## PUBLIC SCHOOL CRICKET IN 1917.

Public School cricket played an even larger part in the cricket of the year than in the two preceding seasons. There were probably more school matches than ever before, though because of the difficulties and expense of travelling, etc., one or two time-honoured fixtures had to be given up; yet others, between schools situated fairly close together were started. But there were less "foreign" matches, at least against sides of any strength, and I hear from several quarters how schools have missed the experience of playing against the kind of sides which were always able to go down to schools in pre-war days.

There were, of course, a fair number of military teams about, and the M.C.C. was able to play a good many schools: Captain P. F. Warner more than once got together a pretty powerful eleven, in which some famous cricket heroes took part, notably Lord Harris—the best batsman of his age in England—and Lord Hawke, President of the M.C.C. The Grenadier Guards, too, had quite a useful eleven, who were very keen on games against schools when they could be managed. So things were not as bad as they might have been, though some schools situated far away were rather short of matches.

Lord's Schools v. the Rest at Lord's has now rightly taken its place as one of the events of the season. It was played on the first Monday and Tuesday, in August, and was followed by a number of holiday games of all kinds and descriptions, in and around London. To those who helped in the organization and management of these, the thanks of the boys and of all cricketers are due.

The weather was rather a disappointment. A glorious May and early June were followed by a bad spell and for the most part after the first weeks of the term there were few chances of batsmen's wickets. It was a year in which bowlers had as a whole the greater chance of distinguishing themselves, and there were a great many who did so. Indeed, since I first wrote in *Wisden* some years ago now, I cannot remember any year where accounts of so many good bowlers have come in from the correspondents at the schools, who

so kindly give me their views, in comparison with the number of good batsmen.

The five bowlers whose doings attracted most attention perhaps, were C. H. Gibson of Eton, G. A. Rotherham of Rugby, J. D'E. E. Firth of Winchester, G. T. S. Stevens of University College School, and H. L. Calder of Cranleigh. Then from Charterhouse I hear that Wooldridge and Rucker were one of the best pair of bowlers the school have had; the same is said of Franks and Partridge of Malvern; Miles and Badger of Shrewsbury were another instance; so were Elmhirst and Skerrett Rogers of Marlborough, and as individuals there were in addition, Browne of Eastbourne, Deighton of Brighton, and others. The first five mentioned, Gibson, Rotherham, Firth, Stevens, and Calder, were all somewhat different in their methods, and all no doubt good. As a natural straightforward bowler, personally I think Gibson stood out by himself and for a boy with probably another year at school, he seems to be something quite out of the common. He bowls fast medium to fast and starts with two great assets before anything else—a good run up to the wicket and a beautifully easy swing and action. He has a great command of length, a very good yorker, and he swerves late. Altogether he is not an easy customer to tackle and he has, too, the power of keeping on for a long time without loss of length or fire.

Rotherham is much the same sort of pace as Gibson, and he too has a nice action, but his success comes more from changes of pace and varieties of ball. His slow ball is a deceptive one, and does not come too often.

Firth, who did more startling performances than either of the others mentioned, has by contrast an ungainly style and ungainly action, but he has the two great qualities of brain and determination. Moreover with only a little help from the wicket he could and did turn the ball both ways, a quick leg break being his special strength. He has many devices, and considering he tries so much he bowls very few bad balls. His pace is just under medium, but he, too, varies this constantly, and he always looked to have plenty of life off the pitch.

Stevens bowls both leg-breaks and googlies, and can bowl the latter at a pace that is fast enough to prevent them being reached and hit on the full pitch. Even at Lord's on a slow wicket, he looked none too easy and one could imagine him being very difficult on a fast pitch. He and Rotherham held claims to be the best all-round boy cricketers of the year.

Calder, the son of an old Hampshire cricketer, came to Cranleigh from South Africa in 1915, and at once got a place in the school eleven. He has been head of the bowling averages in each of his three years. He bowls fast medium with an easy action and a good

delivery, and he has a useful slower ball which he developed in 1916, and which he mixes in cleverly with his faster ones. He possesses also the cardinal virtue of length, which means that he is seldom mastered and he keeps the batsman playing most of the time. He has too a dangerous "yorker" on the leg stump which swings in to the batsman at the last moment. He played in several of the holiday games and certainly created a most favourable impression. At the Oval on one occasion, he got eight wickets for 21.

The selection of the two teams for the Public School match does not grow easier by any means. There are so many schools from which to choose and there are so many candidates for places, whose claims are so nearly equal. It is pleasant that as many school captains as possible should be playing, occasionally a boy of great cricket promise is so young that he may well wait a year before being selected. And there are other considerations. Then two captains as suitable as possible have to be found for a most difficult task, and more than all the elevens have to be chosen to make two sides not merely to be the best twenty-two players in the schools.

Certainly no pains or time were spared in weighing up the various claims and though naturally for one reason or another the elevens lacked many good cricketers—one might mention among others: Partridge of Malvern; Ward of Shrewsbury, and Reid of Cranleigh—yet the two teams as finally constituted could give little cause of complaint. They were: Lord's Schools—G. M. Butler (captain) Harrow; C. H. Gibson, G. N. Scott-Chad, and W. R. Shirley, Eton; J. J. Dalal, Harrow; C. D. McCarthy and G. A. Rotherham, Rugby; J. Elmhirst, Marlborough; W. J. Malden, and R. C. Brooks, Haileybury, and G. O. Shelmerdine, Cheltenham. The Rest—H. N. Vincent, Charterhouse (captain); L. W. Greenwood, A. H. de Bosdari, and J. D'E. E. Firth, Winchester; A. F. Bickmore, Clifton; R. L. H. Holdsworth, Repton; J. D. Wyatt-Smith, Sherborne; G. T. S. Stevens; University College School; K. W. A. Symons, Bedford; P. W. Rucker, Charterhouse; and P. H. Fitzgerald, Tonbridge. Of these, Butler, McCarthy, Shelmerdine, Malden, Bickmore, Fitzgerald, Holdsworth, Stevens, Wyatt-Smith, Symons, and Vincent were school captains. What a match it turned out to be! The finish of it made one think of that unforgettable Eton and Harrow in 1910 in a minor degree. For in this case The Rest, with six men out in their second innings, wanted 62 to save the innings defeat, and then won the match. To begin with play looked like being impossible all the first day, for the ground after a lot of rain was soaking wet, especially the outfield. But at half-past three a start was made and a disastrous one for The Rest—who went in first. The wicket probably was not very difficult, but it was slow and it was very hard to score more than a single. The Rest went down before Rotherham and Gibson, losing six wickets for 20, and only a

stand by Symons and Vincent saved absolute disaster, the score in the end reaching 60.

Four good wickets of the Lord's Schools fell that night for 18, leaving the match in an even position, but thanks almost entirely to Malden (71) and Shirley (32), who both batted very well, the Lord's Schools totalled 134, and when Gibson and Rotherham again disposed of six of The Rest for 22, it looked all over. Then Symons joined Stevens and a stand followed which altered the whole of the outlook, and with Vincent and Symons together the innings defeat was saved, and runs began to come. Eventually the side were out for 151, of which Symons had got 72—the highest score of the match, and the Lord's Schools were left with 78 to get, which they failed to do, The Rest winning by 17 runs. In this last innings Firth had his triumph. The wicket was more difficult than at any other time probably and Firth made the most of his chance. With seven wickets for 27 he clearly won the game. Stevens at the other end bowled most steadily. It was a splendid match, but, of course, on such a wicket there were bound to be many failures in batting, and one saw very little of several players who were known to be good, such as Greenwood and McCarthy, Bickmore, Wyatt-Smith and others. Both wicket-keepers, Brooks and Vincent distinguished themselves.

Eton, Harrow, and Winchester played each other in the same way as in 1916, *i.e.*, all one day matches. Eton played Harrow twice, once on Agar's Plough, and once on Sixth Form Ground the Eton and Winchester match was on Ridding Field, Winchester, and Winchester and Harrow played at Harrow. Eton won all three of their games, but that with Winchester was a desperate encounter, which was anyone's match, and Winchester easily disposed of Harrow. In addition Winchester beat the strong Charterhouse side, and had much the worst of a draw with Marlborough, while Harrow lost to Charterhouse.

In the Eton and Harrow matches one cannot help alluding to the extraordinary succession of occasions in late years on which Harrow have batted first. In 1901 Eton went in first, but they did not do so again until the second match this year. In the meantime Harrow either won the toss and went in or were persistently put in by Eton, and Eton during these years have been right on the crest of the wave of success.

In the circumstances it was not altogether surprising, though we do not think it was good cricket policy that when Harrow won the toss on July 14th this year, they did the same as their opponents had so often done and put Eton in. There is something in the force of superstition, but nothing can alter the value of having first knock in most cases, when one has the chance.

Of the four matches between the three schools only the Eton and Winchester one deserves any long notice. Harrow on Sixth Form Ground did not make much of a fight with either Eton or Winchester. Against Eton they scored 154 to which Eton replied with 240 for four, and against Winchester they totalled 139 and their opponents 246 for four, L. W. Greenwood making 141, which score is one of the highest ever made by a Wykehamist in a school match. At Eton, Harrow made a better fight, but never came within measurable distance of victory. Eton batting first scored 150, and Harrow, after losing six men for 38 in some of the slowest cricket imaginable—under 20 runs were got in the first hour—reached 104, largely owing to a plucky innings by J. T. Frericks.

No more exciting match can be imagined than Eton and Winchester on Ridding Field. Winchester batted first, and after a very good start and some good batting by L. W. Greenwood, D. R. Jardine, and C. P. Brutton, they proceeded to throw away their chances with both hands. Eighty-five was up for four wickets, and then owing to bad running and poor batting, a collapse followed, and the side on a slow but not a difficult wicket were out for 92. But a grand bowling performance by Firth, who got all ten wickets, nearly enabled Winchester to snatch a victory. All through the Eton innings the fortunes varied. Three good wickets were down for 22, and four for 37, then Brocklebank by some sturdy batting changed the outlook and the score was taken to over 60. But then Firth got three more wickets, and with seven for 65 it again looked to be Winchester's match. Low, who came next, and Gibson, both played pluckily, and for once Firth had a lapse. He bowled two bad overs and two really bad balls, which were both promptly hit to the leg boundary by Gibson. The score rose to 89 and then Gibson (8th out) was caught in the deep field. One run later the 9th wicket fell to a catch at mid-off, and Eton had still 3 to get. In running the batsmen had crossed, and so Low and not Hoare had the next ball, off which he got a 3 through the slips, and the game was won. Firth soon got the remaining wicket, and so performed "the grand slam," which has only once before been done in this match, namely by the late Mr. G. A. C. Sandeman for Eton in 1902.

The general verdict of the year on the sides would be: Eton and Winchester just about level—both much stronger than Harrow. Neither Eton nor Winchester was at all exceptional, but neither was by any means weak. Each had one of the best boy bowlers of the year, Gibson and Firth. I have earlier in the article said something of these, but I am tempted just to give their figures for the school matches, and the match at Lord's. In the school matches (all one day) I have taken no account of the second innings as no second innings was played which had any bearing on the result.

Besides Firth Winchester had no bowling of great merit. Bingham, the captain, with in-swingers, was useful on occasions and Toppin, a son of a famous cricketer, Mr. Charles Toppin, of Malvern, is most promising. Toppin bowls fast medium and is also a useful bat. Eton besides Gibson had in Hoare and Shirley two very useful right hand bowlers; the former medium and the latter rather over. As to the batting Winchester were stronger at the top, and Eton were more reliable in the body and tail of the team. L. W. Greenwood, who has a particularly nice style, D. R. Jardine, son of an old Oxford cricketer, and a batsman of very great promise. A. H. de Bosdari who watched the ball carefully, and C. P. Brutton were probably better than any four Eton could produce collectively. But the tail was apt to fail, and Eton had to be got out, most of the way down, and there were several batsmen to be labelled dangerous. Of the Eton batsmen perhaps Shirley was the best. Scott-Chad was a useful man to go in first. Wilson (a batsman of a style about as far removed from the typical Eton batting of the Mitchell regime as one can imagine) was nevertheless a most useful player. He had a lot of good scoring strokes, and somehow he seemed not to get out off some atrocious ones; Barker, a left hander, is promising; and Brocklebank, a nephew of the Hon. F. S. Jackson, and a player who is said to have something of the latter's glorious temperament for cricket, was a hitter of rather uncommon power. He is not a batsman yet, but he has the knack of hitting balls of all kinds of lengths so hard that he may, I believe, have a great cricket future. It is very seldom that Winchester field badly, and they did not belie their reputation this year, but at the same time they had no brilliant fieldsman. In Cokayne Frith, Eton had a cover-point of the class seldom seen; one who may possibly take his place among the heroes in this position. Brocklebank also was an exceptionally good point.

Harrow, except in fielding were certainly not the equal of either of their opponents. They are and have been in a cycle of weak cricket seasons, which come to all schools, and when this is so, there

just as certainly comes the old complaint that something is wrong with the teaching of cricket at the school. Only too often it comes from those who know least about it and who are least qualified to judge.

In the early part of the year total lack of length bowling was Harrow's chief weakness—all the bowlers sent down so many bad length balls, simply asking to be hit. A. H. M. Jackson, another nephew of one of Harrow's greatest cricket sons, was the best of the bowlers, and he did more than one good performance. It was very unfortunate for the side that G. M. Butler, the captain, never got into form, and he seemed to be dogged by misfortunes in school matches. Davies was very useful as a first batsman; Bennett has probably a lot of cricket in him; Dalal was a useful all-round man and "a wonderful snapper up of unconsidered trifles in the slips." Stevenson Moore gave one electric performance.

I do not intend to make any guess as to the best side of the year, but two who were as successful as any were Charterhouse and Shrewsbury. Of the latter I shall have something to say further on.

Charterhouse played 10 matches, of which 8 were won, one drawn, and only one lost—a fine record. Four of the matches were against schools with the following results:

- v. Winchester, lost by 29 runs. Winchester scored 161 and Charterhouse 132.
- v. Harrow, won. Harrow scored 155 and Charterhouse 165 for five.
- v. Westminster, won by 97 runs. Charterhouse scored 258 and Westminster 163.
- v. Wellington, won. Wellington scored 137 and Charterhouse 143 for seven.

The other wins were against A.S.C., Coldstream Guards, Grenadier Guards, 3rd London Regiment, and Rifle Brigade—this last a most exciting game—the Rifle Brigade got 194 and Charterhouse, after being in a most critical condition just got the runs with one wicket in hand.

The eleven of 1917 indeed at Charterhouse will be remembered as the best Charterhouse side for many years past, and possibly one of the best the school has had, and no small measure of success was due to the captain, H. N. Vincent. His keenness, his judgment, and his determination turned what looked like becoming only a fairly good side into a very good one. His wicket-keeping has been spoken of before and, in addition, he is a persistent batsman, who is harder to get out than he looks.

In batting there was a good mixture of sound players and hitters, with T. H. P. Beeching, who ended up with the great record of 490 runs

and an average of 81.06, as the most brilliant. He has many strokes and he hits the short balls with tremendous power. His defence wants a little strengthening. Bechings's innings against Harrow, Westminster, and Wellington at critical times went far towards winning the matches. F. B. Thomas got 287 runs with an average of 35; and A. M. Stern, 222, average 24. Six averaged over 20, and that the side could all bat was shown in the Rifle Brigade match, when the last four wickets put on 20 or 30 runs each at a critical time. The brunt of the bowling was borne by W. T. Wooldridge and P. W. Rucker, a fine pair of school bowlers, and what is more a foil to each other. Wooldridge is fast medium with, as a whole, a good command of length, and a swerve; and Rucker, medium left, with a nice easy action. Their records were: Wooldridge, 33 wickets at a cost of 11.1, Rucker 31 wickets at a cost of 11.8. This is wonderfully good, especially as I am told Mounsey, the well-known professional at Charterhouse, though with a much diminished staff, managed to keep the school wicket (and what a wicket it is!) up to its old standard as well as those of the other grounds. Perhaps there was not quite enough change bowling, but the fielding was excellent. Altogether Charterhouse had a splendid season.

*Westminster*, the time-honoured opponents of Charterhouse, were without being anything out of the way quite a useful side—and they were more highly tested than most, for they certainly had one or two really strong sides against them. N. P. Andrews (the captain), C. E. Stones, and others did valuable work for the side.

*Rugby* have had a succession of good school sides, and this year's, though not so good as its predecessor, was more than useful. In McCarthy (the captain), and a good captain too, and Rotherham, Rugby had two school-boy cricketers above the average. Of Rotherham's bowling I have spoken before. He is also a dangerous batsman, if not altogether sound, and a fine field. McCarthy is a good, sound batsman, and also a first-rate field, and he can bowl leg breaks. Of the others Cave, a left-handed bat, is very useful, and can hit hard. Outside school matches the only side of any strength that Rugby met was the M.C.C., when the school batting collapsed. Rugby beat Uppingham in a one-day match, and Malvern and Marlborough. They have not lost a school match since 1914—a pretty good record as they meet several schools each year.

*Marlborough* were a very good match-playing school side, and they had as they deserved, a successful year. In school matches they had an easy win over Wellington. They came near to defeating Winchester and beat Cheltenham after a thoroughly good match. The game against their time-honoured opponents, Rugby, was absolutely spoiled by weather. It was made into a three-days' game and a finish was thus possible, but the conditions were really hardly fit for cricket during

part of the time. Marlborough who during both Rugby innings had to bowl and field with a soppy wet ball for a great part of the time, had the worst of it. Eventually Rugby won by four wickets. Perhaps fielding was the feature of the Marlborough eleven this year: they were always good and sometimes brilliant. There was no outstanding batsman, but the side could bat all the way down and several times the body and tail of the side got the side out of difficulties. The bowling depended largely on J. Elmhirst and C. H. Skerret-Rogers, who are both good performers. Elmhirst is a googly bowler and it is not easy to distinguish which way he is going to come. Skerret-Rogers bowls left hand with a good high action, and he has a puzzling flight. E. J. Waldegrave kept wicket soundly on all occasions and sometimes was really good, and he captained the side with energy and judgment.

*Cheltenham* played seven matches, of which four were won, one drawn, and two lost. In school matches they played Malvern twice, losing and winning one, and, as I have before said, they were defeated by Marlborough. In the first Marlborough innings of 62, G. O. Shelmerdine secured eight wickets for 27. Cheltenham obtained a lead of 25 and Marlborough in their second innings scored 162, to which Cheltenham replied with 91, thus losing by 40 odd runs. G. O. Shelmerdine (the captain) was the cricketer of the side. He headed both the batting and bowling averages. The former with 43 and 263 runs; the latter with 23 wickets at an average of 8.86. He is a good boy batsman, and though his action is a little unprepossessing, he certainly bowled well at times. He with six others of the side, Kilgour, Haslett, Walsh, Adams, Aplin, and Sands will probably be at Cheltenham next year, so that the outlook is promising. The chief weakness of the side this year was the dearth of really good bowling, while the batting, except Shelmerdine, was uneven.

*Clifton* had a good season. I am told that in ordinary "pre-war" days, with the usual practice, they would have been a very useful side, and in A. F. Bickmore they had one of the best school batsmen of the year; one was sorry that he failed in both innings at Lord's. Owing to various reasons they played only one school match, Tonbridge, which was spoiled by rain, the rest of the opposition being provided chiefly by soldier teams. The M.C.C. in a two-day match beat Clifton by nine wickets. A good win in the early part of the year against a strong soldier team from Minchinhampton gave Clifton plenty of confidence. In the return match the military had ample revenge. These were the two best matches of the term. Of Bickmore, I hear from a cricketer who has played and seen as much first-class cricket as most, that he might easily reach a high rung on the ladder of cricket fame. He has all the natural endowments for a

fine batsman. He was the mainstay of the side, and got runs pretty consistently, and he also captained with judgment. The fielding—especially the ground fielding—reached a high standard, which is always pleasant hearing.

*Haileybury* must be considered unlucky for they kept on losing school matches by small margins, e.g., Dulwich 174 to Haileybury's 167; St. Paul's 155 to Haileybury's 143; Wellington 252 against Haileybury's 236. The Uppingham match was a draw. The Masters also beat the School by one run. In W. J. Malden (the captain) Haileybury had one really good batsman who was also a fine field. Indeed perhaps the best part of the School's cricket was the fielding. The bowling lacked variety and too many of the batsmen were very early tempted to "have a go." Of Brooks' wicket-keeping we have spoken before. E. V. H. Hudson is expected to be captain next year, and H. D. Rankin and H. P. Marshall will also be at Haileybury. In batting Malden averaged 47, getting 284 runs in seven innings, and L. S. P. Maurice, 36, getting 398 runs in twelve innings. Marshall scored 63 against Wellington the first time he played in the eleven.

From *Malvern* I hear that the eleven were a young and inexperienced lot, who did not get going until July, and they only had a few matches—five—in which to show their form. These were all against schools and after losing the first three, the last two were won. They had an excellent pair of fast bowlers in L. E. Partridge and M. K. Franks, comparable, it is said, in the "Malvernian" to any pair of Malvern school bowlers of the past twenty years. Indeed, the bowling of these two was the chief feature of the cricket. The weaknesses were a lack of change bowling and a largish tail to the batting. Partridge should become a really fine cricketer. His batting suffered this year from his having to do so much bowling, but potentially he is a very fine player indeed. J. D. Southern, who captained the side is an attractive batsman and played some excellent innings. At Cheltenham, Malvern declared in the third innings, giving Cheltenham the sporting chance of making 108 in an hour and a quarter, which they did with three balls to spare. In the return match Malvern won by nine wickets. Rugby beat Malvern by 100 runs, 272 and 282 against 113 and 274. Partridge for Malvern, in the second innings, bowled exceptionally well, getting nine wickets for 85 in 24 overs. Shrewsbury won a close match by three wickets, 147 and 148 for seven. The Repton and Malvern is always one of the keenest of school matches, and in this, played at Repton on June 28 and 29, Malvern were victorious—Malvern made 210 and 199 for five (declared) and Repton 122 and 98. For Malvern, Partridge and Franks bowled unchanged.

*Repton* lost their first match to a soldier side by one run: then won five in succession, including Uppingham, where Repton got the 183 wanted to win in the fourth innings for the loss of five wickets—a good performance. The eleven of 1917 could not be compared with the great Repton elevens of the past. R. E. H. Holdsworth (captain) was a good bat, but rather nervous; and B. O. Byass, captain for 1918, is most promising. He was unlucky all the year. A young bowler, K. W. C. Dobson, who bowls fastish, might be useful in the future. In all three school matches Repton lost the toss, and against Malvern—their ancient foes—they had all the worst of the wicket: Repton had to bowl with a wet ball and bat on a sticky wicket.

Turning to *Shrewsbury* we find that they had an unbeaten record in school matches, and must be put down as one of the sides of the year. The results were:—

At Uppingham, v. Uppingham. Won by ten wickets. Uppingham, 118 and 158; Shrewsbury, 258 and 22 for no wicket.

At Malvern, v. Malvern. Won by three wickets. Malvern, 147; Shrewsbury, 148 for seven.

At Shrewsbury, v. Rossall. Won by an innings and 10 runs. Rossall, 52 and 46; Shrewsbury, 108. In the two innings H. P. Miles took ten wickets for 38

At Repton, v. Repton Won by an innings and 61 runs. Shrewsbury, 266; Repton, 97 and 108

Just as in the case of Charterhouse, so Shrewsbury owed a lot to their captain, who was also their wicket-keeper, H. P. Ward; and their first pair of bowlers, H. P. Miles and H. D. Badger. Ward is a good batsman as well as a good wicket-keep, and he was a great asset to the side, both as player and captain. Miles developed into a valuable medium-paced bowler, and was ably seconded by Badger, who is fast. The former, in the term, got 34 wickets at a cost of 7.7 runs, and Badger 20 for 8.2. G. C. McFerren, A. M. Gamble, and R. S. Auden were the changes. In batting five of the side averaged over 20: Gamble, who got runs most consistently (42.0), Ward (31), E. R. Bowring, T. L. Twidell, and Miles. The fielding was somewhat variable—here and there brilliant, occasionally wanting in smartness. The catching on the whole was dependable.

*Uppingham* did not have a very successful season winning only one of their seven matches and losing four, while two were drawn. Three school matches v. Repton, Shrewsbury and Rugby were lost, and that v. Haileybury was a draw.

The outstanding feature of the season was the batting of A. P. F. Chapman, a punishing left-handed player who scores freely all round the wicket. He did not find his form at first, but his last

five innings were 66, 206, 160, 81 and 114. In four of these he was not out, and the remaining innings—the 81—he was run out. He finished up with an average as follows:—10 innings 668 runs, four times not out, average 111.33. No doubt this must be a record for the school, though one recalls that both C. E. M. Wilson and T. L. Taylor had great records there just over 20 years ago. S. R. Gresham, who was an energetic captain, and I. Christopherson played one good innings each, but the rest of the batting was weak. The brunt of the bowling fell on Gresham. R. F. McBride shows good promise for the future, and Chapman has the makings of a slow left-hand bowler. The fielding on the whole was good.

Though *Bradfield* had lost Fawcus and O'Brien of their 1916 team—one of the strongest the school had had—they were by no means weak in 1917, and they had every right to be proud of a victory over Wellington. Kenyon-Slaney, the captain, and Sorensen were both useful cricketers, and G. H. Mower, who bowls left-handed with a beautiful action and who is still very young, shows great promise.

*St. Paul's* did very well. They played nine matches, of which only the first was lost. Six were won and the two others drawn. The wins included both the school matches—that against Haileybury, which was won by a narrow margin, and against Dulwich. In this game *St. Paul's* scored 322 for 7, of which C. H. Pearson got 144, and Dulwich scored 143. *St. Paul's* also beat the R.M.A. at Woolwich. L. L. Rutter, the captain, kept wicket well all the year, but he failed to find his real batting form. C. H. Pearson easily headed the batting averages with 396 runs, average 44. The two brothers Atkinson did useful service all round. L. A. Trace bowled well early in the year, and W. T. Bruce (fast) improved as the season went on. His analysis in the end worked out at 22 wickets at a cost of 6.55 each. In one match against the Grenadiers at Lord's he got seven for six, taking four wickets in four balls. B. G. W. Atkinson will be captain in 1918, and four or five of the 1917 side are expected to be still at *St. Paul's*, including Bruce, C. E. Abelson, a useful left-hand bat, and J. H. Huntley, who is also very promising.

*Cranleigh* had beside Calder another good cricketer in J. G. Reid, who got no less than three centuries, including 124 against the M.C.C. He is a powerfully built boy, with tremendous driving power, and he executes his big drives with a perfectly straight bat. His defence, though not quite sound, has very much improved.

Of the Scotch Schools I have not much information, but I hear that Edinburgh Academy, though very young (averaging well under 17) were a good side. They beat Glenalmond, Watson's, Merchiston, and Loretto, but lost to Fettes. One of the main strengths of the

side lay in F. S. Paterson's bowling. He bowls slow leg-breaks varied by a fast ball and a genuine googly. He was one of the best bowlers the school has ever had.

I regret that space does not allow me to give an account of the cricket of several other schools. In conclusion I think that as a whole the bowling this season was above the average, as was the wicket-keeping. The best side of public school boys for the year would be a very difficult one to select. Probably most people would be agreed over the first six or seven, and would differ largely over the last three or four.

I must once more thank masters and others who have so kindly taken the trouble to supply information about the school sides, without which this article would be of little value.

HARROW v. ETON.

Played at HARROW, Tuesday, June 26.—Much the stronger eleven, Eton beat Harrow in decisive fashion, having won the match by 86 runs when they declared with six wickets in hand. It was unfortunate for Harrow that the side, after losing to Winchester and Charterhouse in the latter part of the previous week, should so soon again have been called upon to fulfil an important fixture. In the circumstances the Harrovians might well have lacked confidence, and so brief an interval between the visit to Godalming and this match with Eton did not permit of judicious consideration being given to the strengthening of the team. Sent in to bat, Harrow up to a point made a fair fight, but in the later stages of the game their weak bowling met with merciful punishment. Davis and Dalal acquitted themselves creditably, and thanks to Bennett and Stevenson-Moore, who put on 48 runs in resolute fashion, the outlook for the home side appeared quite hopeful when the hundred went up with only four wickets down. Only moderate opposition to the Eton attack was offered afterwards, and the innings closed for 154. Gibson bowled very steadily and although Hoare failed, Wilson, a slow bowler, and Shirley who has appreciable pace, did useful work. The Eton fielding was admirable.

Despite the rather tame batting which had characterised the latter part of their innings, Harrow had good reason to be pleased when, on Eton going in, two wickets fell for 23 runs, and they had prospects of making a close struggle on the dismissal of Scott-Chad at 51. Already, however, Wilson had made some fine hits and joined by Barker, a left-hander, he proceeded in most determined fashion to knock the Harrow bowlers off their length. So hard did he drive, and so effectively did he get the ball away on the leg-side that within a very few minutes the victory of Eton was practically assured. The score had reached 131 when rain caused a brief interruption, and it stood at 147 when a smart catch at point sent back Wilson, whose finely hit, if not particularly stylish, 80 included fourteen 4's. Badly knocked about as it had been by Wilson, the Harrow bowling, on Brocklebank joining Barker, met with even more severe treatment. Barker, who had previously batted with some restraint, played with refreshing freedom, and Brocklebank opened his shoulders to much purpose, among his strokes being two in front of square leg for 6. At a great pace 93 runs were added, and then Wilkinson declared. So fierce had been the hitting latterly that Eton's 240 runs were obtained in two hours and twenty minutes—a really big achievement in view of the moderate measure of success attending the early batmen. Following upon the closure of Eton's innings, rain set in, and prevented any further cricket.

## WINCHESTER v. ETON.

Played at WINCHESTER, Saturday, June 30.—This was a truly memorable struggle in which Firth accomplished the remarkable performance of taking all ten wickets in the first innings of Eton for 41 runs and yet Eton snatched a victory by seven runs. Firth's achievement—a record in Winchester cricket—followed within nine days of a striking success in the match at Harrow, where he obtained eight wickets in an innings for 48 runs. Again this young bowler sent down his leg-breaks with great accuracy of pitch and varied his pace and flight in puzzling fashion. Winchester, to begin with, fared so well—the Eton fielding being somewhat at fault—that the score reached 85 before the fourth wicket fell. Then came such a startling collapse that the other six wickets fell for the addition of seven runs. Hoare had the chief hand in this summary termination of the Winchester innings, as on going on a second time he secured four wickets for nine runs. The Eton batsmen were speedily in trouble with Firth's bowling. Wilson had a life given him directly he arrived, but despite some resolute batting by him and by Brocklebank and Barker, the score, with seven wickets down was only 65. Gibson, hitting out, carried the total to 89—only four to win—but three runs were still required when the last man came in, a lucky snick at this critical point placing Eton in front. Winchester, at their second attempt, tried to force the game, but found run-getting very difficult against steady bowling by Gibson and smart fielding. Out of the 71 Eton were set to make no fewer than 58 had been obtained when stumps were pulled up, Wilson hitting with great vigour, and Scott-Chad batting freely. The last innings, however, was not taken very seriously.

**LORD'S SCHOOLS v. THE REST.**

Played at LORD'S, Monday, Tuesday, August 6, 7.—A most dramatic struggle was this, the Rest who at one point, with only four wickets to fall, wanted 52 runs to escape a single innings defeat, gaining a memorable victory by 17 runs. Indeed from start to finish the fortunes of the game varied in most sensational fashion. Curiously enough, too, a match could scarcely have been entered upon under less promising conditions. So much rain had fallen that play before lunch was out of the question, the state of the ground indeed being such that not until within a little while of the start was the pitch marked out, and the grass mown for a small space round the wickets. The grass being very long all over the remainder of the field, the ball, of course, did not travel any distance, with the result that many a stroke, which in ordinary circumstances would have sent it to the boundary, yielded no more than a single. On the drying wicket, Gibson and Rotherham for a time carried all before them. Despite the exercise of much care the Rest batsmen failed one after another until at the end of an hour six of them were out and the score stood at 17. Wyatt-Smith stayed a little while with Stevens, and caused the bowling to be changed, but the only stand of note was one by Symons and Vincent, who carried the total from 25 to 52. Gibson resuming then speedily finished off the innings. Gibson bowled superbly, not only swerving a lot on to the wicket but keeping a splendid length. Off 15 overs and 5 balls he sent down only 13 runs were hit and he took seven wickets. There was a disastrous start to the Lord's Schools' innings, three wickets falling for a single run, and the fourth going down at 11. Stumps were drawn with the score at 18, the Rest notwithstanding that they had been dismissed for 60, holding rather the stronger position.

Next morning in consequence of a heavy dew the wicket at first was appreciably easier and the field having been mown to a greater extent than on the previous day, batsmen found themselves less handicapped. Of the improved conditions, Shirley and Malden took full advantage, settling down and playing so well that the Rest total was passed with six wickets in hand. Altogether an admirable partnership yielded 66 runs, the total being up to 77 before Shirley was dismissed. Very strong on the leg side, Malden continued to bat in fine effective fashion for some time longer and in the end the total reached 134.

Seventy-four runs in arrear, the Rest commenced their innings and again failed so completely against Gibson and Rotherham that the score with six wickets down was only 22. The match, of course, looked as good as over, but again Symons came to the rescue of his side, and this time to great purpose. He had a capital partner in Stevens, and the two batsmen put on 46 runs. Joined by Vincent, who again displayed coolness and skill, Symons hit out in powerful fashion. Without displaying any particular grace of style, he forced the game in resolute fashion, and rarely was his judgment at fault. Butler tried various changes of bowling but without effect, and Gibson going on again lost his length somewhat. Altogether the partnership yielded 70 runs. Eighth out at 138, Symons had hit up 72 out of 116, among his strokes being nine 4's and five 3's.

Despite Symons' spirited effort, the Lord's Schools had only 78 to make to win, and the chances were all in favour of the task being accomplished. Thirteen runs came before Firth met with any success, but then that bowler wrought such a transformation, not only getting on a fine leg break, but keeping a remarkable accuracy of pitch, that there were six wickets down for 25. Butler tried hard to knock Firth off his length, and Dalal batted steadily but, with Stevens bowling skilfully at the other end, and both bowlers brilliantly supported in the field, the Rest maintained the advantage Firth's splendid work had given them and won a great match by 17 runs. While Stevens rendered his side admirable service, the great triumph was that of Firth, who not only took seven wickets for 27 runs, but time after time beat the opposing batsman. Firth's triumph was the more notable as it followed upon brilliant achievements in Winchester's two great school fixtures. On both sides the fielding reached a high standard of excellence, and, if Brooks appeared the more stylish wicket-keeper, no fault could be found with the work of Vincent
