## SCHOOLS CRICKET IN 1991

With J. S. Laney, J. N. Snape and W. P. C. Weston representing England Under-18 at the International Youth Tournament in Winnipeg, Canada, in mid-July, and T. C. Walton, like Snape and Weston, having county commitments, not one of the players capped by the English Schools in 1990 was available for selection in 1991. Although the three at the Winnipeg tournament could in theory have been picked for the English Schools international programme, which commenced at the end of July, the Schools selectors stuck to their policy of choosing their side from those who played in the trial matches at the Oxford Festival. Including the two matches at Lord's, played under the appellation of MCC Schools, fifteen players appeared for the senior Schools side. They were: R. J. Ballinger, A. J. Hall (captain), M. E. Harvey, J. E. Hindson, Keith A. Parsons, Kevin J. Parsons, A. Payne, M. F. D. Robinson, K. G. Sedgbeer, M. J. Semmence, M. J. Walker, R. M. S. Weston, J. M. S. Whittington, N. J. Workman and R. S. Yeabsley. Their schools may be found in the scorecards of matches played at the MCC Festival, Oxford.

The regional matches prior to the Oxford Festival revealed a lack of real quality and variety. This was particularly so in the bowling, although the batsmen did not dominate as much as they had in 1990, and was a contributive factor in the international matches being drawn, after the two matches at Lord's had produced positive results. The Schools beat MCC but lost to the National Association of Young Cricketers.

The batting was led by Weston, who at sixteen showed the concentration to play long innings. He was well supported by his opening partner, Keith Parsons, but apart from Hall, the rest of the batting was disappointing. Several good players were unable to perform to their known ability. This may have been the result of a surfeit of cricket and travel, a problem which was viewed with concern by the appropriate authorities. A rationalisation of the youth cricket programme appears to be necessary, for some of the injuries to young bowlers could perhaps be attributed to the demands placed on them. Both Ballinger and Payne, for example, suffered in this respect. The principal wicket-takers were Hindson, slow left-arm, and Robinson, medium fast, with support coming chiefly from Whittington, another slow left-armer, and Payne, who in two matches took five wickets against Scotland at medium pace and scored 82 against the Young Australians to confirm his all-round potential. The fielding was reliable – the wicket-keeping was shared between Sedgbeer and Workman – and the side was ably led by Hall, who engendered a fine team spirit in a quiet but effective way.

In the first international, against Wales at Clifton College on July 29, 30, English Schools were restricted to 134, one of their lowest totals for some years. Wales, in reply, fared little better, reaching 170 in 59 overs (Robinson six for 31, Hindson two for 37 in twenty overs). An unbeaten 114 from Weston enabled English Schools to declare their second innings at 245 for eight, but rain prevented any further play after tea, with Wales 37 for one.

Against Scottish Young Cricketers at Broughty Ferry on August 6, 7, Weston was again to the fore, scoring 73 of England's 198. The Scots, 77 for three overnight, lost their seven remaining wickets for 48 (Hindson five

for 27), to give English Schools a lead of 73. The loss of Weston for 12 was brushed aside by Keith Parsons and Hall, who put on 141 unbroken for the second wicket before Hall's declaration at 174 invited the home side to score 248 in two hours plus twenty overs. With 140 required from the last twenty, the Scots looked to be out of the hunt, but there followed a whirlwind century partnership between I. M. Stanger (50) and N. Bell (63), before Stanger was brilliantly caught and bowled by Hindson. The last over began with 11 runs needed and two wickets in hand; 3 came from the first three balls, Payne bowled Stewart with the fourth, and Scotland played out the last two balls for a draw.

An injury in that match to Ballinger, the quickest of the new-ball bowlers, further weakened the Schools team, who travelled directly to Worksop College to face the formidable Australian Under-19 side on August 9, 10. Fresh from their one-day success against England Under-19 at Trent Bridge, the Australians put paid to any meaningful contest by batting through most of the first day for 367 in 104 overs – the first time on the tour they had lost all ten wickets. At 55 for five at lunch on the second day, English Schools looked in danger of an innings defeat, but some aggressive batting by Kevin Parsons and Payne in a stand of 86 restricted Australia's lead to 169, Payne showing great composure in his fine innings of 82. There being insufficient time to press for victory, the tourists settled for batting practice, though Robinson responded with a lively spell of bowling and took all three wickets to fall as the Australians progressed to 52.

The Welsh Schools enjoyed an encouraging season, overcoming a shaky start against Scottish Young Cricketers, who reduced them to 13 to five at Ebbw Vale. H. Evans (67) and R. Cogbill (28) pulled the innings round to a more respectable 150, in reply to which Scotland had reached 26 for no wicket when the rain came. That match was then abandoned and replaced by the first limited-overs international between the two sides; the Scots made 199 for four in 50 overs (Stanger 59 not out) and dismissed their hosts for 179 (A. J. Dalton 58).

After their encouraging performance against English Schools, the Welsh Schools met the Irish Schools at Sophia Gardens, Cardiff. Irish Schools, batting first, declared at 264 for five (G. Russell 102 not out), to which the Welsh responded by declaring behind at 235 for five (A. D. Shaw 65 not out). The visitors then batted on into the last afternoon, eventually declaring a second time at 264 for seven (N. Curzon 58, J. Molins 56, E. Armstrong 53 not out), and with the Welsh needing 294 in 100 minutes and twenty overs, the match seemed dead. However, Dalton (83) and A. J. Jones (69) rose to the challenge and set them well on course with a century opening stand. When wickets began to fall in the last hour, though, the Welsh closed ranks and settled for a draw, finishing at 195 for five (K. Banks four for 36).

The Welsh Schools side was captained by A. J. Jones, son of the former Glamorgan batsman, Alan Jones, while Shaw, the England Under-19 wicket-keeper, was chosen as the first Welsh Schools player of the year. The Welsh Under-16 side, coached by T. W. Cartwright, formerly of England, Warwickshire, Somerset and Glamorgan, won the Texaco Under-16 County Championship. In the three-day round-robin final, held at Uppingham School, they took the title by virtue of having lost fewer wickets than Lancashire and Hampshire, with whom they finished level on points.

**HMC SOUTHERN SCHOOLS v THE REST**

At Wadham College, July 12, 13. Drawn. There was little in the slow pitch for the bowlers on the first day, when Jones compiled a neat, assured century, and Robinson's fierce hitting hastened the way to a declaration at 251. The Rest's reply was built around a well-organised, unbeaten century by Weston, supported by a fluent fifty from Parsons. Overnight rain tilted the balance more in favour of the bowlers, and Southern Schools struggled somewhat against tight seam bowling from White and the teasing left-arm spin of Whittington. Although Semmence, promoted to open, scored a good fifty and Walker injected some momentum at the end, they needed 71 overs to reach 186 for eight. The Rest's target of 233 was always beyond them, and for a time they looked likely losers as Carpenter and Richardson bowled well at the start, and Peirce contributed an accurate spell of left-arm spin.

**ESCA NORTH v ESCA SOUTH**

At St Edward's School, July 12, 13. ESCA North won by five wickets in a match generally dominated by batsmen on a pitch with some pace and a large outfield. ESCA South's innings was founded on a fourth-wicket century partnership between Parsons and Thomas, but with Harvey and Hall impressing with the quality of their strokeplay, ESCA North comfortably established a first-innings lead in fewer overs. Although the South fared better in their second innings, thanks mainly to a swashbuckling half-century from Thomas, they still scored too slowly to set a sufficiently challenging target. North, in pursuit of 230, slumped to 92 for five, but were rescued by a hard-hitting stand of 138 from Payne and Whitaker, which swept them to victory in only 53 overs.

#### *Highlights from the Schools*

The dismal weather of 1991 curtailed so many schools matches that batsmen and bowlers alike were restricted. Only three batsmen from the schools reviewed here passed 1,000 runs – the fewest since the wet summer of 1985 – with just five more topping 900. The leading scorers were: K. A. Graham of King's, Macclesfield (1,128 runs at 75.20), J. Hargrove of Victoria College, Jersey (1,046 at 52.30), G. A. Khan of Ipswich (1,006 at 83.83), R. Q. Cake of King's College School, Wimbledon (979 at 57.58), G. J. Kennis of Tiffin (946 at 55.64), R. J. Ayre of University College School (920 at 83.63), R. W. Nowell of Trinity (911 at 47.94) and A. V. Powell of Royal GS, Worcester (903 at 53.11). Of these Ayre and Khan went to the wicket just fifteen times each, while Hargrove, with 23 innings, played the most. Two batsmen recorded three-figure averages, M. G. N. Windows of Clifton compiling 615 runs at 123.00 and E. J. Meredith of Ratcliffe averaging 105.16 for his 631. There were no double-centuries, although ten batsmen reached 150, the two highest scores being 181 not out by R. C. Weston of The Leys and 176 not out by Khan, who reached 150 three times. He alone made five centuries, while four each were scored by Ayre, Cake, Graham, Nowell, M. J. Walker of King's, Rochester and Kennis; the last-mentioned followed his thousand runs and three centuries in 1990 with four hundreds in his first five innings in 1991. In representative schoolboy cricket R. M. S. Weston, who made 700 runs at 63.63 for Durham, scored centuries at the Oxford Festival and for English Schools against Welsh Schools.

Again no bowler took 60 wickets, and 50 or more were taken by only five, the lowest number for many years: A. R. C. Gilmour of Merchiston Castle (53 at 10.50), J. G. Slater of Ellesmere (52 at 8.78), R. S. Jayatileke of Bishop's Stortford (52 at 11.28), B. J. Walters of Tiffin (51 at 12.72) and I. Ritchie of Victoria College, Jersey (50 at 19.08). Of these, Slater bowled the fewest overs (209), while Ritchie's 329 were by far the most. Slater was also the season's most frugal bowler, others with economical averages being J. R. Carpenter of Birkenhead (43 wickets at 8.83), J. M. S. Whittington of Eton (42 at 8.88) and J. L. Cunningham of Bangor GS (47 at 9.82). The best innings returns came from D. G. Gourlay of Glasgow Academy (nine for 9), I. R. Harris of Epsom (nine for 23), N. A. Doggett of Merchant Taylors', Crosby (eight for 4), Whittington (eight for 13) and Gilmour (eight for 18), while ten other bowlers recorded eight-wicket returns and 49 more had seven-wicket hauls.

The most impressive of these was the seven for 7 taken by S. T. Fearon of Wyggeston & Queen Elizabeth I Sixth Form College. Nine hat-tricks were reported, taken by: M. H. Colclough of Newcastle-under-Lyme, A. M. Denslow and D. P. Frost, both of King's College School, Wimbledon, T. J. Gladwin of Highgate, Khan of Ipswich, A. T. Lark of Whitgift, P. A. B. Page of Abingdon, S. J. Perkins of Truro and A. W. Richardson of Oundle.

Without doubt the leading all-rounder was the England Under-15 Schools representative, Nowell, with 911 runs and 49 wickets, followed by J. M. Ramsey of Eltham (829 runs, 47 wickets). Other notable all-round contributions came from R. A. Hawkey of Merchant Taylors', Northwood (676 runs, 46 wickets), B. C. Ray of Royal GS, Guildford (637 runs, 41 wickets), Carpenter, another Under-15 player (548 runs, 43 wickets) and L. J. Crozier of Royal GS, Newcastle (527 runs, 41 wickets).

Thirteen of the Schools who appear in this *Wisden* were unbeaten. Of these, King's, Macclesfield recorded eleven wins and Ellesmere beat ten sides, while at the other end of the scale Nottingham HS won just once, their other twelve games being drawn. The remaining undefeated sides were Chigwell, Clifton, Haileybury, St John's Leatherhead, Sevenoaks, Simon Langton GS, Tiffin, Warwick, Wellingborough and Woodhouse Grove. Among those unbeaten by schools were Bishop's Stortford and Highgate, both of whom lost only to MCC; King's College School, Wimbledon, whose single defeat was at the hands of Guernsey Island Under-23; Dover College, who drew all their schools matches, and Glenalmond.

It was good to read, in reports from the schools, of the popularity of the game, despite the pressure of examinations and the plethora of interests available to today's schoolboys and schoolgirls. Less encouraging, perhaps, was the comment from some masters that opposing sides would have preferred a limited-overs match. This seems to have been the case in instances when one side has played for a draw from the start, and as Gerald Howat says in his report of the Oxford Festival, "at the heart of such a situation is the fear of losing". If interest in cricket is to continue, both for boys at school and after they leave, it is important that a more positive attitude is fostered.

Such an attitude was exemplified by Haileybury's competitive and good-humoured XI, who were determined always to play positively and were rewarded with an unbeaten record, although that was never a primary aim. Against Tonbridge, for example, they rose to the challenge of scoring 40 off the last four overs, 20 off the last two and 13 off the final over, to snatch an exciting victory. Another school similarly unwilling to settle for a draw were Durham, who recorded eleven wins in their sixteen matches. Against St Bees, they made a valiant effort to score 11 from the last over in pursuit of 175, but the last batsman fell 1 short to tie the match with two balls remaining. Even closer was the tie between The Leys and Monkton Combe: in their reply to the former's 271 for four, Monkton Combe's last batsman was dismissed off the last ball with the score 271 from the same number of overs.

More schools found it easier to win chasing runs than to score quickly batting first and then bowl sides out. Thus the toss often played an undue part in success or failure, and at least one school felt that their record of wins and losses simply reflected their success with the toss. An exception was Christ's Hospital, who succeeded in bowling out the opposition nine times in their twelve matches. Similarly successful in that respect were Hampton, a feature of whose season was the number of games won when defending low scores, such as 112 and 132 against Enfield GS and Watford GS respectively. That they could also chase runs was demonstrated in their one-wicket victory off the last ball over Latymer, when chasing 241. Durham, too, while agreeing that a run-chase tended to be easier, achieved more than half their victories when batting first.

Masters reported a number of other outstanding performances and records broken, and these may be found in the returns from schools which follow.
