After the Oxford Festival and the match at Lord's against NAYC, the representative English Schools programme was limited to one game, the fixture v Wales at Headingley being abandoned without a ball bowled. M. A. Roseberry captained the side at Lord's, where he scored two centuries for the second successive year, before moving on to join Middlesex. The captaincy was taken over by M. A. Atherton, whose quietly astute leadership was as significant as were his sound batting and well-controlled leg-spin. Other batsmen to attract notice were D. G. Hodgson, J. D. R. Benson, P. D. Atkins and R. J. Bartlett, who won the Len Newbery Gray-Nicolls Award for the most improved schoolboy cricketer. The leading fast bowler was M. A. Robinson-who was outstanding against Scotland – while A. G. J. Fraser and J. C. M. Atkinson provided sound support. Atherton's spin was supplemented by the off-breaks of P. J. Berry. Supported by an excellent wicket-keeper in W. K. Hegg, the fielding was good, Benson receiving the A. A. Thomson fielding prize of the Cricket Society.

Asked to bat first in the game against Scottish CU Colts at West of Scotland Ground, English Schools began well through Bartlett (67) and Atkins (34), who put on an opening partnership of 110, which was followed by another century stand in 55 minutes from Hodgson (47) and Benson (56). In reply to English Schools' total of 255 for nine in 60 overs, Scotland were then dismissed for 73, thanks to some hostile bowling from Robinson, who took eight for 35 in sixteen overs. Following on, the home side lost two more wickets to Robinson as they collapsed to 38 for five. A spirited stand of 57 between J. Williams (30) and M. Smith (32), before Atherton polished off the tail, brought some respectability and a total of 120, which left English Schools the winners by an innings and 62 runs.

The first MCC Schools Festival at Oxford was an undoubted success; for four days, positive cricket of a high standard was played in an excellent spirit. On the first two days, HMC Southern Schools played The Rest while ESCA North played ESCA South. On the third day all 44 players were rearranged into two further trial games, and on the fourth day a final trial – MCC Schools East v West – was played with the best 22, after which the MCC Schools XI for Lord's was chosen.

## HMC SOUTHERN SCHOOLS v THE REST

At New College, Oxford, July 20, 21. Drawn. Rain, which interrupted the first day, left a damp pitch, on which the bowlers dominated throughout, only Bartlett and, briefly, Hussain of the Southern Schools batsmen looking at all comfortable in their first innings. The Rest found the going even harder against first Robinson then the spinners, Harding and Heath. After Atherton's declaration 53 behind, the medium pace of Pethers and the spin of Cox and Atherton reduced Southern Schools to 77 for six before a fine partnership between Speight and Bartletthe latter played better than anyone – enabled O'Gorman to set a target of 252 in 190 minutes. Although the wicket had eased, only Foster and Atherton could master the spin attack, and once they had gone, off successive balls from Harding (the pick of the bowlers), no-one else lasted long until Pethers and Bashford survived the last six overs.

After a sound start to South's second innings by Atkins and Earl, Roseberry introduced occasional bowlers in the hope of encouraging the declaration, which eventually set a target of 191 in 130 minutes. North made a valiant but unavailing effort to score the runs, Hodgson heading the chase.

Reports from the Schools: The dismal weather in 1985 caused a number of schools matches to be abandoned and curtailed many more. The batsmen generally struggled, only N. A. Stanley of Bedford Modern passing 1000 runs (1,042 at 65.12) from among the schools reviewed here. The bowlers, however, mospered, eight taking 60 wickets and Matthew Taylor, of Enfield GS, collecting 73 at 10.61. The leading all-rounders were N. Hussain of Forest School, with 978 runs and 48 wickets, and

C.M. Graham of Victoria College, Jersey, with 758 runs and 60 wickets. A Combined Public Schools of Western Australia party toured here during the summer and provided strong opposition wherever they played.

Abinedon attributed their unbeaten record to a strong team spirit, inspired by the sound captaincy of M. A. Marsden, and an outstanding attack, led by J. S. Hutchison (medium rightamin-swing) - whose 46 wickets included a return of eight for 25 v Radley - and the slow leftam spin of M. C. Cox, who took 53 wickets. J. C. P. Haynes established a reliable opening partnership with M. T. Boobbyer, whose 965 runs were more than twice the next highest. Roobbyer's four centuries included three in five days. Aldenham's best players were N. A. Fenn, who made two hundreds, and left-arm spinner D. J. Stenning, who took 48 wickets. Both are expected to return in 1986, as are ten of the Alleyn's side, who were perhaps too reliant on their captain, J. Bridgeman. C. O'Gorman showed promise as a fast bowler and A. Stevens and S. Naish played some responsible innings. Allhallows ended the season in style, winning three out of four matches on a Kent tour, after earlier disappointments. Unreliable middle-order batting failed to capitalise on the efforts of W. R. Frost, and the bowlers generally lacked form, the exception being the captain, E. R. M. Gard, whose 45 wickets took his tally over the past two seasons to more than 100.

After losing six matches, Ampleforth dropped two senior members, whereupon their fortunes changed. The spinners, B. R. Simonds-Gooding and J. G. Cummings, began taking wickets, and the fourteen-year-old R. Booth showed promise as a wicket-keeper as well as sharing in a ninth-wicket partnership of 80 with Simonds-Gooding v Blundell's. In a moderate season a young Ardingly side lacked consistency with the bat, although seventeen fifties were shared by six batsmen, and support for the right-arm medium pace of J. E. K. Henderson. Twelve players with first-team experience should be available in 1986. For Arnold, another with a young side, highlights were centuries by A. D. Lyon and a fourteen-year-old, A. D. Jones. Lyon's 124 not out vKing William's College, Isle of Man, was the highest for the school for many years.

Injuries to key players hampered Bablake, whose attack often lacked penetration. Their leading bowler was the off-spinner, D. J. Barr. D. C. Percival, often unavailable owing to injury, played for Warwickshire Under-19, together with the wicket-keeper, N. A. Matkin, and A.M. J. Kearns. The latter, whose three centuries were a school record, shared in an unbroken partnership of 222 with Percival against King Henry VIII, Coventry. In a season of rebuilding, Bancroft's owed much to their captain and opening bat, J. P. Thomas, and the all-rounder, K. R. Gold, who bowled his off-breaks to good effect and was an excellent fielder. R. W. Hubbard, a medium-pace bowler and opening batsman, took eight for 15 v Enfield GS, and promise was shown by V. D. Masani with the bat and N. K. Patel with the new ball. A successful season for Bangor GS culminated in a tour which featured a win v Stockport GS and exciting draws v Amold and King's, Macclesfield. The captain, C. M. McCall, an astute tactician, represented Irish Schools, as did R. B. Millar, who also kept wicket for the Irish Under-19 side in Bermuda.

Unbeaten with sixteen wins in 21 matches, Barnard Castle School batted well down the order and possessed an attack capable of bowling out most sides. D. W. T. McGarr and R. J. Irving both took 50 wickets, while the captain, S. G. Foster, enjoyed a good all-round season. For Bedford School there were convincing and satisfying wins v St Edward's, Felsted and Wellington. At other times, though, the fielding was unreliable and the batting prone to collapse, J. E. Crooker was the outstanding bowler with 45 wickets, while C. J. Honan scored Moturns. Bedford Modern School recorded victories v Kimbolton, Wellingborough, Ardingly, Slowe, Bedford School (by ten wickets) and Royal GS, Colchester. The match v Oundle was drawn with the scores level. The captain, N. A. Stanley, dominated the batting with 1,042 runs and was well supported by T. J. F. Hill and A. J. Trott, while P. A. Owen took 69 wickets at an average of 10.14 with slow left-arm spin, collecting five in an innings on six occasions, including seven for 67 v Oundle.

In a somewhat undistinguished season, Berkhamsted beat Magdalen College School, Framlingham and St Lawrence. P. A. Brown, the captain, was the leading batsman, with two centuries, and the attack relied heavily on S. P. Hunt (slow left-arm) and M. A. Hodges (right-arm medium). **Birkenhead** had one of their least distinguished seasons for many years. The batting, apart from the left-handed opener, A. R. Wilby, was sadly lacking in sound technique and application, and the bowling, without variety from an experienced spin bowler, was too predictable. In a memorable season, the young side at **Bishop's Stortford** – runners-up to Millfield in the Barclays Bank Under-17 competition – lost only to Ipswich, defeating The Perse, Brentwood, Monkton Combe, Dean Close and Ardingly, as well as tying with King Edward's, Bath, both sides being bowled out for 59. This was the school's first tie as far as can be remembered. L. S. P. Fishpool, an outstanding off-spinner, took seven for 16 against King Edward's and thoughout the season, during which he also scored the most runs, he was ably supported by the fifteen-year-old P. E. B. Armitage (leg-spin), S. R. Hartnell (slow left-arm) and A. M. Reynolds (medium). The excellent wicket-keeping of P. Bashford set the standard for a first-class fielding side. A tour of Sri Lanka was planned for the Christmas holiday.

Outstanding for Blundell's was the slow left-arm bowler, R. K. Giles, who, with 55 wickets. took more than twice as many as anyone else. B. A. Barwell scored 148 v King's, Taunton, and wins were recorded v Downside, Oundle, Plymouth and Uppingham. For Bradfield College, who had convincing wins v Westminster, Canford and Charterhouse, a highlight was A.J. Goodsir's return of six for 32 v Wellington College. Positive and entertaining cricket brought Bradford GS a record thirteen wins, including those v St Peter's York, Bristol GS, Hymer's College, Bolton School and Woodhouse Grove. With more than 4,000 runs scored, their strength lay in the batting, P. A. Greenwood, C. E. Nichols and R. M. Nichols setting the platform for the fast-scoring A. A. D. Gillgrass and G. M. Bentley. The attack, headed by M. E. Joy (medium), was accurate but less effective than had been hoped, the left-arm spinner, I.J. McClay, failing to find the consistency of the previous two seasons. Brentwood, whose bowlers had difficulty taking wickets on slow pitches and whose batting generally struggled, were nevertheless encouraged by centuries from R. S. Newman in the win v Framlingham and from the promoted J. G. Northwood in the final match v the Old Boys. Pre-eminent for Brighton College was D. J. Panto, whose 62 wickets included nine for 17 v Christ's Hospital, eight for 4v Worth and seven for 68 v Epsom. Bromsgrove, unbeaten by schools but with ten drawn games, were especially satisfied to beat King Edward's School, Birmingham, for the first time since 1969. In their most successful season for 30 years, Bryanston owed much to consistency in batting, led by the left-handed G. Ecclestone, who headed both batting and bowling averages. With N. Goodenough-Bayly and J. Beale, he formed a penetrative attack which claimed 121 wickets between them.

A young Canford side were encouraged by wins v King's Taunton and Combined Public Schools of Western Australia who, needing 3 to win with three wickets in hand, were beaten by 1 run. R. J. Stearn (medium) took six wickets for 55 against the Western Australians and eight for 71 against Blundell's. Much promise was shown by the young left-hander, C. H. Forward who topped 500 runs in his first season. Well led by S. R. A. Miles, Caterham recorded notable victories v Kingston GS, Trinity, Sevenoaks, St Dunstan's and Reigate GS. The side's highest score of 116 not out came from the left-hander P. J. Sidall, while the fourteen year-old A. D. Brown made two centuries and was the leading bowler, five times taking five wickets in an innings, including seven for 24 v Trinity. Another fine return was the left-am opener, S. G. Randall's seven for 55 v Rutlish. It was a disappointing season in terms of results for a young Charterhouse side. B. T. A. Holdsworth collected the most runs in his first year and fourteen-year-old A. T. Grundy scored the side's only other hundred. Cheltenham College reported their best results for more than ten years, with wins v Marlborough, Malvem (bowled out for 55), Shrewsbury, against whom J. T. Morgan made an unbeaten century, and Clifton, who were bowled out for 116, thanks to a return of six for 18 by O. G. Davies, P.D. Richardson, with his attacking fast bowling and powerful batting, led the side by example

In a mixed season for Chigwell School, highlights were a 162-run victory v Buckhurst Hill County HS, the defeat of The Perse, who were bowled out for 59 by the fast bowling of D.J. Clark and P. W. Hutchings, and a second-wicket partnership of 125 in the win over Brentwod between A. J. Lee and J. R. Maskey, who captained the side well. A young Christ College Brecon, side exceeded all expectations, and were beaten only by a strong Old Boys side. The captain, J. W. Lewis, set an aggressive example in the field and batted powerfully and purposefully, his two unbeaten hundreds including 107 out of 140 in the nine-wicket defeat of Monmouth. Sound performances also came from the opening batsman, S. J. Harrett, and from S. J. Thomas, while with the ball D. O. Lloyd-Jones took seven wickets in a match three times A young Clifton College side, whose batting tended to be brittle, fared better than their record

might suggest, playing many close matches. A highlight was W. M. I. Bailey's unbeaten 107 gainst Felsted; batting at No. 7, he rescued the side from 48 for seven, enabling them to declare a 114 for nine. The attack was sound, excellent performances by M. C. H. Jones and A. A. R. Niven almost bringing about remarkable victories v Marlborough – who, needing 113, were reduced to 74 for eight – and Cheltenham, who recovered from 98 for nine to achieve a target of 117.

Losing only one schools match and reaching the final of the Kent Under-19 Cup, Colfe's owed beir success to the free scoring of the openers, C. A. Spencer and J. Waddell, ably supported by the forcful strokeplay of the captain, M. A. Saleemi. An inexperienced attack depended too muchon K. J. Boxall who, with Spencer and Saleemi, played for Kent Under-19. Another side don't of bowling were Colston's, who beat Monkton Combe and Prior Park, but often failed to captailise on good positions won by their batsmen. J. N. Stutt scored three centuries, bringing his total for the First XI to eight. Cranleigh enjoyed an encouraging season, during which they stablished a schools' cricket festival, inviting Merchant Taylors', Northwood, Bryanston, Rossall and St Peter's, York. S. J. Watkinson (medium) took 54 wickets, surpassing the previous best since the last war (49), achieved by N. A. Paul in 1953, and including eight for 21 v St low's, Leatherhead, seven for 49 v King's, Canterbury, and six for 39 v Rossall, all of whom were beaten. He was well supported by I. Z. Khan and the colt, R. G. Gutteridge.

In a season of mixed fortunes, in which only one match of seventeen was drawn, **Dame Allan's** shool bowled out Ponteland HS for 55 (A. J. Silversides 5–1–9–4), having earlier in the season temselves been dismissed for 29 by St Cuthbert's. The playing record of **Dauntsey's**, for whom 1001, J. Porter, emerged as a promising opening batsman, and whose attack was spearheaded by J. M. Alexander (fast-medium), shows a preponderance of draws, a number of which were the product of conservative declarations. **Dean Close**, fielding an inexperienced side, were pleasantly surprised by their results. The team was built around K. B. Hemshall (in-swing), who led the attack with M. H. Paget-Wilkes, as well as captaining the side and batting at No. 3. I. A. Edginton showed promise both as a batsman and slow left-arm bowler, while P. J. Kirby emerged to play some useful innings. The fortunes of **Denstone** faded somewhat after a promising start, but they did enjoy a close win v the Western Australian Public Schools side.

Downside beat Royal GS, Lancaster, and Strathallan at the latter's festival, and compiled 286 for four in beating Taunton by six wickets. In a disappointing season for **Dulwich**, whose young side struggled, only R. F. Parker batted consistently, while the bowling rested heavily on the shoulders of the left-arm spinner, I. C. Tredgett, whose 48 wickets included eight for 43 v Mill Hill. For **Durham**, unbeaten by schools for the third successive year, their outstanding captain, M. A. Roseberry, was available only rarely, yet he scored more runs than anyone else, at an average of 65.50, and fittingly made 104 in his last innings for the school. He captained MCC schools and NCA Young Cricketers at Lord's, ending his career as a schoolboy with a century there to take his total at headquarters to four. He also played for Durham and in the John Player Lague for Middlesex. His brother, the fourteen-year-old A. Roseberry, followed him in the shool's batting averages.

Rain and the inability of the bowling to dismiss opposing sides brought an exceptional number of drawn games for Eastbourne College. The wicket-keeper, F. J. Westlake, was the Outstanding batsman, his 120 v St John's, Leatherhead, being a solid, impressive innings. Also totable was the performance of J. J. R. A. Harley, the side's leading bowler (medium), who made III and took five for 10 v Ardingly. For two of their four wins, The Edinburgh Academy were indebted to M. B. Holmes (fast-medium away-swing), who took nine for 33 v Merchiston Castle and seven for 19 v Abbot Beyne. Elizabeth College, Guernsey, played some exciting dawn games, notably that v St George's, Weybridge. Promising young players were P. J. woods with the bat and R. P. C. Cox (fast-medium) with the ball, while M. J. Bacon (leg-spin) and A. B. Howe (off-spin) had their moments. F. N. Stratford, able to play for only half the Rason, none the less topped both batting and bowling averages. Ellesmere, without a win, loked too often to their captain, J. Holmes, whose aggregate of 723 runs was a school record and more than twice as many as the next highest. A. R. L. Stubbs bowled his off-spinners to sod effect, and with more support the results might have been more favourable. Outstanding or Eitham College was the captain and left-arm spin bowler, R. J. Hart, who scored 707 runs and look 61 wickets, including seven for 30 v Claysmore. L. A. O'Leary was a consistent opener, and other centuries were scored by A. J. Prifti and N. D. A. Baxter, while the fifteen-year-old I.A. Chase showed considerable all-round promise.

Less successful were Emanuel, with only one win – v Latymer Upper. Their side was built around C. Noble, who totalled 64 wickets at 9.78 and scored 600 runs, including 78 and seven for 21 v Trinity. The Enfield GS XI was dominated by the Taylor brothers, Matthew (fast-medium) establishing a record for the school with 73 wickets, including eight for 27 v Latymer Upperant seven for 39 v Bancroft's, while Malcolm was the leading batsman with 679 runs. The captain of Epsom College, G. J. R. Corcoran, totalled 910 runs, including an unbeaten 139 out 170 v Brighton College. Other highlights were J. B. Appleton's return of seven for 55 v the Grasshoppers and A. C. R. Davidson's 167 not out v The Hague CC on a tour to the Netherlands. A well-balanced Eton side, unbeaten by schools, relied successfully on a medium-pace seam attack to dismiss opposing sides and victories were recorded v St Edward's Oxfod Wellington College, Marlborough and Harrow, against whom F. N. Bowman-Shaw returned seven for 38 at Lord's. In a season of rebuilding, Exeter's young side provided much encouragement for the future, the only defeat by a school being at the hands of Queri, Taunton. The 659 runs amassed by F. O. S. MacDonald were thought to be a school record, and the continually improving fast bowling of M. C. Jacquiss brought him 40 wickets.

Schools Cricket in 1985

For Fettes J. Ellworthy performed a hat-trick and M. Adam twice took three wickets in four balls, but the brittleness of the batting meant that a competent attack rarely had a substantial total to defend and the final record was the worst for many years. A wealth of outstanding performances was recorded by Forest School, for whom the captain, M. D. I. Sheppard, and Hussain were by far the most prolific batsmen. Sheppard hit three hundreds and averaged 76.00; Hussain made two, falling only 22 short of 1,000 runs for the second successive season; and together they put on an opening stand of 237 v St Edmunds, Canterbury. Hussain's leg-spin brought him 41 wickets, including seven for 27 v Brentwood and seven for 86 v Combined Public Schools of Western Australia.

The captain of Giggleswick, M. T. Howard, was a dependable opening batsman, and their leading bowler, A. J. Fowler, went on to open the bowling for Yorkshire Schools Senior XI.Au unbeaten Glasgow Academy XI batted in depth, the openers, M. S. Robertson and G. G. H. Gemmell, laying a solid foundation on which A. G. M. Baird and wicket-keeper-batsman G. B. A. Dyer could build. E. J. Miller and D. H. K. Robbins laboured hard for little rewards medium pace, while G. G. R. Gemmell bowled economically to top the averages. Three from Glenalmond – G. M. Sommerville, L. M. Porter and A. E. Kennedy – played for Scoland Under-19, which was captained by the school's captain of 1983, J. Sutton. Wins came v Fetts. Merchiston Castle and Strathallan, with J. A. Higgins the pick of the emerging young batsman. A young Gresham's side was built around the all-round skills of their captain, J. Lewis, who was well supported with the ball by R. Jackson and T. Berwick. The batting was again brittle.

Dominant at Haberdashers' Aske's, Elstree, was their captain, R. Bate, who had a fine season with the bat. A tour to Devon was undertaken in the summer, with a tour to the Far East planned for Christmas. Superb ground fielding and excellent catches lifted the performance of an experienced Haileybury XI, whose captain, N. R. Venning, led a solid batting line-up.I. Lumley (in-swing) spearheaded the attack, with good support from R. R. W. Bonallack (less spin). Batting in depth, with four centuries scored, Hampton School were defeated only once The bowling acquired greater edge as the season progressed, the left-arm spin of J. P. Shephed again proving effective. The fielding was keen, notably that of S. J. Eggleton and A. P. Hod, while S. J. Young was tidy and agile in his first season behind the stumps. Also good in the field. Harrow achieved some of their eight victories by wide margins, notably those v Haileybur(by eight wickets), Winchester (seven wickets) and Charterhouse (an innings and 108 runs). Their strength lay in the seam bowling of D. B. M. Fox and J. J. Pethers, who returned eight for 33 charterhouse and six for 87 in the thrilling match v Eton at Lord's.

A young Hereford Cathedral School side was well led by P. J. Butler, who batted consistently if less prolifically than anticipated, while promise was shown by N. R. Denny with the bat and A. M. Herbert (fast-medium) with the ball. Highgate struggled to achieve their three wins, their progress being limited by the batsmen's inability to dominate, especially on the lifeless home pitches. Although the attack was steady, the only noteworthy return was six for 20 v Old Cholmelians by the young D. N. Amato, who emerged as a fine all-round prospet. For a young Hipperholme GS side, carefully captained by D. Smith, W. Clarke and M. Kirkbride confirmed with the bat the promise they had shown as colts, and I. Crabtree beams the first player in at least 25 years to carry his bat for the school. With contributions from all their players, Hurstpierpoint beat Ardingly, Seaford, Cranleigh, Bloxham, Sussex Clerg, Sussex Martlets and MCC. The captain, M. P. Speight, who made the major contribution with the bat, played for NCA England South in Bermuda. A tour to India was planned for Christmas.

Highlights for Ipswich School were wins v Bishop's Stortford, Framlingham and Brighton follege, J. J. Zagni (slow left-arm) topped both averages, followed by N. J. Gregory and R. J. Reales with the bat and S. Young (off-spin) with the ball. N. Barrett kept well to the spin bowlers and nine catches were held at short leg by P. Finch. Kelly College's fragile middle- and lowerorder batting too often failed to capitalise on useful individual performances, the best of which RESP. G. Shering's 107 v Plymouth College, and their attack, though accurate, rarely troubled md batsmen. The absence of a safe catcher in the slips proved a handicap. None the less, seven victories were recorded. Kimbolton School, who won the Berkhamsted festival, were ably led by A.N. Caswell, whose bowling, decidedly quick, proved too much for schoolboy batsmen once niches became harder. The left-handed opening batsman, G. J. Kerr, established a school record with his aggregate of 712 runs at 47.46. An enthusiastic but inexperienced King Edward VI College, Stourbridge, XI was carried by C. M. Tolley, although there was potential in the howling of B. Darby (medium) and G. D. Tomkins (slow left-arm). In a successful season for King Edward VI School, Southampton, the batting of the captain, G. J. M. Cottrell, and the opener, R. S. Mayhew, was supplemented by accurate bowling. J. E. Shepherd collected a school record of 56 wickets with his off-breaks.

Victory at the excellently organised UCS festival rounded off a rewarding season for King Edward VII School, Lytham, in which they defeated Burnley GS, Cowley, Batley GS, Stockport 68, Sir John Deannes College, UCS London and Solihull. Prominent for King Edward's School, Bimingham, were the captain, N. A. Willetts (slow left-arm), who headed both averages, S. D. Hath (opening bat and leg-breaks) and the No. 3 batsman, N. Martin, who between them sored 2,378 runs and took 100 wickets. Big wins were recorded v Wrekin (by 218 runs) and Shihull (eight wickets), although some of the best games resulted in draws. For King Henry VIII School, Coventry, in a moderate season, the major contribution with the bat came from A. G. Dow, in his first year in the XI. The attack often had trouble achieving a breakthrough, although N. A. Ansari (seven for 43 v RGS Worcester), and the captain, D. C. Bridges, enjoyed some good returns.

Inconsistent batting restricted the wins of King William's College, Isle of Man, to those v Sockport, King's School Chester – against whom S. W. Ellis (medium) took seven for 33 and scred 71 – and Liverpool College, who were dismissed for 38, seven of the wickets falling for 25 ms to A. J. Corlett (left-arm medium-fast). A similar problem handicapped King's College, Taunton, who had wins v Queen's Taunton, Sherborne, Downside and the XL Club. H. D. W. Wordsworth (medium) was the best bowler and achieved a record for the school of 52 wickets, including nine for 64 v Taunton School. N. P. Barnett was the leading batsman for King's College School, Wimbledon, hitting a fine century v Epsom College, while the captain, J. P. Felham, bowled with fire and received good support from his fellow opening bowler, S. P. Gibson, and the off-spinner, R. M. Wight. Beaten only by MCC – by 7 runs – King's School, Buton, attributed their success to the hostile seam attack of the left-armer, S. J. Griffin, who wok eight for 25 v Canford, and M. A. Walton, effectively backed up by the left-arm spin of C.G. Cowell. The tactical appreciation of the captain, J. Cassell, was good, and his three canturies provided a solid foundation for rather suspect batting. The ground fielding was keen, although the catching did not reach the same standard.

With eight wins, and defeats only by Cranleigh and MCC, The King's School, Canterbury, founded their XI on the skills of three young players –J. P. Taylor, opening batsman and swing towler; the No. 3 batsman, M. B. Ryeland, whose medium-fast bowling brought him the most wickets; and the opening batsman, P. P. Lacamp, who made 574 runs in his first season. Fine tam performances under the all-round example of S. A. Tonks characterised the season for King's School, Chester, for whom A. J. Martin reached three figures twice and a newcomer, D. B. Claringbold, took the most wickets. Never bowled out, yet dismissing the opposition swent times, The King's School, Ely, were unbeaten in a record season, their eleven wins including those v Gresham's, K imbolton and The Leys, the last coming in the final of the County Schools Under-19 competition. The attack was spearheaded by two hostile opening towlers, J. R. G. Bouverie and M. E. V. Gallop, while the leading run-scorers were the captain, M. G. D. Chamberlain, and the hard-hitting K. Worrall.

Excellent fielding and several all-round contributions brought success for The King's School, Macdesfield, who recorded victories v Arnold, Blackpool (twice), Bolton, Stockport GS, Birkenhead, Bury GS and Ipswich and were well led by C. J. Belfield, a forcing batsman. Batting in depth, and with sound leadership from M. P. Mernagh, the young side of King's School, Rochester, overcame the handicap of limited bowling resources to record seven wins. King's School, Worcester, were hampered by a wayward attack and batting that was

inconsistent when in pursuit of large totals. N. A. Marsh began with 272 runs in his first four innings but then his rich form deserted him. Despite frequently bowling themselves into a promising position, **Kingston GS** were frustrated by their fragile batting, which was carried almost entirely by the captain, S. C. R. Cox. Dismissed only once in single figures, he made 114 v Reed's as well as 103 not out v MCC. The left-arm opening bowler, R. A. White, led the attack accurately and played for Surrey Under-16 and Under-19 sides.

Lancing College, unbeaten by schools, equalled the school record for games won, with fewer lost, and took the Langdale Cup in their fourth successive final. Both averages were topped by the captain, J. D. Robinson, whose batting average of 78.18 was the highest since G.H. Heslon's 89.18 in 1914, and whose aggregate of 860 was the highest since E. Cawston made 966 in 1929. His career total for the school exceeded 3,000. A. P. Miller and one of the openers, R. M. Osborn, were the other batsmen of note, while S. F. Cloke developed considerably as an opening bowling partner for Robinson, his 53 wickets being the most for Lancing by a fast bowler, and only five short of the school's record. Leeds GS, whose best result was a four-wicket win v Queen Elizabeth GS, Wakefield, owed much to the prolific batting of J. R. Goldthorp, an England Under-15 player who hit hundreds v Pocklington and Bradford GS. The leg-spin and googlies of the injured G. R. Tyler were often missed. A highlight for Leighton Park was their progress to the regional final of the Barclays Bank Cup, where they yielded to St John's, Leatherhead J. R. Wood, who played for English Schools, scored more than three times more runs than the next highest, at an average of 75.09, and took the most wickets with his fast, straight bowling, despite breaking down with a back injury at the beginning of the Barclays Bank final and not bowling again. Under the conscientious captaincy of D. Doraisamy team spirit was strong, J. Berridge and J. Shingles maturing considerably. P. Newell-Price bowled a nagging length at medium pace and J. Thomas was an effective strike bowler.

The Leys, who achieved victories v St Paul's and Greshams, often struggled to score enough runs to set a target. They were encouraged by the progress of C. K. Butler (left-arm medium), who took seven for 18 v St Paul's. The attack of Lord Wandsworth College lacked penetration and, apart from left-hander A. J. Phillips, their batsmen failed to score quickly enough to score victories. Beating Royal GS High Wycombe, Wellingborough and Oxford School, Lord Williams's School, Thame, lost only to Old Thamensians and Wesley College, Westen Australia. A strong attack was led by R. J. Carr (fast-medium), and the captain, G. A Westlake, gave a confident start to the batting, supported by P. M. Jobson, who played for Essex Second XI. A young Loretto side did well to lose only once, recording good victories v Kelvinside Academy and Fettes. Two Under-16 players excelled, the left-handed opening batsman, T. R. McCreath, playing for Scotland Under-16, and I. S. Pattullo (left-arm medium) troubling opposing batsmen.

Magdalen College School were frustrated by their inability to bowl sides out, achieving this only twice and winning both times - v The Oratory and Bloxham. However, their strong batting prevented defeat against schools except on two occasions, T. M. Morgan-Wynne and M. E. Mackinlay both passing 500 runs. Malvern College won the Lord's Taverners' Colts Trophy, in the final of which a promising thirteen-year-old, J. R. Wileman, put on 152 for the second wicket with G. N. Lunt. The XI, however, was fragile in its batting and had a mixed season. For Manchester GS, who were undefeated, the captain, M. A. Atherton, was outstanding, scoring four successive unbeaten centuries in June v Hulme GS Oldham, Royal GS Lancaster, Amold and William Hulme's GS. He played for MCC Schools and captained English Schools as well as travelling with North of England Under-19 to Bermuda. M. A. Crawley, who also went to Bermuda, reached three figures v Stockport, as did G. Yates v Birkenhead. Although Atherton bowled some accurate leg-spin, leading wicket-takers were the opening bowler, E. J. Bryanl, and Yates, whose off-spin could be difficult to play. Excellent team spirit and sound fielding were also significant, N. Davenport excelling in the deep. Highlights for Marlborough were N. E. Sykes's 100 not out off 56 balls v Rugby and a return of seven for 41 v Haileybury by J. C. Makin.

Merchant Taylors', Crosby, who had several exciting finishes, were heartened by their improved batting, dominated by the captain, M. J. Cooke, with A. Walmsley and S. A. Jones. The attack was again spearheaded by the faster bowlers, T. J. Judge and the left-armer, S. R. Edgington, who were well supported by P. E. Church (off-spin) and N. A. Harley (left-arm medium). The fielding was of a high standard, the example being set, in his first full season behind the stumps, by R. W. Glynne-Jones, who was also a notable batting prospect. Losing only to Stowe, Merchant Taylors', Northwood, equalled the school record of eleven wins, which included those v St Albans, St Paul's, Watford GS, Aldenham, City of London, Highgate,

Westminster, Dulwich and St Peter's, York. Attractive and aggressive batting was led by G. Cornelius and M. A. St C. Stewart, who featured in nine half-century opening stands, while the guileful leg-spin of Cornelius and the accurate pace attack restricted opposing batsmen. Millield boasted a well-balanced XI, who recorded convincing wins over Sherborne, King's Taunton, Downside and Blundell's. They batted in depth, the captain, J. C. M. Atkinson, swring three centuries, including 192 v Bristol University, and being soundly supported by 1.1. M. Smith, R. J. Turner and R. W. Hill. H. R. J. Trump (off-spin) and P. J. Stephenson (slow left-arm) were the top wicket-takers, although the fast bowlers, Atkinson and M. T. Parkinson, were close behind them. Atkinson represented MCC Schools and English Schools, and went on to play first-class cricket for Somerset. The school won the Barclays Bank Under-17 competition for the second year running.

For their victories v Aldenham, UCS, Highgate and Dulwich, Mill Hill owed much to the match-winning bowling of O. I. Akpofure, who against Highgate hit the stumps seven times for 2ms. R. S. W. Roberts and later S. R. Premadasa stood in as captain when J. M. Cicale was mable to play. Good wins v Allhallows and Eltham College were highlights for Milton Abbey 8thod, for whom C. D. Lindsay proved a valuable all-rounder. Monkton Combe, who finished their season with a successful tour of the south-west, had two accurate fast bowlers in J. W. L. Sinfeld and J. A. Jenkins, but the batting lacked a consistent high scorer. Outstanding in a wet and depressing season for Monmouth were B. T. B. Katolina, who was by far the most effective bwder, and S. P. James, who scored the most runs, including 102 v Cheltenham College, and played for Glamorgan in the County Championship.

Norwich School, who enjoyed a successful end-of-term tour of the Netherlands, owed much to the positive captaincy as well as the all-round skills of N. J. E. Foster. The ability of R. J. Wilson (ast-medium) to take wickets on any surface was important, and the potential shown by the young batsmen, Crane and Heath, was encouraging. The batting of an inexperienced Nottingham HS side was dominated by the captain, J. G. Morris, and a left-hander, M. Saxelby. N. Hunt, in his first season, promised much for the future. The leading bowlers were T. Deas (legspin) and G. Harding (off-spin), the latter playing for HMC Schools. Another young side, Oakham, lost only to Wellingborough in schools matches. The batting was pleasingly strong, and R. Wightman, bowling left-arm seam, was particularly effective with the ball. Although Oundle's attack lacked penetration, the team fielded well and batted competently to bring of wins v The Leys, Mill Hill, Bedford School, St Edward's and Uppingham. For runs, The Perse relied to a great extent on their captain, C. P. Wass, and S. C. Riley, but the allack, led by Wass (fast-medium) and S. T. Whiteside (left-arm medium), was better blanced. Ipswich School, Royal GS Newcastle and Wrekin were the schools defeated. Pymouth College began the season with a flourish, but struggled when key players were hat to examinations. S. Crawford often scored freely, but the attack relied too much on B. Johns, Crawford and S. Woodward.

Under the lively captaincy of J. J. Mansfield, Pocklington won eleven matches, eight of them against schools. For the first time three boys passed 600 runs - M. J. Baker (746), Mansfield (68) and M. J. Taylor (621) – while 60 wickets were taken by T. P. D. Balderson (66) and J. D. Nuttall (60). J. R. Ayling, the captain of Portsmouth GS, was another who led by example, his 715 runs at 70.45 and 50 wickets at 7.74 both being more than three times as many as the next highest. He captained Hampshire Schools and played for Hampshire Second XI. After an early befeat by Winchester, there were wins v Charterhouse, Lord Wandsworth, Bournemouth, Churcher's College and Milton Abbey. A rather defensive outlook hampered Prior Park College, although a fast bowler, A. A. D'Souza, performed admirably, moving the ball both ways and sometimes reverting to off-spin. The batting, headed by B. V. Kebbie, the captain, was adequate, sound contributions coming from the wicket-keeper and left-hand bat, M. I. Woodhouse, and A. D. Hadley. For Queen Elizabeth GS, Wakefield, S. Das showed much Mential as a batsman, and M. Smith developed into a useful all-rounder. Queen's College, lauton, fielded a hostile opening attack in the Essien brothers, C. A. E. and D., and their 82 wickets, at an average of 8.54, proved a decisive factor in most of the eight victories. hoonsistent batting, especially on wet wickets, was responsible for their four defeats.

Similar problems faced **Radley**, who played better than their results might suggest. The legpin of J. C. Smellie was usually good to watch, and R. D. Stormonth-Darling's medium-pace
keutters brought him 43 wickets in his first season. Wet wickets also hampered the batsmen of
lateliff college, where P. Mestecky showed great promise as a fast-medium bowler and D. H.
Cole performed admirably behind the stumps. Three of the XI played for county Under-19 sides
cole and Mestecky for Leicestershire and P. H. E. Morel for Sussex. **Reading School** failed to

fulfil early expectations, their one win coming v Reading Blue Coat School, against whom the captain, A. N. S. Hampton, hit the side's only hundred. In a strong batting side, J. R. Jamieson established a **Reed's School** record with 877 runs. Although their attack lacked penetration, they won five matches and were defeated only by **Reigate GS**, who were none the less disappointed by their overall performance after anticipating a good season. Heartening victories were also achieved v RGS Colchester, Trinity and Emanuel. M. T. Holman bowled well in his first season.

An experienced Repton XI were unable to maintain their early promise on the slow June pitches. The batting was built around N. P. Stocks, who scored two unbeaten centuries, and the captain, B. P. H. Richardson, who also kept wicket to a good standard. The consistent R. W. A. Pyne and P. J. A. Heathcote bore the brunt of the attack. Rossall did better then expected with six wins, including those v Giggleswick, Stonyhurst and Bolton School. The left-handed C.J.D. Lees was the most prolific batsman, although some of the younger players showed promise. especially C. D. Foster, the wicket-keeper. A. G. Smith, the leading wicket-taker, bowled with great fire on occasions. Royal GS, Guildford, lacked the experience to turn a number of winning positions into victories, although they beat Reigate GS, Emanuel and Rutlish. Slow scoring and dropped catches, from which the left-arm opening bowler, G. Harmer, suffered most, hampered Royal GS, Newcastle. Only the captain, J. Harrison, accumulated runs briskly, and the side could have produced better cricket with more application. A young but enthusiastic Rueby side was led by T. P. Skipper, who kept wicket well and headed the batting averages, reaching three figures v Marlborough and Clifton, against whom G. Blissett returned six for 38. H. Bhatia, a leg-spinner, again enjoyed rich pickings. After losing to Birkenhead School and Liverpool College, Rydal School improved significantly to beat King's Chester, Cowley and Northern CC. With nine of the side returning in 1986, they have good reason for optimism.

Vulnerable in a crisis, the batsmen of St Dunstan's College often failed to capitalise on the advantage gained by their bowlers - of whom G. Pointer was decidedly fast for a schoolboyand at least five matches were drawn that could have been won. St Edmund's, Canterbury, hada disappointing season, owing to the fact that their batting and bowling, potentially strong, rarely excelled on the same day. Showing a willingness to graft which was at times lacking in others, K. J. Hopper, a left-hander, twice carried his bat. Only four opposing sides were dismissed, the seam attack rather lacking line and length, and it was the leg-spinner, P. J. Bryant, who collected most wickets, including six for 4 v Duke of York's RMS. Unbeaten by schools since 1982, St George's, Weybridge, fielded a mature, well-balanced side, which compiled a record total of 304 for four v St Benedict's. T. J. G. O'Gorman was pre-eminent with 910 runs-making a total for the first XI of 3,373, including eleven hundreds - and 37 wickets, which took his total to 117. A. J. Woodhead, with 52 wickets in 1985, took his haul to 151 in three seasons. St John's, Leatherhead, failed to maintain their unbeaten record of the two previous seasons, but, with most of the side returning in 1986, have high hopes for the future. Although their captain, 6.6. Philpott, enjoyed some success, St Lawrence, Ramsgate, encountered difficulty in bowling sides out. On the other hand, there was some good batting, with A. O. Uzor scoring two hundreds

Frequently failing to realise their potential, St Peter's, York, reported a frustrating season. However, the left-handed J. E. B. Burdass excelled with the bat and a colt, N. D. Muirhead left-hand bat, right-arm medium-fast), had a promising first season. Positive attacking cricked brought Sedbergh wins v Pocklington, Ampleforth, William Hulme's GS, Royal GS Lanester and Stonyhurst, although they were less successful v club sides, being especially vulnerable against spin bowling. A. R. Wright and R. E. F. Stephenson, in particular, batted aggressively, and a well-balanced attack was supported by fielding which reached a high standard as the season progressed. An enjoyable ten-day tour of the Netherlands was undertaken. A young Sevenoaks side developed in confidence to record four victories. The captain and wicket-kept, J. D. Mitchell, batted reliably, as did C. J. Crang, but the bowling depended too much on A. B. Hood (fast-medium) and A. Griffiths (slow left-arm). Another inexperienced side to mature during the season were Shrewsbury, well captained by E. L. Home, who scored the most runs with J. A. Skelton proving a consistent all-rounder.

The season for Simon Langton GS being severely curtailed by the weather and teacher industrial action, the highlight was a tour of Devon, in which they won all five matches. Particularly impressive were the left-handed A. J. Falconer and M. C. Dobson (right-handbat, slow left-arm bowler), who, with the wicket-keeper, R. J. Davies, played for Kent Under!9. Unbeaten by schools, but with only two wins, Sir Roger Manwood's owed much to R. D. Spence and S. A. Smith, who shared an unbroken stand of 155 v St Edmund's, Canterbury, Spence compiling an unbeaten 121 v Duke of York's RMS. J. A. T. Ingram (medium) carried the

wiling, taking six wickets in an innings on three occasions. In a poor season for **Solihull**, withy of note were the increasingly successful leg-spin bowling of W. Mohammed and the batting of R. J. Lucas and S. J. Townley, the latter playing the side's only three-figure innings—109 v UCS London.

Ayoung and enthusiastic Stonyhurst XI were well led by S. J. Bishop. C. H. Guyer headed the batting and M. Docherty took most wickets. They defeated Wrekin, the XL Club and Ampleforth, against whom R. J. Fee took seven for 41. Stowe, who beat Free Foresters, Repton and Merchant Taylors', Northwood, had a strong attack, in which C. Whitmore (fast-medium) took his school tally to 126 wickets and R. B. K. Giles (right-arm swing) showed considerable promise, R. S. M. Morris, with hundreds v St Edward's and Merchant Taylors', frequently held together a tentative batting line-up. Despite a good win v Edinburgh Academy, Strathallan were disappointed with their overall performance on wet pitches which suited neither the pace of 1.1. Pawson nor the strokeplay of R. S. Hamilton and G. S. R. Robertson. However, the divelopment of Robertson as an all-rounder and the perseverance with which A. W. Tench towled were encouraging. Pre-eminent for Sutton Valence was the captain, J. P. Sunnucks, a foreign right-hand bat and fast bowler, who scored 150 not out and took six for 49 in the defeat of Caterham School.

An outstanding Taunton School side enjoyed their most successful season for 80 years, with convincing victories v Clifton, Bradford GS, Queen's Taunton, Blundell's, King's Taunton, Monmouth, Fettes, Sherborne, Millfield and the XL Club. High-scoring batsmen were N. J. Waters and R. J. Bartlett, the latter playing for MCC Schools and English Schools. Six schools nere decisively beaten by Tiffin, whose batting was again headed by the captain and opening bit, A. M. Morley-Brown, whose 838 runs included three centuries. Two more centuries were word by R. L. Hunt, including one before lunch in 85 minutes v Emanuel. With the ball, the kitam orthodox spinner, M. R. Coote, claimed 46 wickets, twice as many as the next bowler. Toubridge School were unbeaten, with wins v Sevenoaks, Charterhouse, Dulwich, Bedford, Wellington College, Winchester, Felsted, Kent Schools, Tonbridge CC and MCC, the last mentioned for the first time in ten years. The left-handed R. Owen-Browne was a distinguished bounder, hitting three hundreds, and one each came from J. I. Longley, who scored the most ms, S. T. Pollington and K. B. Saro-Wiwa. Trinity, Croydon, were encouraged to record more vins than losses, the most pleasing being those v KCS Wimbledon and St Dunstan's. Two matches were won on a tour of Guernsey, the other two being drawn. Noteworthy in a wisfactory season for Truro School were the fast-medium bowling of R. M. H. Bell and two conturies from the all-rounder, P. S. Holmes.

lna period of rebuilding, Uppingham depended very much on A. G. W. Lewin, the captain, hr runs, although the bowling possessed both variety and depth. D. B. J. Cooke, with offwinners, was the most successful bowler. Unbeaten by schools and with sixteen wins, Victoria College, Jersey, owed much to their captain, C. M. Graham, and A. J. Wright, who each collected more than 700 runs and more than 50 wickets. They were well supported by the spin of A.D. Brown, D. V. Carnegie and R. V. Melwani. Enjoying a third successive unbeaten season, Warmick School defeated Bablake, King's Worcester, MCC, Old Warwickians and the XL Their strength lay in the batting, led by J. D. Stanton, whose 715 runs included two lundreds. The bowling depended mainly on the leg-spin of A. J. Moffatt and off-spin of P. J. Watford GS, whose eight wins included those v Alleyn's, Hitchin School, Tiffin, Royal Migh Wycombe, St Albans School and Enfield GS, were unfortunate to lose the services of thir captain, C. S. Dyce, who was injured after making two centuries in four matches. A. G. homas, an agile wicket-keeper, took over the captaincy, and the depth in the batting ompensated for Dyce's absence. Two left-arm spinners, S. J. Mann and S. J. Easterbrook, booked with guile and penetration – Mann took his school haul to 118 wickets – and were well supported in the field.

In a pleasing season, Wellingborough beat Bloxham, Oakham, Alleyn's and MCC (off the lat ball). Two fifteen-year-olds, M. I. Ingram (opening bat) and T. K. Marriott (slow left-arm) reformed consistently throughout. Head and shoulders above the rest of the Wellington College site was the captain, G. D. Reynolds, who virtually carried the batting on his own, as well as bing an excellent fielder and useful medium-pace bowler. The middle-order batting was fragile and the attack not particularly strong, yet wins came v Bradfield, Charterhouse, Haileybury, kpion, Free Foresters, against whom J. S. Hodgson returned seven for 63, and the Royal Corps (Transport. The season for Wellington School, Somerset, began with a flourish, but a later lack confidence resulted in too many drawn matches. Particular features were the spirited batting of J. Clist and the seam bowling of M. Coleman. Uncertain batting undermined a young

Westminster XI, who managed no wins in a poor season. Whitgift reported happier times with victories v Kingston GS, Christ's Hospital (bowled out for 36), and Reigate GS, against whom M. P. J. Ellingham scored 100. Keen fielding assisted A. J. Bowers (medium) and H. Gallagher (slow left-arm), who led the attack.

Positive cricket brought an exciting and satisfying season for William Hulme's GS. M. J. Cross and A. G. Hinchcliffe worked up a good pace on occasions, and P. D. Fearnley and K. G. Rushton led successful run-chases v Stockport GS and Ellesmere College. A first-wicket stand of 128 between G. P. Benson and the captain, the left-handed A. G. Cleary, ensured the downfall of Denstone, and Cross took Birkenhead's last wicket with the last ball to snatch another victory. Winchester were less successful than had been hoped, too often failing to force win in drawn games. Highlights were B. C. Winzer's return of seven for 55 v Marlborough and second-wicket partnership of 170 v Wellington College between A. N. Patterson-Moutray and the captain, I. L. M. Henry, who took his First XI record to 2,300 runs, 103 wickets and 43 catches. Woodbridge School struggled for runs, but the bowling was sound, N. D. J. Henchie (slow-medium) collecting five wickets or more on five occasions and A. A. C. Donnison (medium-fast) taking three wickets in four balls v the Old Boys.

Woodhouse Grove School beat Batley GS, Silcoates, Hawkes CC, Leeds GS, Hipperholme GS and Giggleswick. B. S. Percy was outstanding, his 687 runs breaking the school record, set in 1962 by J. N. Spence, and including 150 not out v Leeds GS, 110 v Queen Elizabeth 68. Wakefield, and 126 not out v Ashville, against whom he put on an unbroken 248 for the second wicket with the captain, N. A. Ledgard, who made 112 not out. Percy, who captained Yorkshire Senior Schools, also took 34 wickets with his seamers and off-breaks, although the most successful bowler was L. Savill (fast-medium), whose 40 wickets included a return of eight for ? v Silcoates and a hat-trick v Leeds GS. Triumphant in the Woodard Festival, where they beat Hurstpierpoint, Ellesmere and Bloxham, Worksop attributed their success to their depth in batting and the splendid off-spin bowling of the captain, E. R. Hughes, often in combination with the slow-medium deliveries of J. P. Wilkins. These two played a leading role in the deltal of Repton. Inaccurate bowling and batting collapses were overcome by Wrekin after half-term, bringing wins v Ellesmere, Liverpool College and Worksop. C. Fenton was the most consistent batsman, while the fast bowlers, P. Richardson and P. Hawkins, became a hostile opening pair who were given accurate support from O. Davies (medium) and J. Whitfield (left-arm orthodox spin). P. Needes kept wicket well. In a mediocre season for Wycliffe College, several notable bowling returns were recorded: A. S. Dickenson (off-breaks) took five for 8 and R. A. Boulton (fast-medium) five for 11 in the match v Marling, while G. S. Campbell (medium) returned seven for 21 v a Malvern XI, as well as scoring the side's only century - v Ratcliffe College.
