

PUBLIC SCHOOL CRICKET IN 1916.

Next to military matches the chief interest in cricket last summer centred in the public schools. As in 1915 the schools adopted various procedure : some played their usual school matches, others played schools which they do not usually play in peace time, in order to make up for the lack of foreign matches.

If as a whole the schools did not have such strong opposition as in an ordinary year a great number of them met one side of exceptional strength. I mean, of course, the Artists' Rifles O.T.C. Their first eleven with D. J. Knight, A. Hartley, E. C. Kirk, G. G. Dumbleton, etc., was a tough nut indeed for any public school side, and the Schools must have appreciated thoroughly playing against such first-rate batting and bowling.

Another point that may be noticed is that the amount of Public School cricket played in the holidays was probably larger than ever before. The authorities at Lord's very wisely decided to have the Public School match early in August, and at the Oval and Leyton and elsewhere there were a number of matches in which the public schoolboys played as a side. It is a distinctly useful innovation ; certainly for several years to come there is not much chance of there being half the amount of country house cricket and games of this kind in which many schoolboys used to take part. In the heyday of country house cricket in the '90's, a boy in the South of England could certainly have played cricket every week and probably every day from August 1 to September 14. Those days are gone, perhaps never to return, and the matches of the kind which were played this year will supply a much-needed want.

I cannot do more here than say a few words about the Lord's match. Mr. F. E. Lacey, as usual, went into the claims and capabilities of all the candidates with the greatest care and discrimination, and selection was no easy matter.

Of course, as always must happen, some of those who had been invited could not play : one may mention among them Waldoock of Uppingham, and Pearson and Halsey of Eton, while Marlborough intimated that none of their players would be able to take part. Still, the two sides, as finally constituted, represented very fairly the

strength of Public School cricket last year. The title of the match, as before, was Lord's Schools (Eton, Harrow, Rugby, Cheltenham, and Haileybury) v. The Rest. To M. D. Lyon, of Rugby, was given the honour of captaining the Lord's Schools, and to H. Ashton, of Winchester, The Rest. Lyon had on his side two of his confrères in the very strong Rugby eleven of the year, and both all-round cricketers, in C. D. McCarthy and G. A. Rotherham. Eton were represented by W. G. Lowndes; and Harrow by their pair of bowlers, N. A. Jessopp and L. H. K. Gregson, and a promising young batsman in H. G. Patterson, son of that very great player, W. H. Patterson. Cheltenham also had three representatives in J. A. S. Jackson, captain of the eleven; G. O. Shelmerdine, a young cricketer who is useful as a bat and bowler; and C. P. Guise, a left-hand bowler. The remaining place was filled by a Haileyburian, J. V. Hughes Hallett.

On the other side Winchester with Ashton and Huband and Westminster with F. R. Oliver, captain of the school team and related on both sides to many Westminster cricketers (for his mother was a sister of H. R. and R. N. R. Blaker) and G. G. F. Greig were doubly represented. Malvern had K. S. Hamatsinhji (a nephew of the Jam Sahib) a really good boy wicket-keeper and a useful batsman; Shrewsbury were represented by H. P. Ward, bat and wicket-keeper; Bradfield by their best all-round cricketer, G. D. Fawcus, a left-hand bat and bowler; then there was P. H. Fitzgerald, Tonbridge batsman and lob bowler; G. T. S. Stevens another young and very promising all-rounder from University College School; M. O. Carter from Bedford Grammar School; and J. S. B. Gentry a left-handed bowler from Christ's Hospital. The Lord's Schools won the toss, and started the batting with Jackson and Patterson. Huband bowled Patterson with a nasty ball in his first over, but then there was a long stand between Jackson and McCarthy, and the former's batting, full of beautiful shots on the off-side, stood out, to my mind, above anything else in batting in the match; after this stand was broken up the fielding side had the best of it, and except for a stand late in the innings by J. V. Hughes-Hallett and Jessopp, which was broken up by Fitzgerald, the lob-bowler, no one did much, but the score reached 242. Captaining The Rest side is a most difficult task and, I think, Ashton was unduly criticized in some quarters for not using Fitzgerald enough. The idea of "if you have a lob bowler why not use him" so often reiterated, is a little exaggerated. Jessopp and Gregson, and more especially Jessopp, were too good for the majority of The Rest batsmen. A Lord's wicket is just the type of wicket to fit them. In the early part of The Rest's innings only Fawcus, of Bradfield, an attractive left-hand bat with plenty of strokes, and Stevens did anything worthy of note, but a fine stand for the ninth wicket by Huband and Greig saved the situation in some degree,

but The Rest finished up 61 behind. In the Lord's Schools' second innings Jackson and McCarthy again got the bulk of the runs, and there was a little brisk hitting by Lyon. The score was 182, which left The Rest 243 to get: a task which proved a great deal beyond their powers. Jessopp again bowled very well, and a bad start was never retrieved, the chief feature being another good innings by Fawcus. The whole side were out for 133, the Lord's Schools thus winning comfortably by over 100 runs. Jessopp's bowling was, I think, generally considered the most striking thing of the match; he got eight wickets in the two innings for 73 runs. The Rest batsmen largely failed to cope with him—on both sides several of the batsmen failed in both innings, so that one had no real chance of seeing their form. But Jackson's innings was, to my mind, the best played and he struck one as a batsman of great promise. A noticeable feature was the number of players who are both batsmen and bowlers—Jackson, McCarthy, Shelmerdine, Carter, Fawcus, Oliver, Stephens. Of the several slow and medium left-handed bowlers, Gentry appeared to give the most trouble. The wicket-keeping of Lyon and Hamatsinhji was very good, both undoubtedly being first-rate boy wicket-keepers. The fielding was, I think, a little disappointing, for in such a game one ought to see the most perfect fielding, but there were some brilliant bits of work done, and the two Wykehamists were exceptionally good, Ashton's catch in the deep field being *the* catch of the match.

With so many schools playing each other who had not done so before or not for a long time, a list of results would be bewildering and uninformative: especially as it must be remembered that in some cases the schools playing away from home had, perhaps, a long journey by train or motor on the morning of a match and then had to begin cricket straight away, and so were decidedly handicapped.

But it must be recorded that Eton, Winchester, and Harrow met for the first time since 1854—the year when the Winchester matches at Lord's were given up.

Harrow played Winchester on New Field, Winchester; Winchester played Eton on Agar's Plough; and Eton played Harrow once on Agar's Plough and once on Sixth Form Ground. All were one-day matches; and all had a definite result. Harrow beat Winchester, Winchester beat Eton and Eton twice beat Harrow; a curious series of results in all conscience, but not without precedent, for in the '30's the same thing happened, in that each school lost and won a match, and all the victories were gained by an innings.

All the four matches were games of low scores, where the bowlers had the best of matters. Winchester v Harrow was played on a wicket which was not difficult. Winchester got Harrow out quite cheaply, but then failed badly themselves, and were beaten by about 50 runs. Jessopp's bowling in this innings was clearly too good for them. He had the help of a strong wind blowing almost straight down the ground, and he was coming off the pitch really fast. With Gregson bowling at the other end, Winchester got no rest. Jessopp had a wonderful analysis.

It was chiefly by good bowling that Winchester beat Eton on Agar's Plough. Winchester won the toss, put Eton in, and got them out for 79, Huband, Clay, and Bingham all bowling well, and then, batting when the wicket was a little easier, Winchester made the runs by slow but sound cricket, Ashton and Bankier making a valuable stand for the third wicket. Eton in their second innings made 244 for seven, the wicket now being much easier. Halsey hit very well for 86.

Eton twice beat Harrow; in the first match on Sixth Form Ground, played on one of the few real summer days, but after a time of wet weather, the wicket was slow and never difficult. Harrow batted first, and made 112, and Eton 200, Pearson, Lowndes, Roe, and Wilson, Nos. 4, 5, 6, and 7, being responsible for most of the runs. The outfield was considerably faster when Eton were batting, and they thus had some advantage. Also the wicket was not of the kind to suit the two Harrow bowlers, for both of them want a bit of "flip" in the pitch, and there was none of this whatever. The return match at Eton was a much closer struggle—Eton eventually getting the 124 runs required to win for the loss of seven wickets.

One rather curious incident, or set of incidents, in the Eton and Winchester match may be mentioned. G. Akroyd, who batted first for Eton, was twice out for the same score, one, in precisely the same way in both innings. Bingham, who is an in-swerre bowler delivered the same kind of ball each time; Akroyd each time hit it quite well to leg, where both times he was caught by Johnstone.

So much then for the matches of the three schools. None of the sides was in any way remarkable, and it would be hard to say which was the strongest or weakest of the three. There was probably not much between them. But it is fairly safe to say that Harrow in Jessopp and Gregson had two of the most prominent cricketers, and without doubt the best pair of school bowlers of the year. It is also safe to say that in batting Harrow were a good deal the weakest, for after H. G. Patterson, who is a sound

player and a most useful man to go in first, G. M. Butler, a son of another famous Harrow cricketer E. M. Butler, and the two bowlers, who are determined if not finished batsmen, the batting was lamentably weak. The two bowlers were a foil to each other in that Jessopp is left-handed and Gregson right. But both were on the fast side of medium. Jessopp is a bowler of whom a good deal may be expected in the future. He is not a tall man, but he is strong and stoutly built, and he can keep up his pace and fire for a considerable time. He has a nice action and though not really fast through the air he comes very quickly off the pitch. He has, too, the left-hander's swerve, and he bowls a deadly yorker. The following account of the Harrow season and of the performances of the two bowlers has kindly been sent me by one who saw as much of their cricket as anyone.

Harrow played seven matches, of which the match with R.M.A. Woolwich was spoilt by rain. They beat a good side brought down by Lord Francis Scott, Sandhurst, Charterhouse, and Winchester, but lost both matches with Eton, and on both occasions Eton won the toss and put Harrow in. It was very pleasant to see the old fixture with Winchester revived, and to see the first Charterhouse side that has appeared at Harrow. The scores of all the matches show that Harrow possessed two fine bowlers in the captain, L. H. K. Gregson, and N. A. Jessopp, but were very weak and unreliable in batting. Both bowlers did very fine work against Lord Francis Scott's XI, and while Gregson's performance of getting eight wickets for 23 against Charterhouse was a grand one, it was eclipsed by Jessopp's achievement against Winchester. Here, with a high wind to help him and his natural swerve, he did one of the finest performances ever seen in a school match: had all batsmen alike in difficulties, bowled unchanged throughout, sent down only two or three loose balls—these luckily were not hit—and had the extraordinary analysis of 19.1 overs, 12 maidens, 12 runs, 9 wickets. Against Charterhouse and Winchester the batting was feeble, and prepared onlookers for the poor show made with the bat against Eton. G. M. Butler, next season's captain, played well for 104 against Sandhurst, and 33 against Charterhouse. H. G. Patterson played well against Lord Francis Scott's XI and Sandhurst and Winchester, and E. O. Bleachley did well in the second match with Eton with two innings of 42 each. Jessopp might have been dangerous, but invariably chose the wrong one to hit. The fielding was keen and smart, and J. T. Frericks was very good in this respect.

Eton in cricket have for so long been on the crest of the wave that it was only to be expected that there must be some falling off, and though they were this year not to be compared with many of the sides that have preceded them, they were by no means in the

hollow. But they were not more than a fair average school side. They had again no slow bowlers of great merit—it is curious that they have had none of late years—and though in Pearson, the captain, two young bowlers in Hill Wood and Gibson, and others there was no great lack, yet there was nothing really formidable. Pearson, Halsey, Lowndes, and Roe were all useful school batsmen.

Bowling was *Winchester's* strong point, and in Huband, Clay and Bingham they had three school bowlers up to the average. Huband is a cricketer whom any captain must like on his side. Full of determination and keenness he makes the best of his abilities; no day is too hot and no hours too long for him to play cricket. As a bowler he is medium pace and makes the ball swerve at the start of an innings, but he does not sacrifice length for the swerve, and he will keep pegging away most determinedly, and never minds being hit. He is by no means a finished batsman, but he has a fine eye, and can hit hard, and several times going in late he pulled the side out of a hole by his hitting; and he is a splendid field in almost any position. Bingham bowls in-swingers, and Clay leg-breaks of more than average merit. Potentially Ashton is the best batsman on the side; he is very quick on his feet and has sufficient scoring strokes, but he was apt to get himself out by a bad shot and throw his wicket away needlessly, just when he looked likely to play a big innings. He, too, is a really good field. The soundest bat on the side was Bankier, who played several very good innings. As a fielding side on the whole *Winchester* were hard triers, but were not, perhaps, quite up to the high standard that *Wykehamists* set for themselves.

I think *Rugby* may certainly claim to be the side of the year. Admirably captained by Lyon they won eight out of nine matches—a fine record for a school team—their only defeat being from the all-conquering *Artists*. They won three school matches—*Marlborough* after a wonderfully exciting match; *Malvern* by four wickets; and *Clifton*, who were weak, by an innings and 220 runs. Lyon perhaps sometimes goes for the bowling a shade too early, but he is a powerful and attractive bat. Of his wicket-keeping I have already spoken. F. R. Kittermaster, a sound steady batsman, heads the averages with 338 runs and an average of 48.18. He scores slowly, but he saved the side on several occasions at critical points. C. D. McCarthy got most runs, 473, with an average of 39.41. He is a most promising bat with patience and good judgment, a good field and bowls useful leg-breaks. G. A. Rotherham, average 31.00 and twenty-seven wickets for 18 was the all-rounder. He is a bat with many strokes and a medium right hand bowler with plenty of variety. In E. J. D. O. Inglis (47

wickets for 14.47) the side possessed a leg-break bowler of more than average merit. He can bowl a googly, and next season might be really good.

A few words must be said of the *Rugby* and *Marlborough* match. It was played at *Marlborough*, and is described as "one of the best school matches ever played. Both sides succeeded in getting themselves into desperate straits, and both sides showed that they could get themselves out again." In the end *Rugby* won a truly remarkable game by eight runs. Nearly 1,300 runs were scored; and no innings was under 250—scoring which a few years back would have been thought quite phenomenal for schoolboys. *Rugby* won the toss and, helped by a stand of 93 for the eighth wicket by Wright and Kittermaster, made 268—Wright going in ninth got 94. *Marlborough's* first innings is described as all head and tail and no middle. 150 for one wicket was up, but six were down for 166; *Marlborough* like *Rugby* had a great eighth wicket stand of 88, and in the end *Marlborough* led on the first innings by 61. They got one *Rugby* wicket that night for 49. Next morning *Rugby*, with three for 76 and the bowlers obviously having the upper hand, looked a beaten side; but determination, and it must be admitted some luck, came to their aid. A sixth wicket partnership added 164; the two heroes of this being Patterson, who got 96, and Kittermaster, not out 110. *Marlborough* were left with 296 to win. Ashfield batted finely for 129, and a very good start at one time gave promise that *Marlborough* would win. McCarthy's leg breaks changed the situation in favour of *Rugby*. Then the match veered round once again in favour of *Marlborough*, and with 260 for six they were in the better position. The seventh wicket fell at 262, the eighth at 283, and the ninth at 287. "Imagine," says the *Marlburian*, "two small boys out there, last men in, nine runs to get at the end of a two whole days' swaying struggle, trying to stave off defeat for a side that a quarter of an hour before seemed to be winning comfortably." They withstood the attack pluckily for several overs, but then Elmhirst was bowled by McCarthy, and this wonderful game ended after so many changes of fortune in a win for *Rugby* by eight runs. So remarkable was the game indeed that I make no apology for referring to it at such length.

Like their opponents *Marlborough* were also a strong side. Ashfield and Paul, the captain, both all-rounders; Jordan

and Cornwall as batsmen; Waldegrave wicket-keeper, and left-hand bat who can hit very hard; and J. Elmhirst a slow bowler of great promise, were the nucleus of a school side above the average.

Another good eleven were *Repton*, who won five matches out of eight, and were never beaten. In school matches they beat Uppingham and drew with Malvern and Shrewsbury. They were, so I am told, and my informant is by no means one who is liable to regard geese as swans, that the Repton team was the best since 1908. This is high praise indeed, for that was a wonderful schoolboy side when H. S. Altham, R. Sale, A. T. Sharp, and Greswell all played first-class cricket in August, and I. P. F. Campbell was also asked to play for Surrey. In batting, my informant says, I think the side of 1916 was very nearly as good as that of 1908, and the only thing wanting was a bowler of the Greswell class, not that the bowling was by any means weak. The outstanding batsmen of a side who could nearly all play were: H. M. Morris, P. S. Bower, and A. J. C. Hirst. Their averages were remarkable: Bower, 8 innings, 350 runs, average 58.33; Morris, 8 innings, 398 runs, average 49.75; Hirst, 8 innings, 346 runs, average 43.25. R. L. Holdsworth also averaged over 40, A. J. Holmes 31, and W. O. Gairdner 28. Nevill, Abraham, Morris, and Bower were useful bowlers, and B. O. Byass is a cricketer of promise.

Malvern were a young and inexperienced eleven, but there was a good deal of talent and if they had had more matches they might have shown themselves a good side. They played five school matches, of which that against Rugby—finished in heavy rain when the conditions were hardly fit for cricket—was lost by four wickets; Shrewsbury also beat them; Repton was a draw, and Cheltenham an easy win for Malvern at Malvern, and a draw at Cheltenham. In K. S. Hamatsinhji, Malvern had a wicket-keep much above the average, when his hands are sound, and two useful left-hand bowlers in Molran (fast) and Franks (very slow). They were a foil to each other, and did most of the bowling. The most promising cricketer on the side is Partridge, who is only 15 years old, but has all the strokes and should become, if he trains on, really good. Gordon, Honey, Hamatsinhji, and Sothern were also above the average of school batsmen.

Westminster had a fairly good side as was shown by its victories over the M.C.C. and the Artists. In the former match Westminster

scored 330 and dismissed their opponents for 138, and in the latter they won by a margin of 60 runs. In school matches they were not so successful: defeating Radley, but losing to Charterhouse twice; and Tonbridge, though the Charterhouse match at Vincent Square resulted in a very close finish. F. R. Oliver was the mainstay of the bowling, and also batted very well throughout the year. He was a good and energetic captain. N. P. Andrews, as last year, was top of the averages, and was the best batsman on the side—he will be captain in 1917. G. G. F. Greig was a useful all-rounder, though he did not come up to expectations as a bowler.

From *Cheltenham* I hear that they had a fairly successful season. They were beaten by Malvern at Malvern, drew with Malvern at home, the match being entirely spoiled by rain; and they drew with Marlborough after the latter had made 430; and beat Clifton. The bowling was a little lacking in variety, and most of the run-getting had to be done by the old colours, Shelmerdine and P. B. Sanger, who is a powerful batsman, both averaging over 40.

Tonbridge had quite a good season, and with six of the side left for next season, and among them Fitzgerald, who will be captain, they ought to be strong. This year Hedges, who was most consistent, and Evans, were in addition to Fitzgerald the best batsmen of the side, and there was a good deal of bowling, though none of it very formidable.

Wellingborough had a very fair side, though not nearly so strong as during the last few years. They played eleven matches, winning five, drawing four, and losing two. Colman, Badham, and Humphery were quite good bats, and the former played well during the holiday school matches at the Oval, in most of which he captained the School's side. Badham was the best "all-rounder" being a good left-handed bowler in addition to being a stylish bat. The bowling was quite up to the usual school standard, with Badham, Childs, and Robinson, the best. The fielding was fairly good throughout the season (with less practice than usual owing to O.T.C. work). There is plenty of talent lower down in the School for future elevens.

Another of the batsmen of the year was A. F. Rickmore of *Clifton*. He is only 17, and most promising, with exceptionally good back play for a boy; he has a power of playing back on very

fast wickets, but possibly in one respect this is his weakness, for he never uses forward play purely as defence. He has a fine drive and plenty of strokes.

Of *Charterhouse* I have no information, I am sorry to say, but I have heard that in Cawston and Cooke they had two promising cricketers.

Among other school cricketers of the year were J. Cartwright of *Felsted*, who got 443 runs, averaging 40.2, and took thirty-nine wickets for 13.13 apiece ; Wyatt Smith of *Sherborne* ; S. G. Hannen of *Radley*, a useful all-rounder ; F. A. Waldox of *Uppingham*, the mainstay of the eleven, who was certainly worth a place in the best Public School side of the year, Bourdillon of Brighton, and Malden, the Haileybury captain, who is a batsman of much promise.

With three men out the score was only 31, but Pearson and Lowndes, the only two old "colours," showed fine form at a critical time, and after a brilliant catch had sent back Lowndes at 63, Pearson and Roe, adding 45, practically determined the result of the match. Pearson, the Eton captain, played a great game for his side. Roe batted in nice style, and Harrow's total having been passed with five wickets in hand, several of the later batsmen hit freely. ETON v. WINCHESTER.

Played at ETON, Saturday, July 8.—As in the previous season the meeting of Eton and Winchester was restricted to one day, and again the two schools agreed not to count the game in the regular series. The contest furnished a big surprise, for although Winchester only a week before had lost to Harrow and Eton three days subsequently had beaten Harrow, Winchester won by 54 runs. In winning the toss and being thereby enabled to send Eton in to bat on a wicket which was somewhat slow, the Wykehamists enjoyed some advantage, but there could be no question as to the meritorious nature of their victory. Ashton, the Winchester captain, had only three bowlers upon whom he could depend, but these contrasted well with one another and were so judiciously used and so admirably supported in the field that they disposed of Eton in an hour and three-quarters for 79. Only at one period did Eton seem at all likely to make a creditable score, Pearson and Lowndes, who came together with three wickets down for 15, putting on 41 runs. This was chiefly the work of Lowndes who, given a life, hit in capital style, but Pearson deserved praise for the restraint he imposed upon himself. Winchester began in rather worse fashion than their opponents, three wickets—one the result of a brilliant piece of fielding by Halsey—falling for 13 runs. Bankier and Ashton, however, turned the fortunes of the game with a partnership which yielded 48, and Eton's total was passed with six wickets in hand. Later on there were eight men out for 97, and the game looked to have great possibilities, but with 36 more runs added before the innings closed, Winchester had their victory assured. Still Eton afterwards gave a brilliant display of batting, hitting up 244 runs in about a couple of hours. Especially attractive was the dashing innings of Halsey, who, on account of an examination, had been prevented from playing against Harrow.

Pearson bowled in capital form, and Hill-Wood secured an advantage for his side directly the innings opened. Against Gregson and Jessopp, Eton at first fared little better than their opponents had done, the score with four men out being only 36. As in the previous innings, however, there came an invaluable partnership for the fifth wicket, Lowndes and Halsey putting on 63. Possibly Gregson during this stand would have been well advised to have changed his bowling earlier even if Lowndes was lucky in some mishits falling just out of harm's way. Eton headed the Harrow total with three wickets in hand, but were only 7 runs ahead when the ninth went down. Just when the issue hung in the balance, and every run was of importance, the Harrow fielding in one or two instances became a little unsteady. In Harrow's second innings Bleackley was again seen to advantage, his play on the on-side being very strong. In company with Patterson he put on 66 runs.

At that point, however, Wright came in and hit with such vigour that the eighth wicket yielded 93 runs, the total in the end reaching 268. Wright's 94 included a 6 and sixteen 4's. Paul and Ashfield opened Marlborough's innings in such fine style that the score was up to 121 before the first wicket fell. This splendid start was so far from being maintained that with seven wickets down the total had only been advanced to 194. The drawing of stumps found Rugby 12 runs behind with nine wickets in hand. Left with 296 to win, Marlborough lost Paul and Cornwall for 88, but the partnership of Ashfield and Jordan, yielding 105 runs, looked to have placed them well on the road to victory, only 103 runs being wanted with seven wickets to fall. The close of Ashfield's splendid innings at 197, however, was speedily followed by three other disasters, and although O'Shea and Waldegrave took their side to within 34 of victory, a great effort by Marlborough just failed of success. In the course of the two days no fewer than 1,240 runs were obtained. Farrer and Elmhirst bowled well for Marlborough, as did Inglis, Rotherham, and McCarthy for Rugby.
