SCHOOLS CRICKET IN 1987

In such a wet summer, the English Schools were fortunate to play as much of their representative programme as they did without greater interruption. None of the batsmen capped in 1986 was available, and it soon became evident that the high standard of batting seen then would not be repeated. M. R. Ramprakash, although still at school, was not considered because of his commitments to Middlesex. Of the bowlers, however, H. R. J. Trump, M. R. Newton, P. J. Martin and I. J. Houseman could all be called upon, but because the International Youth Tournament in Ireland clashed with the Schools international matches, only Newton, being too old for the Youth Tournament, was available for English Schools. Seventeen schoolboys were included in the two NCA teams for Ireland, and while depriving the selectors of their services, it had the advantage of enabling younger cricketers to participate at this level. Trump was the 1987 winner of the Gray-Nicolls Trophy for the year's most-improved schoolboy cricketer.

In the two representative matches, fourteen players appeared for English Schools. They were: G. P. Thorpe (captain), W. M. I. Bailey, I. Binns (The Plume School, Maldon), N. A. Derbyshire, D. N. Essien, M. I. Gidley, D. A. Graham, M. C. Ilott, M. J. Kellaway, N. V. Knight, J. L. P. Meadows, M. R. Newton, P. J. Rendall and R. W. Sladdin. Their schools may be found in the scorecards of matches played at the MCC Festival, Oxford.

Graham, Knight and Thorpe were the pick of the batsmen, and Binns and Rendall showed promise. But even without the experienced players, the bowling was the team's strength. The openers, Ilott, left-arm, and Derbyshire kept a good line and length at medium pace and were well supported by Rendall and Meadows, the two all-rounders. The two slow left-armers, Newton and Sladdin, both spun the ball, and when Newton was required by his county, Hampshire, Gidley's off-breaks provided a balanced attack against Scottish Young Cricketers. Bailey and Kellaway shared the wicket-keeping, and there was a good standard of ground fielding and catching, especially at slip by Thorpe, who captained the team quietly and efficiently.

Against Welsh Schools, at Morris Motors, Oxford, English Schools' inexperience was apparent in the first innings when, put in, they subsided from 158 for five to 170 all out off the last ball of their 60 overs. After the bowlers had restricted Welsh Schools to 150, however, Ilott taking four for 34 and Newton three for 64, the batsmen fared better in the second innings. Knight (88) and Thorpe (66 not out) added 111 for the third wicket, but the declaration, at 195 for four, did not leave enough time. Welsh Schools earned a comfortable draw, finishing with 145 for six (A. Dale 41).

The speed with which the team had developed its confidence was reflected in the victory, by an innings and 2 runs, over Scottish Young Cricketers at Grange CC, Edinburgh. Put in again, they lost an early wicket before Knight (22) and Graham took the score to 74. Graham went on to dominate the innings with an outstanding 111, scored out of 152 in 172 minutes and containing one six and eleven fours; and in their 60 overs English Schools scored 176 for nine. In reply, the Scots were dismissed for 65 in 39.3 overs; Derbyshire (20–11–27–2) had only thirteen scoring shots hit off his bowling, Ilott took three for 24 and Rendall's impressive figures were 10.3–6–5–5. Following on, the home side were undone by the spinners; 31 for four by the close, 103 for seven at lunch on the second day, and all out for 109 soon

afterwards. Sladdin, backed up by good wicket-keeping from Kellaway and Thorpe's slip catching, had figures of 24.2–12–39–6; Gidley, with two for 25, was an admirable foil at the other end.

Welsh Schools, with five Glamorgan Colts at Under-19 level, beat Irish Schools by ten wickets and drew with Scotland Under-19 as well as English Schools. At the Carlisle club, Irish Schools were dismissed for 189 and 98, only S. Harrison (59) and F. O'Mahony (31) establishing themselves. C. Stephens impressed as a seam bowler, returning match figures of nine for 100, while D. Shufflebotham took three for 41 in the first innings and S. Moorcroft four for 21 in the second. The captain, S. Williams (56), and D. Hemp (50) took Welsh Schools to a first-innings total of 253, and when they batted again A. Dale and S. Evans comfortably collected the 35 needed for victory. It was a quite different story at Ynysygerwn, however. Outclassed by Scotland Under-19, the Welsh were saved only by a fighting knock from Shufflebotham, the tenth-wicket pair having to survive the last eight balls. The Scots, batting first, scored 241 for nine declared (G. Salmond 65, G. B. A. Dyer 45), to which the Welsh could reply with only 153 (G. Lucas 48), G. S. R. Robertson scored 108 not out in Scotland's second innings of 207, and at 141 for nine, 295 runs behind, Wales were relieved to secure a

For the MCC Schools Festival at Oxford, selection was on merit and disregarded prior selection for the international tournament in Ireland, even though such players could not be considered for the coming Schools internationals. At a time when little first-class cricket was played elsewhere in England, the Festival did well to enjoy a full day's play on the first and third days, although the second and fourth days were affected.

HMC SOUTHERN SCHOOLS v THE REST

At Magdalen College School, Oxford, July 18, 19. Drawn. Although a full day's play was possible on Saturday, drizzle permitted only three and a half hours on Sunday. On a damp, slow wicket, the left-handed Forward, enjoying some luck against Daniels, and Shahid, an elegant batsman, gave Southern Schools a sound start, but the best batting of the first day came from Knight and Adams for The Rest. On the second day, Forward and Brown put on 147 for Southern Schools' first wicket, with Brown particularly punishing and Marcelline, a Sri Lankan batsman, dominated The Rest's innings before the rain returned. Of the bowlers, McCartney and Daniels looked the pick of the seamers, while Shahid overcame the conditions to bowl his leg-breaks well. Manasseh, slow left-arm, had some success on the first day. Bailey was the better of the two wicket-keepers, but no-one stood out in generally competent fielding sides.

Batty, an off-spinner, was the pick of the bowlers with five wickets. Following a delayed start, the North batted with greater urgency on the second day, scoring 179 in 42 overs before rain stopped play.

The matches at Lord's between MCC and MCC Schools, and between MCC Schools and the National Association of Young Cricketers were abandoned owing to rain. The names of the players selected for those matches may be found in Other Matches at Lord's, 1987.

Reports from the Schools

The schools programme generally suffered less from the dismal weather than the first-class game, although the damp, slow wickets of May and June restricted strokeplay. None the less, six players from the schools reviewed here passed 1,000 runs; C. J. Adams of Repton (1,242), H. A. M. Marcelline of Bishop's Stortford (1,166), N. Martin of King Edward's, Birmingham (1,104), N. V. Knight of Felsted (1,027), R. M. Day of Eastbourne College (1,008) and J. I. Longley of Tonbridge (1,007). Marcelline averaged 145.75 as well as taking 32 wickets, Martin averaged 110.40, and Day in addition took 45 wickets. The bowlers prospered, four taking 60 wickets or more: P. J. Le Cornu of Victoria College, Jersey (70), M. P. Mernagh of King's, Rochester (63), S. J. White of King's, Macclesfield (62) and P. A. Mestecky of Ratcliffe College (61). Le Cornu was the leading all-rounder with 859 runs as well as his 70 wickets, and of the sixteen other bowlers who took 50 wickets, P. D. Lunn of Abingdon scored 721 runs, S. P. Howkins of Dover College 656, D. W. Headley of Royal GS, Worcester 627, S. J. Watkinson of Cranleigh 551 and S. W. Ellis of King William's College, Isle of Man 515. P. Rainey of Ballymena Academy GS averaged only 6.46 for his 52 wickets. Seven hat-tricks were reported: by N. E. Baig of Bloxham, D. L. Clift of Merchant Taylors', Crosby, H. J. A. Daniels of Sedbergh, T. Kemp of Royal GS, Colchester (twice), M. J. T. Jefferson of Stowe and J. S. Pritchard of Reading.

Abingdon, captained with enthusiasm and a sporting approach by G. D. Scott, played positive, exciting cricket. P. D. Lunn batted with classical elegance and sound technique to score 721 runs, including 119 v Magdalen College School, and also took 56 wickets with his leg-spin. S. J. Green and off-spinner R. J. Tilley backed him with the ball, although a lack of penetration - as well as their own weakness against spin bowling - prevented a more rewarding final record. The leading all-rounder for Alleyn's was B. T. L. Bennett, under whose captaincy they beat St John's Leatherhead, Wellingborough and MCC. As opening bowler, he was well supported by J. Papanastasiou (fast) and O. A. Lucking (slow). J. G. Davey, a fifteen-year-old, showed promise as an opening bat. Allhallows, defeated only twice by schools. owed much to their all-rounder, R. Enticott, who averaged 54 in his last eight innings. The most successful bowler was J. E. T. Clark. Ampleforth's strength lay in their bowling, with a well-balanced attack compensating for a weakness in the batting caused by term-long injuries to two key players and general inexperience. There were victories over Durham, Worksop, Oundle and Blundell's. N. A. Derbyshire, aged sixteen, bowled genuinely fast, took 34 wickets, including seven for 46 v Oundle, was selected for MCC Schools and went on to play for English Schools.

As expected, Ardingly's young side experienced a poor season, but with ten players expected to return in 1988, prospects are bright. Arnold defeated William Hulme's GS, Bolton School, Baines, Brighton College and King's, Macclesfield, with whom they later tied at the King's festival. Their captain, R. G. Halsall, led by example, heading the averages and going on to represent Lancashire Schools Under-19 and Lancashire Federation. Bowling right-arm slow, he and S. M. Aga (slow left-arm) took 75 wickets, including Halsall's return of six for 38 against Hutton GS. Wicket-keeper J. Muir claimed 33 dismissals, as well as scoring 443 runs. Ashville College beat Mount St Mary's, Batley GS, Bishop Vesey's, Old Ashvillians and the XL Club, while the scores were tied in the drawn match v Stamford.

Excellent team spirit helped Ballymena Academy enjoy one of their most successful seasons. Any weakness in the batting was offset by a strong attack, spearheaded by P. Rainey, whose 52 wickets cost only 6.46 apiece, and all-rounder J. Glass. These two took 90 wickets between them, the supporting bowlers adding another 76. R. Kennedy was an astute captain and his splendid wicket-keeping inspired a high standard of fielding. In a season of rebuilding, Bancroft's had the encouragement of five victories. Centuries were scored by A. E. Phillips and G. J. Norgate, and there were useful innings from A. C. H. Knight. The captain, R. W. Hubbard (fast-medium), headed the bowling with 43 wickets, although his batting suffered from his carrying the attack, while A. Azad (medium), maintaining a good line and length, took 27 wickets. Two young all-rounders, G. P. Brown (fast medium) and P. Brown (offbreaks), showed much promise. A young Bangor GS side won ten matches, their captain, C. C. Yeates, leading by example with 599 runs, including 105 not out against Campbell College. Fifteen-year-old M. W. McCord, a slow left-arm spinner, was the leading wickettaker. Barnard Castle, an efficient all-round side, were defeated only once in schools matches and won their end-of-term festival for the fourth year running. N. J. Foster and the lefthanded M. E. Jobling passed 500 runs, while R. J. Irving, left-arm fast-medium, took his tally of wickets for the XI to more than 150.

Bedford School's fast bowlers, J. E. Crooker and B. C. Banks, made life unpleasant for opposing batsmen, but only once, against Rugby, did they bowl a side out. Crooker again headed the batting, followed by A. B. Cartmell, the captain and wicket-keeper. Bedford Modern recorded wins over Kimbolton, Christ's College Cambridge, St Albans, RGS Colchester and Gentlemen of Bedfordshire. They were captained by A. J. Trott, whose 625 runs included 116 not out v Queens' College, Cambridge, and 104 v Oundle. P. A. Owen (slow left-arm) took seven for 26 v RGS Colchester, and all-rounder A. D. McCartney (fast) nine for 23 v Kimbolton: each finished with 45 wickets. Fifteen-year-old G. A. H. Awudu was a fine prospect with 324 runs and 21 wickets. Astutely led by M. J. Keen, Beechen Cliff, Bath, enjoyed a solid season, in which they were defeated only by Prior Park – having been 98 without loss after the first hour. Their bowling strength lay with the spinners, J. D. Colbourne (leg-spin) and S. M. Priscott (left-arm), backed up by all-rounder D. J. Adams (fast). Keen, the leading batsman, scored 101 v Cowney GS in his final game for the school.

Berkhamsted, defeated by Brentwood in their opening match, went on to beat Haberdashers' Aske's, Aldenham, St Albans, Framlingham, St Lawrence and Kimbolton. The averages were headed by the opening batsman and slow left-arm bowler, D. T. Hodges, a

Colt, while another Colt, E. Shek, was the next-highest run-scorer. M. R. Player (medium-fast) bowled well, if at times with little luck. Lacking quality batting, **Birkenhead** narrowly failed to clinch victory chasing runs in four of their drawn games. Notable contributions came from the captain, P. I. Rennie, who took the most wickets, and M. J. Wilkie, the wicket-keeper, who scored the most runs. Outstanding for a young **Bishop's Stortford College** side was a Sri Lankan, H. A. M. Marcelline, whose aggregate of 1,166 runs at 145.75 easily passed the school record of 799, made in eight more innings in 1897 by C. H. Titchmarsh, who toured Australia and New Zealand with MacLaren in 1922-23. A correct opening batsman, Marcelline scored five hundreds, his 176 v Kingswood being the second highest for the College, and shared with the captain, G. M. E. Hackwell, an unbeaten stand of 226 v Stamford – a College record for any wicket. Such strong batting was let down at times by poor fielding, especially in the slips, and weak bowling.

After a successful season, **Bloxham** undertook an enjoyable tour to Barbados. N. E. Baig, who played for Pakistan Under-19, was an outstanding all-rounder, and his six for 24 v Denstone included a hat-trick. S. M. Blayney developed as an opening bat of much promise. **Blundell's**, with talented players often failing to take advantage of their opportunities, suffered several heavy defeats and their only win was at the expense of Oundle. A highlight was I. C. Fudge's 108 in the drawn game against Sherborne. A mixed season was reported by **Bradfield College's** young side, who recorded two good wins but suffered some unnecessary losses. D. J. Wiggins, a powerful right-hand bat, in his second year at the school, was the pick of the batsmen, while the captain, W. A. Oscroft, an accurate fast-medium bowler, led the attack. A visit to Barbados was planned for 1988 to participate in the Sir Garfield Sobers International Cricket Festival.

For Bradford GS the season was one of learning and improvement. Handicapped by injuries to two key bowlers, the attack often failed to dominate, yet when it did - against Hymers, Woodhouse Grove and William Hulme's GS - victory resulted. The batting, headed by opener D. R. Chadwick, was more reliable, but the middle order at times lacked discipline and patience when chasing big targets. The opposite was the experience of Brentwood School, whose strong middle order featured left-hander M. D. Wilkins, P. A. Welton, the captain, and J. G. Northwood. After losing two of their first three matches, the side went undefeated, registering good wins over Berkhamsted, Framlingham and Young Essex. The attack did better than expected, despite a slow home pitch. Seam predominated, but there was success, too, for the leg-spinner, P. McGowan. With ten victories, Brighton College exceeded expectations, a highlight being the only defeat of Ipswich, against whom C. P. Sweet scored 189 off 121 balls at the King's, Macclesfield, festival. The batting was solid, with no one player dominating, while Sweet and the two spinners, C. M. Long and C. M. Oliphant-Callum, who took 107 wickets between them, carried the attack. Bromsgrove, unbeaten by schools, were a strong batting side but found it hard to bowl sides out. Four consecutive wins over Dean Close, Kelvinside Academy, King's Worcester and King Edward's Birmingham were achieved when batting second. Bryanston's leading batsman, with more than twice as many runs as anyone else, was S. C. Ecclestone, whose 745 included 119 not out v Free Foresters.

Canford enjoyed their best season for many years, numbering Downside, King's Bruton, Bryanston and MCC among the seven teams beaten. Their only loss, to Bradfield, was by 3 runs. Outstanding was the captain, C. H. Forward, whose aggregate of 854 included 218 not out in 183 minutes in a score of 294 for one declared v King's, Taunton, and 124 not out v Bryanston in a match-winning unbroken opening stand of 200 with wicket-keeper J. P. Blissard-Barnes. A. M. W. Groves (medium) bowled consistently well for his 40 wickets, while fifteen-year-old T. R. Murray-Walker (medium) showed promise in taking twenty. Prominent in a successful season for Caterham were the captain, J. A. Cox-Colyer, who was just one wicket short of the double of 500 runs and 50 wickets, and A. D. Brown, who in spite of the slow wickets scored 898 runs at 81.63, including an unbeaten double-century, as well as taking 37 wickets. Another batsman to average more than 80 was A. J. Lee, captain of Chigwell, who were unbeaten by schools and enjoyed convincing wins v City of London, Brentwood and Enfield GS. Highlights were Lee's unbeaten 112 v Bancroft's and a school record opening stand of 198 between the wicket-keeper, T. A. Coleman (101 not out), and D. J. Clark (87) v MCC. J. F. Carpenter, a left-handed all-rounder, played for Essex Schools Under-15, while Lee played for Young Essex and Essex Schools Under-19.

Christ College, Brecon never fulfilled their promise, failing to win when the opportunity was there and twice losing when a draw could have been gained. The captain, D. O. Lloyd-Jones. a useful all-rounder, set a fine example in the field. Christ's Hospital's promising start was followed by four defeats in five games before a recovery which saw Ardingly (by ten wickets). Epsom and Cranleigh beaten. A high standard of fielding and sportsmanship characterised the season, and there were notable performances by J. P. Williams, with two centuries, and opening bowlers M. G. Fooks and R. C. Phillips, who took 33 wickets apiece. The leading batsman for Clayesmore was G. Owton, whose 626 runs included two hundreds. Two fifteenyear-old opening bowlers, J. Dike and J. Rumball, showed promise with 39 and 33 wickets respectively, and the school reached the regional final of the Barclays Bank Under-17 Cup. which they lost to Millfield. Although Clifton College were frustrated by the poor weather, they defeated Blundell's, Marlborough, Colston's, Eastbourne and Winchester, losing to Clifton CC, Malvern and Tonbridge. W. M. Lawry, an opening batsman, hit 103 before lunch v Downside, and J. L. P. Meadows an unbeaten 143 in 140 minutes v Eastbourne. W. M. I. Bailey was selected to keep wicket for MCC Schools and, with Meadows, played for English Schools. A strong commitment and all-round team effort brought Colfe's seven wins. including those v Alleyn's, Hampton, Emanuel and their first v MCC. D. Neil-Dwyer scored the side's only hundred, and his five consecutive fifties helped secure wins. The captain and opening bowler, J. Streeter, discomfited most opposing batsmen, especially those of Alleyn's, against whom he returned seven for 15, and Emanuel (eight for 47).

Colston's batsmen provided many fine displays, notably centuries from the captain, C. E. J. TenBroeke, and opening batsman R. L. Rees Jones, but the bowling could not offer the support necessary to obtain good results. Coventry School — Bablake retained the Warwickshire Knockout Cup, defeating King Edward's, Birmingham to win the final for the seventh time in nine seasons. This was particularly satisfying because the season had started badly with defeats by RGS Worcester, Loughborough, King Edward's Birmingham and King's, Worcester. Cranbrook, whose only defeat by a school was by 2 runs at the hands of Sevenoaks, achieved their four wins by bowling out the opposition. The drawn match v the Band of Brothers finished with the scores level. In a season of mixed fortunes, Cranleigh were frustrated by injuries and illness as well as the weather, yet remained capable of some impressive victories; St John's, Leatherhead were beaten by 202 runs. Two all-rounders made major contributions, R. G. Gutteridge scoring 110 v St John's and 115 v Merchant Taylors', Northwood, as well as taking 44 wickets, including six for 33 v Eastbourne. The captain, S. J. Watkinson, scored 551 runs and, with eight for 80 v Hurstpierpoint and six for 32 v St John's, took 50 or more wickets for the third successive season, increasing his tally for the XI to 159.

For **Dauntsey's**, strong batting but a limited attack was a formula resulting in too many inconclusive draws. J. W. S. Porter had a wonderful season, scoring five hundreds and more runs than any previous Dauntsey's batsman in recent memory, but his off-breaks and the slow left-arm spin of J. C. Frost were not enough to bowl the side to victory. **Dean Close's** season saw a positive result in all but two of their matches, both of which were rain affected. A young side depended heavily on T. A. Edginton (slow left-arm), who topped both averages, but there was a sound batting prospect in fourteen-year-old C. J. Townsend. Losing only to MCC, **Denstone** beat Wrekin, Trent, Nottingham HS, King's Macelesfield, Old Swinford Hospital School and Abbot Beyne, against whom A. J. Sloan (medium) returned nine for 16. Solid batting was complemented by an accurate attack headed by Sloan and P. R. Dennis-Jones (off-breaks). Dominant at **Dover College** was the captain, S. P. Howkins, whose all-round contribution of 52 wickets and 656 runs, including 103 not out in 87 balls v Dover GS, was a post-war best for the College. Steady bowling was supported by excellent out-cricket, K. G. Keats, D. J. Winwood and J. D. Rouse especially standing out.

Downside's young team were hampered by the absence through illness, for much of the term, of their captain and leading batsman, P. J. A. Baldwin. However, the improving G. C. J. Barrington looked a useful off-spinner and opening bat. Lacking a penetrative attack to complement a strong, quick-scoring batting line-up, Dulwich College failed to record as many victories as they would have liked. There was an exciting tied game v St Paul's, and fifteen-year-old N. K. M. Talonpoika, with 77 v Downside, became the youngest to score a half-century for the College since T. E. Bailey in 1939. In Durham School's young side, all-rounders A. Roseberry and N. Whitfield made a favourable impression and thirteen-year-old W. P. C. Weston looked an outstanding prospect. At their end-of-term festival the school entertained Manchester GS, Millfield and Western Australia Public Schools.

With a school-record eleven victories, including an eight-wicket win v Hurstpierpoint for the Langdale Trophy, Eastbourne College enjoyed their best season ever. The captain, R. M. Day, a left-hand bat and off-spinner, scored 1,008 runs and captured 45 wickets, including seven for 34 v King's, Canterbury. He was well supported by M. A. Chapple (right-hand bat and medium pace), who joined him in five century opening partnerships and returned seven for 10 v Worth. F. A. Ali took six for 16 v Christ's Hospital. The Edinburgh Academy's inexperienced side came together well under the captaincy of T. H. Duff to beat Watson's and St Bees, but Merchiston Castle, Pocklington and Nottingham HS proved too good for them. Duff's 101 not out v Fettes (five sixes, twelve fours) and M. M. A. Simpson's opening spell v St Bees, in which he hit the stumps six times in twelve balls, finishing with six for 20 in ten overs, were the season's highlights. A well-balanced attack and sound batting ensured Elizabeth College, Guernsey, of ten wins, including those v King Edward VI Southampton, Guernsey Island CC and Victoria College, Jersey, against whom J. Walker took six for 30. In his fourth year in the XI, M. Bacon, an influential captain, took his aggregate to 1,233 runs.

C. M. Reed (medium-fast) was the foremost bowler for Ellesmere College, his 41 wickets being a school record. There were fine performances, too, from the captain, J. J. Birchall (fast-medium in-swing), and M. J. Marvell, who in his first season with the XI scored the most runs and bowled slow left-arm with accuracy and guile. Against Birkenhead, O. Braithwaite and T. A. R. Elston put on 117 runs for the first wicket. Eltham College maintained their commendable record of wins, despite injuries which prevented the captain, R. J. Churchill, from bowling. T. J. Prifti enjoyed an excellent all-round season, giving the innings a sound start and troubling opposing batsmen with his slow left-armers. Enfield GS, with an identical record to that of 1986, attributed their four defeats following declarations to the inconsistent bowling of their experienced players. However, encouragement came from the emergence of three talented fifteen-year-old batsmen, one of whom, D. Bowen, scored twice as many runs as anyone else.

A highlight for Epsom College was the nine-wicket victory over St George's, Weybridge (219 for four), in which J. Jessop (106 not out) shared in a school record second-wicket partnership of 193 unbroken with P. J. Williams, the captain and leading bowler. Eton, unbeaten for the first time since 1982 and excellently captained by R. D. O. MacLeay, defeated Winchester by six wickets, Tonbridge (in the first fixture between the schools) by seven wickets, Shrewsbury by four wickets, I Zingari, MCC and Eton Ramblers. The batting relied on the experienced MacLeay and J. B. A. Jenkins, while the attack was built on J. K. Erith's fast bowling and T. P. M. Fleming's slow left-arm spin. Positive results eluded Exeter School, their two wins, over Allhallows and Old Exonians, set against a solitary defeat by Queen's, Taunton. No one player was outstanding, although C. L. Bawden, a left-hand bat and leg-spin bowler, caught the eye as a future prospect.

A preponderance of drawn games also characterised the season for Felsted, most of whose young side are expected to return in 1988. The captain, N. V. Knight, who played for English Schools, was outstanding with 1,027 runs, the next-highest aggregate being S. E. Carson's 377. Although the off-spin of S. A. Pearce-Higgins was accurate and generally economical, and J. B. C. Gilsenan and T. F. C. Cooper, both fast-medium, were hostile on occasions - Cooper took six Winchester wickets for 60 runs - an inability to knock over the tailenders led frequently to stalemate. Fettes did not manage a single win but their inexperienced side exceeded expectations by having the better of drawn games v Strathallan and Kelvinside. The captain, M. A. M. Adam, was a technically correct batsman and also opened the bowling with J. L. MacLean, who enjoyed success with bat and ball. Athletic and enthusiastic fielding was a feature of the XI's season. Forest, while undefeated in schools matches, were not decisive enough to win more than twice - v Bancroft's and the KAP XI. Their leading player was the talented fourteen-year-old, A. C. Richards, who took the most wickets, scored more than twice as many runs as the next batsman, and with A. R. Heyes went forward for HMC Under-15 trials. With Framlingham's young side rarely scoring enough runs to press for victory, N. C. Gowing's 102 not out v St Joseph's, Ipswich, was a feature of the season.

Giggleswick had a disappointing season. Lacking support for M. P. Kaye, a left-handed batsman and left-arm spin bowler, they struggled to dismiss opposing batsmen, found it difficult to chase runs, and failed to register a win. Kaye, scoring 120 not out, featured with D. A. V. Caton in an unbroken opening partnership of 207 – a school record – against Hipperholme GS. Glenalmond, unbeaten by schools, enjoyed good victories over Fettes and

Loretto but lost their momentum towards the end of the season and were perhaps fortunate that rain fell in the matches v Strathallan and Sedbergh. Noteworthy performances came from the opening batsman, J. P. Brown, who scored a maiden hundred v Dollar Academy, P. N. Kay behind the stumps, and R. J. H. White, a wrist-spinner who took 27 wickets, mostly bowling accurate googlies. Also unbeaten by schools were Gordonstoun, who benefited from better weather in the north of Scotland, although their batsmen did struggle on the damp wickets of April and May. A number of good Colts were drafted into the side late in the season, giving rise to expectations for 1988. An excellent season for Gresham's was followed by a tour to Barbados in August. With everyone contributing at some time or other, S. Musselwhite showing potential as a batsman of real quality, and T. D. Berwick regularly picking up wickets with his well-flighted leg-spin, fine victories were achieved v Framlingham, The Leys, King's Ely and MCC.

Haileybury also enjoyed a successful season, their six wins including those v Uppingham. Oundle and Dulwich, as well as the only victory over Scots College, Sydney. Bowling awayswing, B. J. B. Hall took 52 wickets, including seven for 42 v Oundle, and with E. G. Erith (twin brother of the Eton opener) took 90 wickets, a record for a Haileybury opening attack. The introduction to the XI of two sixteen-year-olds, J. B. Jouning and D. C. L. Beynon, produced 668 and 403 runs respectively. A tour to Australia was planned for Christmas. The inexperience of Hampton's young side often found expression when they were chasing runs Nevertheless, W. L. C. Taylor scored 552, with two hundreds, and A. J. B. Sales developed into a useful opening batsman, as well as keeping wicket reliably. With the seam attack restricted by injuries, S. Patel (slow left-arm) took 49 wickets, including eight for 34 v St Benedict's, and P. Laver's off-spin frequently confounded opposing batsmen. Harrow, well captained by D. Manasseh, were unbeaten by schools and defeated Bradfield, Winchester, Charterhouse and Haileybury. Although D. W. F. Berry-Green and A. C. W. Snow opened the attack effectively, and the medium-pace swing bowling of J. A. R. Hill was a welcome addition for the last four matches, it was the slow left-arm spin of Manasseh and R. D. Nelson's off-spin that provoked most dismissals. H. Boralessa batted with excellent concentration and technique, exemplified by his 127 in 380 minutes v Charterhouse and carrying his bat for 91 v I Zingari. Another schoolboy to carry his bat was D. Luka of Highgate, who did so for 82 v Abingdon.

Hipperholme GS's six wins came v Crossley Heath, Rishworth, Habergham, Fulneck, Read and Batley GS. The captain, W. Clarke, bowling fast-medium, took seven for 9 in 8.3 overs as Crossley Heath were despatched for 23, and P. Rawsden hit 102 v Rishworth in the Under-17 Barclays Bank English Schools Cup. Hurstpierpoint, helped by winning five successive matches in the last six days of the season, set a new record with eleven wins, while M. J. Hastwell's aggregate of 891 runs was the second highest ever for the school. Ipswich, unbeaten during the school term, had their most successful season of the 1980s. The captain, J. V. Zagni, compiled 136 v RGS Colchester and 103 not out v Woodbridge, as well as taking 37 wickets bowling slow left-arm. He took five wickets in an innings four times. N. Shahid scored the most runs, including 104 not out v Felsted, and took the most wickets bowling legspin and googlies. Both played in the MCC Schools Festival, with Shahid being selected for MCC Schools v MCC and for NAYC v MCC Schools, as well as playing for Essex Second XI. R. Heap was a consistent opening batsman, and wicket-keeper S. Burnell took thirteen catches and made ten stumpings.

A young Kent College side achieved a creditable record, losing only one schools match and beating Dover College, St Edmund's, Sir Roger Manwood's and Choughs CC, as well as tying with Chatham House. G. Jenkins, a left-handed bat and right-arm fast-medium bowler, was leading run-scorer and wicket-taker, while S. Warley, an off-break bowler, and J. Hooker revealed their potential as opening batsmen in their first season. All-round team effort brought its rewards for King Edward VI College, Stourbridge. The batting tended to be dominated by the captain, G. R. Haynes, whose 140 not out v the Gentlemen of Worcestershire was a school record, M. J. Smith (103 not out v XL Club) and M. Jones. Six drawn games reflected an inability to bowl sides out, and one of the two losses came in an unusual manner when the last man was out, handled the ball, off the last delivery of the game. King Edward VI, Southampton, varied from outstanding, on some occasions, to mediocre on others. They won the local Sixth Form trophy, and held the advantage in many of the eleven drawn games. J. D. Stanley, still with two more years in the XI, was a most consistent batsman, while P. D. Chrispin, a right-arm fast bowler and authoritative left-hand bat, played for Hampshire

Under-19. M. L. Tidby's figures were dented when he was hit for six sixes in an over by a club player from Guernsey. A feature of the season for **King Edward VII**, **Lytham**, was their excellent performance v University College School at the Barnard Castle festival.

Batting was the strong suit of **King Edward's, Birmingham**, for whom W. Martin hit 1,104 runs at 110.40 and P. N. J. Inglis 711 at 64.63. They put on an unbeaten 270 for the first wicket in the win v Gentlemen of Worcestershire; Martin 148 and Inglis 109. Their reputation, however, prompted opposing teams to make defensive declarations, and although J. P. Coates (off-spin) and M. J. Goodall (leg-spin) bowled well, their own attack had its limitations. **King William's College, Isle of Man**, reported one of their best seasons ever; they were unbeaten and their seven wins included defeats of Merchant Taylors' Crosby, Aldenham and Liverpool College. The captain, S. W. Ellis, set the tone with 515 runs and 50 wickets, bowling medium-fast with occasional off-spin. W. R. Ashbrook and J. C. Radford, both medium-fast, supported him well. Centuries came from the left-handed opener, P. W. Townsend (103 v Stockport GS), and Radford (115 v MCC), while the wicket-keeper, A. P. Woodward, put together 419 runs opening the batting. **King's College, Taunton**, batted consistently, passing 200 nine times. The captain, A. C. Berry, scored 673 runs, including 103 v Catford, while the side's other three-figure innings came from D. J. Battishill, whose left-arm spin accounted for 33 batsmen, including six for 29 v Blundell's.

For their seven wins, King's College School, Wimbledon, owed much to their spinners, D. W. Talbot (slow left-arm), and the captain, R. M. Wight (off-breaks). Talbot took 58 wickets in his first season, capturing five or more in an innings six times including a return of eight for 46 v Kingston GS. Wight also headed the batting and was given solid support by his opening partner, I. B. M. Ratnayake. King's, Bruton, a young XI, played some good cricket but, lacking experience, were not consistent enough to win any matches. J. Petrie, the captain, bowling medium pace with control and variation, took 28 wickets, but he disappointed with the bat and the bulk of the runs came from the unorthodox R. Ashfield and the stylish M. Vaughan-Brown. Inexperience also handicapped King's, Canterbury, for whom J. R. Davies (fast-medium) took five or more wickets v Cranleigh, Sutton Valence and KCS Wimbledon. S. R. Turner was a consistent opening batsman, while the only three-figure innings came from A. E. Mitchell v the Old Boys. King's, Chester, drew eleven of their games, not helped by the inability of their captain and strike bowler, J. S. W. Hawkins, to prime the attack. None the less, in spite of a painful back injury, he led the side well. C. Goodier (off-spin) was outstanding, with a school record of 50 wickets in his first season, and A. R. H. Mais and G. W. Jones, a left-hander, batted consistently all season. King's, Macclesfield, beat Cheadle Hulme, Newcastle-under-Lyme HS, Merchant Taylors' Crosby and Abbot Beyne, as well as tying with Arnold, but their six defeats were all by schools. S. R. Swindells scored prolifically and effected 33 dismissals (19 ct, 14 st), while S. J. White's leg-spin brought him 62 wickets one short of the school record - including eight and nine in consecutive matches.

King's, Rochester, enjoyed another successful season in which they were unbeaten by schools and defeated seven under the positive captaincy and example of M. P. Mernagh, whose 63 wickets, including nine for 26 v Wellingborough School, took his total to 210 in four seasons. The batting had depth and maturity. King's, Worcester, had an enjoyable season, but an occasional brittleness in the batting and a reluctance in the middle order to graft after the loss of early wickets revealed a weakness. Although J. R. Underwood (slow left-arm) took the most wickets in his first full season, the lack of an experienced seam attack was a handicap. Fielding perhaps the youngest side in the school's history, Kingston GS often struggled. For all that, there were two centuries – one off 58 balls – from the captain, R. J. Williams, and a return of six for 30 v Teddington CC by R. A. Chandler, a leg-spinner, to savour. Kingswood's strong all-round side celebrated the school's 125th year of cricket with an excellent season. In schools matches they beat Prior Park, King Edward's Bath, Bristol GS, The Perse and Bishop's Stortford, against whom R. W. Lewis took six for 84 before scoring 130 not out in a school record winning total of 243 for nine.

Lancing's attack, consisting of four spinners and three seamers, flourished on the wet wickets of May and June, but lacked the experience and penetration to extract wins from draws on the drier ones of July. With batting in depth and excellent ground fielding, they beat Sussex Martlets, Free Foresters, Brighton VIth Form College, Christ's Hospital, Seaford, Sussex Schools and Hurstpierpoint. Leighton Park struggled at times to dismiss the opposition, although the captain, J. P. Newell-Price (medium-fast) was unlucky not to take

more than 24 wickets. M. Harris (medium-fast) swung the ball prodigiously – perhaps too much on occasions. Schools wins were at the expense of Lord Wandsworth College and Victoria College, Jersey. In a season of mixed fortunes, **The Leys** played some exciting games. The captain and opening batsman, C. W. Barker, scored 613 runs, while N. R. Lankester scored 423 runs and took 46 wickets with his leg-spinners, including six for 56 v Felsted. With only three victories against schools sides, **Liverpool College** reported an indifferent season. Apart from the excellent wicket-keeping of Clein, the fielding was lethargic, even careless, and provided little support to the bowlers. J. M. Bishop's off-spin accounted for 27 batsmen, and J. Q. Harrington, a Colt, took fifteen wickets in his three matches, bowling leg-spin. R. B. Downes and A. W. B. Smith, the seam attack, also opened the batting with some success, but they received little support down the order.

Lord Wandsworth College's inexperienced side also suffered a disappointing season, often either batting or bowling well, but never bringing both together in the same match. The batting of the captain, S. H. Blows, who hit the side's only hundred, and the leg-spin bowling of the young D. A. Berry were bright spots. Highlights for Loretto were an innings of 108 not out from the captain, T. R. McCreath, and a return of seven for 93 by M. C. Eglinton, both v Rossall. Finishing with ten wins, Loughborough GS built their success on all-round strength and hard, fast home wickets. S. Pickering (fast), M. I. Gidley (off-spin) and fourteen-year-old C. Hawkes (slow left-arm) all troubled opposing batsmen, while in the side's own strong batting line-up the captain, I. Bell, and the left-handed Gidley were particularly effective at Nos. 3 and 4. In the ten-wicket victory over the XL Club, openers S. Sawbridge (132 not out) and D. Jones (63 not out) put on 210 runs, while Gidley scored 132 not out v Abbott Beyne. He played for English Schools, as did Hawkes at Under-15 level.

Unbeaten by schools, and losing only to MCC, Magdalen College School recorded five wins, notably those v Lord Williams's College Thame, Dean Close and Latymer Upper. The batting, led by the captain, T. J. Stockwin, with 740 runs, was strong while the bowling, with T. E. J. Waters (medium-fast), S. N. Webb (slow left-arm) and R. J. Suckling (off-spin) prominent, was well supported in the field. Stockwin excelled behind the stumps. In August and September the team played in the Zimbabwe Schools Festival. Malvern College benefited from the fine team spirit engendered by the captaincy of G. N. Lunt, who batted responsibly and enjoyed success with his leg-breaks. The opener J. R. Wileman's 772 runs included 107 v Charterhouse, and the medium-pace all-rounder, E. G. Maughan, had figures of seven for 49 v Old Malvernians in his return of 38 wickets. H. C. Douglas-Pennant, B. C. Usher and S. Johnson-Marshall provided further seam bowling, while A. J. Hardwicke, a Colt, established himself as a wicket-keeper-batsman. Manchester GS, who beat Bury GS, Bradford GS and Lytham, boasted a powerful batting line-up, with J. P. Crawley, P. M. Crawley, I. R. Cross and A. B. Gaskarth all passing 200 runs. Although accurate, the attack generally lacked penetration, but D. J. Worsley's six for 70 v Shrewsbury was a fine performance. The XI's season was curtailed owing to the school's reaching the final of the Barclays Bank Under-17 Cup, which they lost by five wickets to Millfield.

Several close and exciting finishes characterised the later part of the season of Merchant Taylors', Crosby, who were captained by sixteen-year-old R. W. Glynne-Jones, their wicketkeeper. Against King's, Chester, D. L. Clift, in his first over for the XI, took four for 0, including a hat-trick, at medium pace. Another feature was the opening partnership of 149 in 102 minutes between Glynne-Jones and Clift v William Hulme's GS, and S. R. McGee (medium-fast) looked a fine prospect with six for 22 v St Mary's College, Crosby. Merchant Taylors', Northwood, reported a rather indifferent season, although they beat St Albans, Highgate, Watford GS, Enfield GS and St Peter's, York. K. J. Clifford opened the innings effectively but too often the middle order failed him. The most successful bowlers were A. P. Thompson, J. L. Hampel (slow left-arm), who took six for 39 v Watford GS, and the captain, D. W. R. Wiles, who returned six for 36 v Highgate. Success came for Merchiston Castle v The Edinburgh Academy, George Heriot's, St Bees and Stewart's-Melville. M. E. R. Paton, the captain N. R. Ballantyne, S. J. K. Laird and A. J. K. Wilson gave the batting authority, while S. D. L. Francis and D. M. Streek (both fast-medium) formed an effective new-ball partnership. Against Strathallan, F. W. Hunter, a slow left-armer, took nine for 58, thought to be the best return in the school's history.

Millfield were unbeaten for the second successive season, while their Under-17s won the Barclays Bank competition for the fourth year running. The high point for an XI of

tremendous batting depth was an unbroken opening partnership of 252 between G. Lucas and P. Holloway. H. R. J. Trump played for MCC Schools and, as did A. R. Phillips, signed for Somerset. The season was also a notable one for Mill Hill, who undertook a tour to Barbados. established a cricket festival with Plymouth College, Norwich School and Warwick School, and won five of their schools matches, the most for ten years. Aldenham, Dulwich, Highgate, Haberdashers' Aske's and Norwich were the schools beaten. L. B. Braham, the captain, opened the batting with consistency to score 970 runs and was well supported by B. R. Hartman, who also took the most wickets, and C. R. Younger, the wicket-keeper. E. M. Latter, a Colt, took six for 25 v Hampstead CC bowling at medium pace. The batting of Milton Abbey, sound in schools matches, proved to be vulnerable against club sides. However, the success in this department of Colts S. J. E. Courage and C. P. Cook bodes well for the future. The attack lacked penetration, although there was some guile in the slow left-arm bowling of W. O. Quibell and the off-spin of H. G. H. Groves. After five early wins against schools, Monkton Combe lost momentum through exams and rain. Fast bowler J. A. Jenkins emerged as an all-rounder, and fifteen-year-old S. J. Kandavanam (also fast) showed promise for the future.

Playing positive cricket, Newcastle-under-Lyme School achieved five victories, including one by ten wickets over Abbot Beyne. Opening batsmen R. N. Clowes and R. W. Johnson complemented each other's style, while D. J. Brock proved an exceptional fast-medium bowler. In a transitional period, the batting of Norwich School was insecure, with only N. A. Colman showing any degree of aggression. Frequently the bowlers were required to defend totals of less than 100, and once did so v Wymondham. The only convincing win was v RHS Holbrook. The season began slowly for Nottingham HS with nine draws and just one win, but the second half brought some exciting games and five more victories, including that by 120 runs v Bedford Modern, against whom M. Saxelby made 131 in two hours. He was selected for NAYC at Lord's. Hundreds also came from P. R. D. Briggs and N. A. Hunt, who scored the most runs.

Enjoying a successful season with seven wins and just one defeat, **Oakham** had a solid batting line-up revolving round the captain, D. M. Robjohns, who, at No. 3, scored 918 runs and took his aggregate for the XI to 2,322, a school record. Opening bowler S. V. Aldis proved too quick for most schoolboy sides, and was instrumental in Kimbolton being dismissed for 30 and Christ's, Brecon, for 78. Although they were hard to beat, **The Oratory's** lack of experience showed when chasing runs and they managed only two wins. However, with the entire XI expected to return in 1988, prospects are bright. Outstanding for **Oundle** was their captain, T. I. Macmillan, whose 924 runs included four centuries, his 161 not out v Bedford Modern and 125 v St Edward's, Oxford, coming on consecutive days. Another highlight was the first-wicket stand of 209 v MCC he shared with A. R. Turner. The lack of penetrative spin support for R. H. J. Jenkins (fast-medium), who took 46 wickets, restricted their wins to five v Uppingham, St Edward's Oxford, Oundle Rovers, Northamptonshire Amateurs and Free Foresters.

In schools matches The Perse beat Newport FGS, Wellingborough, The Leys and RGS Newcastle. The batting, expected to be their strength, was disappointing later in the season when they failed to force wins from promising positions. N. M. Law, though failing to maintain his early form, again scored more than 500 runs, including 109 v King's, Ely, and another early century came from I. R. Styan with 100 not out v Newport FGS. The attack had depth and variety, with 30 wickets falling to Styan (left-arm medium), including six for 32 v RGS Newcastle and three for 7 in eleven overs v Ipswich. P. A. Bailey (slow left-arm) was the pick of the spinners. Pocklington suffered more than most from the weather, with six matches abandoned, yet still won eleven. Their captain, T. P. B. Balderson, scored 623 runs and took 40 wickets, helped with the bat by S. A. Clarke, who also passed 600 runs, and in the attack by J. R. L. Brown, who captured 44 wickets. Prior Park College enjoyed their best season for many years, beating six schools, among them Dauntsey's by nine wickets and King Edward's, Bath, by ten wickets (a first-wicket stand of 183). M. Woodhouse, J. Reid and A. Hadley all passed 400 runs, while G. Lee, a newcomer to the side, took 35 wickets with his off-spin and fast bowler J. Powell collected 28.

The captain of Queen Elizabeth GS, Wakefield, J. Wild, hit 106 not out v King William's College, Isle of Man, their only century. For their seven wins, countered by only one defeat, Queen's College, Taunton, owed much to their outstanding all-rounder, D. N. A. Essien, who scored the most runs and took the most wickets before going on to represent English Schools. J. J. A. Wilson, an excellent captain, played some fine innings in a strong batting line-up.

Radley were captained by C. H. H. Pegg, who continued to show promise as a wicket-keeper and, although his form with the bat was generally disappointing, compiled their only hundred - 117 v Bradfield. He played for Middlesex Second XI. R. E. Q. Gurney's aggregate included two innings of 97 not out, against Sherborne and Winchester. G. D. L. Powell (slow left-arm) had returns of seven for 61 v Sherborne, six for 38 v Cheltenham, five for 27 v Bradfield and six for 56 v Winchester, the last three schools all being beaten. A below-average season was reported by Ratcliffe College, whose batting was uncertain on the wet wickets. However, the bowling made amends and five wins were recorded. Bowling fast-medium, P. A. Mestecky was in exceptional form, taking 61 wickets at 9.31, including five in an innings seven times, and increasing his tally for the past two years to 119. He also played the side's only three-figure innings, 100 not out v Loughborough GS. Reading School, with eleven wins enjoyed their most successful season for many years. The captain, J. S. Pritchard (fastmedium) took 52 wickets, his eight for 34 v Pangbourne College including a hat-trick, and O. D. Beckett hit 102 not out v Shiplake. T. J. C. Dance, a fifth former, looked a useful rightarm opening bowler but excelled mainly as a left-handed opening bat whose 709 runs included 123 not out v Leighton Park.

In a season of rebuilding, Reed's took comfort from winning more matches than they lost. Reigate GS fielded their best side for some years, only successive losses in the last three matches marring a healthy record. S. J. Virley led the side with assurance and topped the batting, while P. A. Radford, an opener, compiled a maiden century. In his third season, fast bowler M. T. Holman again spearheaded the attack, but really lacked support. It was an outstanding season for Repton's opening batsman, C. J. Adams. Combining power and a range of strokes, he scored four centuries on his way to 1,242 runs, passing 1,000 before the end of June and breaking R. A. Hutton's school record of 1,036. He was selected for MCC Schools. The captain, D. J. Anderson, led from the front, taking 56 wickets with his medium-paced seam bowling. Eight wins were recorded, v Shrewsbury, Cheltenham, Pocklington, Worksop, Oakham and Wrekin; defeat was inflicted by Rugby and Malvern. Rossall's strike bowlers proved too expensive, and their inability to bowl sides out led to ten draws and only one win – v King's, Macclesfield. However, there were many sound contributions from the batsmen, notably the captain and wicket-keeper, C. D. Foster, whose century v Loretto at the Merchant Taylors', Northwood festival was the first against a school for many years.

Royal GS, Guildford, attributed their success to a sound attack, for the batting was occasionally disappointing, with some players frustratingly failing to fulfil their potential. Their end-of-term festival was attended by RGS, High Wycombe, and Royal GS Worcester, who, although without their leading batsmen of 1986, were unbeaten by schools, recording thirteen victories. The side's outstanding player was D. W. Headley, son of R.G. and grandson of G.A., who took 57 wickets bowling at fast-medium and scored 627 runs. J. S. Waters, the leg-spinner, took more than 50 wickets for the third successive season. Rugby, beaten only by Bedford in schools matches, enjoyed a successful season in which the school's Colts won the Lord's Taverners Cricketer Trophy from Wellington College in the final. Twelve fifties and two hundreds were shared by the XI's leading batsmen, with B. C. A. Ellison heading both sets of averages. Bowling fast-medium, he, A. L. C. Winchester and H. N. Bhatia (leg-spin) all took 40 or more wickets. Bhatia played in his fifth successive fixture v Marlborough. Excellent ground fielding characterised the performances of Rydal, with S. M. Williams, J. R. Hogg and P. S. Goldsmith outstanding. A. G. Moore and H. S. L. Bradley batted well, but in a season badly affected by the rain, the bowling tended to be weak.

St Albans were disappointed that their county Colts, A. Dalwood and G. Dill, did not find their form until after the exams. D. Barlow was the only batsman to score more than one fifty, and only J. Smart v Watford GS and G. Bandy v John Lyon took five wickets in an innings. Unbeaten and with eleven victories, St Dunstan's enjoyed their best season ever; with all but two members expected to return in 1988, they are optimistic for the college's centenary year, when a tour of Australia is planned for December. M. A. Slade, whose 687 runs included 108 not out v Trinity, Croydon, G. R. S. Scovell and M. J. Dowse (101 v Whitgift) all played for Kent Under-19. In a strong batting side at St Edmund's Canterbury, N. C. Kennett scored two unbeaten hundreds, putting on 156 with R. Hayes v the XL Club and sharing an unbroken opening stand of 141 with M. J. E. Horton v the Staff. The attack lacked penetration, although the bowlers worked hard. St George's, Weybridge, suffered their first defeats at the hands of schools since July 1982, four coming after declarations. Two fifth formers performed most encouragingly, I. Turner scoring 501 runs and taking 34 wickets, and C. M. Bennett

scoring 568 runs, including 146 not out v Hampton. St George's won the South zone Barclays Bank Under-17 competition, only to lose to Millfield in the national semi-finals.

It was a disappointing season for **St John's, Leatherhead**, who beat only Seaford College but lost to Alleyn's, Whitgift and, heavily, Cranleigh. A redeeming feature was the batting of the captain, S. E. Penfold, whose 747 runs included 107 v XL Club, 113 v Epsom College and 143 not out v Christ's Hospital. **St Lawrence College**, with many young players, managed only three wins against five losses. A. O. Uzor, as well as being the leading wicket-taker, was their outstanding batsman, scoring fifty in eight of his thirteen innings and going on to 154 not out v the Band of Brothers. Memorable in an unbeaten season for **St Paul's** were an exciting tie v Dulwich off the last ball of the final twenty overs and a ten-wicket win v The Leys, against whom H. C. G. Boothroyd-Brooks (121 not out) and P. W. T. Neate (102 not out) put on a school record first-wicket partnership of 246. Fulfilling the promise shown in 1986, **St Peter's**, **York**, won eight matches and lost only to MCC and to their hosts at the Merchant Taylors', Northwood, end-of-term festival. They were ably captained by all-rounder N. D. Muirhead, who scored two centuries, and M. D. Donoghue bowled very well at fast-medium for his 55 wickets.

Never bowled out, Sedbergh were unbeaten and won four matches, including those v RGS Lancaster and Ampleforth. The absence of a good spinner prevented them from pressing for victory in games eventually drawn. H. J. A. Daniels and A. M. Skinner opened the bowling to good effect, dismissing Glenalmond for 28 and Ampleforth for 44, Daniels's six wickets against the latter including a hat-trick. Daniels, a fine left-handed bat, also hit a superb century v a Professionals XI at Glenalmond, and there were two other hundreds from J. R. C. Dakin. Along with the captain, C. D. H. Palmer, these three played for Cumbria Under-19. After narrowly losing their first match to St Dunstan's, Sevenoaks were not beaten and, as in beating Caterham and Cranbrook, showed considerable powers of recovery when defeat seemed likely. St George's, Weybridge, were beaten off the last ball. The captain and wicket-keeper, C. J. Crang, hit three unbeaten hundeds; A. Griffiths (right-hand opening bat and slow left-arm bowler) and J. D. Fry (right-hand bat and fast bowler) were useful all-rounders.

Sherborne, with a young side, did well to remain undefeated. Their four wins included those v Bradfield and Haileybury. Much depended on the captain, A. Kardooni, who batted and led the side with great authority; in a total of 188 for nine declared v Taunton, he hit an unbeaten 114. Some entertaining cricket was played by Shiplake, who beat Oratory, Leighton Park and Bearwood in schools matches. For the second successive season C. Haynes scored the most runs and, despite the lack of suitable wickets, A. Hyman bowled fast and well. M. Patel (slow left-arm) improved during the season. A good fielding side occasionally let itself down by dropping catches at vital times. Shrewsbury's experienced XI had a fair season, the most impressive of their seven victories being over MCC, Cheltenham and Uppingham. The batting depended largely on J. R. Prichard (left-hand), C. M. Bullock, the captain, and M. J. Lascelles, each of whom passed 500 runs, with a century and sixteen fifties between them. A balanced attack shared the wickets but struggled to work through opposing batting after making early inroads.

In an enjoyable season, the inexperienced side of Sir Roger Manwood's were well led by J. A. N. Goold. Although injured for nearly half the season, when available he bowled fastmedium to form an aggressive opening partnership with D. J. Hill (fast), but without consistent support for them the attack often looked unbalanced. Most runs came from M. D. Giles, who, while not always technically correct, hit the ball hard and with confidence. Stamford School, under the captaincy of R. P. C. Plant, who scored 618 runs and took 33 wickets, also enjoyed a good season. There were five good wins, and in two of the drawn games the scores were level with wickets in hand. Stockport GS won their first match, v Liverpool College, and their last, v RGS Newcastle, with four more victories in between. Batting highlights were 100 not out v Haslingden by the left-handed I. Millner and 111 by M. Baulkwill v Doncaster GS. The main strike bowler, M. Duckworth, returned six for 70 v Oakwood, R. Pailin (left-arm medium-fast) took six for 45 v Bangor GS, and there was good support from two leg-spinners, P. Duckworth and B. Anderson. The highlight of a festival held as part of the school's quincentenary celebrations was a first-ever fixture v MCC. Unbeaten, for the first time in some years, Stonyhurst attributed their success to the mediumpace bowling of all-rounders J. Barnes and G. O'Driscoll, although the victories v Ampleforth, Stonyhurst Wanderers and the XL Club resulted from all-round teamwork.

Stowe, a strong batting side, beat Dean Close, Free Foresters, Bedford Modern, Kelvinside Academy and Merchant Taylors', Northwood, losing only to Rugby. The captain, R. S. M. Morris, made an outstanding contribution, his 938 runs including centuries v Dean Close (138), Free Foresters (109 not out), Mill Hill (109), Repton (141 not out) and Kelvinside Academy, against whom he and W. J. P. Atkinson put on 156 in 21 overs. The attack was spearheaded by R. B. Pumphrey (fast-medium), who returned six for 47 v Rugby; balance was provided by the off-spin of Morris, who took seven for 38 v Radley, and the slow left-arm turn of fifteen-year-old M. J. T. Jefferson, whose six for 55 v Dean Close included a hat-trick Strathallan, although unbeaten by schools in Scotland, reported a season of mixed fortunes. The bowling lacked support for K. D. Smith, an off-spinner, who took his wickets for the school to 120, and the batting was generally disappointing. Highlights were G. M. Adams unbeaten century v MCC, and the young opening partnership of R. Moffat and J. A. Jacobsen, which showed its worth at the end of the season.

Taunton School, captained by J. C. Kerslake, son of R. C. Kerslake, were unbeaten for the first time, winning eight matches. A team which enjoyed their cricket, Tiffin beat MCC, Reigate GS, Monkton Combe, Emanuel, Latymer Upper, Reed's and St Benedict's, against whom A. J. M. Carnie (fast-medium) returned six for 47. They batted in depth with five batsmen passing 300 runs; but the only hundred was G. J. Affleck's 102 not out v Emanuel. The captain, N. P. Warren, who opened the bowling with Carnie, made a splendid all-round contribution and represented Surrey Schools Under-19. At Tonbridge, J. I. Longley passed 1,000 runs for the second successive season, carried the batting, not surprisingly, and played for Kent Second XI. J. S. Durling (slow left-arm) was by far the most accurate and penetrative bowler. Eton were the only school to beat them, and there were wins v Winchester, Clifton and Eastbourne at the end-of-term festival.

Playing positive cricket, the young side of Trent College achieved an encouraging record with six wins. They relied initially on the experience and all-round ability of the captain, R. D. Kerrell (fast-medium) and the batting of T. H. Smith, although the leg-spin bowling of I. R. Birch augured well for the future. Trinity, losing only one of their 30 fixtures to the rain, enjoyed fourteen wins, including those v Hampton, Reigate, Reed's, St Benedict's, Kingston GS, Emanuel and MCC – the latter by one wicket, having chased 204 to win. Some promising young batsmen benefited from the experience of K. P. Morley, while the bowling strength lay in the under-16 seam trio of J. D. Good, P. A. Gardner and D. M. P. Turner. Truro were led by S. Peters, who had a solid all-round season and was well supported by A. Johnston, a left-handed batsman.

A mixed season was reported by Uppingham. The middle-order batting was fragile, no batsman inspiring confidence, although E. R. Fowler, a Colt, looked an excellent prospect. The bowling, however, was always strong. P. J. E. Spencer (left-arm medium-fast) and D. B. J. Cooke (off-breaks) each took 48 wickets, Spencer's return including eight for 12 v Leicester Gentlemen, and G. M. Leather (fast-medium) looked useful in his first season. Prominent again for Victoria College, Jersey, was P. J. Le Cornu, who proved himself to be one of the school's best-ever all-rounders with 859 runs and 70 wickets.

Warwick School suffered three early defeats, but consistent progress as the XI gained experience brought three wins. The batting developed around C. G. Stanton, who was ably supported by J. D. Moffatt and A. J. Bolton. C. Oswald, who with P. M. A. Hulyer took up off-spin at the start of the season, returned six for 63 v Trent College, but the presence of three off-spinners at the top of the averages illustrated the weakness of the seam bowling. A record of eleven draws, against two wins – v MCC and Gentlemen of Hertfordshire – reflected in part Watford GS's inability to support with any variety the opening attack of P. G. Rimmer and J. G. E. Pepper. Despite depth in batting, no-one established the habit of playing big innings. Wellingborough School, winners against Wisbech GS, Trent College, Ratcliffe College, Lord Williams's Thame and Kingswood, had an experienced captain in M. I. Ingram, their wicket-keeper, and two interesting young bowlers in fourteen-year-old N. J. Haste (medium), who took seven for 14 v Kingswood, and the fifteen-year-old all-rounder, J. M. Attfield (off-breaks). R. J. Cousins (fast-medium) took the most wickets.

In an excellent season, Wellington College beat Cranleigh, Winchester, Bradfield, Radley, MCC, Free Foresters and the Royal Corps of Transport, all seven wins coming when batting second. Most players made a significant contribution, but noteworthy were J. R. H. Fenwick

(fast-medium), whose 52 wickets included eight for 45 v Radley, and the captain, J. S. Hodgson. The latter's 542 runs included the first century by the school v Marlborough – 122 not out, featuring six sixes and eleven fours – and his off-breaks brought him six for 47 v Winchester. Wellington School, Somerset, enjoyed their best season for many years, with seven victories, the most notable being v Plymouth College and Royal Naval College, Dartmouth. Opener J. Clist, outstanding with 649 runs, provided a firm foundation, and M. Coleman competently captained a team committed to positive cricket. A succession of exciting finishes characterised Westminster's unbeaten season. A well-balanced side was ably captained by all-rounder J. D. R. Griffiths, whose century v Charterhouse was the high point. A tour of India was planned for December.

Whitgift reported fair results in schools matches, in which they beat Reigate GS, Kingston GS, Trinity and St John's, Leatherhead. Three batsmen dominated; N. S. Auer, who hit 100 not out v Dulwich, was the most prolific, followed by the captain and opening bat, I. L. H. Scarisbrick, and G. J. Thompson, who reached three figures v Reigate. Auer also headed the bowling averages, although J. A. M. Bullock (medium) took the most wickets. Enterprising cricket saw William Hulme's GS successfully chase large totals v Queen Elizabeth GS Wakefield, Stockport GS and Rydal, and bowl out St Mary's Crosby, Birkenhead and Bolton. Shrewsbury were also beaten, H. P. V. Scott-Gall (medium) reaping six for 19 on a green-top. Highlights were a school record 143 v QEGS by C. W. Timm, the captain and left-hand bat; three centuries from opening batsman D. M. J. Timm – 118 not out v Stockport, 125 not out v Rydal and 101 v King's, Macclesfield; and his six for 59 v Bolton.

As expected in a year of rebuilding, Winchester's young side experienced a poor season, yet they played better than a record of no wins and ten losses would suggest. Apart from some excellent innings by D. A. de Lanoy Meijer, a Colt, the batting was inconsistent, and the bowling, although supported by some occasionally brilliant fielding, lacked an incisive edge. The XI was captained by M. I. Riaz, a nephew of the Nawab of Pataudi, but while one link was renewed, another was broken with the retirement of V. Broderick, Winchester's professional for 28 years. Woodhouse Grove, another young team, were encouraged to beat William Hulme's GS, Bootham and Leeds GS. The attack lacked quality and variety, too much depending on the captain, L. Savill (fast-medium), who took 32 wickets, headed both averages, and was selected for Yorkshire Senior Schools. The opening batsman, L. Gomersall, developed well as the season progressed to score the most runs. Worksop College, after four decisive defeats in schools matches, finished on a high note with a six-wicket win over Bloxham. A thirteen-year-old left-hander, R. A. Kettleborough, was the most prolific batsman and with most of the side expected to return in 1988, prospects are good.

Wrekin College beat Shrewsbury, King's Worcester, MCC, Wellington CC and Old Wrekinians. The captain, C. A. Fenton, scored 657 runs, including two hundreds, but while runs often came quickly, the batting was occasionally exposed by accurate bowling. A hostile opening attack of J. R. Ford and I. Mirza received able support from Fenton (medium) and S. R. Jackson (left-arm medium), but the loss through injury of Ford for much of the season upset the balance, especially as the spin bowling was disappointing. The batting of Wycliffe College relied too heavily on the captain and opener, S. J. Reed, who with 643 runs broke his own school record of the previous season. A. Brown and S. G. Cady played some exciting free-scoring innings but overall the batting was too inconsistent. Although R. N. Giles (fastmedium) and Cady (left-arm fast) persevered on unhelpful wickets, the bowling generally struggled to bowl sides out. At Wyggeston and Queen Elizabeth I College, the batting was carried by the openers, S. C. Brammar, the captain, and the left-handed K. T. Roberts, who shared in partnerships of 119 v Wyggeston Masters and 138 unbroken in the victory v John Cleveland College in the Leicestershire Under-19 final. The only bowler to take ten wickets was J. L. Green (fast-medium), whose five for 18 were instrumental in the win v Ratcliffe College.

THE DELOITTES RATINGS

Initiated by the former England captain, E. R. Dexter, and introduced prior to the Second Test between England and Pakistan in 1987, the Deloittes Ratings rank Test cricketers on a scale from 0 to 1,000 according to their form in Test matches since 1981. The ratings are calculated by computer and take into account playing conditions, the standard of the opposition and the nature and result of the match. Updated after every Test match, with a player's most recent performances carrying more weight than his earlier ones, the Deloittes Ratings therefore endeavour to provide a current assessment of a Test cricketer's form and his place among his peers. The leading twenty batsmen and bowlers in the Ratings after the 1987 England v Pakistan series were:
