1915, and quite rightly, though, of course, in very different conditions from usual. Some schools played their ordinary school matches, others played no matches against schools, some again had one-day games with schools they had not played before. The great school match of the year, Eton and Harrow, was abandoned, the series thus being broken for the first time since 1858, and other school matches usually played at Lord's were decided on the school grounds. Eton played Winchester a one-day game at Winchester, which does not count in the long series between the schools. In all cases, of course, the foreign matches of the schools were quite different from those of a normal year, but the M.C.C. fortunately were able to send teams, mostly made up of veterans, to play the schools. The school elevens themselves were composed largely of very young, and in some cases inexperienced, cricketers.

Other parts of *Wisden* testify to the services that public school cricketers have done for their country. The list shows how great is the number of famous cricketers and of those of great promise who have given their lives for the Empire. No long article on public school cricket would be fitting this year, and I will do no more than record shortly the doings of the chief schools.

*Eton*, in spite of the fact that several good cricketers who would ordinarily have been there had left to join the Army, had another fine side. No school has for some time had a more wonderful succession of good elevens and good cricketers; not, perhaps, since the great succession of Repton sides about the time of Mr. J. N. Crawford. How strong Eton were this year is really hard to say, for they were never really extended, except on isolated occasions. The sides which played against them were not so strong as usual, except M.C.C. This was the only match that was lost, but it was largely spoiled by rain in the afternoon. Winchester, Capt. E. F. Penn's XI, Authentics, Woolwich, Butterflies were all beaten, and a drawn game was played against the Royal Fusiliers.

The Winchester match was played on Ridding Field after heavy rain, and on a wicket which was difficult all day, and most difficult, as a whole, when Winchester were batting. Eton won the toss, and

scored 98, the highest scores being V. A. Cazalet 11, C. J. Hambro 19, and T. E. Halsey 17. This score proved quite large enough, for Winchester, against some especially good bowling, could only get 24. Hambro and B. R. F. Christy made wonderful use of their chance, and it is seldom that schoolboy bowlers use a wicket so well. Both are medium pace, and both kept a splendid length, bowled very few bad balls indeed, and were really difficult to play. The Winchester bowling, chiefly done by G. D. Huband and J. C. Clay, had been by no means bad. Clay (leg breaks) got most of the wickets, but Huband, medium right, bowled very steadily. But their bowling was not to be compared to that of Eton for whom Hambro got seven wickets for 6 runs—a great performance, and Christy three for 9. In the second innings Eton made 55 for three and declared their innings closed, and Winchester made 60 for two before stumps were drawn. The fielding on both sides was up to quite a high standard. Of course it was not a day on which to judge batting, as a whole. There were bound to be many failures.

I am told that in reality, Eton's batting was strong all through. N. A. Pearson (average 60) and J. B. R. Windham (average 40) both did particularly well, and V. A. Cazalet, who, though not a pretty bat, is a determined player, got many runs at the start of the year.

The bowling was especially good on a fast wicket, but was quite good enough on a slow one, as the Winchester match showed. Hambro, who was captain of the side, was a tower of strength and he is no doubt a fine all-round boy cricketer. He comes of a family of tall and strong men, and though still young he himself is already tall and strong. He had developed wonderfully from the year before, and has the "loins and back" of the real bowler.

Christy, who had given such great promise in 1914, did well, but did not perhaps quite fulfil expectations. N. F. E. Anson, too, was very useful. The fielding as a whole, perhaps, was the weakest feature, not that it was bad by any means, but it was not quite dependable, though the throwing in was good. The match with Woolwich was an interesting one, Eton winning by three wickets. One who knows as much of present Eton cricket as any man, and one who is not by any means an over lenient critic, has told me that he thinks Eton in the ordinary course would have had about as good a side as they have ever had, and few will think that this is too high an estimate.

*Harrow* played six matches, against M.C.C., R.M.C. Sandhurst, R.M.A. Woolwich, Suffolk Regiment, and two teams brought by Captain Penn and Mr. M. C. Kemp. Harrow were beaten by M.C.C., thanks to three fine innings played by P. F. Warner, Relf, and Thompson; by R.M.A. Woolwich, owing to a most unaccountable

batting collapse—the only one of the year, and the rest of the matches were won easily. In G. Marsden Smedley the school had a good and energetic captain, a really fine forcing bat, keen field, and useful bowler. He went in first with D. W. Midwood, a fine defensive player, and in three matches out of six 100 appeared on the board before they were separated. The good start they gave their side was generally followed up well by J. C. Stephen and N. A. Jessopp, both very forceful batsmen. J. M. Ramsey and R. U. D. Renton were capable of making useful scores, and of those who did not get their flannels the most promising, were G. M. Butler, H. G. Patterson, both sons of famous Harrow cricketers of the past—E. M. Butler and W. H. Patterson. In bowling, L. H. U. Gregson was easily the best, and he had more of the hard work thrown on him, as Jessopp, who had shown such promise in 1914 as a left hander (fast medium) lost both his pitch and swing, and was of little use. Gregson may make a really good bowler. Ramsey bowled slow leg-breaks, and two left-handers were useful, Lutyens and Hughes, The fielding of the side was not good, though Midwood at times was useful behind the sticks, and Smedley always alert; the side was very young and lacked experience. For the first time in the history of the school the side was not filled up.

“We played more to fill up the time than anything else,” says my Harrow correspondent. Only one professional, Bannister, was engaged. Mr. E. M. Butler and Mr. C. G. Pope kindly helped Mr. Kemp with the coaching.

Harrow cricket has suffered a grievous loss in the death of two masters, Mr. Charles Eyre and Mr. R. O. Lagden, who have given their lives for the country. Mr. Eyre was captain of Harrow in 1902 and of Cambridge in 1906, and after a short time as a master at Elstree returned to Harrow. He had done a great deal of the coaching in the last few seasons, and it may be said was looked on as the successor of Mr. M. C. Kemp, although all will hope the latter will not give up coaching for many years. Mr. Lagden was a splendid all-round athlete. He played for Marlborough and Oxford at cricket, had been a Rugby international, and was a fine hockey player, and a rackets player of much ability. The loss of two such fine men and good masters will be most severely felt.

Winchester did not have many foreign matches, but they arranged several one-day games with other schools, beside the match with Eton, which has already been spoken of. None of these games, however, are to be counted as school matches in the ordinary sense. Winchester drew with Bradfield, beat Charterhouse at Winchester, and beat Wellington at Wellington, but the home school were without Badoock, their best cricketer. Winchester had, as a whole, quite

a good side, and in the two brothers G. and H. Ashton particularly good batsmen. The latter was probably as good a bat as Winchester has produced for many years past; quick on his feet with very sound defence, and plenty of strokes though he is not strong enough at present to drive really hard. He had an extraordinary run of success, getting 90 against Charterhouse, a century against Wellington, and making runs nearly every time. His brother also played very well, and A. A. Bankier, too, was a very useful batsman. Hickey (72) against Wellington was a valuable hard hitter. The younger Ashton, captain in 1916, came out with a wonderful average, but it must be remembered that the bowling Winchester had to contend against was, of course, not so good as he would have had to play in the ordinary way. The two best bowlers of the side were Huband and Clay. Huband, medium right, was a very steady bowler, who could generally be relied on to keep a length, and Clay bowled leg-breaks of considerable merit. Ormond was a most useful wicket-keep.

*Charterhouse*, instead of the usual two-day match with Westminster, had arranged two one-day fixtures, but both had to be scratched owing to illness. They played Winchester on the understanding that it was not to be reckoned as an inter-school fixture, and Wellington. The match with Winchester was played on a slow wicket on Ridding Field, Winchester. Winchester, who were put in to bat made 221 for six and declared, and Charterhouse then scored 69, Huband getting five wickets for 14. Charterhouse fielded magnificently in this game

*Wellington* were beaten by Charterhouse after a close match at Godalming. Charterhouse scored 148 and Wellington 133. For Charterhouse R. S. Rucker played steadily and well for 73, and G. Cawston got six wickets for 58. F. T. Badoock with five wickets for 23 and 27 runs did a fine double performance for Wellington, for whom D. A. R. Young was top scorer with 47.

A letter from *Charterhouse* tells me that the averages mean little or nothing, and that it is impossible to say anything of the side as a whole, as with so few matches the team naturally never got together, and was never really tested.

*Westminster* had a fairly good side considering that they were very young. Four or five of them will be staying on until next year. Two matches were played against Radley, and that on the Radley ground was Westminster's best performance, for after Radley had scored 307, Westminster got the runs with two wickets to spare. Radley won the return game. The Charterhouse match, as has been said, was not played. Against Tonbridge, who had a good eleven and a rather exceptional bat in R. Sherwell, Westminster

did well up to a point. Westminster batting first made 182 and then got five of the Tonbridge side out for 106, but Hedges played a fine innings for Tonbridge, and Goodman, who joined him, helped him to knock off the runs, Hedges making 89.

F. R. Oliver was the only old colour left. He is a member of a well-known Westminster cricketing family, his father, three uncles, two great uncles, and his grandfather having all played in the XI before him—a wonderful record. He was a keen and energetic captain, who changed his bowling with discrimination, and always got the best out of his side. A medium-paced bowler who concealed his slow ball with great effect, he was always the mainstay of the attack, bowling especially well at the beginning of the Tonbridge match, when he disposed of their three best batsmen at a small cost. He failed in matches to justify the hopes held out of his batting in the year before. He would probably make more runs if he went in first, and should bear in mind that although a Hobbs may step in front of his wicket and play the ball to the boundary, it is not given to the ordinary mortal to do likewise, and that nine times out of ten the umpire's hand is uplifted. P. W. Gardiner was a useful bat and M. A. Robinson batted steadily all through the year, and was very consistent, though he got no score over 50. R. C. May was a most promising wicket-keeper, and C. R. Julian a really good cover-point. The Westminster side had the advantage of some coaching from that most artistic and beautiful of modern batsmen, Hobbs.

Undoubtedly *Marlborough* had stronger opposition than most schools last summer. They won their match against Cheltenham, lost to Rugby, and lost three out of four other games, but two or three of the sides were very strong. They had to play that fine bowler, S. J. Pegler, twice, and batted very well against him the second time, I am told. On the whole they were by no means a weak side, and quite useful by the end of the term. J. R. Baines, the captain, and R. C. Ashfield, who has beautiful strokes all round the wicket, are both really good boy batsmen. E. K. M. Paul and H. G. B. Jordan were both useful, though the former's defence is not all it should be.

In attack, which was not strong. A. F. Alington, a right-hand in-swinger, was the most difficult, though he wants to be steadier, while J. C. Philpott has the makings of a fast bowler. H. B. Watson, leg-breaks, was prevented by illness from playing in several matches.

The Rugby match was played at Rugby on the last two days of the Rugby term. Marlborough batted first on a heavy wicket, after having had a succession of fast ones at home, and against

the good bowling of Standring, fastish swinging away outside the off stump and Ashwell leg-breaks, they failed rather badly, and were all out for 61. Rugby had eight men out for 141, but a plucky, if lucky stand, by Ashwell and Sawyer added 60 runs and this stand, of course, made all the difference. Ashfield, Barnes, Jordan, and Paul all batted well in the second Marlborough innings, but Marlborough could only score 144, and Rugby won by nine wickets. The Rugby fielding was well placed, and very good indeed, and so the bowlers received every support. Probably in batting there was little between the two sides on good wickets.

Marlborough had a good win by nine wickets against Cheltenham at Cheltenham. They made a long first innings score of 376, the two best batsmen of the side, R. C. Ashfield (78) and J. R. Barnes (114) both coming off, and they got Cheltenham out for 149 and 269, although they lost Watson, their slow bowler, owing to illness on the second day.

In other games Marlborough drew with the 15th Division, lost to Major Sarel's XI, which included some good cricketers, after an exciting match, 313 to 331; lost to Mr. Lewis's XV, and lost to two strong sides got together by Mr. T. C. G. Sandford, including S. J. Pegler, and by Mr. A. J. L. Hill, including Lord Hawke, E. R. Wilson, H. C. McDonell, A. M. Miller, etc.

*Clifton* lost to Rugby and Cheltenham and drew with Tonbridge. The Rugby match was a remarkable one. Clifton batting first made 399 and got Rugby out for 154. The latter followed on 219 behind. A great innings by C. G. Boddington, who got 249 out of 418, followed. Boddington was batting for about three and a half hours; he gave no chance until he had scored over 200, and made forty 4's. It was a record innings for the school. Clifton was left with 174 to get to win and plenty of time to do it. After two wickets had fallen cheaply, A. A. Leslie, the captain, and Hussey took the score to 80. Then Haslip, who bowls fast, went on again and got the next four wickets while only 15 runs were added. Leslie made a great effort but there was no one to stay with him, and the innings closed for 121, leaving Rugby winners by 54.

Clifton v. Cheltenham was a small scoring match. Clifton led on the first innings 121—151. On going in again Cheltenham made 156, and so Clifton on an improving wicket had only 128 to get. Four wickets were down for 26. T. C. M. Taberer and S. G. Bassett then pulled the game round and took the score into the 80's, but the last failed, the last five wickets falling for 19, and Clifton lost by 28. In this match F. W. Mathias's leg-breaks were most valuable for Clifton; in the two innings he took nine for 95. The Tonbridge match ended in a draw; Clifton 262 and 154 for eight declared Tonbridge 191 and 133 for five.

Clifton were, perhaps, as a whole, rather a disappointing side. Leslie, the captain, Taberer and Bassett were all very good school-boy batsmen, the first the best of the three on a critical occasion. He is, too, a really good wicket-keeper. The bowling was not strong. Bassett occasionally bowled a good "googlie." Bennett was the most difficult. He bowls left hand with a good swing when the ball is new. He got twenty-two wickets for 19 runs apiece, and Mathias got sixteen for 16. Leslie headed the batting averages with a good record, nine innings for 390 runs and an average of 33 odd. Bassett averaged 42 and Taberer 23.

*Cheltenham's* record is three matches won and two lost. In the Clifton match O. L. Roberts played a most valuable innings of 62, which did much towards winning the match, and S. Bolton in the two innings got ten wickets. The school put up a useful performance against M.C.C., although they were beaten, Thompson, of Northampton getting all ten wickets in this match.

Considering Cheltenham started the year without a single old colour, they did very well. There was a lack of good bowling, and a want of variety, but keen and good fielding in which the captain, J. W. F. Agabeg, set the side a splendid example and made up for a great deal. N. I. Bryce Smith will be captain this year, and J. A. S. Jackson, P. B. Sawyer, G. O. Shelmerdine, and O. L. Roberts will probably still be at school.

*Haileybury* played eight matches, of which three were drawn and five lost. They drew with Wellington, M.C.C., and Mr. P. H. Latham's XI, and lost to the Masters, Tonbridge, Gloucester Regiment, Herts. Club and Ground, and Mr. Hickley's team. The last-named side was composed chiefly of boys in the Winchester Eleven. The Tonbridge match was a close fight with the last innings, when Haileybury had to bat on a nasty wicket. Tonbridge batted first on a slow easy wicket, and got 188, R. Sherwell playing a fine innings of 56. At the end of the first day's play, Haileybury had scored 87 for five, G. C. Thorne 42, and A. J. Barson having both played well. Next day the innings was finished, leaving Tonbridge with a lead of 3. The wicket was now becoming more difficult, but Tonbridge managed to score 174. There on a wicket which helped the bowlers, and on which R. D. Lovelace and G. D. Hale made the most of their chance, Haileybury were got out for 45, leaving Tonbridge winners by 132.

The Wellington match at Wellington was prolific of scoring and never looked like being finished. Haileybury batted first and made 332, of which Hughes-Hallett on his first appearance for the school made an extremely creditable 95. For Wellington, F. T. Badcock got a really fine 144 out of 260, receiving little help from anyone but W. Mure, who came in seventh wicket down. Once Wellington

had saved the follow-on nearly all chance of a finish disappeared. Haileybury in the second innings made 152 for three and declared, and Wellington made 86 for two.

In batting Hughes-Hallett headed the averages, getting 172 runs in five innings with an average of 43. Thorne averaged 27 for seven innings and G. M. Baker 24 for nine. J. S. Wright got fifteen wickets for 23.33, and Saillard fifteen for 24.73. Of the batsmen G. C. Thorne was very good, with strokes all round the wicket, and he watched the ball carefully and well. Hughes-Hallett is a fine strong player, though rather uncertain. G. M. Baker captained the side well, but his batting too was a little uncertain. The most promising next to Thorne was Barson, while Dibdin was solid and most difficult to get out or to tempt, though a slow scorer. The fielding was up to a high standard, but the bowling was not strong. Saillard bowled fast right, Thorne leg breaks, Wright slow left, and Miles medium right.

There were five old colours left at *Uppingham*, and at full strength they were a fairly strong side, but towards the end the eleven lacked the services of F. A. Waldock and E. H. Tattersall. The first of these was a sound player, with plenty of strokes all round the wicket, a bowler with an in-swerve, who was always likely to get wickets, and a good field. Tattersall is spoken of as one of the best wicket-keepers the school has had for many years. C. Whitehead proved himself a good and capable captain. He is a plucky bat and when he has got going scores fast. He averaged 54 for nine innings, Waldock 52 for six, and Craigmile 39 for seven. H. J. McKenzie has good style and might well become a good player. J. L. Horridge, twenty-seven wickets for 16.11, and K. P. Bell, twenty-two for 16, bore the brunt of the bowling. Bell bowled consistently well, and had much improved since 1914. Eight games were played, of which five were won and three lost. The Shrewsbury match, in which Waldock and Tattersall were not playing, was lost by ten wickets. Uppingham got 139, and a fine first-wicket partnership by C. Bournemouth (82) and W. Shaw (49) ensured Shrewsbury of a good lead. They were got rid of for 207, but Uppingham could only get 69 in their second innings, and were beaten by ten wickets.

"So far as cricket was concerned it was a barren year with us," I am told of *Malvern*. Only two matches were played. The first was against M.C.C., brought down by Mr. H. K. Foster, and a fine side including beside Mr. Foster himself, A. P. Day, Pearson, Fielder, and Clarke, of Middlesex. It proved a close and exciting match. Malvern batted first and scored 273, the chief scorers being C. C. Naumann 53, S. L. Bibby 7, and K. S. Hamadsinhji, one of the Jam Sahib's nephews, 54. Good bowling by Capes was mainly responsible for getting M.C.C. out for only 8 more runs than the Malvern total,

and the school going in again got 217, A. L. Gwynne-Jones 46—a sound innings—Naumann 23, G. H. N. Todd 55, and Hamadsinhji 31. M.C.C. wanted 210 to win. Capes and Todd bowled most pluckily, and the runs were only got after eight wickets had fallen.

The Repton match at Repton was started on a slow wicket, which was quite easy at first, and the Malvern side scored 185: Gwynne-Jones 43, Todd 18, Hamadsinhji 35, and Capes 37. Repton had ten minutes batting that evening, sending in their two usual tail batsmen. No wicket fell. The wicket had dried but little next day, and did not become much more difficult. Four wickets fell to four really good catches, and at lunch Repton with one wicket in hand wanted four to save the follow. They just failed to get these and went in again 101 behind. Repton got 151 second time, and Malvern were left with 51 to get and plenty of time to get them. They lost three wickets for 15, but then Bibby and Naumann hit off the runs. There was little doubt that the best side won, but if Repton had saved the follow they would probably have saved the game.

If the XI had had more matches and experience they would probably have turned out a really good side. The bowling might have proved weakish against good sides on Malvern wickets, but Capes is a bowler of real skill and promise. Macrean is fast—somewhat erratic—left-hand, Freeman a very fair leg-break bowler, and Todd medium right. But any weakness in bowling would be, to a large extent, relieved by the stumping. Hamadsinhji and Moritz were both first-class boy wicket-keepers. The former seems to have an extraordinary quickness of eye and hand. There were two very promising bats in the side, Bibby and Naumann, the latter a brother of the Oxford and Cambridge Blues, and there were four or five other very useful run-getters. Altogether the disappointment was that the boys didn't get more matches. No doubt they would have trained on with the experience to be a side above the average. Six of this year's Eleven will probably be at Malvern next summer, and there are some good young players, so the prospects are promising.

Repton played eight matches, of which three, v. Salt's Brewery, Dr. Shipton's XI, and Mr. Powell's XI were won, the last after a close finish, 224 runs to 218, the others both very easily. Mr. S. H. Evershed's XI and M.C.C. beat Repton, and they also lost both school matches, Uppingham and Malvern. The game v. Notts Amateurs was drawn. The side was not a strong one. Only one old choice, G. F. Bell, was left. Unfortunately he was a nervous player and did not do himself justice. Of the previous year's second XI only three youngsters remained, so that there was practically no material from which to build up a side. Everybody of seventeen and a half had left to join the Army, and some who were younger. It is the

first time that Repton has lost both School matches since 1900. The eleven had had so little experience that it was not surprising to see them collapse in each match, but they were capable of rather better things. The only really good player on the side was Morris. He comes back as captain, and should be very good next year. He averaged 34 for nine innings. Of the others, Kenrick and Holdsworth will be at Repton next year. Kenrick bowls the googly, but he is not fast enough through the air at present to be effective against good batsmen. The fielding was quite good as a whole, but the side had a bad lapse in the Uppingham match, and missed a number of catches at the beginning of the game.

Of *Wellington* and *Rugby* I have not been able to glean much information. Rugby did well in matches and must have been a strongish side. F. T. Badcock, of Wellington, who got lots of runs, was a really good schoolboy bat, and I have been told that he is the most promising batsman the school has had since G. J. Mordaunt.

*Tonbridge* too had quite a good eleven, and R. Sherwell (left-hand) was one of the leading boy batsmen of the year, and they had another very useful cricketer in C. K. Tester.

As a whole it may be said that, considering the average age of the school sides was much less than in an ordinary season, it was by no means a bad year. There were certainly many young cricketers of ability and promise. Of those schools of which I have written one might in batting specially mention Windham and Pearson (Eton), the two Ashtons (Winchester), Badcock (Wellington), Sherwell (Tonbridge), Barnes and Ashfield (Marlborough), and Boddington (Rugby). Boddington's great innings must be put down as one of the features of the year's cricket. As an all-round cricketer Hambro (Eton) was probably as good as anyone.

Among the other schools whose sides I have not had space to mention in detail, there were also a number of fine players. Denton and Askham of Wellingborough stand out very prominently. Askham is probably an exceptional boy cricketer—he met with astonishing success as a bowler and is a fine batsman too. Fawcus of Bradfield is another who was a tower of strength to his side.

## DULWICH COLLEGE v. BRIGHTON COLLEGE.
