

PUBLIC SCHOOL CRICKET IN 1920.

It may be safely said that records have not shown many seasons when the weather has been more unkind than 1920 to Public School Cricket. It was a year to be compared with 1879 or 1903, and it was at its worst in July when so many public school matches are played. The week at the end of the term and the beginning of Bank Holiday week, when Lord's was the scene of five school matches, was as bad as any.

We cannot have great years of public school cricket each season, and 1920 must as a whole be put down as below the average, and so far as individuals are concerned, very much below the great year which preceded it. There were also few outstanding sides. Wellington had the strongest eleven which they had put into the field for many a year, and Winchester, without being brilliant, were a good serviceable eleven, and were very successful in school matches, beating Eton, which to them is the all important thing of the season, Harrow, Marlborough and Charterhouse. Tonbridge were a good batting side but their bowling was rather weak.

In watching the school matches at Lord's there were two points which struck one. First, that several of the Marlborough eleven, when batting, waited to receive the ball with their bats held quite high in the air. It was not just the lifting of the bat off the ground as shown, and so truly shown in the picture of the Champion in the pavilion at Lord's. The method entailed the raising of the bat almost shoulder high, and so many of the Marlborough eleven did it that it obviously was "malice prepense." The idea is no doubt that of being "ready," an admirable precept at all ball games, but it certainly did not meet with the approval of a number of the critics.

The second point was that the Tonbridge eleven in their match against Clifton at Lord's did not all wear caps of the same colours. The majority of the eleven wore the first eleven cap, but some of the side including the captain and second captain wore the second eleven cap, which struck one as a rather extraordinary proceeding to those conversant with the customs in most Public School Matches.

The Match between the two selected elevens of schoolboys at Lord's increases in popularity each year, though one was a little surprised that there was not rather a larger crowd present. Mr. F. E.

Lacey had, as usual, spared no pains to get the best possible elevens and had had able advice from several experts, including Mr. W. Findlay, Major E. G. Wynyard (who had helped with the schoolboys' coaching in the Easter holidays), Mr. W. G. Druce and others. The sides were:—

Lord's Schools :—W. Hill-Wood, (captain), the Hon. D. F. Brand and W. L. Hill (Eton), C. T. Bennett (Harrow), P. F. Saunders and H. W. Standring (Rugby), C. M. Skerret-Rogers (Marlborough), E. F. Pye-Smith (Cheltenham) F. de L. Solbé and C. H. Knott (Tonbridge) and W. L. Phillips (Haileybury).

The Rest :—C. T. Ashton and T. B. Raikes (Winchester), G. J. Bryan (Wellington) E. P. Hewetson (Shrewsbury) W. T. V. Tomlinson (Felsted), C. G. Robson (Malvern), A. E. Cross (Cranleigh), A. L. Hilder, (Lancing), J. A. C. Thornton (Uppingham), F. H. Barnard (Charterhouse), and L. A. Percival (Westminster).

Hill-Wood, Saunders, Skerret-Rogers, Pye-Smith, Solbé, Phillips, Ashton, Tomlinson, Thornton, Hilder and Barnard were captains of their school elevens.

The match was played in wretched weather and eventually ended in a draw. The Rest batted first and made 101, Bryan, whose batting created a most favourable impression and Percival, who played steadily, making nearly half the runs between them. The Lord's Schools failed badly against Hewetson's fast bowling, varied by slow ones and his nine wickets for 33 was the best performance in the match. In the second innings the Rest declared at 96 for seven wickets, and then got six of their opponents out for 94.

The selected side to play the Army on the next two days were as follows:—Hill-Wood, Bryan, Ashton, Percival, Barnard, Pye-Smith, Brand, Knott, Hewetson, Strandring and Hill. They never recovered from a bad start against the fast bowling of Captain M. B. Burrows, who was mainly responsible for getting them out for 65. The Army who had a very strong side scored 285 and though Hill-Wood, Bryan and Ashton all made good scores for the Schools in their second innings, the Army were left with only 31 to win, which they got without the loss of a wicket.

In the matches between Eton, Winchester, and Harrow, Winchester on results proved themselves to be, and undoubtedly were, the best side with Eton second, and Harrow the weakest of the three. Winchester led off by beating Harrow most decisively on Sixth Form Ground,—after being put in to bat by their opponents. More than once have I referred in "Wisden" to this fetish which developed in the Eton and Harrow matches of the early years of this century when after the side who batted second had won the match several times, it became the fashion to think it lucky to lose

the toss and even go so far as to putting the other side in. This policy in recent years has more than once led to disaster, and this example of it this summer will probably put a stopper on it.

Winchester ran up a large score against some really weak bowling by Harrow, their length being too bad for words, declared and then Harrow collapsed, Raikes being the most successful of the bowlers. It is a pity that the match is only a one day game, and a short one at that. Two long journeys on the same day and an early start cannot be conducive to good cricket and with only about five hours play available, unless one side or the other is considerably the stronger there are bound to be drawn games in most years.

The first day of Eton and Winchester was a great struggle and an intensely interesting day's cricket. Winchester batted first on a good wicket on Riddings Field, Winchester, and after a most promising start a collapse set in. Allen bowled splendidly by getting nine wickets and the side were out for what was in the circumstances a very poor score. But Eton did much the same thing and there was nothing in it on the the first innings. Winchester went in again that day and after a good start, when 50 went up for no wicket, four fell in a few minutes before the end of play and Eton were on terms again. Next morning Ashton played a fine innings for his side and got good support especially from Thesiger who, though suffering severely from an injury, batted with the greatest pluck and determination. He was obviously in some pain and he could not make some of his strokes properly, but he showed much resolution and his innings was as good as anything in the match. In the end Winchester gave their opponents well over 200 to get, which the latter never looked like doing.

Winchester perhaps were not so strong as in 1919, but they may be put down as a good schoolboy side. In C. T. Ashton, the third brother of the family to be captain of the school, they had the best all-round schoolboy of the year. He is an attractive bat, quick on his feet and with plenty of strokes, and he had a successful season. As a bowler he is fast medium with a considerable control of length, and he often makes the ball swing late. He is a fine field in any position and one certainly expects to hear of him doing well at Cambridge where he is now in residence. Indeed it is quite possible that we shall see the three brothers playing together for their University in the coming season. Frazer, who was second captain, had been one of the mainstays in bowling in 1919, but he unaccountably lost all his form in this direction, and indeed, after early in the term he hardly bowled at all. As compensation his batting improved out of all knowledge, and he developed into a dangerous hitter. In addition there was a good deal of batting on the side. D. A. W. Thesiger was an attractive player with plenty of strokes, and Guise who got 100 against Harrow is most promising. T. B.

Raikes also medium to fast-medium shared the brunt of the bowling with Ashton. He has considerable command of length and variation of pace, and he too swings awkwardly. Huband was quite one of the best wicket-keepers in the schools this year.

The *Eton* eleven did not fulfil the forecast that they would have a first rate side, but they did some good performances. Hill-Wood, their captain, of whose bowling so much had been hoped, fell off in this respect. His big breaks lost their pace off the pitch, though he did fairly well with his off-break toward the end of the year. Still we undoubtedly think that as a batsman he will do best in future. His position at the wicket is ungainly, but he has strong defence and some good scoring shots. G. O. Allen has a beautiful action for a fast bowler, but he was hampered by a strained back. He is also a most useful batsman. The Hon. D. F. Brand, captain in the coming year, was the most attractive batsman of the side with some of the typical *Eton* style of the Mitchell era. He was also a valuable right-handed fast-medium bowler. R. Aird was perhaps the soundest batsman on the side and he should be really good this year. Another who was dangerous was J. P. Dewhurst, a left-hander. Hill was chosen as the wicket keeper for the Lord's Schools and bore out the high reputation he had gained at *Eton*.

Harrow, considering their possibilities, had a most disappointing season. Reference has already been made to their initial blunder in putting Winchester in and losing that match in the first half hour. Throughout their matches, batsmen and bowlers alike batted and bowled in the wrong spirit. A batsman should remember how difficult he finds it, when bowling himself, to get anyone else out and a bowler should take heart from the many low scores he has been got out for. Many of the Harrow batsmen, crediting the bowlers opposed to them with a subtlety and command over the ball which they did not possess, were "out before they were in." Against *Eton* they were faced by the bogey that had been haunting them for a year,—W. W. Hill-Wood in the flesh. There was some excuse for them. They batted on a slow wicket after a series of hard ones, and Hill-Wood is just the type of bowler to worry any school side in a big school match. And the start of the game seemed to indicate that Fate was against Harrow. It was sheer hard luck that H. J. Enthoven was caught off a fine hit for naught. He caught full hold of a full pitch on his legs—the ball was never a foot off the ground—and G. K. Cox at short leg caught a catch which even A. O. Jones might have been forgiven for missing. After that, everything went wrong for Harrow. L. G. Crawley, a dangerous, if not a quite sound, forcing batsman, made a few good strokes, and I. G. Collins and Stewart Brown made a useful stand for the ninth wicket. But the side were out for 85, a miserable score on a wicket, which, had two

good batsmen got set, would have proved easy. Eton did not play up to the Eton reputation at Lord's, and in spite of a really good 26 by Hill-Wood, seven wickets were down for 88. Mayo and Cox, however, put on 38 for the last wicket and Harrow started their second innings 56 behind. Bennett played good cricket from the start, while Enthoven was content to keep up to an end. Thirty-nine was up before Enthoven was really well stumped by Hill—a wicket-keeper of great possibilities. Bennett continued to play a great game, in spite of the heart-breaking exhibition given by the other batsmen on whom he relied. A magnificent last wicket stand of 60 between F. O. G. Lloyd, who hit with rare discretion, and I. G. Collins, who showed imperturbable defence, made a sporting finish possible. Lloyd, however, after bowling well to start with and getting a wicket, was so tired out that he had to be taken off. Hill-Wood batted brilliantly in the second innings, treating the bowling with such contempt that it soon became contemptible. Aird played a quiet game for a time, but towards the end made some beautiful strokes and scored at a great pace.

M. C. Kemp, the famous Harrow, Oxford and Kent cricketer, now in his 60th year, has turned over the coaching at Harrow to M. C. Bird, the old Harrovian, who made two separate hundreds against Eton in the same match. M. C. Kemp "carried on" in most trying circumstances, and with little assistance all through the War. A keener cricketer than "the Bishop," either as a player or as a teacher, has never lived. Though Harrow cricket has been disappointing of late years, his optimism, precept and example have never flagged. The disappointing eleven of last year should grow into very nearly the strongest Public School side this. It is a pity that M. C. Kemp should not have the full credit of the building, of which he has laid the foundations and built the first storey. He has kept on, however, "just one more year," at the urgent request of old Harrovians, until the strain has become too great. M. C. Bird will have good material to handle from the start and Harrovians should be able to look forward this year, and we hope for some years to come, to the Lord's match with delight in place of dread.

Charterhouse were very weak. They had one "class" cricketer in F. H. Barnard, who will captain the school again in 1921. R. W. Quayle, a fair medium-pace, right-hand bowler, who did a really good performance in getting eight wickets for 79 against Winchester, was overworked towards the end of the season. O. Ingram, a left-hand bowler, was useful at times. I. A. W. Gilliat was not so successful either in batting or wicket-keeping as he should have been; he has got into the bad habit of drawing back too far from the wicket, when taking the ball. Barnard had to make runs always and did so almost to the end; with proper support he would have made heaps

more. He made 12 and 38 for "the Rest" against "Lord's" Schools, and was picked for the Public Schools against the Army. In this match, however, he failed to come off. Barnard, Gilliat, P. M. Anderson, J. M. McGuffie, and C. G. Varlor will be at Charterhouse this year. S. A. Morse, R. W. Quayle, and L. H. Smith have gone up to Cambridge.

The best performance Charterhouse did in the year was against Winchester. They should, certainly, having won the toss, have made more than 151, all the batting being weak with the exception of F. H. Barnard, who played a truly great innings of 76 not out, and P. M. Anderson, who made 25. Winchester had 100 up for only two wickets, but after C. T. Ashton was out, Charterhouse always had a sporting chance, and, had they held all the chances given in the innings, they would probably have won the match. They had a great match against Westminster, also. Westminster batted first and made 267. They did none too well at the start and seven wickets were down rather cheaply. F. D. Berryman and C. C. Haine, however, added over 100 for the eighth wicket, both playing good, sporting cricket. Charterhouse started badly, Barnard for once, failing. I. A. W. Gilliat played a great innings for the side, however, punishing the loose ones, running short runs and bagging the bowling. O. Ingram kept up his end and at the finish Charterhouse were 15 runs behind with one wicket to go. Gilliat made 94 not out, and thoroughly deserved his hundred. Against Harrow, Charterhouse had a poor game. They could only total 160, a good stand by J. M. McGuffie and R. W. Quayle redeeming what would otherwise have been an ignominious performance. Their bowling was collared from the start by C. T. Bennett and H. J. Enthoven, both of whom played confident cricket, and Harrow won very easily. Against the strong Wellington side, at Wellington, Charterhouse had a terrible match, J. D. G. Chaytor and E. S. de Brett got them out for 37, Chaytor taking four wickets for eight runs, and de Brett six for 27. In reply Wellington made 171 for two wickets, G. J. Bryan scoring 101 not out.

Wellington were, perhaps, the strongest Public School side of the year. They won all their School matches, and only lost one match out of nine. G. J. Bryan showed himself a really wonderful batsman throughout the year. In School matches he scored 108 v. Bradfield College at Bradfield; 148 not out v. Westminster at Vincent Square; 147 v. Haileybury College at Haileybury; 101 not out v. Charterhouse at Wellington. During the season his average for the school was as follows:—eight innings; times not out two; highest score 148 not out; number of runs 699; average 116.5. Besides his centuries in School matches, Bryan made yet another, against the Free Foresters. He crowned his season with glory when playing for Kent in the holidays.

P. N. Durlacher also batted well, his best score being 124 against Haileybury, when he and Bryan put on 258 for the first wicket. R. A. K. Sangster, C. E. Dixon and W. S. Bristowe were also to be depended upon. The bowling at first showed signs of being the weak point, but towards the end it exceeded all expectations. J. D. G. Chaytor was the most consistent and took twenty-two wickets for an average of 13.1. R. H. Hamilton-Wickes, who has since got his Rugby Football Blue at Cambridge, took twenty-two wickets for 14.5 and E. S. de Brett twenty-six for 14.9. The actual head of the bowling analysis, however, was Bryan, who took ten wickets with an average of 4.7. Against the Lord's Schools Bryan got four wickets for twelve runs in the second innings.

Wellington beat Bradfield College, who were weak, very easily by an innings. Against Westminster they declared with 286 for three wickets, and got their opponents out for 208, H. F. Gorman and C. H. Taylor being the only two batsmen to play the bowling with any confidence. Wellington utilised nine bowlers in this innings. Wellington batted first against Haileybury, at Haileybury, and made the big score of 409. Against this Haileybury could only score 158, of which C. A. Bickmore made 43 and V. A. Arnold 38 not out, in their first innings, and, after a good first wicket stand by W. L. Philips and R. E. H. Hudson, 167 in their second. The match with Charterhouse has been referred to above. Marlborough succeeded in getting Wellington out for 198. Bryan and Durlacher again gave the side a promising start, Bryan making 25 and Durlacher 31. C. E. Dixon made 55, his highest score of the year, and just when it was wanted, and E. J. Mordaunt played a most useful 31. Marlborough played most disappointing cricket, and were all out, on a good hard wicket for 77. Probably it was the pace of the wicket after playing on slow wickets which upset them. They started fairly, if not brilliantly, but a rot set in and the last five wickets fell for one run. Bryan took the last three wickets for 0.

The *Rugby and Marlborough* match, which is the match of their year, was disappointing to both sides. Neither Rugby nor Marlborough played up to their abilities, though this may seem a harsh criticism on Rugby, considering how the game finished. Marlborough won the toss, and on a slow easy wicket made 93 for one wicket on the first day, when rain put a stop to play. On the second day G. L. Ebbels played fine cricket, and while he and G. H. Seeley were together it looked as if Rugby's only chance was a creditable draw. Seeley, however, was out to a weak stroke and Ebbels was bowled by a real good ball. The rest collapsed for no particular reason : they just got out, and the innings closed for 180, a sad ending to an innings in which 100 runs were up for one wicket. Rugby lost one wicket for five runs, but after that P. F. Saunders batted really well, hitting the bad ones without mercy and showing

good footwork. After he left Rugby failed up to a point as Marlborough had failed, eight wickets being down for 179 runs. Then Woodhouse, Bourne, and Thompson played brave cricket, and between them added 54 runs. It was not, as it happened, to be as wonderful in effect as the batting of the Eton tail in 'Fowler's year.' But, had it not been for the pluckiest of innings by W. F. Spreckley, backed up by J. Young and G. E. Tatchell, who kept up their ends like heroes, Rugby would have won a sensational—if disappointing—match. As it was Rugby had one over in which to get 23 runs. They got 14 of them, which made a sporting finish to the match. For Rugby, H. W. Standring came out with the exceptional bowling analysis for the match of 37 overs, 14 maidens, 66 runs, and eight wickets.

Marlborough were an unreliable side, several of them were quite good bats and capable of making plenty of runs, but lack of experience and of cricket temperament led to their downfall on several of the most important occasions. Sheppard, who had damaged himself, and was unable to play until half term had the best temperament, and was difficult to dislodge. Haslehurst had some beautiful shots but was incapable of leaving anything alone and suffered for it. Skerrett-Rogers captained the team well on the whole, though he probably did not bowl Oakley enough.

From *Rugby* I have unfortunately but little information. In *Saunders* probably, they had one of the best school batsmen of the year, and in *Standring* a valuable fast-medium bowler who could also bat.

Clifton were so badly handicapped by rain, that the side, a very young one, never really 'found itself.' Matches against *Rugby* and *Cheltenham* had to be cancelled owing to illness at these Schools. A one-day match against *Marlborough* ended in a draw in the latter's favour, though at one time *Clifton* were in quite a good position. Against *Downside*, *Clifton* had the misfortune to lose the toss, and when they went in against a score of 200, *Clifton* had the clock as well as the bowlers to contend against. Given time, they should have won. *Tonbridge* beat them easily by nine wickets, the slow wicket not suiting the *Clifton* bowling, though *Craster* kept the runs down well.

Thomas started the season well, but seemed to lose confidence as the season went on ; his foot-work is still faulty, but with his eye and strength he should get plenty of runs in time. Lyons was the best all-round player on the side and should do very well indeed in 1921. He got water on the knee when just running into form both batting and bowling, did not rest himself long enough, and lost his best form. Bonham-Carter is an unorthodox player with many faults, but he has the great asset of not being

afraid to hit the ball, and, when in luck, he picks the right one and gets runs very quickly. Burton is a rustic cricketer with the heart of a lion and, as he is a fine cover-point he is a useful man on any side. Weeks and King are two others of the useful type who, with Burton, will be staying on till 1922, and King may be at Clifton in 1923. The School will have seven old choices for 1921, five of whom played in 1919. The bowling in 1920 was almost ruined by Lyons' accident. Meares, a slow right hand leg-break bowler, did very well to get seven wickets for 80 against Marlborough and also bowled well against Tonbridge in the first innings. He and Craster, a medium paced right-hander with a good Yorker which came a little faster than the ordinary ball, did most of the bowling for the side.

Cheltenham were a youngish side but they had some good cricket in them and it promises well for the future. Five old choices will be left next year and there are some good young players coming on. Both the school matches with Marlborough and Haileybury were drawn, the latter being quite ruined by rain. E. J. Pye-Smith the captain, who is now at Pembroke, Cambridge, was a strong and determined batsman. He got two centuries in the year, one of them against Haileybury at Lord's.

Repton had a stronger eleven than in 1919, though the results of their matches were equally disappointing. There were some good individual performances, but there was always a noticeable and pronounced failure to drive home a winning advantage, and the team gave the impression that the second day of a two days' match was of no importance. Uppingham were practically presented with an unexpected win after the game had been left in a level state overnight; a quite uncalled for change in the batting order led to a not unusual collapse, and the match was over by lunch time. At Malvern they had all the best of matters at one time, but Malvern played a good uphill game and saved the match.

Of individuals, C. A. Winter was the best and most consistent batsman and, with two more years at school, should become a player worthy of the best traditions of Repton Cricket. He received useful support from E. S. Wester, G. C. Buxton, and D. B. Sayer, from the last-named in school matches particularly. B. K. Trubshaw's failure reacted on the whole side and left too much to Winter. He had injured his knee at football, and this apparently affected his foot-work, which was altogether faulty. L. V. G. Barrow took nearly three times as many wickets as any other bowler, and at the moderate cost of 16.10 apiece; indeed, his figures are better than those of any Repton bowler of the last four years. He was apt, however, to be too easily disheartened and relied too much on three gallant short legs who were fortunate to get through the season

without injury. D. S. Penton was steady, though he had few chances on wickets that suited him. G. W. J. Winter, coming late into the side after early failures was perhaps the brainiest bowler of all. His thirteen wickets cost him under 10 runs apiece. The fielding at its best was of a high standard, though the need of a wicket-keeper was much felt; the brothers Winter were always admirable and the elder was worth his place as a cover-point alone. There is much good material left for 1921, and C. A. Winter, the new Captain is, from his own keenness and ability, capable of turning out a good eleven.

Malvern had a poor season and I can do nothing better than reproduce Mr. C. Toppin's notes on the eleven. "The Malvern eleven were, it must be confessed, a weak combination—possibly the weakest seen here for thirty years. There was a fair amount of talent, but it was seldom produced when it was wanted—the great test of cricket. C. G. W. Robson, the Captain, is potentially a fine batsman who plays in fine upstanding style—a true disciple of Malvern traditions—but he failed too often to reproduce his form. He just missed a double century against a weak Old Malvernian side, but his best performance was against Repton when he played the best innings of his career under very trying conditions of wicket and situation. Partridge made no big score, but he did some very creditable performances with the bat, and with his big break was out and away the best bowler on the side. Stubbs and Deed are very fairschool batsmen, and Abbott a useful performer, but the rest of the batting was weak. C. T. E. H. Tozer at the other end to Partridge was apt to be expensive, and the change bowling was indifferent. The fielding was very fair, and in Brown the School had a really efficient stumper. Altogether it was a disappointing season, not helped much by the dismal weather. Partridge only will be left for next year, but there are a lot of promising youngsters coming on, and I am hoping for a return of our old school form in the near future. The Repton match here was a fine game played in bad weather, of which Malvern had much the worst. C. G. W. Robson was picked for the Rest against the Lord's Schools, but made only 0 and 5 in the match and was not included in the Public School Eleven v. The Army. Robson had a batting average for the school of 37.1 and took 38 wickets for 16.1, a fine all-round performance.

Tonbridge had a good season in School matches, beating Clifton at Lord's, Westminster at Tonbridge, and playing an even draw with Lancing, at Lancing. They also beat the Blue Mantles, lost to Tonbridge Town, Blackheath, West Kent, Free Foresters and Old Tonbridgians, and drew with the I. Zingari, Band of Brothers and M.C.C. In the I.Z. Match, Solbé, who captained the school, and T. E. S. Francis put on over 300 for the second wicket against the

bowling, among others, of W. S. Cornwallis, of Kent. Solb  also made 195 v. Westminster and a 66 not out against Clifton at a critical period, which was worth many a hundred. He is a very sound bat; a slow starter, but a hard hitter when set, and he finished his school season with an average of 52.7 for 14 innings, a record which speaks for itself. T. E. S. Francis had an average of 51.5 for 13 innings, and H. C. A. Gaunt 44.5 for 14. Gaunt is a really dangerous bat with a predilection for the leg side, and is a safe out-field. Francis plays a correct game with a very straight bat and is a fine field. C. H. Knott was the all-rounder of the side, a brilliant cover-point, and the most dangerous bat and bowler on the side, though in both departments of the game he is unorthodox. With an excellent eye, he can hit very hard all-round the wicket, and in the course of several excellent innings in August he showed considerable promise. Knott's leg-breaks were the undoing of Clifton, he did the hat trick against the "B.B.'s," and rarely failed to get wickets. For the Lord's Schools against The Rest, Knott was the only one to play E. P. Hewetson with any confidence and his 33 in an innings of 72, in which no other player made double figures, was a really good performance. He was picked for the Public Schools against The Army and was unlucky to be run out in the second innings when he had made 17. J. C. Hubbard is a sound batsman and a fine fielder, but had a rather disappointing season. Apart from Knott the bowling of the side was weak, too much work falling upon H. P. Holton, who bowls medium with a good length, and can swing a little. G. T. Gilbert worked hard as the nearest approach to a fast bowler that the team possessed, and A. S. Webster, a left-hander, is young and promising. The last of the Sherwell brothers, N. B. kept wicket adequately, but his batting was disappointing. J. C. Hubbard will be captain for 1921, with Gaunt, Francis, Webster and Sherwell to help. Bowlers as usual will be the trouble. C. H. Knott is in residence at Brasenose College, Oxford, H. T. Gilbert, Balliol College, Oxford, and G. M. Hancock, Magdalene College, Cambridge.

In the match v. Lancing, Lancing batted first and made 112, of which G. H. Stenhouse contributed 54. Stenhouse also bowled remarkably well, taking seven wickets for 61. Tonbridge made 117 and the match was left drawn, Lancing being 143 on in the second innings with three wickets in hand, when rain stopped play. Against Westminster, Tonbridge batted first and declared with 338 for five wickets, Solb  making 195 and Knott 83. Westminster collapsed after a fair start and were all out for 137. At Lord's, Clifton scored 185 in their first innings, W. M. Hampton playing a fine innings for his side of 81 not out. For Tonbridge H. C. A. Gaunt and C. H. Knott with 53 and 45 were the only two to get into double figures, and the side was dismissed for 145. Clifton collapsed in the second innings and were all out for 56, Knott taking

seven wickets for 27 and Holton three for five. In the Tonbridge second innings Gaunt was run out as he was against Westminster, and then Solb  and Francis knocked off the runs.

From Shrewsbury I hear—*Shrewsbury* had a successful season in 1920, when the unfavourable weather conditions are taken into consideration. In their School matches they beat Uppingham in an innings on a fast wicket at Shrewsbury, and drew with Rossall on a rain-damaged wicket at Rossall. The Repton match had to be abandoned altogether owing to the weather. They ought to have won comfortably at Rossall, and had the match well in hand, until they lost their chance by allowing the last two wickets to put on over 100 in the second innings. In the end they required 40 runs to win with four wickets in hand. The chief strength of the team lay in the bowling, which was distinctly good, especially on a fast wicket. E. P. Hewetson was probably the best fast bowler of the year on his day, when the conditions suited him: he bowled really well against Uppingham and the M.C.C. R. L. Brinton, medium-paced with an easy action and natural swerve, bowled well on occasions, and always kept a good length. K. C. Kendall, leg-breaks, was useful. F. Robinson, slow right, with a good off-break, is distinctly promising, and ought to be very useful next year. The batting was very useful on a fast wicket, but there was a lack of sound players, who could adapt themselves to unfavourable conditions. J. S. Stephenson, a natural player with a good free style, was the best batsman on the side, and ought to be really good next year with greater experience. R. S. Worth, a sound player with strong outside shots, was very consistent at the beginning of the season, but out of luck in later matches. H. V. Newton batted well on fast wickets, but played too much at the pitch of the ball to make many runs when the conditions were against him. J. M. Peterson played a beautiful innings against the Cryptics, but did not enjoy the best of luck. He captained the side with excellent judgment. The fielding was sound without being brilliant, and the catching good. Peterson will again be captain this year, with five old colours: Hewetson, Stephenson, R. L. Brinton, F. Robinson, and W. G. W. Jones will also be at Shrewsbury. R. S. Worth has gone up to Pembroke, Cambridge.

Rossall had a very fair average side, in which there were three really good school players, H. A. Packham, H. Goodwin, and C. W. D. Tucker. Packham, the captain, is a distinctly good bat of the careful type. Though he was rather out of form during the school season, he made a lot of runs in Surrey Colts trial matches, and other cricket in August. Goodwin is a left-hander of the very correct and imperturbable type. Against Shrewsbury he played two class innings of 42 not out and 66, and he played Hewetson, of

Shrewsbury, without any apparent difficulty. Tucker is the best bowler Rossall has produced for years. He bowls left-handed, above the medium-pace, and can both swerve and turn the ball from leg, and he bowls very few loose ones. As he has one, or possibly two, more years at the School, he should be really good before he leaves. Rossall just beat St. Bees by two wickets, and drew with Shrewsbury after an exciting and even game.

ETON v. HARROW.

Played at LORD's, Friday, Saturday, July 9, 10.—For the seventh time in succession—the one day games during the war were not reckoned in the regular series—Eton beat Harrow, winning the match in brilliant style by nine wickets. Though not so strong as in some of the seasons before the war they were far superior to their rivals, and would probably have been capable of winning five times out of six. In consequence of the fighting that followed the conclusion of the game in 1919, Hill-Wood, the Eton captain, issued a notice than any repetition of the misconduct would lead to the Eton v. Harrow match being taken away from Lord's. The warning had the desired effect, there being nothing in the behaviour of the boys after Eton's victory to which the slightest exception could be taken. Though the ground had recovered to a surprising extent from the rain that had ruined the University match, it was still rather slow and great progress was made on the first day, twenty-nine wickets going down for 372 runs. Harrow certainly did not profit by winning the toss, and soon found themselves in a disastrous position. They had five wickets down in forty minutes for 28 runs and, despite some plucky hitting by the tail-end players, were all out before one o'clock for 85. Hill-Wood bowled his slows cleverly but did not seem to have as much spin as in 1919. Having such modest total to face, Eton went in full of confidence, but they did not do so well as expected, and though Hill-Wood stayed for over an hour they had only four wickets in hand when the Harrow total was passed. However, some brisk hitting made a great difference, Mayo and Cox putting on 38 for the last wicket in less than half an hour and the total reaching 141 or 56 ahead. Enthoven (right hand medium pace) bowled extremely well. Harrow went in for the second time with two hours and a half left for play. Bennett and Enthoven made such a good start that for a time the prospect seemed quite bright, but though 39 runs had been scored when the first wicket fell, four wickets were down before the arrears were cleared off, Brand's medium pace bowling—excellent in length and with an appreciable break—destroying Harrow's hopes. Bennett played a splendid innings and up to a certain point was quite brilliant on the off-side. Seventh man out at 100 he was batting for an hour and fifty minutes. At the drawing of stumps Harrow held a lead of ninety with a wicket to fall. On Saturday morning Collins and Lloyd, the not-outs, added twenty-eight, their partnership for the last wicket producing in all 60 runs in three quarters of an hour. Lloyd, for the eleventh man, gave a surprising display of free hitting. Eton required only 119 to win and with the wicket in much better condition than on the previous day the task did not look at all formidable. Allen was bowled with the score at six, but on Aird joining Hill-Wood, Harrow met with no further success, the remaining runs being hit off in sixty-five minutes. Hill-Wood took charge of the game, playing with immense confidence in his own unorthodox fashion. Never probably has any other Eton batsman stood at the wicket with such a pronounced and ungainly bend of the right knee. Allowing for his faults of style, however, Hill-Wood was very brilliant. He rarely or never allowed a short pitched ball to escape punishment. Inasmuch as he scored 101 runs and took six wickets he had the chief share in the victory of his side. Still, Brand's bowling on the Friday afternoon was the turning point of the match.

HARROW.

Ninety-one matches have been played, of which Eton have won thirty-eight, Harrow thirty-five, and eighteen have been drawn. This is the generally published record, but Harrow men object very strongly to the game in 1805 being treated as a regular contest between the two schools, contending that it is no more correct to count that than the fixture in 1857 which has been rejected.

The one-day matches between the two schools during the War were not counted as belonging to the regular series.
