SCHOOLS CRICKET IN 1993

To get to "Oxford" as a cricketer – never mind as a scholar – represents excellence in itself for the 44 boys invited annually to the MCC Oxford Festival, which leads up to three matches at Lord's. The 1993 Festival was badly hit by the weather, as it had been in 1992. Boys who had hoped to play on two or even three occasions at Lord's had their aspirations curtailed at tea on the first day, with no further play possible on the following days.

Nor did the weather at Oxford, in the preceding trials, give the selectors as much time as they would have liked for players to display their talents; batsmen not getting to the wicket and bowlers not invited to perform have scant opportunity to press their claims. There may be a case – whatever the weather – for selectors asking a batsman to retire or a bowler to be withdrawn from the attack. Equity would demand that such players would be in the squad for Lord's in that their performances had told the selectors all they wished to know.

Those who came to Oxford broadly represented the best schoolboy talent of the year. One says "broadly" for several reasons: Jonathan Henderson (Hulme GS, Oldham), Robin Weston (Durham) and Nathan Wood (William Hulme's GS, Manchester) were unavailable because of their commitment to the England Under-18 International Youth Tournament. Wood, indeed, later made his debut as an England Under-19 player against West Indies at Old Trafford. The basic selection requires that 22 come from the English Schools Cricket Association (ESCA) sector and 22 from the Headmasters' Conference Schools (HMC). The latter selection depends much upon reports from schools; objective judgments must be made from what can be subjective submissions. After four days of intermittent cricket at Oxford, the following were selected to play in at least one match at Lord's: Andrew Bairstow, Scott Boswell, Michael Cawdron, Dominic Hewson, Quentin Hughes, Barry Hyam, Neil Killeen, Anthony McGrath, Tim Mason, Alex Morris, Richard Nowell, Ben Phillips, Spencer Platt, Darren Shadford, Anurag Singh, Matthew Taylor and Peter Wilcock. Their schools may be found in the scorecards that follow. - Gerald Howat.

HMC SOUTHERN SCHOOLS v HMC NORTHERN SCHOOLS

At Wadham College, Oxford, July 9, 10. Drawn.

Rain delayed the start until after lunch and the first innings was limited to 35 overs each. No batsman was able to establish himself although all the openers played with some purpose. The slow bowlers on each side, especially James and Nowell, proved the most successful. Hames and Hewson, in the Southern second innings, shared in a partnership of 89 while the seamer Boswell bowled a good line. More rain, on the second afternoon, made any result academic, but Bairstow compiled an excellent half-century for the Northern side in difficult conditions.

This became a one-innings match because of rain. The North proved the stronger side by far, as nearly all their batsmen played an innings of substance, especially Morris, and almost every wicket-partnership achieved something. Only Swann, in a determined innings, contributed much to the South's reply against a varied attack which included the pace of Richardson, the leg-spin of Lapsia and the slow left-armers of Taylor. Shadford, though not getting wickets on this occasion, showed his all-round potential.

MCC fielded a cosmopolitan XI, led by John Barclay, with two former Test players, a Bangladesh Under-19 representative and four more with English county experience. Terry and Dracup dominated play until mid-afternoon. Terry, reaching his century just before lunch, drove more strongly than schoolboys were used to and runs might have been saved had the field been set deeper. The off-spinner Mason, bowling rather faster than one might expect, had Terry caught as he induced a collapse from 173 for two to 188 for six. Williamson and Black, however, hit strongly before the declaration after 63 overs – mindful, perhaps, that the Schools had successfully chased 216 two years earlier. Wilcock and Bairstow were in no trouble and what might have been an interesting finish was spoilt when the rain came – as predicted exactly by the weathermen – at four o'clock.

Eton held the advantage from the start, thanks to Machin, who scored their first century at Lord's since 1968. At lunch they were 127 without loss; Harrow's best chance had come in the seventh over when only their inept fielding prevented a run-out. Machin lost Simpson when they had put on 149 but proceeded, with gathering speed, to score 150, including 13 fours, from 193 balls over nearly four hours. It was the highest score since the fixture was reduced to one innings in 1982. Simpson immediately declared, setting a target of 255 in three hours. Harrap was run out in the third over and Chittenden caught behind off the sixth ball from Lightfoot, the spinner, who worried the batsmen so much that he did not concede a run until his fifth over. By then McIntosh had retired, felled by Douglas's pace, and the loss of Foster, their century-maker in 1992, left Harrow effectively 21 for four with Renshaw leading a fight for survival. But he batted for 130 minutes, reaching fifty just before the close, and had support from Barker and then Henson, who defended for an hour and three runs to keep Eton out.

Of the 158 matches played between the two schools since 1805, Eton have won 52, Harrow 44 and 62 have been drawn. Matches during the two world wars are excluded from the reckoning. The fixture was reduced from a two-day, two-innings-a-side match to a one-day fixture in 1982. Forty-seven centuries have been scored, the highest being 183 by D. C. Boles of Eton in 1904; M. C. Bird of Harrow is the only batsman to have made two hundreds in a match, in 1907. The highest score since the First World War is 161 not out by M. K. Fosh of Harrow in 1975, Harrow's last victory. Since then Eton have won in 1977, 1985, 1990 and 1991; all other games have been drawn. A full list of centuries since 1918 and results from 1950 can be found in Wisdens prior to 1994.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE SCHOOLS

Despite wet weather, it was a summer for the batsmen, with 11 schoolboys passing 1,000 runs – the same number as in the record-breaking summer of 1990. I. C. Sutcliffe of Leeds GS was the most prolific with 1,623 at 101.43, followed by G. R. Treagus of King Edward's, Southampton (1,613 at 84.89), C. Clark of Durham (1,246 at 77.87), M. V. Steele of Wellingborough (1,174 at 83.85), A. D. Pierce of Lancing (1,125 at 66.17), W. Ritzema of Durham (1,124 at 62.44), J. E. Phillips of Royal GS, Worcester (1,024 at 53.89), L. J. Marland of Manchester GS (1,016 at 127.00), C. E. Mear of Kimbolton (1,007 at 50.35), R. J. Howell of Newcastle-under-Lyme (1,004 at 66.93) and J. J. Bull of Oakham (1,001 at 58.88). Treagus played the most innings with 25 and all had 20 or more except for Marland, who played just 13, and Steele with 19. Marland and Sutcliffe were two of five batsmen to record three-figure averages, the others being R. M. S. Weston of Durham, with 581 runs at 145.25 in only seven innings, N. T. Wood of William Hulme's GS, with 939 at 117.37, and G. A. Bucknell of Bryanston with 803 at 100.37.

There were two double-centuries; the highest, 208 not out from Marland, was closely followed by Ritzema's 207. In addition, 23 batsmen scored three or more hundreds, the most being eight by Sutcliffe (a rate of a hundred every three innings), six by Treagus and five by J. M. Connor for Royal GS, Worcester. Four others made four centuries, including Wood, who also averaged one every three innings.

It is perhaps not surprising, given these statistics, that the bowlers fared less well in 1993. Only 11 took 50 wickets and just two passed 60: T. J. Mason of Denstone with 63 at 11.79, and J. R. Carpenter of Birkenhead, also with 63 at 13.65. These two sent down 292 and 301 overs respectively and only M. J. Cawdron of Cheltenham needed as few as 200 overs for his 50 wickets at 10.56.

Five of the bowlers who took 30 or more wickets recorded single-figure averages. C. M. Gammell of Charterhouse Girls was the most economical with 42 at 5.02. Among the boys, I. D. Shambrook of Dartford GS led with 34 at 8.58, followed by A. J. Terrington of Exeter with 30 at 8.90, A. Sahai of Westminster with 30 at 8.96 and N. N. Bielby of Simon Langton GS with 36 at 9.38. Six bowlers took hat-tricks, of whom B. W. Gannon performed the feat twice for Abingdon. The others were M. Cassidy of Glasgow Academy, J. A. Floyd of Bishop's Stortford, S. R. Hall of Manchester GS, P. Jack of Bromsgrove and N. Stanger of Reed's. No nine-wicket returns were reported, although 12 bowlers took eight in an innings, the best figures being eight for ten by G. P. Brooks of Plymouth College.

When some schools play more than 20 matches and others fewer than 12, it is not always easy to compare all-rounders. However, two who especially caught the eye, maintaining the best averages as well as the highest totals, were Cawdron (887 runs at 73.91, 50 wickets at 10.56) and Mason (800 runs at 61.53, 63 wickets at 11.79). Of those who played in fewer than 15 matches, D. Spencer of Kingston GS collected 612 runs at 51 and 45 wickets at 13.40, while R. J. Nowell of Trinity had 597 runs at 45.92 and 51 wickets at 16.90. The winner of the Cricket Society's Wetherell Award was W. J. House of Sevenoaks, who scored 612 runs at 76.50 and took 28 wickets at 10.07.

Again it was encouraging to note the increasing fixture lists in which 27 schools played more than 20 matches, and King Edward VI, Southampton, played 27. Nineteen schools won more than half their games; Simon Langton GS won 71 per cent, with Barnard Castle and Woodhouse Grove winning 70 per cent. Woodhouse Grove were unbeaten, as were ten other sides, although in some instances the number of drawn games suggests that the unbeaten record was more the result of negative play than of a side's strength. Several schools expressed frustration at the negative attitudes of opposing sides, some of whom would bat defensively until well after tea, leaving them only a third or even a quarter of the overs in which to chase an unreasonable target. Other unbeaten sides who won more than half their matches were Abingdon, Colfe's, Eton and Oundle, while at the other end of the scale, with no victories, were Bristol GS, Christ College Brecon, Kingswood, Shiplake, Trent, Woodbridge and Wycliffe.

Many batting records and some bowling records were broken during the season; these and a number of other outstanding performances may be found in the returns from the schools which follow.

An excellent all-round contribution resulted in what was thought to be Abingdon's most successful season: unbeaten and victorious in 14 of 21 matches. He was well supported by Luke List, who also headed the batting averages, while Adam Janisch's 626 runs included five fifties in his last ten innings.
