

THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN 1966

The summer of 1966 brought partial eclipse to the major schools. Many of the best players came from the smaller and less publicised schools. The sign of the season was the drubbing given at Lord's to the Public Schools by the English Schools Cricket Association. This was only the second year in which the E.S.C.A. had taken part in the schools fortnight at Lord's. That the contribution they can make to it is large was thus quickly made evident. Two of their leading players were also qualified to play for the other side, J. R. A. Cragg of King's, Macclesfield, and K. Griffith of Worcester Royal Grammar School, but that does not detract from the merit of their performance on this occasion. Five others of the E.S.C.A. side won places in the representative Schools XI against Combined Services, and only four of the Public Schools side. Never before have the larger cricketing schools been left out in the cold to such an extent. Increasingly of late years they have been challenged by players from schools less well known. Now in 1966 H. B. Hollington (Haileybury) was the only player from those schools who annually play at Lord's to be chosen for the final representative team. Winchester, Charterhouse and Bradfield were others without representation.

It is impossible to say with any degree of certainty whether the change has been brought about by a decline in the playing standards of the old established cricketing schools, or a marked improvement in the newer cricketing nurseries. A combination of both is the probable answer. In theory the larger schools, with their greater coaching facilities, should produce the leading boy players. So much coaching to-day is, however, so stereotyped as to stifle natural talent that tends away from the orthodox that those offering fewer opportunities for coaching may actually be at an advantage. It may be, of course, that the approach to the playing of cricket is more virile and uninhibited in the latter schools. That thought is prompted by the report of one cricket master on his team's performance during the summer.

"A first XI cricketer should be naturally very fit," he wrote, "but there is a lethargic and slow footed air about our cricket and, indeed, the cricket of other first XIs. One wonders whether schoolboys go to bed too late nowadays or eat too much of the wrong type of food; or is it simply unfashionable to try as hard as is physically and mentally possible?"

Happily signs of bad sleeping and eating habits and of a wrong attitude to the game were not evident at Lord's, when the E.S.C.A. and the Public Schools met. The tempo of the play and

the brand of cricket were highly satisfying, a relief from the boredom of so many of the season's county matches. A year earlier the E.S.C.A. pioneers in novel circumstances did not do themselves justice, with the exception of M. J. Ikin (Staffordshire), the son of a Test-playing father. This time they gave of their best, and the batting of Cragg and Griffith was a delight. Together they put on 170 in two hours, and to their credit the Public School bowlers sent down 45 overs in that time. Cragg, a grandson of Lancashire's President, was the more polished. He looked the best batsman in the match, neatly correct, with sure footwork to take him down the pitch to challenge slow bowlers, and his driving in the region of extra cover was admirable. As in 1965 he carried the batting in his school side with 495 runs and an average of 45. Griffith, who was only 16 at the time, was magnificently vigorous, a tough, resolute batsman with a pleasing upright stance. His defence was sound, and he not only walloped the loose ball with fine crisp strokes but unerringly found the gaps in the field. His century was an exhilarating affair containing a 6 and fifteen 4's. Griffith placed his scoring strokes so well between the fielders that he should have made the bowlers, particularly the spinners, wonder if the modern split field can be any sort of answer to a resolutely aggressive opponent.

The E.S.C.A. were also responsible for most of the good bowling. Here again Griffith was prominent. Indeed, he impressed me as the most complete bowler on the two sides. He bowled off breaks from a good lively action, which suggested pace off the pitch, and he imparted emphatic spin to the ball. The Public Schools had no slow bowling comparable to that of this side. Ikin, a thoroughly good all-round cricketer, was another off-spinner, who, however, tended to bowl with a trajectory too flat to worry anyone in the air, and P. Johnson from Nottingham High School was a decidedly good leg spinner despite an awkward action. Johnson, who has amassed the remarkable total of 244 wickets for the High School, and Griffith were responsible for the last six Public School wickets falling for 29. Earlier the in-swing of J. Walker (Cheshire) had started the innings on the wrong note by toppling the first three batsmen in quick succession.

Yet the pace bowling of the boys was less impressive than the spin. Of the five on show only C. J. R. Black of *Stowe* had a sideways-on action. The others were in varying degrees open-chested bowlers, effective enough on pitches such as green-tops where the turf does the work. In such conditions the pace bowler merely has to put the ball somewhere on a length and allow the ball's seam to do the rest. On true pitches the bowler has to do the work and one of his most important weapons is nip off the turf. But the open-chester, swinging the arm without the accompanying swing of the body, which accounts for pace off the pitch, is without that weapon.

Black accordingly was the most pleasing of the five. He had the groundwork of a good bowler. Already he was fast, and two corrections to his method might bring him into the express class. As yet his long run was virtually the same pace from start to finish, and at the wicket he reached a delivery position with his backside thrust out. He could with advantage study Trueman to note how that classic bowler brings his run to a climax and arches his back at the moment of delivery.

Walker was quite a lively in-swinger, and a resilient cricketer willing to take the rough with the smooth. His start at Lord's could hardly have been more depressing. In his first over he was smitten for a six and a four. In his second he bowled three no-balls and yet came back to take wickets with each of the last two balls of the over. His opening partner was J. Denman of Sussex, who was in his second year as a representative boy cricketer at Lord's. He was again an eminently steady medium pacer. Black's opening partner for the Public Schools was N. P. Bond (Blundell's). He achieved little on the day but nevertheless looked a good schoolboy bowler. The Public Schools attack, however, was generally weak, composed of all-round cricketers, several of whom put more emphasis on their batting than their bowling. J. H. M. Grimsdick was the only class spinner on the side, a neat left-hander, but he was clearly tiring after a season of solid work with both bat and ball for Merchant Taylors'. What success the school side gained they owed almost entirely to him. Only one other batsman and one other bowler gave him much support while he was taking 52 wickets at 11.2 each and scoring 546 runs with an average of nearly 50. The other Public School slow bowlers at Lord's were a rough lot with horrible actions and low deliveries.

The batting of the Public Schools was disappointing. Although number 11, Bond, had scored 554 and averaged 46 for Blundell's, which suggested powerful batting from top to bottom, they fell easy prey to Walker and the E.S.C.A. spinners. Only Hollington, D. R. Owen-Thomas (K.C.S., Wimbledon) and R. D. V. Knight (Dulwich) achieved anything of note. Hollington, a left-hander strong on the front foot, drove vigorously at the start, and again in the second innings, and Owen-Thomas and Knight shared a stand of 44. Owen-Thomas revealed his skill at cutting and off driving, and Knight, another left-hander, was an obviously well equipped batsman. Unfortunately, the paper strength of the batting was such that Black batted number nine, where he had barely time to refresh us by his emphatic treatment of half volleys. He also batted low against Combined Services, when he rattled up a couple of twenties.

Whatever the reputations of the other batsmen, I feel that the cause of cricket would have benefited, if Black had been given a higher position. The aggressive stroke-making batsman is scurvily

treated in the modern game, where the grafter is usually more popular with skippers than the go-getter; where, in fact, the match-saver is, alas, more highly regarded than the potential match-winner. Black was undoubtedly a match-winner for Stowe, who defeated four other schools, his bowling too fast for most schoolbovs and his striking too vigorous for most opposing bowlers. He hit 124 in eighty-five minutes against Oxford University Authentics, 99 in sixty-six minutes against The Leys and other speedy fifties. Such batsmen should be encouraged to continue batting in that vein. To give them tail-end positions is apt to give them the idea that they must become more defensive in order to attain higher rating. And what a misfortune that would be. The same applied to A. L. O. Green, of Bedford, who was number eight in the Public Schools side. Green, who made 622 with an average of 44 for his school, hit centuries against The Levs and Haileybury at above a run a minute. Unfortunately, he came and went speedily both against the E.S.C.A. and in the preceding match when playing for Southern Schools against The Rest.

In the latter game C. Johnson (*Pocklington*) lived up to his school reputation, based impressively on the scoring of 668 runs at an average of 111, by making 88 not out. He batted in such scintillating manner that he hit five sixes and seven fours. Two quick dismissals by Walker and Griffith in the next match cost him his place in the representative Schools XI, but he was clearly one of the best cricketers of the school year. Others helped Johnson to enliven that first game. The 57 of Owen-Thomas was a sparkling innings, and J. H. Aten (*Cranleigh*) shared with him a stand of 62 inside forty minutes. Aten's part was 37 with two vast sixes out of Lord's and into St. John's Wood Road, which has not often been invaded since Jim Smith ceased to scythe his bat for Middlesex. Others who created good impressions with the bat were Hollington, R. L. Burchnall (*Winchester*) and T. E. N. Jameson (*Taunton*). The bowling was less encouraging.

In the final match the Schools were rather easily defeated by the Services. Those batsmen who got going were dismissed just when they should have been set. There were seven scores above 20 but not one above 30. Griffith made two of the twenties, but strangely he was allowed only four overs in the match. The boys on this occasion did not do themselves justice, but it was nevertheless a pretty good year for schools cricket. Those boys who played in the three matches at Lord's approached their cricket in a positive manner, refreshing indeed to anyone accustomed to the spectacle of so much negative play in the county game. The influence of the first-class game on the young is naturally great, and the bad habits tend to spread faster than the good. It is greatly to the credit of the games masters and coaches that the spirit of schools cricket as

shown in these representative games, has remained so good despite the bad influence of adult players.

That games masters and coaches have a task demanding constant watchfulness at this time is clear. They can no longer advise their boy players with confidence to watch their county sides and be guided by what they see. Much of what they are liable to see needs to be speedily forgotten, and that is easier said than done in the case of the impressionable young. This past year I heard murmurings about a "blatant chucker" among the bowlers of one West Country school. At Lord's in the *Clifton-Tonbridge* match we had an example of time wasting, for which the example set by the county players is directly responsible.

After a Tonbridge declaration, Clifton began the final innings with seventy minutes in which to make 111, but Tonbridge allowed them only 17 overs, a wretched average of 87 balls an hour. Correspondence I had with the games masters of the two schools refuted the suggestion made at the time that the time wasting was deliberate. Time wasting, however, there most certainly was to a degree which reflected badly on Public Schools cricket. Not long afterwards I saw the West Indies bowl 36 overs in seventy-five minutes on the same ground. All but one were bowled by spinners, whereas Tonbridge used pace throughout their seventy minutes. Yet, when all pertinent allowances have been made, including damp conditions for Tonbridge, the difference is vast.

Much muddled thinking accompanied this innings. I was told that, in condemning the slow over rate, I was overlooking the fact that by declaring Tonbridge had made a most sporting move to revive a game spoiled by the weather. The inference was that they could not then be expected to bowl their overs with despatch. In my view the declaration was ridiculous, but, having made it, Tonbridge should not have slowed the game down in order to avoid its consequences. I condemn the declaration because it falsified the play. Tonbridge had no hope of bowling an entire side out in the ninety minutes they anticipated, but which was in fact reduced to seventy minutes. The declaration was an embarrassing gift to the opposition, and victory in such circumstances would have been hollow. A match that cannot be won genuinely is not worth winning on the misguided altruism of opponents. Too many matches to-day which deserve to be drawn are doped to produce an artificial finish. No disgrace is attached to drawing a game, and it is against the spirit of games playing to throw it at the opponents in order to avoid such a result. A side goes into a match with the object of winning it. If they reach a position where they have no chance of winning, they should strive for the next best result, a draw. The only good declarations are those made to give the declarers a chance of winning. Any that are designed in the main to give the other side a chance are bad ones. Each side, in fact, should look after their own interests without concern for the welfare of opponents. That is not to say that declarations which dangle a carrot should not be made, but the carrot should not be too fat. Rain had wrecked the Clifton-Tonbridge match as a contest beyond repair. No time remained for genuine manoeuvre, and the Tonbridge batsmen should have been allowed to play the match out to its logical result. Cricketers need to be realistic, not romantic, in such circumstances.

The number of drawn games in 1966 indicated that cricket was not played so improvidently elsewhere. The wettest part of the summer came during the main match-playing period in the schools. The Scots were particularly hard hit by what a cricket master reported was "an unusually wet summer even by Scottish standards". Four of Glenalmond's fixtures were never started, and only four of the other eleven were decided. Twice they played in absurdly wet conditions. Thus a potentially strong side were hamstrung, though D. R. A. Emslie had enough playing time to reveal himself as an outstandingly good wicket-keeper. George Watson's had eight draws in 13 games, but their season was made memorable by the bowling of A. P. Greening and R. B. Thompson, who put out Loretto for 23 and Merchiston for 74 in successive weeks. Yet Loretto overall had one of the best Scottish records with seven wins against two defeats. For the second year running A. H. Francis took over 50 wickets cheaply for them. Fettes too did well, being beaten only by the Masters, and Edinburgh Academy's sound batting and superb fielding brought them victory in four interschool matches. For George Heriot's, W. J. Dishington and D. O. Lee shared two opening century partnerships.

This seemed to be a notably good year for wicket-keepers. M. Beale from Dorset, who kept for the representative Schools XI was up to the very best school standard. He was big for the job, but he was a neat mover, and his hands were sure. The first choice of the Public Schools was V. G. Evans (Warwick), and he was not far below Beale's standard. Ellesmere were blessed with two unusually good stumpers, J. L. Beresford-Bourne, who made eight stumpings, and K. R. Bayliss. These two boys were taught by E. J. Rowe, the former Nottinghamshire wicket-keeper. They stood up to all the Ellesmere bowlers, and that is certainly something to boast about in these long-stop days. Berkhamsted's wicket-keeper, G. S. May, brought his total of victims in three years to 54. B. R. Lawrence behind the wicket contributed materially with the allrounders, Black and J. N. Dixey, to Stowe's good season. Some excellent bags by wicket-keepers included 24 by M. J. Esplin for Bradfield, 27 including 10 stumpings for A. Clarke (Lancing) and 33 for I. A. R. Murray (Malvern).

Murray was a key member of a splendid fielding and strong

batting side that brought Malvern nine wins in 13 games. They won six of their school matches and drew the other, a record amply rewarding the excellent captaincy of G. B. Treverton-Jones, who was also the leading bowler. P. J. Allerton, young enough to have another year at school, scored 633 in 10 completed innings and was chosen for the trial games at Lord's. In addition to his wicketkeeping successes Murray contributed a batting average of 39.5. Malvern were clearly the leading side in the West, where the school game flourished more perhaps than in most parts during 1966. After a long lean period Cheltenham, I am happy to record, enjoyed one of their best seasons since the war with four wins in school matches. Their batting was steady, and their catching helped to make the opening bowlers, G. G. Angier and J. W. H. Jessop, a match winning pair. Angier's 45 wickets at only 13.26 runs each was a notable performance. Nearby, Dean Close also had a successful inter-school summer and a fast bowler, S. A. H. Chapple, whose 40 wickets cost fewer than 10 runs each. King's College, Taunton, for whom R. W. Poynton started the season with seven successive fifties and had a final average of 78, went through the season unbeaten. Millfield, though inexperienced, again had a good record. They were captained by Tom Graveney's nephew, a son of J. K., who took 40 wickets at 11 runs each and routed Hardye's by taking nine for 17.

Worcester Royal Grammar School had one of the best seasons in the school's history, to which Griffith contributed much. With the bat he made 454 and in the field was one of the three spin bowlers on whom the success was based. Griffith's 40 wickets cost 9.45, D. E. Perryman, another off spinner, had 42 at 10.35, and the slow left-hander J. C. H. Lee took 37 at only 7.5. Taunton, like their neighbours at King's, thrived with four wins in school matches. Jameson, who represented the school in the first game at Lord's, had a batting average of 57.75 and a bowling average of 15.7. Though they were less successful than Malvern and Cheltenham, Marlborough and Clifton maintained the standard of cricket in the West schools. Overall Marlborough's results were average, but they were not beaten by another school, and when they walloped M.C.C. by 125 runs, I. C. R. Brown, the son of F.R., hit 98. N. P. G. Ross, the captain, and C. M. Page emerged with fine all-round records. Clifton, who tied with Sherborne at 141, also had average results, which would surely have been better if the fielding had been up to the standard of the batting and bowling, in both of which their captain, H. R. St. G. Hamersley, was prominent. A. S. Dixon's 111 against luckless Downside, who finished the season without a single win, was the first century scored for Clifton for five years.

It is always difficult, and usually impossible, to name the best side of the year. In 1966, *Dulwich* undoubtedly had the proudest

record in the south, while *Pocklington* and *St. Peter's*, *York*, led the way in the north. *Dulwich*, who were beaten only by M.C.C., claimed 1966 as their best season for 25 years, which would take them back to the days of T. E. Bailey and A. W. H. Mallett. For Knight in particular the summer was a triumph. His four centuries represented a school record; in seven games against other schools he made 545 with an average of 109; his grand total in all matches was 742 with an average of 74.2.

On the whole the other leading cricketing schools of the south did not enjoy outstanding seasons, but it must be remembered that in their club games they meet generally tougher opposition than schools in most other parts of the country. Charterhouse, most of whose matches were left drawn, had a young side promising much for 1967. Despite the Charterhouse pitch, which offers little to slow bowlers, their spinners were more successful than the pace bowlers. N. G. Woodwark, an off-spinner aged 16, took 38 wickets and two similarly youthful opening batsmen, J. M. Bennett and R. E. W. Wild, each scored in the neighbourhood of 400 runs in support of J. R. Ginson's 564. One of their defeats was at the hands of Eton, who scored 185 for two in one hundred minutes to win. Yet Eton had a modest record, as did Harrow with a fragile batting side. Bradfield's batting was also unreliable, and they achieved less than in recent years. Winchester, who did well against club sides and less well against schools, relied over much for runs on R. L. Burchnall, whose total was 610. Tonbridge were another side with shaky batting, but they had two excellent opening bowlers in P. G. Roffey and W. A. J. P. Breen.

Among the most successful southern sides were Cranleigh and K.C.S., Wimbledon. Cranleigh, adventurously led by Aten, who was also a brilliant fielder, won five of their seven school matches. Aten made runs, and his three pace bowlers did the rest. J. H. Chuter did a hat-trick, C. M. Lee hit the stumps seven times against Christ's Hospital, and K. R. Sunderland took six for 7 against St. John's, Leatherhead. Owen-Thomas played the major part in the most successful season K.C.S. have ever enjoyed with nine wins against a single defeat. He was top of both batting and bowling averages with 605 runs and 38 wickets. Although King's, Canterbury suffered from weak batting, several Kent schools prospered. Sevenoaks, nine wins to one defeat, had their best season for many years. Dover, who won twice as often as they lost, had a season of exciting finishes. T. C. D. Craven-Phillips hit two centuries for them and averaged 56. St. Lawrence, Ramsgate, had a really fast bowler in their captain, J. W. Nagenda, who took 45 wickets, and a highly successful all-rounder in R. P. R. Dixon. The latter made 534 runs and took 38 wickets with left-arm spin. Kent College began with only two old colours and yet won eight games.

Other schools in the south were deserving of mention. Forest became the first and only school to beat Brentwood in four years, but with an unusually young side Brentwood still won more matches than they lost. Canford had the distinction of beating Bryanston by an innings in a single day. Their captain, W. S. Rippon-Swayne, took his total of wickets during four years in the school team to 129. Ardingly lost only one of their eight inter-school matches, to Lancing, and won four. Eastbourne, thriving on the bowling of R. A. D. Perkins and P. F. Hepburn, were equally prominent against other schools. They won five times and lost only to Cranleigh. After losing their first two matches narrowly to Cheltenham and Bradfield, whose margin was only six runs, St. Edward's, Oxford lost subsequently only to M.C.C. Their leading batsman at the tender age of 15 was P. R. Thackeray with 366 runs. Haileybury's season was distinguished by the batting of Hollington, who made 533 in 10 completed innings and his opening stand of 218, a Haileybury record, with B. R. Kirkpatrick against Uppingham. Uppingham lost only once, but bad weather combined with some indifferent catching caused them to leave nine of their 12 matches drawn. If the record of St. Paul's was modest, they could take pleasure from the excellence of their fielding.

In the north, Pocklington's only defeat was inflicted by M.C.C. Against that solitary set-back they set ten victories and had only two drawn matches. In addition to Johnson, C. R. Flitton distinguished himself greatly by taking 55 wickets at the paltry cost of 6.8 runs each. St. Peter's, York, enjoying one of their best seasons, also won ten times, losing three matches, and were unbeaten in school matches. They have indeed lost only seven games to other schools in ten years. They fielded finely and generally played attacking cricket with a splendid all-round side. St. Bees, seven wins and two defeats, had such a strong and varied battery of bowlers that no opponent scored a fifty against them, and the highest total against them was only 122 by Lancaster University. K. Bursall, their leftarm spinner, took 37 wickets at 5.05. Another unbeaten side in School matches was Denstone, for whom R. L. Short made 775 and scored two centuries, but they had a narrow escape against Wrekin. At the close the scores were level at 141 with the last Wrekin pair at the wicket. Wrekin themselves had their best season for many years. They were another side with ten wins, though they lost five.

Lancaster R.G.S. for the third year and King's, Macclesfield, for the second came through unbeaten by another school. Lancaster's most successful bowler was a leg spinner, M. J. Bather. He took nine for 13 against Bradford G.S. and finished the term with 44 wickets at 7.8. Kimbolton scored too slowly to achieve much success, but they had a highly successful fast bowler, M. W. Roddis, who has played for the Northamptonshire second team.

Roddis took seven for 18 against *Stamford*, six for 17 against *Perse* and nine for 14 against *Wellingborough*, who were put out for 28. *Rossall* also had a match-winning fast bowler, J. R. Roberts, a left-hander, and came out on the right side with a team of modest calibre.

Newcastle R.G.S., who won seven times, had a curious finish to their match with *Durham*. When the last ball was bowled, *Durham*'s last pair were together and they needed two to win. The ball passed through the wicket without removing a bail, struck the astonished wicket-keeper, and a bye was run. The result a draw, Newcastle 144, Durham 144 for 9.

Another odd finish was that in which Warwick suffered their only defeat of the season. Worcester R.G.S. also needed two off the last ball, and they ran them when Warwick missed a simple catch. Nevertheless, Warwick, with eight wins, had a fine season under the captaincy of D. I. Dollery, son of the former Warwickshire captain and Test cricketer. Young Dollery was the leading bowler. Worcester were involved in another tight finish with Sebright, who had their most successful season with nine wins against one defeat. On that occasion Worcester set Sebright to make 166, and they raced the clock by scoring them in two minutes under two hours. Sebright's outstanding bowler was P. D. Markwick-Smith, a left-arm googly type spinner whose 60 wickets cost only 6.48.

Monmouth were another school to indulge in some fast scoring, for their captain, J. S. Jarrett, was not only their leading bowler but also a hard-hitting batsman. He played innings of 40 in twenty-three minutes and 60 in fifty-four minutes. However, the batting generally was not good enough, and their results were not striking.

Several schools up and down the country had frustrating seasons, not least King William's, Isle of Man. As though a wet summer was not sufficient handicap, they suffered also the effects of the seamen's strike. Shrewsbury looked like having a very successful season when they won four of their first six games. Then injury kept their captain, J. G. Matthews, out of the next two, and the side lost its impetus. Rugby had a good all-round side but kept on narrowly failing to win and so won only three of their 12 matches and left six drawn. Wellington did not gain a single win. They also just missed getting home. Marlborough beat them by one wicket; M.C.C. hung on grimly at 135 for 9 to draw when set to score 200. Wellington were not alone in failing to win a match.

In 1967 school cricket at Lord's is hit by the extra Test match which has to be staged there in a dual-tour season. The Public Schools v. E.S.C.A. match has had to be cut to one day, which is a grave, but seemingly unavoidable, misfortune, and the only two-day game remaining, apart from *Eton* v. *Harrow* earlier in the season, is the representative game against Combined Services.
