



SCHOOLS CRICKET IN 1981

The selection of the English Schools Cricket Association Under-19 team was complicated in 1981 by the absence of some key players with the NCA teams in Denmark for the International Youth Tournament, which the England North team won, with England South runners-up. Of the 26 players who went to Denmark, the 15 schoolboys were not considered for the International nor the Divisional matches, although some did play in the Regional games and the match against the Indians. Yet, despite the absence of C. Penn, N. J. Falkner and P. Gill in particular, a reasonably balanced side defeated Irish Schools (by six wickets), Welsh Schools and Scottish CU Colts.

The ESCA programme did not escape the ravages of the poor weather, which also disrupted many schools fixtures. In the rain-affected match against Irish Schools, two enterprising declarations brought about a positive result; and the eight-wicket defeat of the Welsh Schools featured an unbroken third-wicket partnership of 119 between H. Morris and N. R. Newman. The first day of the fixture against Scottish CU Colts having been completely washed out, a 55-overs contest was played, English Schools winning by 28 runs.

Rain again intervened in the match v Sri Lankan Schools, only four balls being bowled in two days, but the three-day game v Indian Young Cricketers ran its full course, exposing the limitations and inexperience of the English Schools side. Despite the suitability of the pitch, their spinners failed to prevent the Indian side from reaching a first innings total of 306, and although the follow-on was averted and T. A. Cotterell took six for 37 in Indian YC's second innings, the English Schools found themselves chasing 323. They could find no answer to the spin attack, led by Test player R. Shastri, and, in the face of constant appeals from the Indian side, it was left to tailenders G. D. Rose and C. Bullen to bring some respectability to the defeat — by 173 runs.

The batting was largely in the hands of Newman, A. J. H. Dunning and Morris, whose notable innings included 86 for MCC v NAYC and 76 not out v Welsh Schools. Although lacking support from the other spinners, Cotterell was successful, and fast bowlers D. C. Perry, N. S. Taylor and Rose picked up useful wickets. The fielding was of a high standard, especially that of Newman and Dunning, and P. Moores kept wicket efficiently. Under the quiet captaincy of Morris, the spirit of the side was always excellent.

Reports from the Schools

With their key players either off form or injured, a young **Abingdon** side had a disappointing season, with many close matches ending in defeat, although they were encouraged by the promise of newcomer T. Winter, whose medium right-arm bowling claimed twenty wickets. **Alley's**, often failing to force a result from a winning position, managed only three wins over schools - Rutlish, Emanuel and Royal Russell. S. Banfield, a consistent all-rounder, revealed tactical imagination as captain and B. Lane, who played some long innings, made an aggressive 113 v the XL Club. G. Hamilton, never easy to score off, always exploited a green wicket, while J. Graham's flighted leg-spin took many unexpected wickets later in the season. After a slow start, **Allhallows** were encouraged by the batting of D. A. S. Chapman and S. R. Dryden, whose century v St Edmund's, Canterbury, was a highlight. The hostile M. W. R. Luff spearheaded the attack, supported by P. M. Tuck and leading wicket-taker Chapman. With a strong batting side, **Ampleforth** defeated Sedbergh, Stonyhurst, St Peter's York, Worksop, St Benedict's Ealing and Dulwich. D. S. Harrison, an outstanding captain, set a school wicket-keeping record (22 ct 13 st) and batting record (744 runs), as well as captaining The Rest XI for the Independent Schools trial and HMC Schools. For **Arnold School**, with wins v William Hulme's GS, King Edward's Lytham, Ratcliffe and Ipswich, S. Bickerdike took a record 49 wickets.

Blake, undefeated for a third consecutive season, and with a record fourteen wins, retained the Warwickshire and Birmingham Under-19 Cup by defeating Solihull School at Edgbaston in the final. Right-hand opening batsman W. P. Matthews, who scored 108 v Bishop Vesey's GS, represented Coventry Second XI and was selected to play for The Rest v South at Eastbourne. A fine season for **Bancroft's School** was followed by a successful tour to Dublin. C. R. Thomas and M. G. De Jode, a solid opening pair, put on a record, unbroken partnership of 213 v the XL Club, De Jode's 124 not out also being a school record, as was his aggregate of 659. I. P. Debnam confirmed his promise as an all-rounder and R. S. Patel (left-arm fast-medium) bowled some devastating spells. **Bloxham** enjoyed their best season since 1970, their penetrative attack, which regularly bowled out opponents, being led by outstanding swing bowler and captain, P. A. D. Farrar. **Barnard Castle**, who were unbeaten, recorded victories v King's Tynemouth, St Bees, Dame Allan's, King Edward's Birmingham and Whitehaven. The side, who were never bowled out, owed much to their captain, C. R. Andrew, who took the most wickets (right-arm medium) and whose total of runs was 473 more than the next highest.

Bedford Modern School defeated Christ's College Cambridge, Queen's College Cambridge, Kimbolton, Bishop's Stortford College, RGS Worcester, Bishop Vesey's GS (twice) and Moseley CC Colts. A formidable opening partnership of A. K. G. Jones and A. Fordham twice contributed double-century stands – 215 v KES Birmingham and 201 v Denstone College – Fordham scoring four centuries in his total of 952 runs and Jones numbering three in his aggregate of 1,022. **Bedford School** owed their wins v The Leys, Bedford Modern, Uppingham and Stowe to excellent fielding and a strong bowling side, few batsmen being able to cope with S. P. Clayton's medium-paced in-swingers and I. T. Osborne's speed. Although the batting was generally inconsistent, a highlight was S. M. Smith's aggressive, unbeaten 101 v Uppingham. R. A. Millard played for HMC Southern Schools at Eastbourne. **Berkhamsted**, who had two tied matches in one week – v Framlingham and then on their tour to Holland – beat Brentwood, Abingdon, St Lawrence and Kimbolton. Noteworthy all-round performances came from M. J. Parsons, who headed the attack, and P. J. Allen, who averaged more than 40 for the second successive season.

Birkenhead, whose first defeat for three years was inflicted by Manchester GS, owed much to their captain, S. T. Crawley, the leading player in the North-West, who played for HMC Schools and for The Rest v Southern Schools. Under the positive captaincy of opening batsman N. P. Purkiss, **Bishop's Stortford College** recorded some exciting finishes, achieving wins v Aldenham, Kimbolton, The Leys, Stamford, MCC and Chigwell. Running well between the wickets, G. M. Lane and the left-handed Purkiss scored 1,000 runs between them, while J. S. Pryke took 42 wickets and R. S. Banks, with whom he opened the bowling, showed real promise as a fast bowler. **Blundell's**, whose wins included those v Oundle, Douai and Uppingham, were undefeated. Captain H. Morris, who passed 50 eleven times to score 923 runs at an average of 184.60, captained the ESCA and MCC Schools sides and played for Glamorgan. He received good support from P. S. Selley and P. D. Langdon, who each passed 500 runs, while R. J. Taverner (slow left-arm chinamen) and Langdon (off-spin) were the leading bowlers.

A successful tour to Bermuda in July was enjoyed by **Bradfield College**, who beat Radley and Free Foresters. A. Brown kept wicket with distinction and centuries were scored by M. J. Gent, who carried his bat for 111 against the Authentics, and P. R. C. Came, who played a high-class innings on a lively pitch v Wellington. Generally, however, Bradfield failed to score quickly enough in the first innings and eight games were drawn. Unbeaten by a school, **Bradford GS** recorded victories v Manchester GS, Woodhouse Grove and Hymers College. Their strong attack was spearheaded by pace openers A. White and G. T. N. Isbecque, who bowled out a strong Woodhouse Grove side for 38 in an unchanged spell of 34.3 overs. The batting was less reliable, with only all-rounder A. A. Metcalfe scoring consistently, but the fielding was good. S. G. P. Hewitt (12 ct 21 st) excelling behind the stumps.

Brighton College, undefeated, achieved a record twelve wins and took the Langdale Cup (Sussex knockout competition). Their well-balanced side, strong in every department, featured outstanding fielding and was never bowled out. M. Simmonds, the captain, was selected for Southern Schools, HMC Schools and English Schools. A young **Bristol GS** side had a mixed season in which D. J. Woolley scored an unbeaten century against St Brendan's and R. P. Yelland emerged as a promising all-rounder. In an improved season, **Bromsgrove School** defeated Christ's College Brecon and Dean Close. There were outstanding performances from captain S. C. Goodwin, who scored 103 not out v King's, Worcester, and S. W. Williams, who took seven for 49 v Denstone. **Bryanston** owed their unbeaten record to a high standard of fielding, consistent batting by M. Guymer and a valuable all-round contribution from D. Ticehurst, whose fast left-arm bowling took ten for 41 v a young **Canford** side, who did well, in a season of rebuilding, to achieve four wins. M. D. Smith, the only Canford batsman to pass 50, was a sound wicket-keeper, while both N. A. S. Mowat (slow left-arm) and D. G. Le Sueur (right-arm fast-medium) showed promise. An enthusiastic **Charterhouse** side were indebted to C. W. H. May, who scored 80 and 90 v Surrey Young Cricketers, and outstanding opening batsman, W. R. Bristowe, who played unselfishly and represented MCC Schools and HMC Schools. Sound fielding supported an accurate attack, led by S. C. Toombs (medium) and R. J. Rogers (slow left-arm) who between them captured 84 wickets.

The highlight for **Cheltenham College** was their victory v Malvern, who were dismissed for 42 in an hour and a half, J. G. Brettell (slow left-arm) taking five for 10 and P. C. D. Sykes (fast medium) five for 20. With seven matches abandoned and some of the leading players unavailable, **Christ College, Brecon**, never settled down, although notable performances came

from P. G. Chambers who took six for 19 v Hereford Cathedral School and five for 41 v Bromsgrove. Captain S. A. Brown was a useful all-rounder and the promising S. W. Harvey was selected for Welsh Schools v Scotland. For **Christ's Hospital**, without a win, the established players failed to find form, although newcomers B. A. F. James and T. A. P. Godfrey looked promising with the bat, as did off-spinner S. C. Wilson and T. I. Christoph (medium-fast left-arm) with the ball.

A tour of Barbados ended the season for **City of London School**, for whom P. A. Townson scored 104 in the victory over MCC and 120 not out v Royal Russell. Despite achieving only one win – v Cheltenham, when J. S. Brooks made 118 not out – **Clifton College** had an exciting season, attributing their lack of success to a shortage of top-class bowlers. Fourteen wins were recorded by **Colfe's School**, including those v St Dunstan's, Trinity Croydon, City of London, Eltham College and Haberdashers' Aske's (Hatcham). Highlights were a tied match v MCC and the batting of A. J. Caswall, whose record 1,237 runs at an average of 103.08 included three undefeated centuries. **Colston's School** were encouraged by the batting of fifteen-year-old W. M. Smith, who, with more than 600 runs for the second consecutive season, scored a maiden century v Bristol GS. D. B. Pigott proved to be a successful all-rounder, compiling a maiden century v the XL Club and taking eight for 42 (fast-medium) v Marlborough School the following day. After a slow start to the season, **Cranleigh School** found form to defeat Epsom, St John's and Christ's Hospital in their last three fixtures. Their batting failed to dominate and careless catching let down a consistently steady attack.

Held together by captain S. M. Hassall, a disappointing **Dauntsey's** side failed to score runs quickly enough, while the attack was often wayward. The highlight, in an otherwise mediocre season, for a young and inexperienced **Dean Close XI** was a hard-hit 80 v Warwick by opening bowler D. Leng. **Denstone**, unbeaten for the first time since 1958, fielded a well-balanced team, although the attack, depending heavily on A. J. Little, lacked penetration when he was injured. **Douai** were beaten only by Blundell's and Taunton. Their captain R. A. Keeble was selected for Southern Schools v The Rest and played for Hampshire Second XI. **Dover College** were undefeated, their seven wins including those v Sir Roger Manwood's, MCC, Sutton Valence, St Lawrence College and Kent College, against whom J. G. Ryeland took five for 9. Their strength lay in their batting, although fifteen-year-old D. Carrion showed promise with the ball. However, apart from the excellence of wicket-keeper-batsman I. Elks, who played for Kent Second XI, the fielding was poor. With no wins but only one loss – v Sherborne – **Downside**, lacking a strike bowler, relied mainly on the all-round skills of captain T. A. Cotterell, who was selected for the English Schools team. A young **Dulwich** side, whose best win was v Lancaster RGS, featured an improved attack – N. J. Bennett (left-arm fast-medium) taking five for 25 v St Paul's – and competent catching, although the batting was often prone to collapse. With wins v St Peter's York, Merchiston Castle, RGS Newcastle, Norwich and King's Lynn GS, **Durham** had a well-balanced side, the batting being headed by the Shaw twins.

Eastbourne College scored runs quickly to beat St John's Leatherhead, King's Canterbury, Lancing (twice), Hurstpierpoint, Clifton and Winchester, against whom D. Gordon (medium-fast) took eight for 43. S. J. D. Yorke, who headed the batting, scored 152 v The Hague CC. An inexperienced **Edinburgh Academy** side, who defeated Merchiston and Pocklington, owed much to C. D. Fraser-Darling, who, despite injury, finished the season with 35 wickets as well as scoring 122 v Loretto, 119 v Strathallan and 114 v the XL Club. In an indifferent season, **Elizabeth College, Guernsey**, beat Victoria College Jersey (twice) and St Dunstan's. For **Ellesmere College**, left-hander G. L. Home scored the most runs, including 103 not out v the XL Club, and took the most wickets (slow left-arm). The strength of **Eltham College**, who won the Kent Schools Cup, lay in their batting; M. R. Surguy and M. J. Holcombe played consistently well, as did opener N. S. Comber, whose 140 v Haberdashers' Aske's (Elstree) came in 120 minutes.

Emanuel recovered from early difficulties to win the London Schools knockout trophy for the fourth year, and were runners-up in the Surrey Schools final. P. A. Young (right-arm medium-fast) made an outstanding contribution with 66 wickets, including eight for 11 v St Albans. **Enfield GS**, whose sixteen wins included the defeat of Chigwell, Forest, Hampton, Mill Hill, St Albans and Watford GS, owed their batting strength to brothers J. and G. Allen, both of whom scored centuries. Captain M. Jones (right-arm fast-medium) set a school record of 66 wickets. Prospects look good, their Colts side having reached the final of the Lord's Taverners Cricketer Colts Trophy. Six centuries were scored for **Epsom College**; hundreds before lunch

were hit v Christ's Hospital by captain M. C. Humphrys and wicket-keeper J. R. Ansell. Ansell's two other centuries included one in 58 minutes v St John's, Leatherhead, the last 50 coming in 14 minutes. M. J. Morris, who took 38 wickets, reached three figures on one occasion and R. M. C. Williams made 116 in his last innings. Losing only to St Edward's Oxford, **Eton** defeated Radley, Marlborough, Wellington, Winchester and MCC. Success came from their ability to bowl out opponents, as well as their strong batting in which C. C. Birch Reynardson and M. V. Fleming, in his first season, were prominent. **Exeter School**, in a mediocre season, failed to overcome the problems caused by inconsistent batting and a weak attack.

Felsted School, who defeated Oundle and The Leys, were disappointed by careless fielding and an attack that lacked pace and penetration. However, the batting was strong, led by wicket-keeper M. W. C. Olley, who played representative Essex cricket, and promising all-rounder J. P. Stephenson. **Fettes College**, with wins v St Paul's and The Leys, owed their batting strength to captain J. P. Kennedy – who scored 140 not out v Glenalmond, 136 v The Leys and 134 v St Paul's – and C. A. Evans, who made 112 against Oakham and 100 not out v Merchiston Castle. **Forest School** were ably captained by all-rounder I. Crossley, while newcomer M. Sheppard showed promise with the bat.

Giggleswick School recorded victories v Durham, St Bees and the XL Club. Captained by Australian R. Etheridge, an inexperienced **Gordonstoun** side had a satisfying season and, although the fast bowlers tended to be expensive, R. P. J. Heyes (medium) made a significant all-round contribution.

Undeclared by a school for five years, **Haberdashers' Aske's, Elstree**, batted soundly, with N. J. Churchman a promising all-rounder whose pace often made the vital breakthrough. A tour to Sri Lanka was planned for December. Highlights in an unspectacular year for **Hampton School** were hundreds by C. B. Dennis-Baker v Latymer and John Lyon and the all-round performance of J. E. C. Poulter. **Harrow's** young side did well to remain unbeaten, their solid batting and efficient bowling securing good wins v Charterhouse, Haileybury and Radley. With encouraging wins v The Leys and St Paul's, **Highgate School** were an excellent fielding side, with fourteen-year-old N. Rathbone performing well behind the stumps. **Hipperholme GS** again specialised in narrow defeats, although victories included those v Giggleswick and Burnley GS. Apart from R. S. Butterworth and J. B. Lunn, the batting was inconsistent, while the bowling relied heavily on I. D. Hartley. Wicket-keeper N. P. Broadbent showed promise, making as many stumpings as he took catches. In an otherwise disappointing season, **Hurstpierpoint** gained exciting victories v St John's Leatherhead and Eastbourne. A second tour of India was planned for the winter.

Ipswich, victorious v Framlingham, Holbrook and The Perse, were ably led by all-rounder P. Caley, who made 145 v Norwich School and was appointed captain of Suffolk Schools, for whom wicket-keeper J. Levick was also selected. Seam bowler M. Mitson took six for 67 v Felsted.

Fragile batting hampered **Kimbolton** who defeated The Perse and St Lawrence Ramsgate. S. C. Render was outstanding, taking five wickets in an innings on five occasions. A century by fourteen-year-old N. A. Willetts v Bedford Modern was a highlight for **King Edward's School, Birmingham**, whose competent batsmen were often frustrated by careless fielding and mediocre bowling. With a strong batting side, **King Edward VI College, Stourbridge**, were often thwarted by the negative approach of opponents. D. S. Scriven's aggregate was the highest for the school since 1933 and leg-spinner D. Glover was superb. Sensibly captained by G. P. J. Staples, **King Edward VI School, Southampton**, had an excellent season, with fast bowler D. M. M. Horne taking 40 wickets. **King Edward VII School, Lytham**, owed much to captain G. F. H. McDonnell, who, when making 114 v Manchester GS, went from 88 to 106 in three balls. He played for Lancashire Schools, Lancashire Federation Under-19, North of England Under-19 team in Denmark, and is on Lancashire's books. An improved attack was led by fifteen-year-old opening batsman N. D. W. McDonnell (right-arm off-breaks), who took six for 55 v Batley. A place in the semi-final of the Warwickshire knock-out competition encouraged **King Henry VIII School, Coventry**, for whom captain C. R. Mills headed the batting. C. J. Harrison (right-arm fast-medium), who led the attack, took eight for 33 v The Woodland and N. Ball's 33 wickets included five for 19 v Bablake.

Disappointing batting performances, careless fielding and an outbreak of measles affected the progress of **King's College, Taunton**, who none the less beat Wellington. King's Bruton and the XL Club. On a tour to Barbados both R. P. Twose (138) and R. J. Harden (100) scored maiden centuries. In a season of rebuilding, **King's College School, Wimbledon**, lost to only one school. P. J. Morse scored 119 not out v University College School, Hampstead, but, apart from N. J. Moritz, the batting lacked consistency. Positive cricket was played by **King's School, Bruton**, for whom I. A. Stuart took seven for 16 v Monkton Combe. With a strong attack, **King's School, Canterbury**, beat Highgate and St Peter's Adelaide – the only defeat of their tour. A highlight was the leg-spin of fifteen-year-old R. W. G. Oliver, who returned nine for 22 v the Old Boys. Restricted by poor fielding, an otherwise capable **King's School, Chester**, side owed much to captain C. N. Hudson, who headed the batting averages and whose off-spin captured 40 wickets.

In an exciting season, **King's School, Macclesfield**, recorded eleven wins. Captain P. Moores, selected for HMC Schools, excelled as wicket-keeper (17 ct 20 st) and broke the school batting record (set in 1936), failing by just 8 runs to make 1,000 for the season. N. D. Smedley, first reserve for Southern Schools v The Rest, passed 800 runs for the second consecutive season and left-arm spinner C. D. Burgess exceeded 100 wickets for the school. Inconsistent with the bat, a young and inexperienced **King's School, Rochester**, side were encouraged by M. Fairbank, who extracted impressive pace from unhelpful wickets. With all the side returning in 1982, prospects look good. For **King's School, Worcester**, S. Fleming took twice as many wickets as the next bowler and J. Vincent, despite starting the season in the Second XI, scored the most runs. **King William's College, Isle of Man**, with a young side, are another school who look forward to an improved season in 1982. On a tour to Holland in July, **Kingston GS** comfortably won all their matches, including those v a Royal UD Deventer XI, containing two Dutch internationals, and an Eastern Holland Youth XI. At home, however, the side failed to fulfil their potential, although the bowling was encouraging and exciting all-rounder R. J. Purchase, the only batsman to reach three figures, scored a magnificent 80 in even time v Surrey Young Cricketers.

Fielding well, a happy **Lancing College** side defeated Hurst and Epsom, against whom D. C. Popplewell scored their only century. Two young players impressed – fourteen-year-old J. D. Robinson with the bat and fifteen-year-old off-spinner C. S. Mays. Although **The Leys** suffered nine defeats, several were by a narrow margin. The fielding was slipshod and the middle order too often collapsed. J. H. E. Griffith scored a memorable 111 v MCC. **Liverpool College**, hampered by illness and injury, none the less achieved good wins v Ruthin and Rydal. D. M. Fletcher scored a century on debut and the fielding was keen. For **Leeds GS**, who achieved the most wins since 1952, openers J. K. Bowman and C. E. R. Stewart were always reliable, while wicket-keeper R. M. W. Sugden had an outstanding season with 19 catches and 20 stumpings. Although still unbeaten by an MCC side, **Lord Williams's School** had only a moderate season, relying too heavily on the fast bowling of G. Porter, who was selected for Gloucestershire Second XI. **Loretto**, whose batting tended to be brittle, depended on right-arm fast-medium bowlers P. J. Ledingham and C. R. Marks (five for 18 v Glenalmond), both of whom passed 50 wickets.

Tight bowling and excellent fielding brought six victories – including those v MCC, Abingdon and Dean Close – for **Magdalen College School**, whose generally sound batting improved with experience. The strength of **Malvern**, who defeated Dean Close, Clifton, Charterhouse and MCC, lay in the attack. J. R. N. Ashworth (slow left-arm) taking nine for 26 v MCC, seven for 70 v Clifton and six for 31 v Radley. The batting was suspect, apart from lefthanders R. Mason, who scored 102 v Charterhouse, and M. J. Woolf (captain and wicket-keeper), who played for Southern Schools v The Rest, for whom Ashworth played. **Manchester GS**, beaten only by Bradford GS, owed much to captain J. M. Salthouse, who passed 50 seven times and scored the side's first century for five years (v the XL Club). M. J. Frost returned six for 43 v Bury GS, six for 51 v Stockport GS and, v Marple Hall, took seven for 24 with a spell of six wickets in ten balls, including the hat-trick. **Marlborough**, in a season of rebuilding, featured sharp fielding, with M. R. C. Swallow an impressive outfielder holding sixteen catches.

Seven wins by an unbeaten **Merchant Taylors', Northwood**, side included those v Westminster and Mill Hill, against whom 113 was made by S. P. Ducat, who, with A. A. G. Mee, scored the most runs. A steady attack was well supported behind the stumps by D. Jenkins, although the fielding was variable. **Merchiston Castle School** were encouraged, in a

season of reconstruction, by the performances of P. K. Young and captain M. V. Townsend, who together contributed nearly half the runs scored. The bowling again featured M. G. Robertson, whose seven for 15 v Coleraine AI was a highlight. Undefeated, **Millfield** recorded wins v King's Taunton, Clifton, Guernsey XI, Free Foresters, the XL Club and ESCA (South-West). A strong batting side, never bowled out, owed most to openers P. G. Roebuck (brother of the Somerset batsman) and captain A. J. H. Dunning, who put on stands of 260 unbroken v Marlborough and 217 v Malvern; both were selected for ESCA and MCC Schools and Dunning played for Somerset Second XI. Fielding was sound, with D. Pyemont a proficient wicket-keeper and Dunning and P. A. C. Bail excellent close catchers.

Mill Hill beat St Paul's, Aldenham, UCS and Oundle, against whom T. A. J. Dawson took eight for 32 with his off-breaks. School records were set by captain S. P. H. Thomas (18 ct 13 st) and Dawson (79 wickets), who also represented HMC Schools v ESCA. **Monkton Combe**, who too often failed to bowl out opponents, were nevertheless encouraged by the left-arm fast bowling of A. R. C. Batterham and the all-round performance of captain A. N. Perry. For **Monmouth**, who beat Brecon, Dean Close, Colston's and Taunton, L. J. J. Watts proved a fine all-rounder, taking five for 13 v Taunton. Captain A. G. Davies, a successful wicket-keeper-batsman, was engaged on a summer contract with Gloucestershire, while K. G. Lewis, who scored 112 not out v RGS, Worcester, and 99 not out v Dean Close, was selected for the Welsh Schools.

Although **Norwich School** failed to score enough runs on slow wickets, their bowling, headed by N. Kedar (leg-spin) and S. P. Bowling (right-arm fast), inspired more confidence.

A strong team spirit, especially in the field, was a feature of **Oakham's** superb season, in which 90 per cent of the catches were held. Two centuries each were scored by I. R. J. Thorpe and T. M. Hopper. For **Oundle**, A. M. Jeremiah and A. M. W. Waters formed an above-average opening attack and, although the batting was vulnerable, wins were recorded v Bedford and Uppingham.

Established batsmen were disappointing for **The Perse**, who defeated King's Ely, Chigwell, Magdalen College School and Culford. However, fourteen-year-old J. M. C. Stenner's 71 not out v Wrekin College was an innings of quality. M. A. P. Hall (fast right-arm) bowled aggressively for figures of six for 11 v Newport and six for 35 v Culford. Under the unselfish captaincy of T. A. Crockatt, a young **Pocklington** side played some positive cricket.

For **Queen Elizabeth GS, Wakefield**, who were unbeaten for the second time in five years, A. Chapman's haul of 118 wickets in three seasons was a post-war record, as was captain P. H. D. Eastland's aggregate of 667 runs. With wins v Bishop's Stortford, King's Bruton, Allhallows and Kingswood, **Queen's College, Taunton**, were indebted to the all-round excellence of G. V. Palmer.

Although experienced players failed to find form, and each of their matches was affected by rain, **Radley** beat Sherborne and Abingdon. Two of their side, both sons of former Middlesex players, were selected for the Public Schools trial – fast bowler G. D. Moss and D. R. C. Gale (leg-spin and opening bat), whose 135 not out v Abingdon was the highest against a school since E. R. Dexter was in the side. A highlight for **Ratcliffe College**, who failed to fulfil their early promise, was off-spin bowler A. MacDiarmid's six for 24 – including the hat-trick – v St Edmund's College, Ware. In a disappointing season, **Reading School's** captain R. K. Purslow played some notable innings, as did J. M. Salmon, while G. M. Cox (right-arm fast-medium) was rewarded with a return of six for 51 v Abingdon.

Reed's School, who lost only one school fixture, depended much on the all-round abilities of M. R. Dunn (off-spin) and the medium-pace bowling of captain P. J. McDuell. Apart from P. N. J. Downman, who scored one century and six 50s, **Reigate GS's** younger players failed; their unbeaten record reflects the skilful batting of captain N. J. Falkner, who represented the NCA in Denmark, and the economical bowling of vice-captain A. M. Babington. Unbeaten by a school, **Repton** recorded wins v Rugby and Cheltenham; captain J. S. Frost, who captured 44 wickets, made a match-winning 106 not out v Cheltenham and J. D. Carr's 552 runs included 101 not out v Pocklington. Frost played for The Rest v HMC Southern Schools. **Rugby's** strong attack, led by N. C. W. Fenton (fast) and H. J. E. Evans (fast-medium), was often let down by the fielding, which lacked aggression. A young **Rydal** side, whose keen fielding supported well the medium-pace bowling of T. Forster and P. Schofield, found

run-getting difficult, although T. Aughton's 100 not out v King's School, Chester, was an innings of quality.

Injuries, as well as youth and inexperience, hindered **St Albans School** at the beginning of the season, although a later improvement brought some encouraging performances from W. J. Dean, M. D. Lynes and A. P. Latham, who took eight for 16 in the early defeat by Enfield GS. With only three draws, **St Dunstan's College** played positive cricket, yet failed to fulfil their potential; the attack lacked penetration, the fielding was erratic, and the batting relied too heavily on captain A. M. Ford and C. M. Denny. In a successful season, **St Edmund's, Canterbury**, recorded a number of notable individual performances: 103 not out v Norton Knatchbull by R. E. Walton; K. A. Rumbelow's seven for 11 v St Lawrence and five for 8 v Sir Roger Manwood's, against whom I. A. Minter took five for 6; and returns of six for 21 v Kent College by A. P. Walton and six for 26 v Forest School by M. S. Jordan.

St George's, Weybridge, followed a successful season with a tour to Guernsey. Unreliable catching handicapped **St John's, Leatherhead**, who had victories over Hurstpierpoint, St George's Weybridge and Christ's Hospital. A young **St Lawrence** side relied heavily on the batting of captain A. J. Billings and M. J. Marchant, who also opened the bowling and captured 31 wickets in his first season. A broken leg deprived **St Peter's, York**, of their captain, E. F. J. Wright, and an injury to outstanding fast bowler A. J. N. Simpson restricted his appearances in schools matches to six, in which he took 25 wickets. The batting showed promise, with fine centuries coming from S. R. Gorman and left-hander S. P. Burdass. Following a crushing defeat by Ampleforth, **Sedbergh** defeated Stonyhurst, William Hulme's GS and RGS Newcastle. Although the bowling often lacked variety and penetration, the batting was consistent, and captain-wicket-keeper J. D. C. Roberts had an excellent season. In a satisfactory season, **Sevenoaks** were intelligently captained by M. I. Dickenson who scored the most runs and kept wicket soundly. P. Durdant-Hollamby was a useful all-rounder and the performances of N. P. Thomas, R. C. Withers and J. G. Perks suggest batting strength for 1982.

With a number of close finishes, **Sherborne's** powerful batting side defeated Bradfield, Canford, King's Taunton, Downside, Haileybury and Marlborough. W. J. Rydon was an outstanding all-rounder, with 100 not out in 90 minutes v King's, Taunton, and six for 12 v Downside, while J. D. Lloyd gave excellent support behind the stumps. **Shrewsbury's** strength lay in their batting, with D. J. Saunders reaching three figures v Shropshire Schools, Cheltenham and Malvern, and Colt I. J. F. Hutchison scoring 186 v Repton. Left-hander J. C. C. Pettegree, who scored most runs, played for The Rest v Southern Schools. **Simon Langton GS**, again unbeaten, owed much to the batting of S. C. Goldsmith and captain A. R. Wood as well as to the off-spin bowling of A. J. E. Castle.

Sir Roger Manwood's School, who beat Allhallows, had difficulty in scoring runs, the only consistent batsman being P. Millard; although D. G. Chisholm (right-arm fast-medium) took most wickets, the least expensive was slow bowler D. J. Stevens. **Solihull**, losing finalists in the Warwickshire and Birmingham Under-19 Cup, defeated KES Birmingham, Wolverhampton GS and Bedford Modern. Of the bowlers, M. Whitehead (right-arm fast-medium) ran through the KES batting and A. McNeish's leg-spin and googlies puzzled most batsmen, although not wicket-keeper J. Robinson, who set a school record for stumpings. **Stamford School's** eight wins included those v Kimbolton, Wellingborough, King's Peterborough and the XL Club. The batting, often brittle, was dependent on openers D. W. Browne and captain J. G. Franks, who kept wicket for the NCA at the International Youth Tournament in Denmark; pace bowlers G. C. Dale and R. Tarrant led a tight attack, in which C. P. Richardson showed promise as an off-spinner. In an unspectacular season for **Stockport GS**, the young T. Reeman opened successfully, while A. King and R. Samarji (right-arm fast) formed a hostile opening attack. With excellent fielding and economical bowling, **Stowe School** reported some exciting draws, their only defeat being at the hands of Bedford. The middle order was fragile, but openers T. A. Lester and M. M. Ivson excelled, scoring 108 and 101 respectively in an unbroken stand of 212 v Dean Close. Lester played for HMC Southern Schools v The Rest. **Strathallan's** only defeat – by 1 run v Glenalmond – came in the last match of the season, their success being based on a seam attack – which benefited from the damp summer – backed up by some good close catching. The strength of **Sutton Valence** lay in their bowling, spearheaded by A. R. Shaw (right-arm fast) and well supported in the field, with B. C. Hart setting a school wicket-keeping record of 24 dismissals and I. Ekuza holding eleven catches at gully. Captain B. R. Rafuse's absence with cartilage trouble considerably weakened the batting, which, apart

from Shaw and fifteen-year-old M. T. Russell-Vick, was pedestrian and rarely inspired confidence.

Taunton School, with six players under sixteen, had a satisfactory season, achieving wins v Christ's Hospital, Douai and MCC. J. C. Pike and N. J. Pringle were both selected for HMC Under-15 XI. **Tiffin's** splendid, unbeaten season featured the record all-round performance of P. R. C. Robinson, whose 988 runs included one century and nine 50s, and whose 59 wickets included five in a match on five occasions. N. D. Hicks played for ESCA Schools v HMC Schools. Under the shrewd captaincy of J. M. W. Sale, **Tonbridge School** were also unbeaten by a school, with wins v Felsted, Haileybury, Winchester, Sevenoaks, Lancing and Christ's Hospital. Fast-medium bowler M. P. Hickson played for MCC Schools, and G. R. Cowdrey, who headed the batting, played for Southern Schools, his 58 retired v The Rest featuring four 6s and six 4s. Three wins by **Trent College** came in last-over finishes - v Ratcliffe, Stamford and Mount St Mary's. The season ended with a three-week tour to Barbados. **Trinity's** eleven victories included those v St Peter's York, King's Rochester, St Benedict's Ealing and St Dunstan's. Captain J. E. Vigar, whose four centuries included three in consecutive innings, scored a record 1,103 runs and was ably supported by wicket-keeper S. N. Perry, who made three centuries and set a school record of 47 dismissals. **Truro School**, beaten only by a strong Old Boys XI, owed much to the spin bowling of T. J. Manhire, and benefited from a consistent batting line-up.

Under the able captaincy of M. D. Furness, **University College School** had an encouraging season, H. R. Sharp again proving to be a useful all-rounder. With an improved attack and keen fielding, **Uppingham** had an encouraging season. Captain and leading batsman J. J. Whitaker played for HMC Schools and featured in three county opening stands with T. J. Preston-Jones, who also put on 164 for the first wicket with J. W. J. Sly.

Nine wins by **Warwick School**, all achieved when batting second, included those v Bishop Vesey's GS, Bromsgrove, Bloxham, KES Birmingham, Trent College, the XL Club and Dean Close. The penetrative attack was spearheaded by promising fast bowler A. C. Nunn, with sound support from R. M. Sadiq (medium-fast). In their best season for many years, **Wellingborough School** recorded good wins v Oakham, Bloxham and Aylesbury GS. Captain A. C. Harlow included four centuries in his aggregate of 945 and played for ESCA and HMC Schools. Defeated only by Eton and MCC, **Wellington College** had five wins, including those v Winchester, Radley and Repton. Frustratingly, some of their players did not live up to their promise. The strength of **Westminster School**, who were never bowled out, lay in their batting, which tended to be defensive, the more aggressive batsmen often proving unreliable. R. S. Rutnagur and captain G. A. C. Davies were responsible all-rounders.

In an average season, **Whitgift** defeated Dulwich, Christ's Hospital and The Hague CC Colts, against whom S. D. W. Horner scored 103 not out and B. W. Kennedy-Cooke took six for 17. The attack, well supported in the field, depended on slow left-arm bowlers Kennedy-Cooke and R. D. Ronald, who returned figures of seven for 27 v Reigate GS, while fifteen-year-old D. N. Drinkwater (leg-spin) showed promise. After an inauspicious start, **William Hulme's GS** were taken to success at the end of the season by their captain, R. P. Thornton, who reached three figures v Nottingham HS and Trinity, Croydon. Inexperience hampered **Winchester College**, for whom promising fifteen-year-old W. E. J. Holland, the youngest member of the side, made the most runs. The fast-scoring G. H. Payne collected 154 from 99 deliveries in the last three games.

Beaten only by Bradford GS, **Woodhouse Grove School** numbered Leeds GS and Hipperholme GS among their victims. Their strength lay in the bowling, with S. A. Hill (off-breaks) and S. A. J. Kippax (leg-breaks and googlies) forming a powerful combination. Kippax also proved a successful opening batsman, and A. G. Percy scored freely towards the end of the season, hitting a maiden century v Giggleswick. Without a win, but with exciting drawn games v Repton, Wrekin and MCC, **Worksop College** were weakened by injuries. A young **Wrekin** side owed their success to opening bowlers O. N. E. Harvey and J. R. Mackenzie (both right-arm medium) who took 67 and 75 wickets respectively - the first time that two bowlers have taken more than 60 wickets for the school in the same season. Mackenzie, batting in the middle order, also scored the most runs. For **Wycliffe College**, unbeaten by a school, captain F. J. Hemming-Allen, in his sixth year in the XI, again dominated as both batsman and bowler (right-arm fast-medium). D. W. Nicholls also shone as an all-rounder, while T. G. Hale impressed as a wicket-keeper-batsman.
