SCHOOLS CRICKET IN 1986

Despite the absence through injury of the captain, M. A. Atherton, and the restricted availability of J. C. M. Atkinson, N. A. Kendrick and M. W. Alleyne owing to the calls of counties and England Young Cricketers, the English Schools side in 1986 had a core of experienced players to blend with the young players coming into the team. The batsmen scored at a good rate and in fine style, with M. R. Ramprakash and S. P. Titchard outstanding, Ramprakash going on to play for England Young Cricketers. Good support came from M. A. Crawley, N. A. Stanley, D. Leatherdale and P. A. Gover, the last named leading the side well in the absence of Atherton and setting a fine example in the field. It was a pleasure to see fielding of such a high standard, and R. J. Turner, the wicket-keeper, gave good support. The strike bowlers, P. J. Martin, I. J. Houseman and the more experienced M. J. Smith, were hampered by unresponsive pitches but bowled an attacking line and gave little away. Two promising spinners, H. R. J. Trump (off-spin) and M. A. Newton (slow left-arm), did most of the work.

Only one of the English Schools international matches, that against Scotland, was unaffected by the weather. The worst hit was the first, against Sri Lankan Young Cricketers at Manchester where English Schools, put in, were rescued from a shaky start by a third-wicket partnership of 154 between Titchard (95) and Crawley (86). Gover declared at 302 for nine, but rain brought the match to an end after seven balls on the second day with Sri Lankan Young Cricketers 45 for one. When the match against Irish Schools at Chesterfield also ended in a draw, English Schools were in the stronger position. Despite losing the toss, as they did in all four of their international matches, they made 249 for five declared, Titchard scoring 114, and then bowled out Ireland for 164 with Trump and Newton taking four wickets each. A second declaration at 105 for two set a target of 191 in 104 minutes, of which

Ireland had made 117 for five when time ran out.

Against Welsh Schools at Pontarddulais, English Schools compiled 237 for nine (Ramprakash 85) before dismissing the Welsh for 183, seven wickets falling to Trump for 58 off 23 overs. Titchard and Ramprakash had put on 95 for the first wicket when the rain again intervened. At Dartford, Scottish Young Cricketers were restricted to 166 for six in their 60 overs, whereupon the prolific opening partnership of Titchard (53) and Ramprakash (117) contributed 132 of English Schools' 256 for seven. Scotland, struggling against good tight bowling, were then dismissed for 144, Martin's pace bringing him five for 30 and Turner claiming five victims behind the stumps.

The 55 runs needed for victory were scored without loss.

The second MCC Schools Oxford Festival followed the same format as the first. On the first two days, HMC Southern Schools played The Rest, while ESCA North played ESCA South, the players being rearranged into four different teams for further trial matches on the third day. A final trial – MCC Schools East against MCC Schools West – on the fourth day ended with the selection of the team to play for MCC Schools at Lord's. Finally, HMC Schools played a three-day match against Sri Lankan Young Cricketers.

HMC SOUTHERN SCHOOLS v THE REST

At Magdalen College School, Oxford, July 19, 20. Drawn. Toss: HMC Southern Schools. On a firm but slow pitch, with a fast outfield, Longley and Stanley began HMC Southern Schools' innings with a stylish century partnership which was echoed by Crawley and Foster for The

Rest. Fishpool's off-spin, well backed up, restrained the later batsmen, and to keep the game open Foster declared at The Rest's overnight score, 54 behind. Griggs dominated the Southern Schools second innings, emerging from a slow start to play some fine strokes, and Stanley was able to set a target of 258 in what became 71 overs. Some excellent catching especially by Speight, prevented anyone playing the big innings needed for The Rest to win, and when Fishpool and Stanley looked as if they would bowl the Southern Schools to victory, The Rest's last-wicket pair played out the last four overs.

Spin bowlers controlled the match on a helpful pitch, Trump and Newton, the English Schools pair, sharing the wickets in the North's first innings. Only Titchard mastered the conditions and the attack to score 87. Ramprakash led the South's reply, setting them on the way to a 24-run lead from their 60 overs. Batting again, the North overcame an injury to Titchard and the continued

threat of Kendrick's slow left-arm spin to set a target of 198 in two and a half hours. Rather than achieving it, the South looked likely losers at 90 for six, but Ramprakash and Turner held to secure a draw.

Reports from the Schools

Once the weather improved, batsmen prospered in 1986, eight players from the schools reviewed here passing 1,000 runs: J. I. Longley of Tonbridge (1,141), M. P. Speight of Hurstpierpoint (1,130), M. A. Crawley of Manchester GS (1,123), N. A. Stanley of Bedford Modern (1,116), D. P. Spiller of Royal GS, Worcester (1,073), A. D. Brown of Caterham (1,061), P. I. Prichard of Shrewsbury (1,051) and R. S. M. Morris of Stowe (1,001). Crawley averaged 112.30, as well as taking 31 wickets, while Brown, Stanley and Speight all averaged more than 80. Four bowlers took 60 wickets: T. P. B. Balderson of Pocklington (64), C. M. Graham of Victoria College, Jersey (62), J. S. Waters of Royal GS, Worcester (61) and J. D. Nuttall of Pocklington (60, at an average of 8.78). Graham also scored 715 runs, and of the nine other bowlers who took 50 wickets, M. A. Atherton of Manchester GS scored 627 runs. Seven hat-tricks were reported: by J. S. Clarke and J. Holt of Hipperholme, A. D. Ferrier of Eastbourne, J. S. W. Hawkins of King's, Chester, J. S. Pritchard of Reading, A. Sharma of Forest, and J. J. Zagni of Ipswich. The outstanding return was J. Boiling's ten for 30 for Rutlish against Wallington HS.

The absence of an effective strike bowler prevented a young Abingdon side from converting winning positions to victories, although their positive attitude brought six wins, including excellent performances v St Edward's Oxford and Reading. The batting was led by the captain and opener, J. C. P. Haynes, while of the five main bowlers P. Lunn, with leg-breaks, posed the most problems. The outstanding performance for Aldenham was G. E. Peel's nine for 76 in the win over King William's College, Isle of Man. UCS, Oratory, Denstone and Liverpool College were also defeated. Much promise was shown by K. Jahangir, who played for HMC Schools Colts. Alleyn's, though failing to play to their potential, beat St John's Leatherhead, Emanuel and Wilson's. T. Wareham was a sensible, unselfish captain, J. Bridgeman played some fine attacking innings, and O. Lucking dismissed many good batsmen with his deceptive slow-medium 'floaters'. Allhallows' young and inexperienced side took comfort from some favourable draws and the loss of only one schools fixture. The captain, S. B. Claro, was well supported by J. M. Stamford with the bat and J. E. T. Clark with the ball. After losing six consecutive matches early in the season, Ampleforth were forced to introduce three new players, whereupon they won six of their last eight matches, beating Worksop, St Peter's York, Denstone, Oundle, Uppingham and Blundell's. The batting, apart from R. E. O'Kelly, and the opening bowling were generally poor. However, two contrasting left-arm spinners, B. R. Simonds-Gooding and D. H. Churton, who joined the XI in the second half of the season, were above average, as was W. J. Bianchi, who came in for the final matches as third seamer and headed the averages.

Ardingly, with three fast bowlers and stroke-playing batsmen, lost four of their first five matches in wet May, but when the wickets hardened they enjoyed six successive victories, Christ's Hospital, Worth and Wellingborough all being bowled out cheaply. A. M. E. Gould (left arm) and P. E. Jackson bowled with some aggression in the right conditions, and there was good support from Clark, a neat wicket-keeper, and C. M. Thorne, who took fourteen catches in close positions as well as heading the batting. Impressive for Arnold was fourteen year-old S. M. Aga (slow left-arm), whose 47 wickets included returns of seven for 50 v King William's College, Isle of Man, seven for 69 v King Edward VII, Lytham, and four for 7 v Stockport GS. With only the captain, S. Davies, finding form with the bat, the side's strength

lay in the bowling. There was also an outstanding prospect at Ashville College, who beat Bootham, Batley GS, Bradford GS, Giggleswick and Leeds GS. M. W. Yates, an opening bowler, took 45 wickets, including six for 31 v Bradford GS and four for 6 v Woodhouse Grove. Three centuries were scored for the school, two by H. M. Rogers and one by the applain, J. E. Hill.

Unbeaten until July, when some good adult sides exposed the brittleness of their batting, Bancroft's attributed their success to all-round effort and the positive captaincy of V. D. Masani. R. W. Hubbard's 404 runs and 42 wickets included 109 v St Albans School and eight for 44 v Essex Schools Under-19. G. J. Norgate, a wicket-keeper-batsman, set the tone for an accellent fielding side in which A. M. O'Neill took some outstanding catches, as well as winning the match v Enfield GS with his leg-breaks, returning seven for 51. Bangor GS enjoyed another productive season, even if the senior batsmen did not do as well as expected. Centuries were scored by G. C. Yeates, S. R. N. McClatchey and C. M. McCall, the captain, the last two also taking most wickets. Despite some inconsistency, Barnard Castle recorded eleven victories including those v Durham School, Queen Elizabeth GS Wakefield, Solihull School, King Edward VII Lytham and UCS London. The captain, S. G. Foster, led by example with 558 runs and 42 wickets, and played for HMC Schools against Sri Lankan Young Cricketers. Bedford School's young and inexperienced side went through the season unbeaten, although to have as many as fifteen draws proved frustrating. J. E. Crooker impressed with bat and ball, as exemplified by his 91 and seven for 42 v Cambridge frusaders.

For Bedford Modern, who achieved a record ten wins and were undefeated by English schools, N. A. Stanley was again outstanding: his aggregate of 1,116 runs was a school-record, as were his average of 85.84 and his five centuries. He captained HMC Schools v Sri Lankan Young Cricketers, and played for MCC Schools, English Schools, Northamptonshire Under-25 and their Second XI. A. J. Trott's unbeaten 150 v RGS Colchester was also a school record. An effective attack comprised A. D. McCartney, M. W. White (both fast), Stanley (fast-medium) and P. A. Owen (slow left-arm), while T. C. Taylor, with 30 dismissals, kept wicket immaculately. Berkhamsted, beaten only by Bishop's Stortford, were pleasantly surprised by their season, enjoying wins over Brentwood, Magdalen College School, St Albans, St Lawrence, Kimbolton and Framlingham. The bowling was led by the captain, S. Hunt (slow left-arm), and M. Player (medium). S. Fox was the most successful batsman. The leading player for Birkenhead was the all-rounder, P. I. Rennie, given good support in the attack by the captain, E. N. Kitchen, who took his 100th wicket for the school.

A well-balanced **Bishop's Stortford** side had an excellent season following a successful winter tour to Sri Lanka, their strong batting built on the openers, L. S. P. Fishpool and T.A. G. Lucas, who compiled a school record of 162 for the first wicket v Framlingham. In his four seasons in the XI, Fishpool, whose aggregate of 644 was the highest for the school since D. F. Cock in 1933, scored a school record of 2,171 runs, took 147 wickets with his off-spinners and held 30 catches. He played for Essex Second XI and for HMC Schools. Spin was the chief strength of a varied attack, with P. Bashford's wicket-keeping again setting the standard for a first-class fielding side. Although scoring prolifically, a young **Bloxham** side, for whom N. E. Baig was the outstanding cricketer, were limited by their inability to bowl out opposing sides. **Blundell's**, whose only schools wins came at the expense of Plymouth College and Taunton, were also hampered by the lack of a penetrative bowler, although P. G. Wilson (medium) showed promise. Fine centuries came from S. S. Patidar and the captain, A. R. Giles

With no wins, but two close draws and a tie v the Authentics, **Bradfield College** relied heavily for runs on their captain, R. M. F. Cox. J. D. Pearce, a fifteen-year-old left-arm spinner, headed the bowling averages, while W. M. Porter (fast) took the most wickets. After a frustrating start, **Bradford GS** finished the season with victories over Woodhouse Grove, Bolton and Hymers. Fielding well, they played enterprising cricket, and it was rewarding to see less experienced players rise to the occasion when some senior players failed to reproduce their form. D. R. Chadwick had a promising first season as opener and P. R. Miles batted forcefully in the middle order, as well as bowling his off-spin intelligently in a contrasting partnership with I. J. McClay (left-arm spin). **Brentwood** won only two games, suffering from inexplicable batting collapses. They were encouraged, though, by the performance of P. Welton, a right-handed batsman of class and a useful medium-pace bowler. An inexperienced **Bromsgrove** side achieved good wins over Bloxham and King's, Worcester.

For Canford, the captain and left-hand bat, C. H. Forward, scored consistently, and the young W. E. Johnson showed promise, but although T. C. LeGallais and R. J. Stearn bowled well at medium pace, the attack generally lacked variety. A tour to Kenya was planned for January. In an enjoyable season which brought nine wins for Caterham, the power of A. D. Brown and P. J. Sidall, combined with the correct technique of J. A. Cox-Colyer and S. R. A. Miles, proved too much for most opposing bowlers. Brown was outstanding, his 1,061 runs including 105 in 39 balls v Alleyn's, 127 in 69 balls v Rutlish, 109 in 95 balls v Trinity and 189 in 113 balls v RGS Guildford. Hundreds in successive innings came from Miles v Sutton Valence and Reigate GS. Charterhouse's wins over Wellington College, Bradfield and Malvem were offset by heavy defeats at the hands of Tonbridge, Harrow, Eton and Rugby. In a more successful season, with only one game lost, Cheltenham College recorded notable victories v MCC and Haileybury, the latter thanks to a second-wicket partnership of 138 between the captain, W. J. Davies, and C. M. Harris.

Bowling out the opposition in eight of fourteen matches, Chigwell beat Brentwood, Enfeld GS, St Edmunds Ware and John Lyon, losing only twice to schools. D. Clark was the leading bowler, well supported by M. G. Chalkley (both right-arm medium). Clark and the wicket-keeper, T. A. Coleman, shared a second-wicket stand of 125 v John Lyon. Christ College, Brecon, were unbeaten, but only three of their thirteen matches were won, dropped catches more than once letting the opposition escape with a draw. Opening batsmen N. S. Johnson and the captain, S. J. Harrett, provided a sound foundation to the batting, including a record 182 v Bronwydd CC (Harrett 108), but otherwise both batting and bowling lacked real power. Despite only two wins, Christ's Hospital were encouraged by the quality of cricket played by, and the progress of, their young side, eight of whom return in 1987. The only three-figure innings was R. T. Macro's 106 v Eastbourne. At Clifton College, also with a young but well-balanced side, their first six batsmen scored reliably while the bowling was a healthy combination of speed and spin. R. J. W. Holdsworth took seven Millfield wickets for 75, and there were notable wins v Winchester and Eastbourne.

Unbeaten in one of their most successful seasons, Colfe's defeated Eltham College. Chislehurst & Sidcup, Alleyn's, Latymer Upper, Hampton, Judd, Sevenoaks, Borden GS and Harvey GS, the latter in the final of the Kent Under-19 Cup, which they won for the first time. The school also won the Kent Under-15 Cup. The captain, C. A. Spencer, was outstanding with 900 runs, including two centuries, others coming from R. J. Harmer and a fifteen-year-old all-rounder, P. R. Whiteland, who bore the brunt of the bowling with the 6ft 10in tail J. E. M. Streeter. Colston's, with victories over Bristol GS, Bristol Cathedral School, Hutton GS and Marling, owed much to the high scoring of their captain, J. N. Stutt, who in his four years in the XI scored 3,028 runs with ten centuries. As the highlight of a successful season with fourteen wins, Coventry School - Bablake won the final of the Warwickshire Cup from King Edward's, Birmingham, the only school to have beaten them earlier in the season. They also reached the last eight of the Barclays Bank Under-17 competition. Positive batting, especially when chasing runs, brought Cranbrook their best results since 1968. At the end of a season of fluctuating fortunes for Cranleigh, R. Radbourne finally fulfilled his potential with centuries on consecutive days at the Rossall Festival v Merchant Taylors' Northwood, St Peter's York and Rossall. S. J. Watkinson (medium) headed the bowling with 53 wickets, particularly proving his hostility and stamina in the second half of the season.

Dauntsey's attributed their record of ten drawn matches in twelve to their inability to bowl sides out. The most hostile bowler was C. R. B. Page (left-arm fast-medium), while J. W. S. Porter scored the most runs, with hundreds in consecutive matches v King Edward's Bath and Wycliffe College. In a season of rebuilding, one highlight for Dean Close was an innings of 127 v Bloxham by P. J. Kirby, the captain and left-hand opening bat. M. H. Paget-Wilkes (medium) and T. A. Edginton (slow left-arm) had their days with both bat and ball, and as eight players were expected to return, prospects for 1987 are good. The young Dover College side exceeded expectations, thanks mainly to the captaincy and example of J. T. Wilson, who in addition to his playing ability inspired team loyalty and fostered a high quality of fielding. Downside, with average results, were hampered by their unreliable batting, but the bowling was accurate and usually penetrative, particularly that of C. E. Crossland (medium) and E. O. Thesiger (fast-medium), who was a thoughtful and decisive captain. The failure of a good batting side to achieve a target when batting second left Dulwich College with mixed results. G. N. Fisher was a reliable opener, the captain, I. C. Tredgett (slow left-arm), was easily the best bowler and the fielding was always keen, with M. C. Lea a fine exponent behind the

sumps. A tour of Australia was planned for December, a foretaste of which came in the matches v St Peter's Adelaide and Caulfield GS, who produced the fastest bowling the XI had fored all season.

There were some outstanding performances for Eastbourne College. F. J. Westlake, the captain and wicket-keeper, scored a school record of 913 runs and played for Surrey Under-19; A. M. Thorpe-Beeston scored 108 in 95 minutes before lunch v St John's, Leatherhead, hitting eleven 6s, breaking two windows, smashing three slates on the school roof and losing two balls; and A. D. Ferrier (fast-medium) took a hat-trick v Collyers School. A memorable win for The Edinburgh Academy was the defeat of the previously unbeaten Barnard Castle. However, a lack of depth in the batting and dropped catches were a handicap later in the season, and their main strength was the spin combination of G. A. Muirhead (left-arm) and I. D. Lamond (off-breaks), who took 98 wickets between them. Undefeated for the first time in many years, Elizabeth College, Guernsey, were ably captained by M. J. Bacon. Highlights were returns of six for 29 by F. N. Stratford in the exciting win over Victoria College, Jersey, and six for 10 by A. B. Howe v Marlow CC, plus Bacon's 102 v King Edward VI, Southampton.

Ellesmere College, beaten only once by a school, achieved good wins over Birkenhead, Merchant Taylors' Crosby, Wrekin and Liverpool. J. Holmes again dominated the batting, support coming in the first half of the season from A. R. L. Stubbs and in the second half from J. J. Birchall, who also took the most wickets. Holmes (113 not out) and Stubbs (102 not out) put on 232 for the second wicket v Rydal. Overcoming early injuries to three prominent players, Eltham College won ten matches and lost only one. Their batting had depth, with three batsmen scoring hundreds, one of them being the captain and all-rounder, R. J. Hart, who scored the most runs and took the most wickets. An inexperienced Enfield GS team coped well with a strong fixture list, although the absence of a spinner left the attack unbalanced. Fourteen-year-old D. Bowen, with more than 500 runs, was an outstanding prospect.

Notable individual performances enhanced the season of a young Epsom College XI. P. Vickars (fast-medium) returned six for 13 in the 118-run victory over KCS Wimbledon and J. Gardner scored 103 as Free Foresters were defeated by one wicket. Other wins were against Christ's Hospital and Cranleigh. Eton, who lost only to St Edward's Oxford and St Peter's, Adelaide, defeated Marlborough, Charterhouse (bowled out for 46), Wellington College (bowled out for 73) and Hyderabad Under-19, as well as dismissing Harrow for 37 at Lord's before rain intervened. Although the opening partnership of R. D. O. MacLeay, a left-hander, and J. A. Teeger became increasingly effective, the main strength lay in the bowling, off-spinner J. D. Norman's 30 wickets including seven for 12 v Wellington and three for 1 v Harrow. The captain, F. O. S. MacDonald, dominated the cricket at Exeter School, scoring more than twice as many runs as the next batsman, including 137 not out v Blundell's and 103 v Wallsway. Although their bowling lacked penetration, they beat Wellington and inflicted on Truro School their sole defeat. The emergence of D. W. Ahl as an all-rounder promised well for 1987.

For Felsted, who defeated Oundle, The Leys, Aldenham, Brentwood and Winchester, the Knight brothers, A. V. and N. V., put on 192 for the first wicket v Bedford, both making centuries – a school record. A. V. Knight also hit 158 not out (five 6s, 24 4s) v Oundle, sharing in a second-wicket partnership of 227 with the captain, D. H. J. Griggs. In addition to scoring the most runs, Griggs formed an outstanding pace trio with B. J. S. Cooper, who took 52 wickets, and R. P. Haywood. Fettes College, heavily dependent on the all-round skills of M.A. M. Adam, had to contend with frequent batting collapses which left the lower order often grateful to salvage a draw. A. Sharma of Forest thrice took five wickets and scored fifty in the same match, his five for 26 in the defeat of Brentwood including a hat-trick. He shared 72 wickets with R. J. Davis, who took eight for 17 in the eight-wicket win over Enfield GS and six for 39 v Ilford CHS, who lost by nine wickets. There were two hundreds – a maiden 120 not out by P. J. Butler in the victory over MCC, and 100 not out v City of London from fourteen-year-old A. C. Richards, the leading run-scorer.

Although enjoying wins against Durham and Stonyhurst, Giggleswick were disappointed with their results. They had a dependable batsman in S. N. Youdale, and S. J. Pighills, an off-spinner, took a match-winning seven for 25 v Hipperholme GS. Glenalmond, inspired by their captain and Scotland Under-19 opening bowler, L. M. Porter, overcame an inauspicious start

to collect two good wins and several favourable draws. E. L. Calder, another all-rounder, scored a powerful maiden century v Sedbergh, and a Colt, I. M. S. Wilson, looked especially promising. Gresham's owed their success to the all-round excellence of C. J. M. Lewis and the batting of fifteen-year-old H. Spence, who in his first season scored the most runs. With an accurate attack making opposing batsmen work hard for their runs, emphatic victories were recorded v Ipswich, Culford, The Leys and MCC.

Strongly placed in several drawn games, an inexperienced Haileybury side failed to secure a win owing to the lack of an incisive bowler and their inability to score runs quickly, J. M. Meacock's 101 not out v Dulwich and the all-round promise of B. J. B. Hall (fast-medium) who took all six Sherborne wickets to fall, were noteworthy. Hampton attributed their success in a season of transition to an excellent team spirit engendered by the able captaincy of S. J. Kale. The leading batsman was R. M. Holloway, whose unbeaten 111 won the game v RGS High Wycombe, and although the attack at times lacked penetration, J. C. Reeve (mediumfast) took six for 11 on his début to bring victory over John Lyon. P. Laver (off-spin) took the most wickets, while A. J. B. Sales proved a reliable wicket-keeper in his first season. Harrow, unbeaten by schools, defeated Wellington College, Malvern, Charterhouse and Haileybury, Their three century-makers were A. W. Sexton, M. D. S. Raper and J. J. Pethers, the latter scoring 100 not out and taking four wickets against Malvern. Highlights for Hereford Cathedral School, also undefeated, came in the fixture against local rivals, Belmont Abbey, in which N. R. Denny compiled his first century for the school and off-spinner A. Macdonald took six for 28. A young Highgate side would have benefited from a batsman who could take on the bowling. However, victory over UCS Hampstead was encouraging, as was the potential of the off-spinning all-rounder, D. N. Amato.

Inconsistent batting let **Hipperholme** down early on, but their real strength was in the bowling. Two hat-tricks were recorded, both by fast-medium bowlers: J. Holt v Read, Selby, and the captain, J. W. Clarke, in his six for 44 v Batley GS. Clarke also took six for 30 in the victory v Fulneck, while in a limited season Baldwin (fast) returned seven for 34 to bring about the defeat of Woodhouse Grove. **Hurstpierpoint** followed a tour of India at Christmas by establishing a school record of nine wins, including the final of the Langdale Trophy in which the captain, M. P. Speight, scored 162 not out v Eastbourne. Speight, who kept wicket for Sussex in the County Championship, was outstanding, his 1,130 runs extending by 353 his own record aggregate set in 1984. A young **Ipswich School** side began well with a nine-wicket win over Culford, the captain, J. J. Zagni (slow left-arm), performing the hat-trick in his six for 24. Openers R. Heap and A. M. Paul put on 151 v Framlingham, and the promising N. J. Gregory featured in several key partnerships. The school reached the semi-finals of the Barclays Under-17 Cup.

King Edward's, Birmingham, boasted strong early batting with the first three – N. Martin, P. N. J. Inglis and A. P. Hitchins – all topping 500 runs. However, with an attack which could neither contain sides, nor bowl them out, being asked to bat first was not an advantage and too many drawn games resulted. Similar problems faced King Edward VI College, Stourbridge, who fielded keenly and possessed attacking batsmen capable of chasing most totals. They were beaten only once in schools matches and had in C. M. Tolley an imaginative captain who represented England Schools. After an uncertain start, King Edward VI, Southampton, played some sound cricket, although they relied too heavily for their runs on the captain, P. A. Arnold, and M. A. Noyce. The bowling, with the 6ft 8in tall A. J. Donaldson particularly impressive, was hostile on helpful wickets. Pre-eminent in a successful season for King Edward VII, Lytham, was the captain, D. K. Chrispin, a forthright opening bat and off-spinner who topped both averages and scored 100 not out in twenty overs v Kirkham GS. I. C. Ball had figures of five for 16 in the win over William Hulme's GS.

King's, Taunton, ended the season by winning five of their last six games, Queen's Taunton, Allhallows, Monmouth and Blundell's numbered among their final tally of seven victories. The captain, R. G. Twose, played for Somerset Second XI, and his 44 wickets for the school included four or more on seven occasions. The best return was G. K. Barber's seven for 39 v Downside. King's College School, Wimbledon, with many newcomers to the side, improved steadily to finish with four wins and three losses in schools matches. R. M. Wight, a right-hand opening bat and off-spinner, made an outstanding all-round contribution, and the captain, A. D. Mallinson, scored a fine hundred v St Paul's. King's, Bruton, with an experienced team, were somewhat disappointed to beat only Kingswood and the XL Club, although they had the better of four draws. C. Cowell was the leading all-rounder, while the

conomical slow left-armer, N. Randall, headed the bowling. Unbeaten by schools, King's, Canterbury, built their successful season around three players; the captain, No. 3 bat and medium-fast bowler, M. B. Ryeland; opening batsman and opening bowler, J. P. Taylor; and the other opening batsman, P. P. Lacamp. A high proportion of draws could be put down partly to the weather and partly to defensive declarations by captains aware of the XI's latting strength.

Nine wins by King's, Chester, in their most successful season for some time included those v Duke of York's, Dover - off the last ball - Wolverhampton GS and William Hulme's GS, against whom N. J. Brown, a left-hand wicket-keeper-batsman, hit 109 not out. C. G. Oswald opening bat and off-spinner) made a telling all-round contribution, while J. S. W. Hawkins, the leading wicket-taker, had a hat-trick in his eight for 56 v Liverpool College. The batting of R Stott was the main feature of a sound season for the young XI of King's, Macclesfield, who best King's Chester, Rossall and Abbot Beyne but lost their last three matches, at the Ipswich Festival. In contrast, King's, Rochester, lost three of their first four matches before positive cricket won the next seven in succession. They batted in depth, and had a marvellous opening attack in the captain, M. P. Mernagh, and I. J. Nightingale who took almost 100 wickets. There was a high standard of catching and the wicket-keeping of D. C. Walsh was quite outstanding. Schools wins were at the expense of Sutton Valence, St Edmund's, Bethany, St lawrence, Dover College, Wellingborough and Maidstone GS. In an average but enjoyable REASON, King's, Worcester, found that their bowling was let down by brittle batting at vital times. J. A. Cooper, the captain, scored consistently, putting on 197 for the second wicket with T. A. Preston v Durham, while thirteen-year-old R. G. Tomlinson batted well when brought into the side. S. J. Jevons (fast medium) topped both averages and fielded athletically.

A limited attack held back **King William's College, Isle of Man**, only the captain, S. W. Ellis (medium-fast or off-spin), looking likely to make a breakthrough. When batting first the team did well, passing 200 on five occasions, and there were maiden hundreds from three batsmen—Ellis, 102 v Manchester GS, R. F. M. Cook, 107 v Merchant Taylors', Crosby, and Radford, 128 v the Old Boys. The loss of several promising players left **Kingston GS** short of experience, especially among the batsmen, who were unable to capitalise on winning positions established by the bowlers. Four took more than twenty wickets, with noteworthy returns coming from S. Kumar, the captain — six for 52 v St George's, Weybridge — and the opener, R. J. Williams—six Emanuel wickets for 50.

Kingswood reported their best results for 25 years with wins over Beechen Cliff, Colston's, King Edward's Bath, the XL Club and the Old Boys. The batting, much improved, was headed by the fifteen-year-old opener, R. W. Lewis, who scored more than twice as many runs as the next batsman, including 107 not out v Colston's. He also topped the bowling averages. The captain, T. Gleghorn, returned six for 27 v Wallington GS with his off-breaks and M. A. J. Earp, one of the strike bowlers, took six for 38 v King Edward's Bath, including two off the last two balls to win the match.

Ably captained by S. B. Higgo, their wicket-keeper, Lancing College won nine matches, schools defeated being Seaford, Cranleigh, Epsom, St Peter's, Christ's Hospital, Charterhouse and Victoria College. A strong seam attack was spearheaded by the pace of S. F. Cloke, with W. A. Gooda's gentle off-spin providing the only variety. A. J. Cunningham scored the most runs, but all the batsmen made a contribution and the averages were headed by S. N. S. Message, who joined the side midway through the season to open the innings. Leeds GS, with twelve drawn games and just one win, could none the less be encouraged by the performance of J. R. Goldthorp, who played for Yorkshire Under-19 and captained their successful Under-16 side. Leighton Park's twelve wins numbered those over Douai (by ten wickets), King James Henley (by nine wickets), Oratory, Bearwood (by 105 runs) and Reading Bluecoat. Hampshire have shown interest in J. R. Wood, a left-handed opening bat and right-arm medium-fast bowler, who, though available only for weekday matches because of club commitments, hit 926 runs at 132.28, including an unbeaten double-century (eighteen 6s) in the Barclays Bank Under-17 Cup. P. J. Newell Price (fast-medium) took six for 25 v Douai and was well supported by J. D. Thomas (medium-fast) and N. L. Stevens (slow left-arm) throughout the season

Highlights in a frustrating season for **The Leys** were a 117-run victory over The Perse and the successful leg-spin bowling of N. R. Lankester. **Llandovery College** also reported a mediocre season, although in mitigation the young side played ten of their games against adult

opposition. The most enjoyable fixture was the drawn game v Denmark Under-19. For Lord Williams's, who lost only to MCC, the captain R. J. Carr scored the most runs and took the most wickets with his fast bowling, while R. J. Gregory was an excellent wicket-keeper. For Lord Wandsworth College, undefeated by schools but with only one win, there were innings of 116 not out by S. H. Blows v Shiplake and 112 not out by the captain, D. R. W. Wood, v Farnborough Sixth Form College. Also unbeaten, but with eleven draws, Loretto would have welcomed more than three wins. The left-handed opener, T. R. McCreath, led the way with the bat, A. T. G. Craig (leg-spin) always bowled well, and M. C. Eglinton developed from a medium-pacer into a promising off-spinner.

The young XI of Magdalen College School had a mixed season, often compiling high scores only to find themselves unable to dismiss the opposition. Paradoxically, no batsman passed 500 runs, although J. C. K. Lewis, S. N. Webb (slow left-arm) and A. L. C. Winchester each captured more than twenty wickets. A young and enthusiastic Malvern side were ably captained by M. C. A. Pougatch, a reliable wicket-keeper who claimed 28 dismissals. The batting tended to be fragile, with J. R. Wileman, at sixteen their leading batsman, too often losing his wicket instead of going on to the big scores his talents suggested. The bowling, though steady and economical, lacked penetration. Unbeaten and with fifteen emphatic wins. Manchester GS had not just one but three exceptional players. M. A. Atherton topped 600 runs and took 50 wickets with his leg-spin, including six for 27 v Lytham and six for 44 v Arnold. He opened the innings with M. A. Crawley, whose 1,123 runs at an average of 112.30 passed Atherton's two-year-old record and included a run of 476 in five innings without being dismissed. Although exams and injury restricted the appearances of G. Yates, he managed 34 wickets with his off-spin and 636 runs, his best being a brilliant 207 v Duchess HS, Alnwick at the Durham Festival - another school record - and six for 16 v RGS, Lancaster. A virtually all-spin attack also featured R. Steele (off-spin) and P. D. E. Richards (slow left-arm), who took seven Duchess HS, Alnwick, wickets for 50. Atherton, Crawley and Yates were all selected for MCC Schools, although Yates did not play in the match v NAYC. Atherton also played for NCA Young Cricketers v Combined Services and but for a broken thumb would have captained English Schools, for whom Crawley played.

Marlborough suffered their worst season for many years, the nadir coming with their dismissal for 33 by Wellington College. However, the side was young and made great progress during the season, with two Colts, G. W. Barker and A. J. Robinson, both topping 500 runs. In a period of transition, Merchant Taylors', Crosby, struggled early on, often being dismissed for low scores, but they finished on a high note with wins over Northern Nomads, the XL club, William Hulme's GS and King's, Macclesfield. Fifteen-year-old wicket-keeper and opening bat, R. W. Glynne-Jones, took nineteen catches and made seven stumpings as well as scoring the most runs, including 115 v Royal Military School, Dover, and S. Bell (fast-medium) returned eight for 49 v Old Crosbeians. All-round effort brought Merchant Taylors', Northwood, greater success than anticipated, wins in schools matches coming at the expense of St Albans, Highgate, St Paul's and St Peter's, York. They were shrewdly captained by D. W. R. Wiles, who passed 100 wickets for the XI and played for Middlesex Second XI.

The highlight for Merchiston Castle in an unbeaten season was their exciting finish v The Edinburgh Academy. Having followed on, Merchiston Castle could set a target of only 26, but thanks to a return of six for 13 by B. D. Cameron (left-arm medium), their opponents were dismissed for just 24. Also unbeaten and winning eight of their twelve matches, Millfield's strongest side ever contained a balanced attack and a potent batting force, eight players averaging more than 20. J. C. M. Atkinson, H. R. J. Trump, A. R. Phillips and the wicket-keeper, R. J. Turner, all played for English Schools, Atkinson captaining the side against St Lankan Young Cricketers and, with Trump and Turner, playing for HMC Schools. Atkinson appeared for Somerset in the County Championship, while Trump and Phillips played for their Second XI. The school won the Barclays Bank Under-17 competition for the third consecutive year, and the Lord's Taverners Under-15 competition. The competent batsmen of Milton Abbey School were frustrated by the wet weather early on, and when the pitches hardened the bowling suffered from the lack of a penetrating bowler, depending too much on the off-spin of G. Cameron-Clarke and B. A. Murray's skills behind the stumps.

Capably led by N. J. E. Foster, whose off-spin accounted for eight Culford batsmen, Norwich School recorded seven victories. R. J. Wilson (medium) was the leading bowler, with an eight-wicket return v St Joseph's, but the left-arm spin of all-rounder J. R. Marsh was

significant. School records were set at **Oakham** by D. M. Robjohns, whose four centuries were the most in a season and whose 902 runs at 60.13 surpassed the 825 scored in 1913 by S. H. G. Humphrey. **Oundle's** inexperience resulted in poor results. Their brittle batting often collapsed after the weakness of their bowling left them facing large totals.

The batsmen of The Perse frequently made an enterprising bid for victory, but a general inability to bowl sides out often left them facing difficult targets. N. M. Law topped both averages, he and the captain, T. A. G. Miller, scoring by far the most runs. I. R. Styan bore the brunt of the attack, while the slow bowlers, P. J. A. Alexander and P. A. Bailey, proved their worth once the pitches hardened. Undefeated by schools in their best season ever, Pockington won twelve of their last thirteen matches to take their total of victories to sixteen. They attributed this success to their opening bowlers – the captain J. D. Nuttall (left arm), 60 wickets at 8.78, and T. P. B. Balderson, 64 at 11.68 – who were ably backed by the third seamer, J. R. C. Brown (38 at 10.18). Batting second in all but one game, the young Prior Park College side featured in many high-scoring draws and only once managed to reach their target.

But for dropped catches, Queen Elizabeth GS, Wakefield, may have shown more wins and fewer draws, although they did finish the season in style, winning all three of their fixtures on alour of Holland. The captain, A. M. Smith, played for English Schools. After a shaky start, owing to the absence through injury of key players, Queen's College, Taunton, realised their potential by winning the last six successive schools matches. D. N. A. Essien was the outstanding player. Radley, under the inspiring leadership of J. C. Smellie, were unbeaten by schools, defeating St Edward's Oxford, Abingdon, Stowe, Bradfield, Winchester and Mariborough. Three players stood out. C. H. H. Pegg, who played for Gloucestershire Second XI, was among the best schoolboy wicket-keepers with nineteen catches and nine stumpings, as well as a century v Wellington College; R. D. Stormonth-Darling, whose leg-cutters were particularly effective on damp wickets, took 40 wickets for the second season; and fourteen-year-old M. J. Lowrey, the Lord's Taverners' Under-15 Cricketer of the Year, had a remarkable first season, taking 32 wickets with his off-breaks and scoring a maiden century v Stowe.

Another school to enjoy its best season for many years was Ratcliffe College, for whom the captain, J. Farnell, hit 103 not out v Ruthin. P. Mestecky's medium-fast bowling brought him 58 wickets, including five in an innings six times and a return of nine for 26 v Trent College. Reading's young team relied heavily on the captaincy and batting of their left-handed opener, J. E. Grimsdale, and the fast bowling of J. S. Pritchard. Grimsdale scored 104 v Lord Wandsworth College, and Pritchard's 44 wickets included seven for 41 in RGS Colchester's 94 and figures of 7-2-8-9 in Oratory's 31. Six of the nine were bowled and he ended the innings with a hat-trick.

In a season of rebuilding, Reed's depended on their experienced players, notably J. D. F. Paris, who finished the season with five consecutive scores over 50, including two successive centuries, and T. T. Oliver, a slow left-arm spinner. First victories were gained over Trinity Croydon and another young Reigate GS side who, while disappointed with their results, had four good wins in July, two of them on a tour of Jersey. The captain, A. S. Clayton, led from the front with more than 500 runs, and others prominent were the opening bowler, M. T. Holman, and C. S. Bates, a fine young wicket-keeper. Noteworthy for Repton were a memorable tied game v Wesley College, Melbourne, and good wins v Shrewsbury and Malvern, both achieved by comfortable margins and when batting first. Sound teamwork was a feature under the decisive captaincy of G. M. Cook.

The highlight of a season of fluctuating fortunes for Rossall's young side was their end-of-term festival in which six teams played fifteen matches in five days. The wicket-keeper, C. D. Foster, was a sound opening batsman, well supported by the captain, P. Cartwright, and P. A. Clayton, who made a major contribution with his medium-pace bowling and batting at No. 4. Clayton, who made a major contribution of Some fine cricket, especially in the field, brought ten wins for Royal GS, Guildford, including those at the expense of Kingston GS, Judd, Portsmouth, Wallington, Reed's, King's Worcester, Royal GS High Wycombe and KCS Wimbledon, who were dismissed for 88, seven wickets falling to P. Challinor (medium) for 18 runs. However, three consecutive defeats rather upset the record. Royal GS, Newcastle, enjoyed convincing wins and suffered equally convincing defeats. A highlight was a first victory over MCC. A. Atkinson, the 1987 captain, and S. Johnson performed well throughout the season.

Royal GS, Worcester, recorded wins over eight schools, the most emphatic being v Repton, when J. S. Waters produced a remarkable display of leg-spin – described by the opposition as "devastating" – to take nine for 20. Waters took 61 wickets altogether, with sound support from G. T. Burrow (slow left-arm) and D. W. Headley (fast-medium). Equally outstanding was the opening batsman, D. P. Spiller, whose 1,073 runs passed the previous school record by more than 100. He hit three hundreds, including an aggressive 139 v Royal GS, High Wycombe, and passed 50 on six other occasions. With a strong batting side consistently capable of large scores, Rugby beat Warwick, Oundle and Charterhouse, all by more than 100 runs, and lost only to Clifton. Fifteen-year-old B. C. A. Ellison (fast-medium) collected 51 wickets in his first season, and although conceding more than 1,000 runs, the leg-spinner time since 1931, although more than half their fixtures were affected by the weather. Their all-rounders, M. Sherington and C. Robinson – an able captain – as well as the wicket-keeperbatsman, E. Jones, made significant contributions.

Mediocre batting, which gave the **St Albans** bowlers nothing to defend, resulted in their losing the first five matches, although an improvement came with better weather and the ability to introduce talented Colts. Apart from the wicket-keeping of D. Hopkins, most of the talent lay in the Under-15 side. A. Dalwood averaged 179 as the St Albans Colts won their County Cup competition. Pre-eminent for **St Dunstan's** was M. A. Slade, who, in addition to taking the most wickets, hit two hundreds and six fifties in the best batting figures for the school since the war. However, inability to bowl sides out prevented the side from winning at least five of their drawn matches. **St Edmund's, Canterbury**, suffered from a similar problem, their three wins being achieved when batting second. As the averages reflect, there was depth in the batting, but the only bowler with more than twenty wickets was P. J. Bryant, a legspinner, whose 35 included seven for 74 against Queen's, Taunton. **St Edward's, Oxford**, won four successive matches in May, largely through the fast in-swing bowling of C. G. Sharp, who took nine for 42 when Eton were dismissed for 76. The batting relied too heavily on the first three in the order – A. J. W. Brown, whose 105 not out brought the ten-wicket victory over Bradfield, J. D. Ball and G. J. Young.

Unbeaten by schools for the fourth consecutive season, St George's, Weybridge, had in J. Creber a polished batsman and improving leg-break bowler. He scored the most runs and took the most wickets. St John's, Leatherhead, beat Epsom, KCS Wimbledon, Whitgift and Royal GS, Guildford, and the Under-17s reached the South final of the Barclays Bank Cup for the second successive year. Two hundreds were hit – 106 by S. J. Walster, an opening bat and medium-pace bowler, v the Grasshoppers and 100 not out by A. C. Martin, the captain, v Whitgift. A highlight for St Lawrence College was the sixth-wicket partnership of 198 v Kimbolton between G. Hewitt-Coleman (109) and E. Anish (93). The absence of M. Carrington from all but four matches, owing to a broken arm, deprived the team of his aggressive batting and medium-fast bowling, but with nine of the side expected to return in 1987, prospects are good. Much promise was also shown by the St Peter's, York, XI, seven of whom were under sixteen. Inexperience told when they were chasing a total, and injuries to both opening bowlers, one for the whole season, severely restricted the attack. Nevertheless, M. D. Donoghue (fast-medium) and J. Brewster (off-spin) took 68 wickets between them, and the fourteen-year-old opening bat, R. Hutchinson, impressed with almost 600 runs.

Sedbergh, whose only defeat in schools matches was by one wicket at the hands of Pocklington, beat Ampleforth, Lancaster and William Hulme's GS. G. J. Porritt, with two centuries, was the leading batsman, the only other three-figure innings coming from A. J. D. Wheatley. Although the absence of an effective spin bowler was disappointing, M. W. Mewburn (left-arm fast) bowled consistently well and was generally supported by fine fielding. Sevenoaks' wins were v Judd and Ardingly. A. B. Hood, their main strike bowler, returned six for 22 against the latter, but when injury kept him out of the side there was an abundance of drawn games. In many of these, the XI's solid batting gave them the advantage. S. A. Ford (left-arm fast) showed promise with the ball, as well as achieving a batting average of 108 by being dismissed only once in eight innings. A strong Sherborne side were unbeaten and might have finished with more than seven victories, five opposing teams being eight or nine wickets down at the close. Totals of more than 200 were made regularly, with the major contributions coming from S. W. D. Rintoul and A. Kardouni, whose unbeaten 124 v Radley was a highlight. P. M. S. Slade's medium-pace bowling brought him almost twice as many wickets as the next bowler, N. H. Peters, who was fast but not as destroying as expected.

Surensbury's successful season featured eleven victories under the able captaincy of C. M. Ballock. D. J. Burrows headed the averages, scoring hundreds v Free Foresters, Cheltenham and Uppingham, but J. R. Prichard was the outstanding batsman, his school record of 1,051 ms including centuries v Manchester GS, MCC, Shrewsbury Saracens and Shropshire Inder-19.

Sally, a combination of bad weather and the teacher's industrial dispute severely curtailed the season for Simon Langton GS, who hope for more opportunities in 1987. Solihull enjoyed a better season than of late under the excellent captaincy of S. J. Townsley, who scored by far the most runs. R. E. Hatcliffe scored the only century, v Bromsgrove, in his first senior innings. A balanced attack featured the spin of A. A. Jowsey (slow left-arm) and P. St J. Heath (leg-breaks and googlies), the pace of M. J. Sawle and the swing and seam of P. S. Godson. Highlights were the 1-run defeat of Royal GS, Worcester, and a semi-final appearance in the Birmingham Under-19 Cup. Despite failing to manage a win, Stockport GS enjoyed their cricket, their team spirit being a credit to the captaincy of P. H. Duff. M. K. Duckworth, a left-hander, and N. J. Vernon, who scored the XI's two centuries, dominated the batting, although Vernon's form fell away when he was promoted to open with Duckworth. As spearhead of the attack, R. A. Pailin (left-arm fast) was consistent.

Because of the weather, **Stonyhurst** completed only one of their first seven matches – which they lost to Giggleswick despite J. Barnes's return of seven for 13. Excellent fielding and tight towling characterised their cricket, bringing wins over Rossall and the XL Club. The superb taiting and positive captaincy of R. S. M. Morris were the basis of **Stowe's** successful season. With four hundreds, he became the first Stoic to top 1,000 runs – more than twice as many as the next batsman, his opening partner, I. O. Bendell, who hit one century. Dean Close, Mill Hill, Bradfield, Royal GS Colchester and Wellington were schools beaten, with only defeats being by Radley and Wesley College, Melbourne, both in close encounters. A. J. E. Hazzard (right-arm in-swing) was the most successful bowler, taking five wickets in a match three times and returning four for 9 v Merchant Taylors', Northwood. The ground fielding was keen and the catching safe. A young **Strathallan** XI had a disappointing season, depending unduly on the batting of the captain, G. S. R. Robertson, who played for Scotland Under-19, and the successful off-spin of K. D. Smith. In a season of rebuilding which saw 29 players represent Suton Valence, D. G. Plommer twice reached three figures and was well supported by J. D. Crouch, a forcing right-hand bat. In a steady attack, D. Patel emerged as an economical leg-spinner.

Taunton School beat MCC for the third year in succession and recorded wins against seven schools, the only defeats being at the hands of Blundell's and Millfield. They attributed their success to strong batting, headed by M. Van Der Walt, a varied attack and good catching. Tiffin were unbeaten until the end of June, when St George's, Weybridge, inflicted their only defeat by a school. Highlights were victory over a strong Caterham XI, and a tied match v Watford GS. N. P. Warren opened the batting consistently, and was the steadiest of the opening bowlers. The lion's share of the bowling was borne by the captain, M. R. Coote (slow left-arm), whose 47 wickets took his tally over four years to 172 at 13.55 apiece. Tonbridge, who lost only to Pembroke School, Adelaide, beat Charterhouse, Winchester, Free Foresters, St Peter's Adelaide, Old Tonbridgians, Tonbridge CC and Kent Schools. Weakness in the bowling was offset by the remarkable batting of J. I. Longley, who, with four hundreds, became the first Tonbridgian since M. C. Cowdrey in 1950 to score 1,000 runs. His 1,141 runs broke the school record aggregate established in 1910. Longley represented HMC Schools against Sri Lankan Young Cricketers.

The relatively inexperienced **Trinity** XI, well led by G. M. Vigor, recorded good wins over King's Rochester, St Benedict's, City of London and Reigate GS. K. P. Morley's 852 runs included two hundreds, while the predominently seam attack was spearheaded by P. A. Gardner, still a Colt, T. W. Harlow and D. J. Trafford. Unbeaten until their last match, but drawing nine, **Truro School** owed much to the sound captaincy and batting of P. G. Phillips and the swing bowling of S. R. Peters (medium-fast), who took 38 wickets. The batting of University College School was often in difficulties, too much depending on A. D. Diamond and P. A. Teleki. The bowling, too, had its weaknesses, but R. H. H. Thompson (left-arm last) bowled with spirit, and there were notable performances from D. O. Benaim (medium), who took seven for 26 v John Lyon, and A. S. Lal (fast-medium), six for 32 v Westfield College.

Uppingham, rebuilding, tended to be let down by their batting, although C. M. Frost played some fine innings and D. B. J. Cooke, C. R. Saunders and M. C. Renison of the younger players looked useful. Cooke, with his off-spin, was the mainstay of the bowling, support coming from the promising Colt, P. J. E. Spencer (left-arm medium). Victoria College, Jersey, enjoyed a ten-match tour of England in July, highlights of which were exciting last-over finishes at Hurstpierpoint and Eastbourne. The captain, C. M. Graham, confirmed his status as one of the school's best-ever all-rounders, his 715 runs and 62 wickets taking his total for the XI to 2,482 runs and 191 wickets. Spinners A. D. Brown and D. V. Carnegie ended their school careers with 122 and 102 wickets respectively.

Warwick School, unbeaten for three years, lost three times in 1986. The main problem layin the bowling, but it was of concern that the batting depended so much on three players: A. J. Moffatt, the captain, who scored 116 v MCC and v Solihull; J. D. Stanton, who hit 111 v King Edward's, Birmingham; and T. R. Luckman, 102 v Bloxham. Without defeat until the last week of the season, Watford GS played positive cricket under the captaincy of their excellent wicket-keeper, I. Thomas. All-rounders M. J. H. Hanson and A. A. Chaudry were the leading players, but there were few large scores from a strong batting line-up, and the predominantly seam attack suffered from unreliable close catching. The out-cricket, however, was keen. For Wellingborough, with schools wins over Aylesbury GS, Alleyn's and Maidstone GS, the captain, P. S. H. Wilson, and fifteen-year-old M. I. Ingram topped 600 runs. T. K. Marriott, another fifteen-year-old, headed the bowling with 42 wickets. Fourteen-year-old J. M. Attfield showed great promise and with eight players expected to return in 1987, prospects are good.

Wellington College, another young side, played positive, attacking cricket as was seen when they successfully chased large totals to defeat Repton and Winchester. Marlborough were bowled out for 33 in their only other win. A return of six for 43 v Repton contributed towards the 42 wickets of J. R. H. Fennick (fast medium) in his first season, W. R. D. Waghorn, a left-hander, batted in attractive fashion, and P. A. Huxtable hit a maiden century v Free Foresters. Although promising more, Wellington School, Somerset, achieved just one victory. M. Colman's early-season seam bowling and, later, his batting, including an innings of 101 not out v Wells Cathedral School, provided some compensation. Whitgift's inability to bowl out the opposition offset the advantage of having a competent batting side. G. J. Thompson scored a century v Reigate GS, while the captain, N. J. Taylor's post-war school record of 808 runs included hundreds v Christ's Hospital and Domini. S. J. Hill showed promise as an of-spinner.

If disappointing in terms of results, William Hulme's GS's season could be deemed a success in the development both of individuals and of the team. D. M. J. Timm and G. J. O'Driscoll became good high-order batsmen, and the side was rarely short of runs. However, the inexperience showed in the bowling as they attempted to convert the advantage gained by the batsmen into wins. Winchester, although relatively weak, did win five matches, and there was merit in the batting of R. J. Waddington and the off-spin bowling of T. S. Maclure – hitherto a wicket-keeper – which brought him 41 wickets. Topping the averages for Woodbridge School was the slow left-arm bowler and No. 5 batsman, J. R. Harper. A. A. Donnison (opening bat and fast-medium bowler) scored the most runs and took the most wickets. Despite managing only one win – v Silcoates – Woodhouse Grove profited from their experiences and were especially encouraged by the sound technique and application of their young opening batsman, J. L. Gomersall. C. A. Miller's left-arm spin showed control and variety.

Worksop College shrugged off the loss of their first three matches to finish with more wins than losses. Well-timed declarations by R. J. Darwin, an outstanding captain, brought six thrilling finishes. The top half of the batting was sound, with D. B. Storer hitting a century v Wrekin and batting consistently, and while the attack lacked the depth of the previous year, B. D. Hackett was a useful opening bowler. His six for 26 set up the victory over Hurstpierpoint. The young Wrekin side, all but two of whom are expected to return in 1987, recorded only one win. The batting, somewhat unreliable, depended mainly on the captain, C. A. Fenton, who, if less successful than in 1985, still played some valuable innings. S. R. Jackson (left-arm fast-medium) and J. R. Ford (fast) developed into a good opening pair but the spinners, J. B. Rimmer (off-spin) and R. W. Barker (left-arm), took fewer wickets than expected. Wycliffe College ended their season in style after a poor start, winning four of their last seven matches. S. J. Reed was an outstanding captain and high-scoring opening batsman,

but his bowlers lacked the accuracy he must have wanted from them. Winners of the leicestershire County Cup for the first time, Wyggeston and Queen Elizabeth I College attributed their success to the consistent batting of the captain, R. M. Lee, the all-round ballity of S. C. Brammar, and the penetrative fast bowling of J. L. Green and D. Bennett, ball of whom played for Leicestershire Under-19.
