## SCHOOLS CRICKET IN 1992

Of the players capped by English Schools in 1991, M. E. Harvey, J. E. Hindson, M. J. Walker, R. M. S. Weston and R. S. Yeabsley were still at school and would have been eligible to play again in 1992. In the event, Yeabsley was injured and withdrew from the MCC Schools Festival and the others were not available owing to commitments to counties and – in the case of Walker – to England Under-19. In addition, G. Chapple, who would otherwise have been considered, was playing in the Youth "Tests" against Australia and Pakistan before joining Lancashire. It was therefore possible for other players to test their ability at a higher representative level, and 16 appeared in the senior Schools side: J. M. A. Averis, M. J. Brooke, J. A. L. Henderson, N. Humphrey, A. M. James, W. S. Kendall, G. J. Kennis, G. A. Khan, T. J. Mason, C. E. Mulraine, P. J. Nicholson, O. B. Ratcliffe, S. J. Renshaw, C. J. Rika, M. Trescotthick and P. J. Wilcock. Their schools may be found in the scorecards of matches played at the MCC Schools Festival, Oxford.

The overall standard was reasonable, with no player consistently outstanding. After the promise shown by the bowlers in the preliminary games, their later performances were somewhat disappointing. Henderson, probably the pick of the quicker bowlers, could play in only one of the internationals, leaving Averis and the two all-rounders, Renshaw and Rika, to bear the brunt and, while consistent, they were never penetrative enough. The off-spinner, Mason, was the most successful, as well as scoring some useful runs. The most consistent of the batsmen was Kendall, who batted positively at all times. He had sound support from Brooke, Humphrey, Khan and Wilcock, and Rika produced an impressive century when it was needed against Welsh Schools. Mulraine led the side well, made telling contributions with the bat and was outstanding in the field. Nicholson performed admirably behind the stumps in all the matches, but otherwise the fielding always left something to be desired.

The regional matches played at Radley and Rochdale prior to the Oxford festival were keenly contested and evenly balanced between bat and ball, a particularly pleasing feature being the general quality of the bowlers. It was disappointing that the weather at Oxford was so wet, although there were plenty of encouraging performances. Foremost among the quicker bowlers were Averis, Henderson, Rika and Wellington, while Mason and a trio of left-arm spinners – J. R. Carpenter, James and Ratcliffe – made an impression.

The first of the international matches, against Irish Youth, took place in Dublin on July 21 and 22. English Schools reached 204 for nine in the allotted 60 overs (Kendall 42, Humphrey 39), and after almost two hours had been lost to rain, Ireland finished the day on 75 for three. Next morning saw a dramatic collapse in which seven wickets fell for 38 runs in 65 minutes, the spinners Ratcliffe (four for 39) and Mason (three for 36) doing most of the damage. England then extended their lead to 243, with Brooke (57) pushing the score along. Survival was Ireland's aim and despite Mulraine's attacking fields the game finished in a draw with Irish Youth on 154 for four.

It was Welsh Schools who had the best of a draw in the next game, on July 27 and 28 at Pontarddulais, where Wales won the toss and fielded. The pitch generally favoured the bowlers, and it needed a careful century from the usually fluent Wilcock to take English Schools to 175 for five. However, the English bowlers were less effective and the fielding was disappointing, so that Dalton (67) and Jones (68 not out) were able to take Wales to a first-innings lead of 80. Prospects looked poor just after lunch on the second day, when England were five wickets down with a lead still only in the twenties. However, a magnificent stand of 124 between Rika (106) and Mason (39) in 115 minutes saw them to 259 (S. Jones five for 76), leaving time only for Welsh Schools to progress to 22 for one in pursuit of 180.

The game against Scottish Young Cricketers at Steetley on August 6 and 7 produced the most exciting cricket. Rika was taken ill before the start and his absence seemed to affect the bowlers, so that the Scots had no difficulty in reaching 245 for nine in their 60 overs. Khan (83) and Kendall (80 not out) then batted attractively and positively to take English Schools to a declaration at 269 for six after 56 overs. Scotland did not show the same purpose on the second day and eventually declared at 226 for nine, leaving England the daunting target of 203 in 20 minutes plus 20 overs. Wilcock set the tone with 23 off 26 balls, Humphrey and Mulraine accelerated further with a stand of 74 in 34 minutes, and when Humphrey was out for 50 from 53 balls, Brooke joined Mulraine. With a barrage of fours and sixes they knocked off the last 84 runs in 36 minutes, Mulraine 73 not out (58 balls) and Brooke 44 not out (23 balls), to complete an outstanding victory.

Welsh Schools' creditable draw against English Schools was the climax of an international season that began badly, with the three-day game against Irish Schools at Pontypridd completely washed out. They met Scotland in Edinburgh, where the Scots scored 195 (N. Ball 76, G. Hamilton 72, D. Parsons 35; C. Wiseman four for 34), in reply to which the Welsh took a lead with 256 (S. Jenkins 42; R. Gilmour four for 53, C. Mears three for 48). The Scots fought back strongly, declaring at 264 for six (A. Heather 61, J. Clutterbuck 90, N. Ball 38; S. D. Thomas three for 57) and had reduced Welsh Schools to 145 for six (P. Richards 46; D. Wylie four for 37) when time ran out.

### HMC SOUTHERN SCHOOLS v HMC NORTHERN SCHOOLS

At Wadham College, Oxford, July 10, 11. Drawn. A promising match was ended by rain after only 44 overs on the second day. On the first, Hames made a bright start for Southern Schools, although it needed Cawdron and Averis to give the innings respectability after a middle-order collapse. The left-arm spin of Carpenter and Ratcliffe tied down all the batsmen, who never found it easy to get the ball away against generally accurate bowling on a slow wicket and outfield. When Northern Schools replied, it was the lively seam bowling of Wellington that caused a slump to 46 for four, before Mulraine and Renshaw rescued the innings with an excellent century stand. The South's second innings was interrupted three times by rain before the final deluge, but there was time for Kendall to play some vigorous strokes in scoring 87 out of 130, and for Carpenter and Henderson to stand out as the pick of the bowlers. In the field the throwing was good, some smart catches were held and the wicket-keeping of Nicholson was above average.

A stand of 107 between Humphrey and Kennis was the cornerstone of the South's innings, with Mason's off-spin the pick of the bowling. Wilcock batted with authority for the North before retiring with a pulled muscle, and then a positive contribution from Bairstow and Treagus enabled Powell to declare 21 behind. Humphrey again batted solidly before rain ended play after only 34 overs on the second day.

Once they had departed in close succession, runs were at a premium as two wickets fell to Mason, the Denstone off-spinner who fielded the ball well. The South African Gilbert chanced his luck while Radley gave a brief and undefeated demonstration of how to find the gaps before declaring at 195 for five at tea. MCC Schools struggled against the pace of Fox and Fay, the former claiming the first two wickets at 12 before Kennis, with two off-drives, showed why he had been such a prolific scorer for his school. An attacking partnership of 98 between Mulraine and Kendall maintained the run-rate and once Mulraine was run out, Kendall took command with some glorious strokes, hitting nine fours in his 69 not out.

At Lord's, July 15. Drawn. Toss: MCC Schools. The NAYC team featured four of the boys who had played in the Oxford Festival, including Kennis, who had represented MCC Schools the previous day, and with the Schools making two additional changes, 17 of the Oxford trialists appeared at Lord's. On a slow, low wicket Kennis looked in no difficulty until well caught by Brooke at square leg and NAYC reached 127 before lunch. Averis went off injured after four overs and with their 12th man, J. A. L. Henderson, also injured, the Schools fielded ten men for most of the morning. The spinners, Mason and James, showed good control, although it was Colclough who dominated the afternoon in a fifth-wicket partnership of 65 with Spencer. As soon as Colclough was out – well caught by Nicholson, whose wicket-keeping was impeccable – NAYC rather belatedly declared, whereupon both the Schools' openers were dismissed within four overs. Thereafter Mulraine attacked well in a brisk partnership with Brooke, but NAYC seemed in no hurry to get through their overs and what was probably a vain pursuit ended when the rain came with 14 overs remaining. There was just a hint that Harris might have spun the Schools out.

**ETON v HARROW**

At Lord's, June 24. Drawn. Toss: Eton. The oldest surviving fixture in the Lord's calendar was threatened with extinction, because its traditional Saturday was unavailable. A compromise shifted it to Wednesday, coincidentally the 80th birthday of Etonian and broadcaster Brian Johnston, who made Lord's the venue of his celebrations. His old school put Harrow in and within nine overs had reduced them to 13 for three; Douglas's pace dismissed Harrap and Danby in successive overs. Foster and Renshaw batted cautiously, reaching 81 by lunch. But in the afternoon their partnership gathered momentum, swelling to 196 over nearly four hours, despite the tidy spin of Wemyss and Lightfoot. The chief honours went to Foster, who scored the first hundred since T. M. H. James's unbeaten 112, also for Harrow, in 1978. He hit 13 fours in 239 balls. A few minutes later Hill declared, setting a target of 210 in what became 44 overs. It was a tall order for an inexperienced Eton side, none of whom had appeared at Lord's before. Evidently Harrow were wary of a third consecutive defeat, and they briefly scented victory when Hawkins claimed five wickets, for the second year running. But too little time was left, and Walsh steered Eton to the close with three wickets in hand.

**ETON v HARROW, RESULTS AND HUNDREDS**

Of the 157 matches played Eton have won 52, Harrow 44 and 61 have been drawn. This is the generally published record, but Harrow men object strongly to the first game in 1805 being treated as a regular contest between the two schools, contending that it is no more correct to count that one than the fixture of 1857 which has been rejected.

The matches played during the war years 1915-18 and 1940-45 are not reckoned as belonging to the regular series.

In 1904, D. C. Boles of Eton, making 183, set a record for the match, beating the 152 obtained for Eton in 1841 by Emilius Bayley, afterwards the Rev. Sir John Robert Laurie. Emilius Bayley Laurie. M. C. Bird, Harrow, in 1907, scored 100 not out and 131, the only batsman who has made two 100s in the match. N. S. Hotchkin, Eton, played the following innings: 1931, 153; 1932, 109 and 96; 1933, 88 and 12.

## HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE SCHOOLS

Although some schools reported as many as five games completely abandoned owing to the weather, a fine May offered some compensation. Six batsmen profited to pass 1,000 runs: R. W. Nowell of Trinity (1,505 at 79.21), A. Singh of King Edward's, Birmingham (1,138 at 63.22), W. J. Earl of Framlingham (1,084 at 83.38), J. E. Phillips of Royal GS, Worcester (1,082 at 60.11), R. M. S. Weston of Durham (1,046 at 104.60) and J. S. G. Hargrove of Victoria College, Jersey (1,043 at 65.18). Earl played only 16 innings and Weston 18, while Nowell played the most with 25. Weston was one of three batsmen to record three-figure averages, the others being S. C. Janes of Hampton, with 995 runs at 124.37, and M. H. Colclough of Newcastle-under-Lyme, with 622 at 103.66.

Three double-hundreds were reported. The highest was 221, scored by S. J. Hygate of Reigate GS, while 200 not out was achieved by both A. M. Barr of Victoria College, Jersey and K. R. Spiring of Monmouth. Nowell made an incredible seven centuries in his 25 innings. Weston and Ardingly's A. C. Slight (15 innings) both hit five, and four each came from G. P. Barrett of King's, Chester (15 innings), Earl, Janes (14 innings) and E. W. H. Wiseman of The Perse (15 innings).

It was a significantly better year for the bowlers, six of whom passed 60 wickets. A. Choudry of Latymer Upper collected 77 at 11.88, followed by N. C. F. Taylor of Durham (68 at 10.88), Nowell (64 at 14.92), M. G. Burle of Bishop's Stortford (62 at 11.61), S. Hunt of Plymouth College (61 at 15.52) and D. C. Sainsbury of Reigate GS (61 at 17.47). All except for Hunt and Burle sent down more than 300 overs, and Sainsbury conceded 1,066 runs. Of those who took more than 35 wickets, four recorded single-figure averages: N. J. Watson of Oratory (52 at 7.75), J. M. Gayfer of The Glasgow Academy (38 at 8.55), L. J. Crozier of Royal GS, Newcastle (44 at 9.02) and O. F. A. Le Fleming of Exeter (39 at 9.53). The best innings returns were recorded by R. Oram of Forest (nine for 40), D. Kepp of Reed's (nine for 57) and N. J. Wood of Rugby (nine for 64). Oram's nine-wicket haul included a hat-trick, and others to perform the feat were T. P. Howland of KCS Wimbledon, D. Lupton of Ashville College and J. C. Orr of Exeter. Of the nine other bowlers to take eight in an innings, the most impressive return was eight for nought by N. A. Doggett of Merchant Taylors', Crosby.

The leading all-rounder was again the remarkably talented England Under-16 representative Nowell, with his 1,505 runs and 64 wickets. He was followed by D. O. Dyer, another Under-16 player also from Trinity (811 runs, 51 wickets), A. Moss of Royal GS, Guildford (744 runs, 52 wickets), N. M. Davies of Royal GS, Worcester (772 runs, 42 wickets) and T. W. Earl of Brighton (758 runs, 40 wickets). The Wetherell Award, presented by the Cricket Society to the leading schoolboy all-rounder, went jointly to Nowell and D. Spencer of Kingston GS, who collected 522 runs at 47.45 and 32 wickets at 8.93.

It was encouraging to note the expanding fixture lists of many sides, although less encouraging were the references to negative cricket played by some XIs. In many cases an unbeaten record seemed more important than positive results and Haberdashers' Aske's commented that men's sides played much more positively than many schools. Ten of the schools who appear in this *Wisden* were unbeaten. Of these Glasgow Academy won ten of their 12 matches, Trinity won 13 of 25, Durham nine of 21 and Forest eight of 16; the remaining unbeaten sides were Bedford, Eton (who drew 12 of their 14 matches), King's, Canterbury, Manchester GS, Merchant Taylors', Crosby and Repton. At the other end of the scale, no victories were recorded by Culford, Fettes, Marlborough and Christ College, Brecon.

The match between Malvern and Berkhamsted was interesting for a strong Tolchard family connection. J. G. Tolchard (Leicestershire and Devon) was master-in-charge at Berkhamsted, while his brother, R. W. (England and Leicestershire), was the cricket professional at Malvern. Two of J. G. Tolchard's sons were playing in the match, the elder, J., as captain of Malvern and the younger, E., in the Berkhamsted XI.

The Sir Garfield Sobers Schools Tournament, held in Barbados in July, was won for the second year by Grenada Schools, who beat Michaelhouse from South Africa by 27 runs in the final. English and Scottish schools participating were Merchiston Castle, who reached the semi-finals where Grenada Schools beat them by seven wickets, Radley, who won three of their four matches, and Bradford GS, who were fourth in their group.

Masters reported a number of other outstanding performances and records broken, and these may be found in the returns from the schools which follow. (Note: The qualifications for inclusion in the averages in this *Wisden* have been increased to 150 runs and 15 wickets.)


