



SCHOOLS CRICKET IN 1983

Of the players "capped" in 1982, seven of whom went on to play first-class cricket in the following season, none was available in 1983, leaving ESCA with an inexperienced side. Selection problems were also compounded by the calls of NCA North and South teams for the International Youth Tournament in Holland, which coincided with three matches in the ESCA programme.

Their first game, in the Michael Gerard Trophy series, was against Welsh Schools at Bristol. After Wales had won the toss, J. P. Stephenson, aided somewhat by the fielders, dominated England's first innings with an unbeaten 157 out of 249 for four. Wales, struggling at 140 for six, added 70 in their last nine overs to finish 39 behind. England's rather belated declaration set Wales a target of 276 in just under two hours and twenty overs, and the match was drawn.

The three-day game against Australian Young Cricketers at Southampton proved a real test for the relatively inexperienced Schools side. Australia, electing to bat, amassed 352 for seven in ideal conditions, Veletta making 167, before England lost R. M. Pepper in their first over. However, N. J. Lenham and S. C. Goldsmith held the innings together, enabling them to declare at their overnight total of 259 for seven, in the hopes of being set a realistic target. Australia, though, mindful of their forthcoming "Test", were not so inclined and England were asked to score 294 at approximately 6 an over, towards which Pepper and Stephenson contributed an unbroken opening stand of 120.

Owing to injury and the calls of HMC Schools for their game against Australian Young Cricketers, five changes were made to the ESCA side for their final game at Glasgow against Scotland CU Colts, which had to be won for England to retain the Michael Gerard Trophy. M. A. Roseberry and D. Billington replaced Lenham and Stephenson, M. Roberts kept wicket in place of J. M. Robinson, with A. Dyson and D. Baines also coming into the side. Scotland were bowled out for 166, having collapsed from 122 for two, nine wickets falling to spin, six of them to K. T. Medlycott. England replied with 281 for five, achieving maximum bonus points, with fifties from Roseberry, M. Whitmore and P. A. Redfarn. Medlycott then took four for 41 as Scotland were bowled out again for 158, leaving England to score 44 runs in seventeen overs, of which they needed only 11.4, to bring victory by seven wickets and the Michael Gerard Trophy.

The side's batting was sound: centuries came from Pepper and Stephenson and the gifted Lenham was well supported by Whitmore and Redfarn. The brunt of the bowling was borne by Medlycott (slow left-arm) and W. M. Smith (off-spin), both of whom performed effectively. Medlycott twice took six wickets in an innings and returned ten for 102 against Scotland. The fielding was sound, especially that of Pepper, Goldsmith, Lenham and Whitmore, while Robinson was lively behind the stumps.

A notable performance in 1983 came from the Rendcombe College fast bowler, I. S. Bishop, who also played for NAYC against MCC. He took ten wickets in an innings for 5 runs against Marling GS, who were all out for 17 in reply to Rendcombe's 162 for six.

HMC SOUTHERN SCHOOLS v THE REST

At Eastbourne College, July 16, 17. The Rest won by eight wickets. The pick of the bowlers were Fenton, Barton and Allingham - all fast-medium and with the ability to achieve movement in the air and off the seam. Robinson was outstanding behind the stumps and the batting was dominated by Lenham and Stephenson, while Jenkins battled through sticky patches in both innings and Fell struck the ball cleanly.

Reports from the Schools

Most schools were affected by the appalling weather early in the season, many losing the first six weeks to rain and suffering from lack of outdoor practice. For Abingdon, who beat

Brentwood, UCS Hampstead, Newbury and Pangbourne, the captain, S. J. Rushton, and the wicket-keeper, B. E. Woolley, were the leading batsmen, while T. D. Winter's medium-pace bowling brought him 41 wickets. The ability to bowl out their opponents brought Alldham, who were unbeaten, their most successful record for many years, with wins v Mill Hill, Highgate, Liverpool College, King's School Chester and King William's College, Isle of Man. An inexperienced Allyn's side were let down by brittle batting, too much depending on the captain, C. R. Preston. However, team spirit was excellent and the bowling tight, with C. W. B. Grigg (medium) taking wickets in every game, and left-arm spinners J. M. Nash and R. M. Antoniadis proving a match-winning combination when the wickets became harder. Highlights for Allhallows were consecutive wins v MCC and Bradford GS, as well as a return of eight for 29 by E. R. M. Gard (right-arm fast-medium) against Sir Roger Manwood's.

Ampleforth, who finished the season with victories v Oundle, Blundell's and Uppingham, owed much to the swing bowling of J. N. Perry, who took seven for 13 v Bootham and seven for 40 v Uppingham, and the seam bowling of M. L. Roberts, who returned seven for 25 v Durham and seven for 33 v Sedbergh. The batting was led by C. P. Crossley, supported by R. P. Rigby, who scored the side's only hundred – v Denstone. An innings of 104 not out by A. J. Cardwell was a highlight for Arnold School, who beat RGS Lancaster, King's Macclesfield and Ipswich. Outstanding for Ashville College, who enjoyed a tour to Barbados in March and April, were left-hand bat and wicket-keeper J. C. Lister and left-arm I. D. Hopper, whose 53 wickets were more than twice as many as the next highest.

Bablake, unbeaten by a school for the fifth consecutive year, won the Birmingham and Warwickshire Schools Under-19 Knockout Cup, also for the fifth time running. Their captain, G. M. Charlesworth, later captained Warwickshire Schools Under-19 side. A. Glaznieks was the main bowler, with J. Desai's leg-breaks providing interesting contrast. A young Bancroft's side relied heavily on captain I. P. Debnam with both bat and ball, well supported by D. N. Thurston. The young J. P. Thomas opened the batting all season and made two hundreds, while W. J. Head excelled in the field and P. J. Savage proved a useful right-arm medium bowler. Barnard Castle, also with a young side, were encouraged by winning five matches against schools. Bedford School's season featured wins v Felsted, Campbell College, Belfast and Oundle. Their fielding was again excellent, as was the bowling of C. J. Bell.

Following a successful pre-season tour of Barbados, where five out of nine games were won, Bedford Modern were defeated only once, their seven wins including those v Bishop Vesey's GS, Oakham, Bedford, Oundle and Wolverhampton GS, against whom their leading bowler, P. A. Garratt (off-spin), took eight for 5. Fourteen-year-old A. D. McCartney (fashy right-arm) came into the side late in the season to finish top of the bowling averages and A. Fordham had another excellent season, scoring 133 not out against Stowe and passing 50 on six other occasions. He also appeared for Bedfordshire. In a season of rebuilding, Berkhamsted beat St Lawrence, Framlingham and RGS Colchester. The captain, P. L. Beard, hit a fine 131 not out against St Lawrence, P. A. Brown played some long innings and D. N. Jackson filled a sound supporting role. N. J. S. Cowley (fast medium) was the leading bowler, and the fifteen-year-old S. Hunt (slow left-arm) showed promise. Birkenhead, undefeated, were encouraged by the performance of another fifteen-year-old left-arm, E. N. Kitchen, while off-spinner S. McGowan bowled with admirable control of line and length. Outstanding with the bat were P. J. Sylvester and opener E. R. Hamilton.

The bowling of Bishop's Stortford College, who beat Stamford, relied heavily on G. L. Chapman and G. R. Marsh (both right-arm fast-medium), although they batted in depth and found P. Bashford, still a Colt, a good prospect behind the stumps. T. M. Cooper (fast-medium bowler and opening bat) dominated the averages for Bloxham, for whom E. J. MacLennan was a sound batsman-wicket-keeper and J. Rice an astute captain. Blundell's reported good wins v Downside, Plymouth College and Exeter School. Their captain, M. C. Coe, whose off-breaks brought him 46 wickets, was well supported by A. Kiloh (slow left-arm) with the ball and D. J. Dutton and J. C. Hunt with the bat. Bradfield, in their best season ever, were undefeated, with wins v Charterhouse, Eton, Wellington College, Winchester, Stowe, St Edward's and Westminster. They owed their success to H. J. Norman, the captain and wicket-keeper, as well as to the batting of J. M. Tremellen, who reached his 103 not out v Charterhouse with the winning hit, and the bowling of A. J. Straker (right-arm fast-medium), who took nine for 20 v St Edward's, the other batsman being run out.

A promising **Bradford GS** side were let down by poor fielding and an inability to bowl sides out. T. Welsh and A. M. Broadbent none the less both passed 40 wickets and I. J. McClay showed promise as a left-arm spin bowler. **Brighton**, who reported a successful tour to India at Christmas, won all ten of their matches against schools. N. J. Lenham, with five centuries and an unbeaten 93, was outstanding, his opening partnership of 249 against Eastbourne with A. J. Herbert being a highlight, as was his century before lunch v Cranleigh. In addition, he took the most wickets at medium pace, in a tight attack. **Bristol GS** were encouraged by exciting victories v Cotham GS and Queen's College, Taunton. In a closely fought season, **Bromsgrove** were let down by their lack of consistent batting, although P. J. Humphries (right-arm fast-medium and right-hand bat) proved a useful all-rounder and J. D. Hart's right-arm swing bowling was often accurate.

With wins v Blundell's and Taunton, **Canford** owed much to P. G. Edwards (slow left-arm) and D. G. LeSueur (right-arm fast-medium) for their dismissal of 94 out of a possible 100 opponents in ten matches. M. D. Smith scored nearly twice as many runs as the next batsman, including an unbeaten 137 to win the match v Royal Navy CC. A disappointing season for an experienced **Charterhouse** side featured wins v Tonbridge, Westminster and Rugby, against whom P. D. Newman (left-arm fast), took seven for 28. The advantage of a strong attack, though, was too often squandered by the middle-order batting. A similar weakness characterised the **Cheltenham** side in which the efforts of P. N. Richardson, S. P. E. Churchfield and R. P. W. Thompson, who made 137 not out v Haileybury, were often wasted, and the bowling was unspectacular. Outstanding for **Christ College, Brecon**, who were unbeaten, despite occasionally careless catching, was the captain, S. W. Harvey, who played the side's only three-figure innings and was well supported by two useful young players in N. P. Gibson and P. D. Thomas. In a season of steady improvement, **Christ's Hospital** recorded wins v Cranleigh and Whitgift. A highlight was the batting of T. A. P. Godfrey, who scored more than twice as many runs as anyone else.

Clifton were disappointed by the performance of their young side, for whom J. S. Matthews was consistent with the bat and P. A. Berry showed all-round promise. S. C. Hazlett's lack of application rather restricted his undoubted talent. **Colfe's School** found satisfaction in wins v old rivals Trinity, Croydon and Emanuel, and in the all-round excellence of A. S. Byers, who achieved a "double" of 600 runs and 50 wickets. Also notable was the hard hitting of M. A. Saleemi, whose accurate right-arm seamers brought him seven for 23 v Trinity. K. J. Boxall (left-arm fast-medium) also bowled effectively, and fourteen-year-old C. Spencer showed potential as a batsman, coming into the side late in the season and scoring 101 not out v St Edmund's, Canterbury. With 723 runs in 1983, including a school record 142 v the XL Club, and 600 or more in four successive seasons, W. M. Smith of **Colston's School** achieved a record aggregate of 2,790.

A high point for **Dame Allan's School** was their victory in the Morpeth six-a-side competition. Brittle batting brought a depressing season for **Dauntsey's**, for whom J. Plumtree took eight for 21 v Wycliffe. **Dean Close** ascribed their success to a strong attack featuring P. M. Vincent (in-swing), R. N. Lindsay (right-arm fast) and M. C. A. Forster (left-arm spin). With an attack lacking penetration, despite the efforts of N. Baker (left-arm), A. T. Swales (left-arm chinamen) and R. C. F. Thompson (right-arm), **Denstone** were unable to capitalise on the batting of R. J. Robinson, who made 150 not out v Ampleforth and 96 v Barnard Castle. A tied match v Lancaster RGS and C. D. Chignell's unbeaten 105 v Free Foresters were highlights for **Downside**. With wins v Fettes, Giggleswick, Ashville, RGS Newcastle and St Bees, **Durham's** side was dominated by M. A. Roseberry, who averaged 75.09 with the bat and 8.45 with the ball and against St Bees reached 216 in two hours 40 minutes, a school record. During a summer tour to Barbados, three out of six schools matches were won.

Positive cricket was played by **Eastbourne**, for whom J. R. Prentis (right-arm fast-medium) collected 40 wickets and 811 runs, including 163 not out v The Hague. **Edinburgh Academy**, who beat Watson's, Merchiston Castle and Fettes, passed 200 runs on five consecutive occasions, with A. F. Gunn reaching three figures v Loretto and Denstone. Notable bowling performances came from the captain, G. R. Mawdsley (right-arm medium), who took seven for 20 v Watson's, and M. S. Watt (right-arm fast). For **Elizabeth College, Guernsey**, M. Read and C. Warlow consistently laid a solid foundation for the later batsmen, while J. Mattinson scored runs stylishly, as well as being the main strike bowler (left-arm fast-medium). An inexperienced **Ellesmere** side were encouraged to win their last three matches. The captain, R. T. Millinchip, took the most wickets (right-arm leg-break

and googly). In another fine season, which left **Eltham** unbeaten and winners of the Kent Cup competition, their captain, M. J. Holcombe, set school records of over 2,600 runs and 132 wickets in four years. His brother, B. A. Holcombe, showed promise as an all-rounder, and with W. H. Wright fulfilling his potential, the side felt optimistic for 1984.

With a strong batting side, **Emanuel** won both the London and Surrey Schools knockout competitions for the fourth time in eight years, their victories including those v RGS Guildford, Kingston GS and Tiffin. Their leading batsman was F. Ahmed and the leading bowler T. J. Harmer, who returned nine for 19 v Westminster City School. Convincing wins v St Albans and RGS Colchester were highlights for **Enfield GS**, whose sound fielding and bowling, led by N. Jackett (slow left-arm) and R. Carter (right-arm medium), were let down by inconsistent batting, although R. Eustance scored two centuries. J. R. Ansell and R. M. C. Williams of **Epsom College** featured in two double-century and two century opening stands, Ansell bringing his aggregate for the school to 2,571 runs and Williams his to 2,015. Eton, whose seven victims included Charterhouse, Wellington College, Winchester and KCS Wimbledon, owed their batting strength to J. P. Berry and M. H. Brooks, whose 114 not out v Winchester brought victory in the last over. The attack was spearheaded by the two right-arm fast-medium bowlers, C. E. Pettifer and R. J. F. Luke, who together bowled out KCS Wimbledon for 35, Pettifer taking seven for 13, assisted by six slip catches. In a season of rebuilding, **Exeter** were encouraged by four victories and the promising off-spin bowling of I. D. Hayter.

Felsted achieved five of their six victories batting second, thanks largely to J. P. Stephenson, whose 913 runs included three centuries. A young **Fettes** side had a disappointing season, a tight attack often being frustrated by fragile batting. With wins v Hipperholme GS, Ashville and Loretto, **Giggleswick** owed much to the captaincy of N. C. Westhead, the all-round skills of B. L. Baldwin and the batting of R. M. White, who made 111 v MCC. Outstanding for **Glenalmond**, unbeaten by schools in Scotland, were all-rounder M. H. Alexander (slow left-arm and right-hand bat) and opening bowler J. F. Alexander (in-swing).

The **Haberdashers' Aske's, Elstree** side, carried mainly by all-rounders D. G. Price and A. P. Moulding, improved greatly during the season. A tour of Hong Kong and Singapore was planned for the winter. **Haileybury** were encouraged by the performances of N. R. Venning (left-hand bat) and J. T. Lumley (right-hand bat and right-arm fast-medium in-swing), who were expected to return for another two years. **Harrow**, unbeaten since 1980, achieved convincing wins v Radley and Wellington College, owing much to their captain and all-rounder, J. W. S. Raper. For a young **Hereford Cathedral School** side, promise was shown by P. J. Butler and N. R. Hales with the bat and by N. J. Startin with the ball (left-arm spin). An average season for **Highgate**, in which fifteen-year-old M. G. Griffiths (slow left-arm) took eight for 25 v Old Chalmelians, was followed by a tour to Holland, where three out of five matches were won. **Hurstpierpoint's** eight wins included those v Seaford, Cranleigh, The Hague, Bloxham, King's Taunton and Worksop. Right-arter J. R. C. Lamb led the attack with pace and hostility, and notable performances came from A. P. Subba Row (off-cutters) – seven for 48 v St George's, six for 38 v Bloxham and six for 37 v King's Taunton – and J. N. Rogers (off-spin).

In a mediocre season for **Ipswich**, a highlight was the fast-medium left-arm bowling of S. Priscott, whose 34 wickets included seven for 38 v Framlingham and six for 20 v Culford. Despite their inexperience, enthusiasm brought a young **Kelly College** side their most successful season for some years. Fragile batting was offset by outstanding ground fielding, notably from R. M. Summerell, and a strong attack, led by A. J. Carter and P. G. Shering (both right-arm fast), well supported by J. M. A. Stock, R. P. Edwards (right-arm medium) and off-spinner J. R. Parkhouse. Following a poor start, with eight batsmen failing to score v Stamford, strong team spirit brought success for **Kimbolton**, culminating in their winning the Cowall Cup v Berkhamsted, Framlingham and St Lawrence. Batsmen at **King Edward VI College, Stourbridge**, flourished once the pitches dried out, R. N. Tolley (667) and D. J. Shorter (634) both exceeding the record aggregate set in 1933 and scoring two centuries apiece, Shorter's 131 being a school record. He also captured the most wickets. D. J. Bullock returned nine for 27 on one occasion.

For **King Edward VI School, Southampton**, M. E. O'Connor's record aggregate of 889 runs was more than three times higher than the next. Unbeaten, **King Edward's School, Birmingham**, owed their success to a number of players, six of their side going on to play Young Amateur cricket for Warwickshire and Worcestershire. N. Willetts's 156 v Bablake

included a hundred before lunch. Sixteen-year-old S. D. Heath led the attack with a haul of 58 wickets, ably supported behind the stumps by N. V. Subhedar, who took 23 catches and made twenty stumpings. The captain D. Sewell, who dominated the averages, was the outstanding cricketer for **King Henry VIII School, Coventry**. Although their attack lacked pace, the fourteen-year-old orthodox left-arm spinner, I. D. Harris, showed considerable promise.

The nine wins recorded by **King's College, Taunton**, included those v Wellington School, King's Bruton, Taunton, Allhallows, Blundell's, Worksop and Bloxham. Despite unimpressive fielding, the quicker bowlers did well, R. J. Harden (left-arm medium) taking most wickets as well as averaging over 40 with the bat. He was well supported by three right-arm fast-medium bowlers, A. J. Willson, H. D. Wordsworth and the fifteen-year-old G. K. Barber. Despite the efforts of P. S. Noble, lack of penetration brought a number of frustrating draws for **King's College School, Wimbleton**, for whom J. P. Feltham, aged fifteen, had a promising first season, in which he hit 100 not out v MCC and with his captain, J. H. Frost, who reached 134 not out, put on 193 for the second wicket v The Buccaneers. **King's School, Bruton**, owed their relative success to the leadership and all-round performance of I. C. D. Stuart, as well as to some good out-cricket, particularly the ground fielding of S. H. Maxwell, the slip-catching of D. J. M. Bruce and the wicket-keeping of J. C. Enderby.

In an entertaining season, **King's, Canterbury**, were unbeaten by schools. **King's School, Macclesfield**, however, won only their opening match - v King's School, Chester. For **King's School, Worcester**, R. Jones, J. Mackie and S. Preston all scored useful runs, K. Andrews (slow left-arm) was effective with the ball, and D. Rogers led the side well, his insistence on attacking cricket bringing a sequence of seven victories in eight days at the end of the season. Despite sound fielding, wayward bowling brought a mid-season slump for **King William's College, Isle of Man**, whose leading batsman, S. C. Watson, passed 80 on four occasions. Lack of penetrative bowling also hampered **Kingston GS**, who too often found themselves chasing large totals, despite the efforts of their captain, R. C. Marshall (left-arm seam). S. H. Clayson again dominated the batting, his two centuries including the side's first v MCC (102 not out), whom they beat. An enjoyable tour of Holland was undertaken in August.

In another successful season for **Lancing**, C. S. Mays was outstanding, passing 50 wickets for the second successive season, and scoring more than 600 runs, with 134 v Victoria College, Jersey, and 118 v The Hague, against whom he also took six for 53. **Leeds GS** were encouraged by the success of their young side for whom S. Joyce scored 101 not out v QEGS, Wakefield, and A. F. Tyler, who played for Yorkshire Senior Schools, topped the batting averages. Another pleasing aspect was the success of their spin-bowlers, A. Setia (off-breaks), who collected six for 4 v Bootham School, and G. R. Tyler (leg-breaks and googlies). Well led by C. A. J. Allan, a young and enthusiastic **Leighton Park** side collected six wins. P. D. R. Berridge was the most consistent batsman, although a fourteen-year-old, J. R. Wood, showed considerable promise. C. J. Pye-Smith, left-arm round the wicket and accurate, took the most wickets.

The Leys, who beat Fettes and St Paul's, benefited from the all-round skills of J. D. R. Benson, whose 757 runs included 201 not out v the Headmaster's XI. A disappointing season was reported by **Lord Wandsworth College**, whose leading batsman, A. M. Blows, was selected for the Bedfordshire Under-19 side. For **Lord Williams's School, Thame**, P. M. Jobson, an attacking batsman and right-arm medium bowler, made a significant all-round contribution. **Magdalen College School**, unbeaten, again relied heavily on the all-round talents of M. R. A. Barrow and their captain, S. A. Mendes, who have together scored 2,400 runs and taken 150 wickets in the past two years. Positive cricket, inspired by their captain, A. H. Lewis, brought **Malvern** an enjoyable, if not particularly successful season. R. A. F. Bache blossomed as an opener and N. R. C. Maclaurin could play a punishing innings, while R. G. Fleetwood bowled his out-swingers with enthusiasm and J. M. Davey's off-spin brought him 21 wickets in eight games. The bowlers were well served by athletic and eager fielding, with R. Wothers holding some excellent catches behind the stumps.

For **Manchester GS**, who were unbeaten, M. A. Crawley scored 135 not out v Leeds GS. **Marlborough's** strong batting side, featuring J. T. Burrell, who made 142 v St Edward's, were often frustrated by a wayward attack, in which the most consistent bowler was R. T. Thicknesse, whose orthodox left-arm spin brought him 35 wickets. Having won no matches in 1982, **Merchant Taylors', Crosby**, were encouraged to win four in 1983. Owing to a lack of application, their batting was disappointing, only I. M. Kerr passing 50, but the attack was more encouraging, with L. N. J. Heathcliff-Core (left-arm fast) bowling valiantly and

S. J. Weston (right-arm medium-fast) and S. R. Edgington (left-arm fast) emerging with promise.

Inspired by the example of left-hand opening bat and wicket-keeper D. J. Jenkins, **Merchant Taylors', Northwood**, batted aggressively and entertainingly to defeat Dulwich, Highgate, MCC, Westminster and a touring Under-19 side from Trinidad and Tobago. Owing to a back injury to their captain and fast bowler, A. M. Roberts, the attack lacked penetration, though, and they were beaten for the first time in three years - by RGS Colchester. The batting of **Merchiston Castle** was fragile, relying heavily on I. D. Rose and, later in the season, A. G. Young. The attack was accurate but expensive, although D. F. W. Burn showed promise. **Millfield** reported six wins, including those v Clifton, Downside and Blundell's, as well as narrow defeats by MCC and Sherborne. In a young side, captain P. A. C. Bail was the mainstay with both bat and ball, while J. C. M. Atkinson (also a useful bat) and J. A. Strachan formed a promising opening attack.

Mill Hill, another young side, also recorded six wins, the best being v Stowe, whose last nine wickets fell in 22 minutes, victory coming off the last ball of the match and R. S. W. Roberts returning six for 49. J. M. Cicale became the school's youngest centurion since W. Murray-Wood in 1933 when he scored 100 v Highgate. Left-handed opener A. P. Fussell showed promise for **Monkton Combe**, whose batsmen scored freely but whose attack lacked penetration. **Monmouth**, winners of the Barclays Bank/ESCA Under-17 tournament, owed their success to depth in batting in which S. P. James, captain of the Welsh Under-15 side, scored the most runs. The attack was spearheaded by two slow bowlers, A. J. Kear and D. W. Joseph.

Three-figure innings were played for **Norwich** by N. J. E. Foster and P. D. C. Nicholls, the latter, with 127 not out, being responsible for the victory v Trent College, and leading the attack with J. A. Cooper. Following an uncertain start to the season, **Nottingham HS** achieved six victories, including those v Worksop, William Hulme's GS and Plymouth. A highlight for **Oakham** was their captain, M. Steans's, innings of 178 in one hour 47 minutes before lunch v the XL Club. A disappointing **Oundle** side did not live up to expectations, being easily beaten by Felsted, Rugby and Bedford, although victories came v Stowe, Uppingham and Blundell's.

For **The Perse School**, the prolific J. M. C. Stenner played several fine innings, including 138 not out v RGS Newcastle and 134 not out v The Leys. He was well supported by W. R. Graham, M. Melzer and C. P. Wass, who also bowled aggressively, with R. Hanka, and was missed when injury or illness prevented him playing a full part in some matches. Positive, enjoyable cricket was played by **Pocklington**, for whom R. V. Henderson amassed a school record of 515 runs and 51 wickets. **Plymouth College** had a mediocre season in which J. Chislett captained the side with authority, and A. Dowling and S. Woodward performed usefully with the ball. For **Queen Elizabeth GS, Wakefield**, whose lack of bowling brought eight drawn games, notable debuts were made by J. Swain, who scored two centuries and made 390 runs in nine days, and the fourteen-year-old S. Wood. Lack of consistent batting was a problem for **Queen's College, Taunton**, although with most of a young side returning in 1984, prospects are good.

Radley's strong batting side featured R. C. H. Reed, who scored 111 v St Edward's and topped the averages, with E. J. B. Popplewell, brother of N. F. M., who scored the most runs and did well behind the stumps with 30 dismissals. Although a brisk pace brought R. B. Lagden 42 wickets, the attack often struggled. Outstanding fielding, notably that of all-rounder P. W. Tarimo, and steady bowling for **Ratcliffe College** tended to be let down by brittle batting, although an experienced side had an above-average season. A highlight was C. R. Merriman's 121 not out v Mount St Marys. Excellent team spirit brought an enjoyable season for **Reading School**. The batting of D. G. Purslow was noteworthy, especially his 121 v Abingdon, and captain E. P. O'Leary was competent with both bat and ball (off-spin), scoring 82 and taking five for 50 in the same match v Shiplake.

Reed's School were frustrated by inconsistent batting, several opportunities for victory being missed. A highlight was the defeat of MCC, who lost eight of their wickets for 52 to R. Saddleton (right-arm fast-medium). An inexperienced **Reigate GS** side struggled to find consistency, although they recorded good wins v Emanuel and King Edward VI, Southampton, whom they beat by six wickets, chasing 243 for nine. D. G. C. Downman and the captain, D. R. Cawthorpe, both made centuries, and mature performances in tight situations came from a young all-rounder, P. A. Rowlinson. **Repton**, with nine wins, owed their success to a well-balanced attack, excellent fielding and the consistent left-handed

batting of S. W. Lovell, who averaged more than 100 in his last seven innings. Highlights for **Rossall** were a century by N. V. Salvi v the Old Rossallians, and his stand of 161 with R. I. Kanhai in the same match. **Royal GS, Guildford**, with eight wins, were defeated only once. Notable performances came from J. Perrin, whose 40 wickets included an analysis of seven for 34 v Wimbledon College, and from J. Figuera, a reliable wicket-keeper, who held five catches in the match v Trinity, Croydon. **Royal GS, Newcastle**, owed much to the wicket-keeping of D. Archer, the batting of L. D. Anderson, who made 92 not out and 109 not out in successive matches, and the development of M. Bailey whose thoughtful approach enabled him to build a useful innings and produced a dangerous mixture of right-arm swing and seam bowling. The left-arm spin of R. S. Wise was effective, but the off-spin of the injured S. J. Gill was missed.

With only one defeat by a school and thirteen wins, including the side's first v Bedford Modern, **Royal GS, Worcester**, owed much to the batting of P. Bent, whose 926 runs at an average of 57.87 included three hundreds. The strength of **Rugby's** experienced side was the attack, spearheaded by N. C. W. Fenton – who headed the averages with fast and penetrative bowling, and D. J. Cleverly (right-arm fast-medium), who took the most wickets and also batted usefully. D. P. W. Umbers played an outstanding innings v Oundle, making an unbeaten 181 out of 236 for five. A successful **Rydal** side, who won their first five matches, relied heavily for their runs on C. Robinson and left-hander J. T. Owen, while the attack was led by R. Williams (right-arm medium) and J. M. Sherrington (slow left-arm).

With strong teamwork, a balanced attack and pride in their fielding, **St Dunstan's** won five matches in succession v Colfe's, Sutton Valence, Judd, Highgate and the XL Club. Their most successful player was S. J. Cross, who headed both batting and bowling averages. Their middle order being prone to collapse, **St Edward's, Oxford**, relied heavily on D. A. Soper, who made 100 not out v Oundle. He also provided valuable support (right-arm medium) for R. N. C. Franklin (left-arm chinamen and googlies), whose 47 wickets included a match-winning return of seven for 63 v Cheltenham. In a strong **St George's, Weybridge**, side, T. J. O'Gorman equalled a 50-year-old record of five centuries, while J. W. P. Jones and R. Garland formed an effective opening partnership. Keen fielding backed up varied and accurate bowling, which featured A. J. Woodhead (slow left-arm), P. J. Davis (fast-medium) and A. P. Jansen (medium). A valuable contribution from each member of the side brought success to **St John's, Leatherhead**, who were unbeaten.

St Lawrence, Ramsgate, depended for their batting on P. R. Hobercraft, with S. W. Cook and N. A. Crush, who scored the side's only century. G. G. Philpott, aged fifteen, and J. M. G. Barber shared most of the bowling, but the efforts of the captain, Hobercraft, were often let down by poor catching. The all-round strength of **St Peter's, York**, was epitomized by their captain, S. R. Gorman (opening bat and off-spinner), A. Forman (fast) and S. P. A. Burdass (left-hand bat and wicket-keeper). They were unbeaten, as were **Sedbergh**, whose sound team-work brought victories v Stonyhurst, Rossall, RGS Newcastle and William Hulme's GS. Sedbergh's high standard of fielding was maintained, J. E. K. Wilson excelling behind the stumps.

A disappointing season for **Sevenoaks**, who none the less beat King's, Rochester and Catterham, was brightened by the emergence of the sixteen-year-old J. D. Mitchell as wicket-keeper-batsman, and the right-arm fast-medium bowling of A. J. Preston, as well as by a return of six for 38 v Maidstone GS by A. J. Bell. Discipline and determination as well as a high standard of fielding characterised the cricket played by **Sherborne**, who were beaten only by Radley, their seven wins including convincing defeats of Cheltenham and Haileybury during their end-of-term festival. Never bowled out, yet dismissing the opposition on twelve occasions, **Shrewsbury** won thirteen matches and lost none. R. J. P. Burton, an outstanding captain, became the first Salopian to achieve a school career "double" of 1,000 runs and 100 wickets. I. J. F. Hutchinson scored three centuries and was well supported by A. D. Hobson and D. J. Pollock, while R. P. Holt collected 51 wickets, backed up by excellent fielding.

Highlights for **Sir Roger Manwood's** were a tied match v St Edmund's, Canterbury, when M. I. A. Howell took seven for 25, and the all-round excellence of G. W. Laslett (right-arm medium). Following a tour to Australia at Christmas, **Stamford** were encouraged to beat Kimbolton, Deacon's, Peterborough and Bishop's Stortford. In the match v an MCC side containing G. Boycott, a stand of 201 between G. M. Canham and N. J. Tyers brought victory with an over to spare. R. P. Alston (right-arm seam) and Tyers (left-arm spin) took most wickets in an otherwise disappointing attack. **Stowe** were let down by weak middle-

order batting, although the young attack looked promising. **Strathallan**, unbeaten by schools, owed much to captain M. J. de G. Allingham whose 551 runs at 91.83 included three hundreds. An inexperienced **Sutton Valence** side, frustrated by fragile batting, owed much to captain R. D. Coate, who bowled quite quickly to take the most wickets, and also scored the most runs.

For **Taunton School**, who recorded convincing wins v King's Bruton, Blundell's and Queen's Taunton, three players reached three figures and J. C. Pike did the hat-trick v MCC. In the absence of fast bowlers, **Tiffin** did well to win six matches, owing much to their orthodox left-arm spinners, M. R. Coote and W. Shermer. No batsman was outstanding, but useful contributions were made right down the order and the captain, N. A. Legg, made the most of his slender resources. Following an early loss to Charterhouse, **Tonbridge** beat Sevenoaks, Lancing, Wellington College and Clifton. Their strength came from depth in batting and the development of their captain, A. D. H. Grimes, into a penetrating opening bowler. With 901 runs, N. W. F. Redwood was the leading batsman for **Trinity School, Croydon**, who won eight matches and were beaten by only one school. Other batsmen lacked consistency, although P. J. Smith made 112 not out v St Benedict's. Of the bowlers P. D. Bone (right-arm) and B. S. Lees (right-arm leg-spin) took most wickets, with Redwood's leg-spin also proving effective. In a season of mixed fortunes, **Truro** benefited from the all-round contribution of their captain, D. C. Aldwinckle, well supported by the opening batsmen, T. W. R. Scott and left-hander A. J. Jones. **Uppingham**, in a season of rebuilding, achieved wins v Oakham, Rugby, Blundell's and Oundle.

Victoria College, Jersey, owed their success to a strong batting line-up, headed by their captain, W. Jenner, who passed 1,000 runs for the second successive season, including four centuries. Other three-figure innings came from P. L. Lalor (two) and D. A. Oliver. An opening partnership of 197 v Elizabeth College between Jenner and A. J. Sugden was a school record. Inability to bowl out the opposition brought ten drawn games for a young **Warwick** side, who were none the less unbeaten, with wins v MCC and Solihull. N. C. B. Robinson was an astute captain and the mainstay of the batting, which had depth but lacked quality. S. J. Holdsworth developed promisingly as a right-arm out-swing bowler. Inconsistent batting hindered **Wellingborough**, who beat Alleyn's and Lord Williams's School, with M. Griffiths the leading bowler. A young **Wellington College** side, who beat Stowe, Bedford and Haileybury, were encouraged by the promise of the young G. D. Reynolds, who came into the side in mid-season and topped the batting averages. For **Wellington School**, who played only six matches, no batsman totalled 100 runs.

Early batting disasters unsettled the batsmen of **Westminster**, until the end of the season when R. J. Levy made an aggressive century v Free Foresters. However, the bowling and fielding were always good, with the leading bowler, T. E. Lunn, proving a competent captain. Inconsistent batting brought a mediocre season for **Whitgift**, for whom S. Talbot (right-arm fast-medium) bowled effectively. Despite some erratic performances, a young **William Hulme's GS** side beat Hulme GS, Oldham and Loughborough GS, against whom the leg-spinner, N. R. Fairfax, returned seven for 58, while I. D. Thorpe (right-arm fast) took six for 28 v Stockport GS. Of the batsmen, A. G. Cleary (left-hand) opened competently and P. T. Fearnley showed promise, putting on 150 for the second wicket with his captain, J. D. Sealy, who showed great skill in the field.

Sound team performances brought **Winchester** nine wins, including those v Charterhouse, Felsted, Eastbourne, Clifton and the Hampshire Schools, to equal the record of the Nawab of Pataudi's side in 1959. Left-arm spinner J. D. Dean took 58 wickets and I. L. M. Henry made a valuable all-round contribution. C. N. N. Smith and the captain, W. E. J. Holland, scored plenty of runs. **Woodbridge**, beaten by only one school, were encouraged by the emergence of promising young players S. Bacon and M. Whitehead (off-spin). In their best season ever, **Woodhouse Grove** were unbeaten with eight wins, including those v Leeds GS, Bradford GS, Hipperholme GS and Giggleswick. Their strength lay in the all-round ability of their captain, S. A. J. Kippax (leg-spin), and the brothers Percy, A. G. averaging a remarkable 4.93 with the ball.

Despite their youth, **Wrekin** recorded three wins and were encouraged by the success of their captain, R. P. Mitchell (right-arm fast), with the ball in the second half of the season. Weak middle-order batting brought **Wycliffe** their first defeats by schools – Dean Close and Dauntsey's – since 1980. The exception was J. R. Bodington's innings of 116 in 74 minutes v Hereford Cathedral School. The attack was strong, slow left-armed S. L. Thomas being potentially very good, R. B. Hair (seam) showing admirable control and R. J. Boulton, Bodington and S. J. Shorthose all making useful contributions.
