



THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN 1965

Because the ground had to house two Test matches instead of one, less Public Schools cricket was played at Lord's in 1965 than usual. Individual schools had their matches curtailed, but two representative games of two days each were still arranged. There was a change here which actually gave the boys more representative cricket. The Southern Schools v. The Rest match was played at Roehampton, and its place on the fixture list of Lord's was taken by a match between the Public Schools and the English Schools Cricket Association, after which a Schools team played Combined Services.

The introduction of the English Schools Association was welcome indeed, though in this first year at Lord's their side was not quite strong enough for the full strength of the Public Schools. Here perhaps I might repeat an earlier suggestion, giving us more representative schools cricket at Lord's. If the inter-school matches continue to be curtailed as in 1965, an extra representative fixture could be inserted into the programme. There is no reason why it should not be played even in those years when Lord's has two Tests. Most people, I feel sure, would prefer the playing days allotted to the Services to be cut rather than those belonging to the boys. Given two more days for representative play, I suggest dividing the country into three areas to produce three teams from the Public Schools. Add the English Schools Association, and it would be possible to play two trial matches, after which the representative side for the final match could be chosen.

Whatever part they are to play in future, the introduction of the English Schools was a move for which M.C.C. deserve congratulations. Another innovation in 1965, a tour of Southern Africa by a representative schools side, is rather more controversial. In theory such ventures should do only good. Yet, I am not entirely in favour, because in this lazy modern age it seems that the more that is done for youngsters the less they try to do for themselves. In the last analysis all the coaching, prompting and helping will not bring a young player to the top without him working very, very hard at his game. However, in expressing these doubts, I do not wish to crab the splendid efforts of those responsible for inaugurating such a tour particularly M. J. Ricketts. We may hope that they fired their young cricketers with their own fine enthusiasm. Also arranged for the winter was a tour of India and Ceylon by the London Schools Cricket Association.

Those intimately concerned with Schools cricket agreed that 1965 was not a vintage year, particularly for batsmen. That was

not surprising in such a wretched summer. We have had wetter summers, but, taking into account the rain, the cold and the winds, I regard 1965 as the worst season for cricket in my experience. Inevitably the young and immature suffer more from adverse conditions than their seniors. A vintage year it may not have been, but turning from much false, dreary and often meaningless county cricket, I found the play of the boys decidedly encouraging. For the moment, at least, cricket masters and coaches are managing to keep most of the worst aspects of the modern county game out of the schools.

To me the bowling of the boys gathered at Lord's was particularly pleasing. In these days, when seam bowling dominates first-class cricket, good actions are rare. So-called bowler after so-called bowler lolllops up to the wicket open-chested and puts the ball rather than bowls it. Of all the young pace bowlers I saw on county grounds only Herman of Middlesex had the action of a true bowler. At Lord's finally it was a pleasure to see boys with genuine actions. One or two were not so good, but the general impression was of real bowlers, sideways on and making full use of the body in support of the arm swing. And life off the pitch comes essentially from body movement.

The most impressive bowler was D. L. Acfield, an off-spinner from Brentwood, whose elder brother had previously played in these representative games as a medium pacer. At Brentwood, Acfield had taken 61 wickets at little more than 10 runs each, a feat which helped the school to become one of the most successful teams of the year. He had a fine, lively action and a sense of flight and variation. It is many years—since indeed the days when Marlar was at Harrow—that an orthodox spin bowler from the schools has impressed me so much. The off-spinner on the English Schools side was M. J. Ikin, an all-rounder from Staffordshire who, like his famous Test playing father, bowled right handed and batted left. He also had a sound bowling action, though as yet lacking the necessary snap at the moment of delivery. Left-handers, P. W. Watts of Bradfield and D. R. Aers of Tonbridge, similarly based their bowling on good side-on actions. Watts looked the better at Lord's, where Aers sacrificed flight for pace.

The pick of the quicker bowlers was A. M. Jorden (Monmouth). Here was a big, fast bowler with a strong, impressive action. Against Combined Services he took four for 11 in the second innings, and as Acfield took seven wickets in the match the two best looking boy bowlers took the honours. The other opening bowler for the Public Schools was G. D. B. Lane of Epsom. I fancy we did not see him at his best. His method indicated that he was a good bowler, and he was no less swift than Jorden, but on this

occasion his control of direction deserted him. On the English Schools side A. Suffling of London was the boy expected to shine. He was quickish left arm, his action good, but, though he looked an excellent prospect, he did not achieve enough to win selection for the representative game. The other opening position went to J. Denman of Sussex whose run to the wicket was obviously modelled on the Sussex opening bowler, Thomson. He was a medium pacer whose otherwise good method suffered from a faulty position at the wicket, where he landed with his left foot pointing in the direction of third man.

Curiously the batsman who impressed me particularly in the trial game, Aers, was not selected against Combined Services, though he was subsequently included in the touring team for Africa. His innings of 22 against the English Schools was accomplished schoolboy batting, and his dismissal was unfortunate, for he played a fine stroke but in doing so knocked his wicket. His Tonbridge record, 914 runs with an average above 70, clearly indicated his standing as a high-class school batsman.

There were several other encouraging batsmen, among whom the most workmanlike was C. A. Richardson of Stamford, the school which gave M. J. K. Smith to cricket. Richardson looked an eminently sound little player with scoring power to leg and an unusually strong off-drive. On paper he was the most successful batsmen in the representative games. He followed scores of 18 and 88 not out in the Roehampton trial with 64 against the English Schools and 16 and 103 not out against Combined Services. N. J. Cosh (Dulwich) looked no less impressive while scoring 67 against the English Schools, and D. R. Walsh (Marlborough), who then made 52 not out, was another powerful driver to the off, a batsman of eminently sound method. On the opposite side only Ikin, who made 64 not out, achieved much. After a quiet start he revealed himself as an expert hooker and gave every indication that he is bent on emulating his father. The art of hooking is seldom practised in the county game today, though, goodness knows, much of the medium paced seam stuff deserves to be hooked.

Of these boy batsmen only Richardson came off against the Services, and J. M. M. Hooper of Charterhouse, did much less throughout the representative period than a player of his quality could expect. It was left to Watts, the captain, to give Richardson the batting support which enabled Acfield and Jorden to bowl the Schools to an admirable victory. Watts had shown himself to be a neat, correct stroke maker while batting briefly before the declaration against the English Schools. Against the Services he rose to full stature, hitting 75 not out and sharing an unbroken

stand of 179 with Richardson, after the first five wickets had gone for 67, and when the Schools were apparently slumping to defeat.

The Schools had a good, workmanlike wicket-keeper in C. E. P. Carter of Radley. He was, however, among those who looked as though they were avoiding the barber in the hope of qualifying for the award of the M.B.E. Long hair may be fashionable for those who strum a guitar but is to be deprecated on the cricket field. Hair which screens the eyes is an impediment to efficiency.

The teams in the representative games contained several all-rounders, and the schools generally were no less well equipped with such players than usual. Again I would urge young all-rounders not to be too ready to sacrifice one of their weapons in the cause of specialisation when they advance into senior cricket. Several boys in 1965 headed both batting and bowling averages for their school. J. E. Hall, aged only 15, actually scored most runs and took most wickets for Ardingly. At Bloxham, A. T. Tame, the captain, headed both lists and brought his school record for four years in the first team to 1,500 runs and 172 wickets. A double of more than 500 runs and more than 50 wickets was achieved by A. B. Palfreeman of Nottingham High School. The most remarkable all-round performance of the summer was perhaps that of P. E. Rodger, who led the unbeaten George Heriot's side. In an unusually wet Scottish summer his 35 wickets at under five runs each were remarkable enough. Still more so in support of this feat was his batting average of 44.6 from 357 runs. George Heriot's won 10 matches and drew the other four. Fettes with seven wins against one defeat were another successful Scottish school. Strathallan, beaten only by Fettes, fared excellently against other schools.

If the bowling at Lord's was such as to give pleasure to those who enjoy the purity of style, the continued progress of googly type bowling in 1965 was no less pleasing. P. J. Catterall, a leg-spinner, set up a record for King's, Canterbury, by taking 66 wickets with an average of 10.47. King's accordingly enjoyed an exceptionally successful season, during which they won 12 times. Shrewsbury had a 14-year-old bowler of left-arm googlies and chinamen who took 34 wickets at 20.2 each, and another successful leg spinner was P. A. Gilchrist with 40 wickets at 8.1 runs each for Worcester Royal Grammar School. His alliance with K. Griffith, an off-spinner whose 43 wickets cost only 10.3, enabled Worcester to set eight wins against three losses.

It is always difficult to suggest the team of the season. This is something about which I am rarely willing to be emphatic, certainly not this year. Considering the conditions the records of the individual schools makes surprisingly good reading. In addition

to those already mentioned several enjoyed better seasons than for several years past. Among them were Marlborough, for whom Walsh made over 600 runs. They won seven and lost three against the strong opposition they habitually meet. Cranleigh had their best season since 1950, and their summer was made particularly notable by two hat-tricks. These were done by K. R. Sunderland, who took four wickets in four balls against Brighton, and P. R. Maylam against Common Room.

Bradfield, like Marlborough and Brentwood, were unbeaten in school matches, and were again among the best sides. Watts headed both batting and bowling averages. Their batting was so sound and lengthy that no other school managed to take all their 10 wickets. Tonbridge, led by Aers who added 41 wickets to his 914 runs, won seven and lost only once, and Stowe had 10 wins out of 12 matches and also lost only once, to Bradfield. In the North, St. Peter's, York, lost early in the season to Worksop, but subsequently were highly successful against school opponents. Not since N. W. D. Yardley was at St. Peter's in the Thirties has any batsman scored so heavily for the School as the 1965 captain, P. F. Nettleton, who made 775 with an average of 51.66. W. R. Pickersgill contributed to the side's many excellent performances by taking 56 wickets at 11.28, including all ten for 13 against Giggleswick. Bradford Grammar School, armed with strong bowling, were unbeaten, as were King's, Macclesfield. J. R. A. Cragg averaged 57, with 629 runs, and King's won 10 of their 17 matches. Other batsmen who helped their school to a good record, one defeat only, were the Dulwich openers, Cosh who made 503, average 45.7, and R. D. V. Knight, whose total was 502 and average 38.6. Another school with only one defeat was Pocklington. Trinity School, Croydon, beat 10 other schools.

Winchester had reason to be pleased at the end of a season during which they beat Eton. R. L. Burchnall made 691 runs and his average of 53.15 was almost double that of the second batsman. More evidence that spin bowling was coming back into its own in schools cricket, unlike the county game, was the presence of R. J. Priestley and O. J. C. Oakes standing out on their own among the Winchester bowlers. Eton began well by winning four of their first five matches and then slumped. Harrow had an undistinguished season, and though Charterhouse had ample batsmen, headed by Hooper, they lacked the bowling to bring them much success.

Some unfortunate school sides failed to win a match, but the obvious failures were outnumbered by those schools who finished the summer term more than content. If it was not a vintage year for star players—and I do not think it was particularly disappointing in that respect—it was an excellent one for school teams generally

despite the adverse circumstances. And so many individuals had impressive records that my suggestion that four representative sides should be brought to Lord's to play a couple of trial games is strengthened. More than 22 are worthy of such notice. At Lord's this year we saw one son of a famous cricketing father do well. Another who came to the front was C. J. Tompkin, son of the late Leicestershire batsman. Tompkin, a hard and uninhibited hitter like his father, made 533 runs for Trent, who won nine of their 22 matches and drew six others.

In their report to the Editor of *Wisden*, King's, Canterbury, took pride in having averaged 20.67 overs—122 balls—per hour throughout the season. Do they really think such a tempo good, or even satisfactory? England averaged only 106 balls an hour during their six Tests. Set against that wretched figure 122 may seem excellent, but, if I had the job of cricket master, I would not do any boasting until my school side averaged something in the region of 25 overs, 150 balls an hour. Keen young players, eager to extract the maximum of enjoyment from each day's cricket, should be able to move quickly enough to approach that average. Before the war we used to expect 22 overs an hour from all first-class sides, youthful and elderly alike. Young teams, such as the Universities, habitually maintained higher averages.

Lest it may be thought that I am writing at random, I will first instance Oxford of 1931, my last year in the side. On the first day at Lord's against Cambridge we bowled 148.2 overs in just under six hours. In fact we averaged nearly 25 overs an hour, and, though Cambridge totalled 386 that day, we still had time in which to win the match. In one earlier match during the season that Oxford attack had averaged over 25 overs an hour throughout a lengthy innings. County and Test cricket of that period was played at much the same tempo. England, for instance, averaged 23 overs an hour at Lord's in 1930 during an Australian innings of more than 700 runs.

A brisk tempo in those days allowed a satisfactory proportion of matches to be brought to definite results. Today in the same time counties, bowling too few overs per hour, have recourse to fiddles to obtain false results. Annually I read several school cricket reports mentioning drawn matches which would have been won, if they had continued for a few more minutes. Those matches would have been won, if the over rate had been better. Games masters and coaches might give that matter some thought before embarking on the 1966 adventure.
